Delivered – NT:4506 > ρύομαι > rhoumai (hroo'-om-ahee); middle voice of an obsolete verb, akin to NT:4482 (through the idea of a current; compare NT:4511); to rush or draw (for oneself), i.e. rescue: KJV - deliver (-er).

...from – NT:4483  $> \delta \epsilon \omega$  > rheo (hreh'-o); a primary verb; for some tenses of which a prolonged form rheuo (hryoo'-o) is used; to flow ("run"; as water): KJV - flow.

#### 2 Samuel 22

- <sup>1</sup> And David spake unto the LORD the words of this song in the day that the LORD had delivered him out of the hand of all his enemies, and out of the hand of Saul:
- <sup>2</sup> And he said, The LORD is my rock, and my fortress, and my deliverer;
- <sup>3</sup> The God of my rock; in him will I trust: he is my shield, and the horn of my salvation, my high tower, and my refuge, my saviour; thou savest me from violence.

Saviour – NT:4990 σωτήρ **soter** (so-tare'); from NT:4982; a deliverer, i.e. God or Christ:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - saviour.

## The Preeminent Deliverer (cont)

#### **Colossians 1**

<sup>13</sup> Who hath **delivered us** from the **power of <u>darkness</u>**, and hath <u>translated</u> us into the kingdom of his dear Son:

<u>Darkness</u> – NT:4655 >  $\sigma$ κότος > skotos (skot'-os); from the base of NT:4639; shadiness, i.e. obscurity (literally or figuratively): KJV - darkness.

...from – NT:4639 –  $>\sigma\kappa i\alpha$  > skia (skee'-ah); apparently a primary word; "shade" or a shadow (literally or figuratively [darkness of error or an adumbration]): KJV - shadow.

#### **Proverbs 4**

19 The way of the wicked is as darkness: they know not at what they stumble.

#### Jeremiah 13

**16** Give glory to the LORD your God, before he cause **darkness**, and before your feet stumble upon the dark mountains, and, while ye look for light, he turn it into the shadow of death, and make it **gross darkness**.

#### Daniel 2

**22** He revealeth the deep and secret things: **he knoweth what is in the darkness**, and the light dwelleth with him.

#### Amos 5

18 Woe unto you that desire the day of the LORD! to what end is it for you? the day of the LORD is darkness, and not light.

#### Amos 5

20 Shall not the day of the LORD be darkness, and not light? even very dark, and no brightness in it?

#### Zephaniah 1

Bitterly - OT:4751 mar (mar); or (feminine) marah (maw-raw'); from OT:4843; bitter (literally or figuratively); also (as noun) bitterness, or (adverbially) bitterly:

 $\textit{\textbf{KJV}}$  - + angry, bitter (-ly, -ness), chafed, discontented,  $^{X}$  great, heavy.

<sup>15</sup> That day is a day of wrath, a day of trouble and distress, a day of wasteness and desolation, a day of darkness and gloominess, a day of clouds and thick darkness,

<sup>16</sup> A day of the trumpet and alarm against the fenced cities, and against the high towers.

## The Preeminent Deliverer (cont)

#### **Colossians 1**

<sup>13</sup> Who hath **delivered us** from the **power of darkness**, and hath **translated us** into the kingdom of his dear Son:

Translated – NT:3179 >μεθίστημι > methistemi (meth-is'-tay-mee); or (1 Cor 13:2) methistano (methis-tan'-o); from NT:3326 and NT:2476; to transfer, i.e. carry away, depose or (figuratively) exchange, seduce: KJV - put out, remove, translate, turn away.

<u>Dear</u> – NT:26 > ἀγάπη > agape (ag-ah'-pay); from NT:25; love, i.e. affection or benevolence; specially (plural) a love-feast: KJV - (feast of) charity ([-ably]), dear, love.

#### **Hebrews 11**

5 By faith Enoch was <u>translated</u> that he should not see death; and was not found, because God had <u>translated</u> him: for before his translation he had this testimony, that he pleased God.

<u>Translated</u> – <u>NT:3346</u> μετατίθημι **metatithemi** (met-at-ith'-ay-mee); from <u>NT:3326</u> and <u>NT:5087</u>; to transfer, i.e. (literally) transport, (by implication) exchange (reflexively) change sides, or (figuratively) pervert: **KJV** - carry over, change, remove, translate, turn.

#### The Preeminent Redeemer

#### **Colossians 1**

<sup>14</sup> In whom we have <u>redemption</u> through his blood, even the <u>forgiveness</u> of <u>sins</u>:

Redemption – NT:629 > ἀπολύτρωσις <END GREEK> apolutrosis (ap-ol-oo'-tro-sis); from a compound of NT:575 and NT:3083; (the act) ransom in full, i.e. (figuratively) riddance, or (specially) Christian salvation: KJV - deliverance, redemption.

...from – NT:3083 > λύτρον > lutron (loo'-tron); from NT:3089; something to loose with, i.e. a redemption price (figuratively, atonement): KJV - ransom.

#### Isaiah 49

7 Thus saith the LORD, the **Redeemer** of Israel, and his Holy One, to him whom man despiseth, to him whom the nation abhorreth, to a servant of rulers, Kings shall see and arise, princes also shall worship, because of the LORD that is faithful, and the Holy One of Israel, and he shall choose thee.

#### Isaiah 49

**26** And I will feed them that oppress thee with their own flesh; and they shall be drunken with their own blood, as with sweet wine: and all flesh shall know that I the LORD am thy Saviour and thy **Redeemer**, the mighty One of Jacob.

#### 1 Corinthians 1

Enemies – NT:2190 ἐχθρός **echthros** (ech-thros'); from a primary echtho (to hate); hateful (passively, odious, or actively, hostile); usually as a noun, an adversary (especially Satan):  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - enemy, foe.

Reconciled – NT:604 ἀποκαταλλάσσω **apokatallasso** (ap-ok-at-al-las'-so); from NT:575 and NT:2644; to reconcile fully: **KJV** - reconcile.

...from – NT:575 ἀπό **apo** (apo'); a primary particle; "off," i.e. away (from something near), in various senses (of place, time, or relation; literal or figurative):

**KJV** - (X here-) after, ago, at, because of, before, by (the space of), for (-th), from, in, (out) of, off, (up-) on (-ce), since, with. In composition (as a prefix) it usually denotes separation, departure, cessation, completion, reversal, etc.

...from – NT:2644 Καταλλάσσω **katallasso** (kat-al-las'-so); from NT:2596 and NT:236; to change mutually, i.e. (figuratively) to compound a difference: **KJV** - reconcile.

<u>Wicked</u> – <u>NT:4190</u> πονηρός **poneros** (pon-ay-ros'); from a derivative of <u>NT:4192</u>; hurtful, i.e. evil (properly, in effect or influence, and thus differing from <u>NT:2556</u>, which refers rather to essential character, as well as from <u>NT:4550</u>, which indicates degeneracy from original virtue); figuratively, calamitous; also (passively) ill, i.e. diseased; but especially (morally) culpable, i.e. derelict, vicious, facinorous; neuter (singular) mischief, malice, or (plural) guilt; masculine (singular) the devil, or (plural) sinners:

**KJV** - bad, evil, grievous, harm, lewd, malicious, wicked (-ness). See also NT:4191.

Moved away – NT:3334 μετακινέω **metakineo** (met-ak-ee-neh'-o); from NT:3326 and NT:2795; to stir to a place elsewhere, i.e. remove (figuratively): **KJV** - move away.

## **Hopeful**

Hope – NT:1680 ἐλπίς **elpis** (el-pece'); from a primary **elpo** (to anticipate, usually with pleasure); expectation (abstractly or concretely) or confidence:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - faith, hope.

Preached – NT:2784 κηρύσσω **kerusso** (kay-roos'-so); of uncertain affinity; to herald (as a public crier), especially divine truth (the gospel): **KJV** - preacher (-er), proclaim, publish.

<u>Creature</u> – <u>NT:2937</u> ΚΤίσις **ktisis** (ktis'-is); from <u>NT:2936</u>; original formation (properly, the act; by implication, the thing, literally or figuratively): **KJV** - building, creation, creature, ordinance.

Minister – NT:1249 διάκονος **diakonos** (dee-ak'-on-os); probably from an obsolete **diako** (to run on errands; compare NT:1377); an attendant, i.e. (genitive case) a waiter (at table or in other menial duties); specially, a Christian teacher and pastor (technically, a deacon or deaconess): KJV - deacon, minister, servant.

We suffer but not to the extent that Christ suffered yet following after and fulfilling His suffer through the living sacrifice of ourselves for the body of Christ, for His sake, for the church.

Rejoice – NT:5463 χαίρω **chairo** (khah'-ee-ro); a primary verb; to be "cheerful", i.e. calmly happy or well-off; impersonally, especially as salutation (on meeting or parting), be well:

KJV - farewell, be glad, God speed, greeting, hall, joy (-fully), rejoice.

Sufferings – NT:3804 πάθημα **pathema** (path'-ay-mah); from a presumed derivative of NT:3806; something undergone, i.e. hardship or pain; subjectively, an emotion or influence: **KJV** - affection, affliction, motion, suffering.

...from – NT:3806  $\pi \acute{\alpha} \theta \circ \varsigma$  **pathos** (path'-os); from the alternate of NT:3958; properly, suffering ("pathos"), i.e. (subjectively) a passion (especially concupiscence): **KJV** - (inordinate) affection, lust.

Behind – NT:5303 ὑστέρημα **husterema** (hoos-ter'-ay-mah); from NT:5302; a deficit; specifically, poverty:

KJV - that which is behind, (that which was) lack (-ing), penury, want.

...from – NT:5302 ὑστερέω **hustereo** (hoos-ter-eh'-o); from NT:5306; to be later, i.e. (by implication) to be inferior; generally, to fall short (be deficient):  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - come behind (short), be destitute, fail, lack, suffer need, (be in) want, be the worse.

...from –  $\underline{\text{NT:5306}}$  ὕστερος **husteros** (hoos'-ter-os); comparative from  $\underline{\text{NT:5259}}$  (in the sense of behind); later:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - latter.

<u>Afflictions</u> – <u>NT:2347</u> θλίψις **thlipsis** (thlip'-sis); from <u>NT:2346</u>; pressure (lit or fig):

KJV - afflicted (-tion), anguish, burdened, persecution, tribulation, trouble.

...from – NT:2346  $\theta \lambda i \beta \omega$  **thlibo** (thlee'-bo); akin to the base of NT:5147; to crowd (literally or figuratively):

*KJV* - afflict, narrow, throng, suffer tribulation, trouble.

<u>Church</u> – <u>NT:1577</u> ἐκκλησία **ekklesia** (ek-klay-see'-ah); from a compound of <u>NT:1537</u> and a derivative of <u>NT:2564</u>; a calling out, i.e. (concretely) a popular meeting, especially a religious congregation (Jewish synagogue, or Christian community of members on earth or saints in heaven or both): **KJV** - assembly, church.

Fulfil – NT:4137 πληρόω **pleroo** (play-ro'-o); from NT:4134; to make replete, i.e. (literally) to cram (a net), level up (a hollow), or (figuratively) to furnish (or imbue, diffuse, influence), satisfy, execute (an office), finish (a period or task), verify (or coincide with a prediction), etc.:

**KJV** - accomplish, <sup>x</sup> after, (be) complete, end, expire, fill (up), fulfil, (be, make) full (come), fully preach, perfect, supply.

...from – NT:4134 πλήρης **pleres** (play'-race); from NT:4130; replete, or covered over; by analogy, complete:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - full.

<u>Manifest</u> – <u>NT:5319</u> φανερόω **phaneroo** (fan-er-o'-o); from <u>NT:5318</u>; to render apparent (literally or figuratively):

KJV - appear, manifestly declare, (make) manifest (forth), shew (self).

...from – NT:5318 φανερός **phaneros** (fan-er-os'); from NT:5316; shining, i.e. apparent (literally or figuratively); neuter (as adverb) publicly, externally:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - abroad, + appear, known, manifest, open [+-ly], outward ([+-ly]).

KJV - fit, frame, mend, (make) perfect (-ly join together), prepare, restore.

Without dissimulation – NT:505 ἀνυπόκριτος **anupokritos** (an-oo-pok'-ree-tos); from NT:1 (as a negative particle) and a presumed derivative of NT:5271; undissembled, i.e. <u>sincere</u>: **KJV** - without dissimulation (hypocrisy), unfeigned. [not pretending]

<sup>10</sup>Be kindly affectioned one to another with brotherly love; in honour preferring one another;

### 1 Thessalonians 4 ...holiness - love

<sup>7</sup> For God hath not called us unto uncleanness, but unto holiness.

<sup>3</sup> In whom are hid all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge.

# Romans 1 ... comfortable with each other

<sup>11</sup> For I long to see you, that I may impart unto you some spiritual gift, to the end ye may be established;

<sup>12</sup> That is, that I may be <u>comforted together</u> with you by the mutual faith both of you and me. Comforted together - NT:4837 συμπαρακαλέω sumparakaleo (soom-par-ak-al-eh'o); from NT:4862 and NT:3870; to console jointly: **KJV** - comfort together.

<sup>13</sup> Now I would not have you ignorant, brethren, that oftentimes I purposed to come unto you, (but was let hitherto,) that I might have some fruit among you also, even as among other Gentiles.

# Romans 15 ... comfortable with the scriptures

Comfort – NT:3874 παράκλησις **paraklesis** (par-ak'-lay-sis); from NT:3870; imploration, exhortation, solace:

Comfort – NT:3890 παραμύθιον paramuthion (par-am-oo'-thee-on); neuter of NT:3889; consolation (properly, concretely): **KJV** - comfort. Fellowship – NT:2842 ΚΟΙνωνία **koinonia** (koy-nohn-ee'-ah); from NT:2844;

partnership, i.e. (literally) participation, or (social) intercourse, or (pecuniary) benefaction:

**KJV** - (to) communicate (-ation), communion, (contri-) distribution, fellowship.

<sup>2</sup> Fulfil ye my joy, that ye be likeminded, having the same love, being of one accord, of one mind.

# Titus 1

<sup>9</sup> <u>Holding fast</u> the faithful word as he hath been taught, that he may be able by sound doctrine both to exhort and to convince the gainsayers.

Holding fast – NT:472 ἀντέχομαι **antechomai** (an-tekh'-om-ahee); from NT:473 and the middle voice of NT:2192; to hold oneself opposite to, i.e. (by implication) adhere to; by extension to care for:

KJV - hold fast, hold to, support.

<u>Gainsayers</u> – <u>NT:483</u> ἀντίλεγω **antilego** (an-til'-eg-o); from <u>NT:473</u> and <u>NT:3004</u>; to <u>dispute</u>, <u>refuse</u>:

KJV - answer again, contradict, deny, gainsay (-er), speak against.

<sup>10</sup> For there are many unruly and vain talkers and deceivers, specially they of the circumcision:

<sup>11</sup> Whose mouths must be stopped, who subvert whole houses, teaching things which they ought not, for filthy lucre's sake.

Sure – NT:804 ἀσφαλής **asphales** (as-fal-ace'); from NT:1 (as a negative particle) and sphallo (to "fail"); secure (literally or figuratively):

KJV - certain (-ty), safe, sure.

Stedfast – NT:949 βέβαιος **bebaios** (beb'-ah-yos); from the base of NT:939 (through the idea of basality); stable (literally or figuratively):

*KJV* - <u>firm</u>, of force, stedfast, <u>sure</u>.

# 2 Peter 3 ...graciousness, knowledge

Perfecting – ΝΤ:2677 Καταρτισμός **katartismos** (kat-ar-tis-mos'); from NT:2675; complete furnishing (objectively): **KJV** - perfecting. ...from – ΝΤ:2675 Καταρτίζω **katartizo** (kat-ar-tid'-zo); from NT:2596 and a derivative of NT:739; to complete thoroughly, i.e. repair (literally or figuratively) or adjust:

*KJV* - fit, frame, mend, (make) perfect (-ly join together), prepare, restore.

...from – NT:739 ἄρτιος **artios** (ar'-tee-os); from NT:737; fresh, i.e. (by implication) complete:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - perfect.

Took – NT:142 αἴρω **airo** (ah'-ee-ro); a primary root; to lift up; by implication, to take up or away; figuratively, to raise (the voice), keep in suspense (the mind), specially, to sail away (i.e. weigh anchor); by Hebraism [compare OT:5375] to expiate sin: **KJV** - away with, bear (up), carry, lift up, loose, make to doubt, put away, remove, take (away, up).

OT:5375  $\aleph U_{\tau}$  nasa' (naw-saw'); or **nacah** (Ps 4:6 [OT:7]) (naw-saw'); a primitive root; to lift, in a great variety of applications, literal and figurative, absol. and rel. (as follows):

**KJV** - accept, advance, arise, (able to, [armor], suffer to) bear (-er, up), bring (forth), burn, carry (away), cast, contain, desire, ease, exact, exalt (self), extol, fetch, forgive, furnish, further, give, go on, help, high, hold up, honorable (+man), lade, lay, lift (self) up, lofty, marry, magnify, \*needs, obtain, pardon, raise (up), receive, regard, respect, set (up), spare, stir up, \*swear, take (away, up), \*utterly, wear, yield.

Having nourishment ministered – NT:2023 ἐπιχορηγέω **epichoregeo** (ep-ee-khor-ayg-eh'-o); from NT:1909 and NT:5524; to furnish besides, i.e. fully supply, (figuratively) aid or contribute:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - add, minister (nourishment, unto).

<u>Knit together</u> – <u>NT:4822</u> συμβιβάζω **sumbibazo** (soom-bib-ad'-zo); from <u>NT:4862</u> and bibazo (to force; causative [by reduplication] of the base of <u>NT:939</u>); to drive together, i.e. unite (in association or affection), (mentally) to infer, show, teach: **KJV** - compact, assuredly gather, intrust, knit together, prove.

Subject to ordinances – NT:1379 δογματίζω **dogmatizo** (dog-mat-id'-zo); from NT:1378; to prescribe by statute, i.e. (reflexively) to submit to ceremonially rule:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - be subject to ordinances.

...from –  $\underline{\text{NT:}1378}$  δόγμα **dogma** (dog'-mah); from the base of  $\underline{\text{NT:}1380}$ ; <u>a law</u> (civil, ceremonial or ecclesiastical): **KJV** - decree, ordinance.
