## Love is Eternal

## **Hebrews 13**

<sup>1</sup>Let brotherly love continue.

Brotherly love – NT:5360 φιλαδελφία **philadelphia** (fil-ad-el-fee'-ah); from NT:5361; fraternal affection: **KJV** - brotherly love (kindness), love of the brethren. Continue – NT:3306 μένω **meno** (men'-o); a primary verb; to stay (in a given place,

state, relation or expectancy):

KJV - abide, continue, dwell, endure, be present, remain, stand, tarry (for),  $^{X}$  thine own.

# ...Greatest gift is Love (charity)

#### **Romans 12**

<sup>9</sup>Let love be <u>without dissimulation</u>. Abhor that which is evil; cleave to that which is good.

Without dissimulation – NT:505 ἀνυπόκριτος **anupokritos** (an-oo-pok'-ree-tos); from NT:1 (as a negative particle) and a presumed derivative of NT:5271; undissembled, i.e. sincere:

**KJV** - without dissimulation (hypocrisy), unfeigned.

# <sup>10</sup>Be kindly affectioned one to another with brotherly love; in honour preferring one another;

Preferring – ΝΤ:4285 προηγέομαι **proegeomai** (pro-ay-geh'-om-ahee); from NT:4253 and NT:2233; to lead the way for others, i.e. show deference, respect, high esteem, reverence, admiration, even obsequiousness (sweet talk): **KJV** - prefer.

#### 1 Thessalonians 4

<sup>8</sup> He therefore that **despiseth**, despiseth not man, but God, who hath also **given unto us His Holy Spirit.** 

<sup>9</sup>But as touching **brotherly love** ye need not that I write unto you: for ye yourselves are taught of God to **love one another**.

And indeed ye do it toward all the brethren which are in all Macedonia: but we beseech you, brethren, that ye increase more and more;

#### 1 John 2

<sup>10</sup> He that **loveth his brother abideth in the light**, and there is none occasion of stumbling in him.

#### 1 John 3

<sup>10</sup> In this the children of God are **manifest**, and the children of the devil: whosoever **doeth not righteousness** is **not of God**, **neither he that loveth not his brother**.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>11</sup> Not slothful in business; fervent in spirit; **serving [being a slave] the Lord**;

# Love is Eternal (cont)

#### 1 John 3

<sup>14</sup> We know that we have **passed from death unto life**, because we love the brethren. He that **loveth not his brother abideth in death**.

#### 1 John 4

<sup>20</sup> If a man say, I love God, and hateth his brother, he is a liar: for he that loveth not his brother whom he hath seen, how can he love God whom he hath not seen?

#### 1 Peter 2

<sup>17</sup> Honour all men. Love the brotherhood. Fear God. Honour the king.

#### 1 John 4:8

He that loveth not knoweth not God; for **God is love**.

#### 1 John 4:10

Herein is love, **not that we loved God**, but that **He loved us**, and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins.

#### 1 John 4:12

No man hath seen God at any time. If we love one another, God dwelleth in us, and **His** love is perfected in us.

#### 1 John 4:16

And we have known and **believed the love** that God hath to us. **God is love**; and he that **dwelleth in love** dwelleth in God, and God in him.

#### 1 John 5:1

Whosoever believeth that Jesus is the Christ is **born of God**: and every one that loveth him that begat **loveth him also that is begotten of him**.

#### 1 John 5:3

For this is **the love of God**, that we **keep His commandments**: and His commandments are **not grievous**.

<u>Grievous</u> – <u>NT:926</u> βαρύς **barus** (bar-ooce'); from the same as <u>NT:922</u>; weighty, i.e. (fig) burdensome, grave: **KJV** - greivous, heavy, weightier.

# **Love Generously**

## **Hebrews 13**

<sup>2</sup>Be not <u>forgetful</u> to <u>entertain strangers</u>: for thereby some have <u>entertained angels unawares</u>. <u>Forgetful</u> – <u>NT:1950</u> ἐπιλανθάνομαι **epilanthanomai** (ep-ee-lan-than'-om-ahee); middle voice from <u>NT:1909</u> and <u>NT:2990</u>; to lose out of mind; by implication, to <u>neglect</u>: **KJV** - (be) forget (-ful of).

...with hospitably

Entertain strangers – NT:5381 φιλονεξία **philonexia** (fil-on-ex-ee'-ah); from NT:5382; hospitableness: **KJV** - entertain stranger, hospitality.

Entertained – NT:3579  $\xi \epsilon \nu i \zeta \omega$  **xenizo** (xen-id'-zo); from NT:3581; to be a host (passively, a guest); by implication be (make, appear) strange: **KJV** - entertain, lodge, (think it) strange.

Angels – NT:32 ἄγγελος **aggelos** (ang'-el-os); from **aggello** [probably derived from NT:71; compare NT:34] (to bring tidings); a messenger; especially an "angel"; by implication, a pastor:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - angel, messenger.

<u>Unawares</u> – <u>NT:2990</u> λανθάνω **lanthano** (lan-than'-o); a prolonged form of a primary verb, which is used only as an alternate in certain tenses; to lie hid (literally or figuratively); often used adv. unwittingly:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - be hid, be ignorant of, unawares.

#### Romans 12

# <sup>12</sup> Rejoicing in hope; patient in tribulation; continuing instant in prayer;

<u>Continuing instant – NT:4342</u> προσκαρτερέω **proskartereo** (pros-kar-ter-eh'-o); from <u>NT:4314</u> and <u>NT:2594</u>; to be earnest towards, i.e. (to a thing) to persevere, be constantly diligent, or (in a place) to attend assiduously all the exercises, or (to a person) to adhere closely to (as a servitor): **KJV** - attend (giveself) continually (upon), continue (in, instant in, with), wait on (continually).

# <sup>13</sup> Distributing to the <u>necessity</u> of saints; **given to hospitality**.

Necessity – NT:5532 χρεία **chreia** (khri'-ah); from the base of NT:5530 or NT:5534; employment, i.e. an affair; also (by implication) occasion, demand, requirement or destitution:

**KJV** - business, lack, necessary (-ity), need (-ful), use, want.

Hospitality – NT:5381 φιλονεξία **philonexia** (fil-on-ex-ee'-ah); from NT:5382; hospitableness:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - entertain stranger, hospitality.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>14</sup> Bless them which persecute you: bless, and curse not.

# Love in Bonds

## **Hebrews 13**

<sup>3</sup>Remember them that are in <u>bonds</u>, as <u>bound with</u> them; and them which <u>suffer adversity</u>, as being yourselves also in **the body [of Christ]**.

Remember – NT:3403  $\mu$ ι  $\mu$ ν ήσκω **mimnesko** (mim-nace'-ko); a prolonged form of NT:3415 (from which some of the tenses are borrowed); to remind, i.e. (middle voice) to recall to mind: **KJV** - be mindful, remember.

Bonds – NT:1198 δέσμιος **desmios** (des'-mee-os); from NT:1199; a captive (as bound): **KJV** - in bonds, prisoner.

## ...Love Binds

Bound with – NT:4887 συνδέω **sundeo** (soon-deh'-o); from NT:4862 and NT:1210; to bind with, i.e. (passively) be a fellow-prisoner (figuratively):  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - be bound with. Suffer adversity – NT:2558 κακουχέω **kakoucheo** (kak-oo-kheh'-o); from a presumed compound of NT:2556 and NT:2192; to maltreat:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - which suffer adversity, torment.

# **Proverbs 24**

<sup>10</sup> If thou faint in the **day of adversity**, thy strength is small.

#### Romans 8

<sup>16</sup> The Spirit itself beareth witness with our spirit, that we are the children of God:

<sup>17</sup> And if children, then heirs; heirs of God, and joint-heirs with Christ; if so be that we **suffer with Him**, that we may be also glorified together.

<sup>18</sup> For I reckon that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us.

#### 1 Corinthians 12

<sup>20</sup> But now are they many members, yet but **one body**.

<sup>21</sup> And the eye cannot say unto the hand, I have no need of thee: nor again the head to the feet, I have no need of you.

Nay, much more those members of the body, which seem to be more feeble, are necessary:

<sup>23</sup> And those members of the body, which we think to be less honourable, upon these we bestow more abundant honour; and our uncomely parts have more abundant comeliness.

<sup>24</sup> For our comely parts have no need: but God hath **tempered the body together**, having given more abundant honour to that part which lacked.

Tempered together – NT:4786 συγκεράννυμι **sugkerannumi** (soong-ker-an'-noomee); from NT:4862 and NT:2767; to commingle, i.e. (figuratively) to combine or assimilate:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - mix with, temper together.

<sup>25</sup> That there should be no schism in the body; but that the **members should have** the same care one for another.

<sup>26</sup> And whether one member suffer, all the members Suffer with it; or one member be honoured, all the members rejoice with it.

# Love in Bonds (cont)

## Hebrews 13 (cont)

<sup>3</sup>Remember them that are in bonds, as bound with them; and them which suffer adversity, as being yourselves also in **the body [of Christ]**.

# 1 Corinthians 12 (cont)

<sup>27</sup> Now **ye are the body** of Christ, and **members in <u>particular</u>**.

Particular – NT:3313 μέρος **meros** (mer'-os); from an obsolete but more primary form of meiromai (to get as a section or allotment); a <u>division or share</u> (literally or figuratively, in a wide application):

**KJV** - behalf, course, coast, craft, particular (+-ly), <u>part</u> (+-ly), piece, portion, respect, side, some sort (-what).

# Love is not Judgmental (critical, disapproving, disparaging) Hebrews 13

# <sup>4</sup> Marriage is honourable in all, and the bed <u>undefiled</u>: but <u>whoremongers</u> and <u>adulterers</u> **God will judge.**

Marriage – NT:1062 γάμος **gamos** (gam'-os); of uncertain affinity; nuptials:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - marriage, wedding.

<u>Honourable</u> – NT:5093 Tίμιος **timios** (tim'-ee-os); including the comparative timioteros (tim-ee-o'- ter-os); and the superlative timiotatos (tim-ee-o'-tat-os); from NT:5092; valuable, i.e. (objectively) costly, or (subjectively) honored, esteemed, or (figuratively) beloved:

KJV - dear, honourable, (more, most) precious, had in reputation.

<u>Undefiled</u> – <u>NT:283</u> ἀμίαντος **amiantos** (am-ee'-an-tos); from <u>NT:1</u> (as a negative particle) and a derivative of <u>NT:3392</u>; unsoiled, i.e. (figuratively) pure: **KJV** - undefiled.

Whoremongers – NT:4205 πόρνος **pornos** (por'-nos); from pernemi (to sell; akin to the base of NT:4097); a (male) prostitute (as venal), i.e. (by analogy) a debauchee (libertine):  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - fornicator, whoremonger.

Adulterers – NT:3432 μοι χός **moichos** (moy-khos'); perhaps a primary word; a (male) paramour; figuratively, apostate: **KJV** - adulterer.

<u>Judge</u> – <u>NT:2919</u> κρίνω **krino** (kree'-no); properly, to distinguish, i.e. decide (mentally or judicially); by implication, to try, condemn, punish:

**KJV** - avenge, conclude, condemn, damn, decree, determine, esteem, judge, go to (sue at the) law, ordain, call in question, sentence to, think.

## **Hebrews 12**

God the Judge of all, and to the spirits of just men made perfect,

#### Psalm 7

<sup>11</sup> God judgeth the righteous, and God is angry with the wicked every day.

#### Psalm 35

<sup>24</sup> **Judge** me, O LORD my **God**, according to thy righteousness; and let them not rejoice over me.

#### Psalm 43

<sup>1</sup> **Judge** me, O **God**, and plead my cause against an ungodly nation: O deliver me from the deceitful and unjust man.

#### Psalm 50

<sup>6</sup> And the heavens shall declare his righteousness: for **God** is **judge** himself. Selah.

#### Psalm 75

<sup>7</sup> But **God is the judge**: he putteth down one, and setteth up another.

# Love never fails, pails, or ails

## **Hebrews 13**

<sup>5</sup>Let your <u>conversation</u> be without <u>covetousness</u>; and be <u>content</u> with such things as ye have: for he hath said, **I will never <u>leave</u> thee, nor <u>forsake</u> thee**.

<u>Conversation</u> – <u>NT:5158</u> τρόπος **tropos** (trop'-os); from the same as <u>NT:5157</u>; a turn, i.e. (by implication) <u>mode or style</u> (especially with preposition or relative prefix as adverb, like); <u>figuratively</u>, <u>deportment or character</u>:

KJV - (even) as, conversation, [+like] manner, (+by any) means, way.

<u>Without covetousness</u> – <u>NT:866</u> ἀφιλάργυρος **aphilarguros** (af-il-ar'-goo-ros); from <u>NT:1</u> (as a negative particle) and <u>NT:5366</u>; not avaricious (greedy):

*KJV* - without covetousness, <u>not greedy</u> of filthy lucre.

Content – NT:714 ἀρκέω **arkeo** (ar-keh'-o); apparently a primary verb [but probably akin to NT:142 through the idea of raising a barrier]; properly, to ward off, i.e. (by implication) to avail (figuratively, be satisfactory):

*KJV* - be content, be enough, suffice, be <u>sufficient</u>.

## 2 Corinthians 12

<sup>9</sup> And he said unto me, **My grace is sufficient** for thee: for my strength is made perfect in weakness. Most gladly therefore will I rather glory in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me.

# 1 Timothy 6

- <sup>5</sup> Perverse disputings of men of corrupt minds, and destitute of the truth, supposing that gain is godliness: from such withdraw thyself.
- <sup>6</sup>But godliness with contentment is great gain.
- <sup>7</sup> For we brought nothing into this world, and it is certain we can carry nothing out.

# 1 Timothy 6

<sup>8</sup> And having food and raiment let us be therewith content.

<u>Leave</u> – <u>NT:447</u> ἀνίημι **aniemi** (an-ee'-ay-mee); from <u>NT:303</u> and hiemi (to send); to <u>let up</u>, i.e. (literally) <u>slacken</u> or (<u>figuratively</u>) <u>desert</u>, desist from: **KJV** - forbear, leave, loose.

<u>Forsake</u> – <u>NT:1459</u> ἐγκαταλείπω **egkataleipo** (eng-kat-al-i'-po); from <u>NT:1722</u> and <u>NT:2641</u>; to <u>leave behind in some place</u>, i.e. (in a good sense) let remain over, or (in a bad sense) to desert: **KJV** - forsake, leave.

#### Hosea 14

<sup>4</sup> I will **heal** their backsliding, I will **love** them freely: for mine anger is turned away from him.

# Love never fails, pales, or ails (cont)

# **Hebrews 13**

<sup>6</sup> So that we may <u>boldly</u> say, The Lord is my <u>helper</u>, and I will not <u>fear</u> what man shall do unto me. <u>Boldly</u> – <u>NT:2292</u> θαρρέω **tharrheo** (thar-hreh'-o); another form for <u>NT:2293</u>; to <u>exercise courage</u>:

**KJV** - be bold, X boldly, have confidence, be confident. Compare NT:5111.

<u>Helper</u> – <u>NT:998</u> βοηθός **boethos** (bo-ay-thos'); from <u>NT:995</u> and theo (to run); a succorer:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - helper.

<u>Fear</u> – <u>NT:5399</u> φοβέω **phobeo** (fob-eh'-o); from <u>NT:5401</u>; to frighten, i.e. (passively) to be alarmed; by analogy, to be in awe of, i.e. revere:

**KJV** - be (+sore) afraid, fear (exceedingly), reverence.

#### Psalm 30

<sup>10</sup> Hear, O **LORD**, and have mercy upon me: **LORD**, **be thou my helper**.

#### Psalm 54

<sup>4</sup> Behold, **God is mine helper**: the **Lord is with them that uphold** my soul.

**KJV** - bear up, establish, (up-) hold, lay, lean, lie hard, put, restself, setself, stand fast, stay (self), sustain.

# Love is Submissive

## **Hebrews 13**

<sup>7</sup> <u>Remember</u> them which have the <u>rule over</u> you, who have spoken unto you the **Word of God**: whose <u>faith</u> follow, <u>considering</u> the <u>end</u> of their conversation.

Remember – ΝΤ:3421 μνημονεύω **mnemoneuo** (mnay-mon-yoo'-o); from a derivative of NT:3420; to exercise memory, i.e. recollect; by implication to punish; also to rehearse: **KJV** - make mention; be mindful, remember.

Rule over – NT:2233 ἡγέομαι **hegeomai** (hayg-eh'-om-ahee); middle voice of a (presumed) strengthened form of NT:71; to lead, i.e. command (with official authority); figuratively, to deem, i.e. consider:

**KJV** - account, (be) chief, count, esteem, governor, judge, have the rule over, suppose, think.

Faith – NT:4102 πίστις **pistis** (pis'-tis); from NT:3982; persuasion, i.e. credence; moral conviction (of religious truth, or the truthfulness of God or a religious teacher), especially reliance upon Christ for salvation; abstractly, constancy in such profession; by extension, the system of religious (Gospel) truth itself:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - assurance, belief, believe, faith, fidelity.

Considering – NT:333 ἀναθεωρέω **antheoreo** (an-ath-eh-o-reh'-o); from NT:303 and NT:2334; to look again (i.e. attentively) at (literally or figuratively):  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - behold, consider.

End – NT:1545 ἔκβασις **ekbasis** (ek'-bas-is); from a compound of NT:1537 and the base of NT:939 (meaning to go out); an exit (literally or figuratively):  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - end, way to escape.

# Love is Submissive (cont)

## **Hebrews 13**

<sup>17</sup> Obey them that have the <u>rule over</u> you, and <u>submit</u> yourselves: for they <u>watch</u> for your <u>souls</u>, as they that must give account, that they may do it with <u>joy</u>, and not with <u>grief</u>: for that is <u>unprofitable</u> for you.

Obey – NT:3982 πείθω **peitho** (pi'-tho); a primary verb; to convince (by argument, true or false); by analogy, to pacify or conciliate (by other fair means); reflexively or passively, to assent (to evidence or authority), to rely (by inward certainty):  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - agree, assure, believe, have confidence, be (wax) confident, make friend, obey, persuade, trust, yield.

Rule over – NT:2233 ἡγέομαι **hegeomai** (hayg-eh'-om-ahee); middle voice of a (presumed) strengthened form of NT:71; to lead, i.e. command (with official authority); figuratively, to deem, i.e. consider:

**KJV** - account, (be) chief, count, esteem, governor, judge, have the rule over, suppose, think.

Submit – NT:5226 ὑπείκω **hipeiko** (hoop-i'-ko); from NT:5259 and eiko (to yield, be "weak"); to surrender: KJV – submit self.

<u>Watch</u> – <u>NT:69</u> ἀγρυπνέω **agrupneo** (ag-roop-neh'-o); ultimately from <u>NT:1</u> (as negative particle) and <u>NT:5258</u>; to <u>be sleepless</u>, i.e. keep awake: **KJV** - watch. <u>Souls</u> – <u>NT:5590</u> ψυχή **psuche** (psoo-khay'); from <u>NT:5594</u>; breath, i.e. (by

implication) spirit, abstractly or concretely (the animal sentient principle only; thus distinguished on the one hand from  $\underline{\text{NT:4151}}$ , which is the <u>rational and immortal soul</u>; and on the other from  $\underline{\text{NT:2222}}$ , which is mere vitality, even of plants: these terms thus exactly correspond respectively to the Hebrew  $\underline{\text{OT:5315}}$ ,  $\underline{\text{OT:7307}}$  and  $\underline{\text{OT:2416}}$ ): **KJV** - heart (+-ily), life, mind, soul, +us, +you.

Joy – NT:5479 χαρά **chara** (khar-ah'); from NT:5463; cheerfulness, i.e. calm delight:

**KJV** - gladness, <sup>X</sup> greatly, (X be exceeding) joy (-ful, -fully, -fulness, -ous).

<u>Grief</u> – <u>NT:4727</u> στενάζω **stenazo** (sten-ad'-zo); from <u>NT:4728</u>; to make (intransitively, be) in straits, i.e. (by implication) to sigh, murmur, pray inaudibly:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - with grief, groan, grudge, sigh.

<u>Unprofitable</u> – NT:255 ἀλυσιτελής **alusiteles** (al-oo-sit-el-ace'); from NT:1 (as a negative particle) and the base of NT:3081; gainless, i.e. (by implication) pernicious [destructive, evil] :  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - unprofitable.

# **Love Never Changes**

#### **Hebrews 13**

<sup>8</sup> Jesus Christ the same <u>yesterday</u>, and <u>to day</u>, and for ever.

<u>Yesterday</u> – <u>NT:5504</u> χθές **chthes** (khthes) or echthes (eh-khthes'); of uncertain derivation; "yesterday"; by extension, in time past or hitherto: *KJV* - yesterday. <u>To day</u> – <u>NT:4594</u> σήμερον **semeron** (say'-mer-on); neuter (as adverb) of a presumed compound of the art. <u>NT:3588</u> and <u>NT:2250</u>; on the (i.e. this) day (or night current or just passed); generally, now (i.e. at present, hitherto): *KJV* - this (to-) day.

#### Malachi 3

<sup>6</sup> For I am the LORD, I **change not**; therefore ye sons of Jacob are not consumed.

# Love is profitable

#### **Hebrews 13**

<sup>9</sup>**Be not carried about** with <u>divers</u> and <u>strange doctrines</u>. For it is a good thing that the <u>heart</u> be <u>established</u> with grace; not with meats, which have **not <u>profited</u>** them that have been <u>occupied</u> therein.

Divers – NT:4164 ποικίλος **poikilos** (poy-kee'-los); of uncertain derivation; motley [dissimilar], i.e. various in character:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - divers, manifold.

Strange – NT:3581 ξένος **xenos** (xen'-os); apparently a primary word; foreign (literally, alien, or figuratively, novel); by implication a guest or (vice-versa) entertainer: KJV - host, strange (-r).

Doctrines – NT:1322 διδαχή **didache** (did-akh-ay'); from NT:1321; instruction (the act or the matter): KJV - doctrine, hath been taught.

<u>Heart</u> – <u>NT:2588</u> καρδία **kardia** (kar-dee'-ah); prolonged from a primary kar (Latin, cor, "heart"); the heart, i.e. (<u>figuratively</u>) the thoughts or feelings (mind); also (by analogy) the middle: KJV - (+broken-) heart (-ed).

Established – NT:950 βεβαιόω **bebaioo** (beb-ah-yo'-o); from NT:949; to stabilitate (figuratively):  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - confirm, (e-) stablish.

<u>Profited</u> – <u>NT:5623</u>  $\mathring{\omega}$ φελέω **opheleo** (o-fel-eh'-o); from the same as <u>NT:5622</u>; to be <u>useful</u>, i.e. <u>to benefit</u>: **KJV** - advantage, better, prevail, profit.

Occupied – NT:4043 περιπατέω **peripateo** (per-ee-pat-eh'-o); from NT:4012 and NT:3961; to tread all around, i.e. walk at large (especially as proof of ability); figuratively, to live, deport oneself, follow (as a companion or votary): **KJV** - go, be occupied with, walk (about).

## Love is Just

#### **Hebrews 13**

We have an altar, whereof **they have no right to eat** which serve the tabernacle [by them]. <u>Eat</u>...from – <u>NT:2068</u> ἐσθίω **esthio** (es-thee'-o); strengthened for a primary **edo** (to eat); used only in certain tenses, the rest being supplied by <u>NT:5315</u>; to eat (usually literal): *KJV* - <u>devour</u>, eat, live.

# **Love Suffers All**

# **Hebrews 13**

<sup>11</sup> For the bodies of those beasts, whose blood is brought into the sanctuary by the high priest for sin, are **burned without the camp**.

#### **Hebrews 13**

<sup>12</sup> Wherefore Jesus also, that he might <u>sanctify</u> the people with his own blood, **suffered** without the gate.

<u>Sanctify</u> – <u>NT:37</u> άγιάζω **hagiazo** (hag-ee-ad'-zo); from <u>NT:40</u>; to make holy, i.e. (ceremonially) purify or consecrate; (mentally) to venerate: **KJV** - hallow, be holy, sanctify.

<u>Suffered</u> – NT:3958 πάσχω **pascho** (pas'-kho); including the forms (patho (path'-o) and pentho (pen'-tho)), used only in certain tenses for it; apparently a primary verb; to experience a sensation or impression (usually painful):  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - feel, passion, suffer, vex.

#### **Hebrews 13**

Let us go forth therefore unto him **without the camp**, **bearing his reproach**. Reproach – NT:3680 ὀνειδισμός **oneidismos** (on-i-dis-mos'); from NT:3679; contumely: **KJV** - reproach.

# Con'-tu-me-ly-noun, plural -lies.

- 1. Insulting display of contempt in words or actions; contemptuous or humiliating treatment.
- 2. A humiliating insult.

# Love is Heavenly

## **Hebrews 13**

<sup>14</sup> For here have we **no continuing city**, but **we seek one to come**.

<u>Continuing</u> – <u>NT:3306</u> μένω **meno** (men'-o); a primary verb; to stay (in a given place, state, relation or expectancy):

KJV - abide, continue, dwell, <u>endure</u>, be present, <u>remain</u>, stand, tarry (for),  $^{\chi}$  thine own.

#### **Revelation 3**

<sup>12</sup> Him that overcometh will I make a pillar in the temple of my God, and he shall go no more out: and I will write upon him the name of my God, and the name of the city of my God, which is **new Jerusalem**, which cometh down out of heaven from my God: and I will write upon him my **new** name.

#### **Revelation 21**

<sup>2</sup> And I John saw the holy city, **new Jerusalem**, coming down from God **out of heaven**, prepared as **a bride adorned for her husband**.

#### James 1

<sup>17</sup> Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and cometh down from the Father of lights, with whom is no variableness, neither shadow of turning.

## **Hebrews 13**

<sup>15</sup> By him therefore **let us offer** the **sacrifice of praise** to God continually, that is, the fruit of our lips **giving thanks** to His name.

#### Psalm 27

<sup>6</sup> And now shall mine head be lifted up above mine enemies round about me: therefore will I offer in his tabernacle **sacrifices** of joy; I will sing, yea, I will sing **praises** unto the LORD.

#### Psalm 54

<sup>6</sup> I will freely **sacrifice** unto thee: I will **praise** thy name, O LORD; for it is good.

#### Psalm 69

<sup>30</sup> I will praise the name of God with a song, and will magnify him with thanksgiving.

<sup>31</sup>This also shall **please the LORD** better than an ox or bullock that hath horns and hoofs.

# Love is Good

## **Hebrews 13**

16 But to do good and to communicate forget not: for with such sacrifices God is well pleased.

Do good – NT:2140 εὐποιΐα **eupoiia** (yoo-poy-ee'-ah); from a compound of NT:2095 and NT:4160; well-doing, i.e. beneficence: **KJV** - to do good.

Communicate – NT:2842 ΚΟΙ νωνία **koinonia** (koy-nohn-ee'-ah); from NT:2844;

<u>Communicate</u> – <u>NT:2842</u> κοινωνία **koinonia** (koy-nohn-ee'-ah); from <u>NT:2844</u>; partnership, i.e. (literally) participation, or (social) intercourse, or (pecuniary) benefaction:

**KJV** - (to) communicate (-ation), communion, (contri-) distribution, fellowship.

#### Psalm 34

<sup>14</sup> Depart from evil, and do good; seek peace, and pursue it.

#### Psalm 37

<sup>27</sup> **Depart from evil**, and **do good**; and dwell for evermore.

#### 1 Peter 3

<sup>10</sup> For he that will love life, and see good days, let him refrain his tongue from evil, and his lips that they speak no guile:

<sup>11</sup>Let him **eschew evil, and do good**; let him seek peace, and ensue it.

Eschew – NT:1578 ἐκκλίνω **ekklino** (ek-klee'-no); from NT:1537 and NT:2827; to deviate, i.e. (absolutely) to shun (literally or figuratively), or (relatively) to decline (from piety): **KJV** - avoid, eschew, go out of the way.

#### Psalm 37

<sup>3</sup> **Trust in the LORD**, and **do good**; so shalt thou dwell in the land, and verily thou shalt be fed.

#### **Ecclesiastes 3**

<sup>11</sup> He hath made every thing beautiful in his **time**: also he hath set the world in their heart, so that **no man can find out the work that God maketh** from the beginning to the end.

<sup>12</sup> I know that there is no good [found] in them [this time and this world], but for a man to rejoice, and to do good in his life.

<sup>13</sup> And also that every man should eat and drink, and enjoy the good of all his labour, it is the **gift of God.** 

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>12</sup> For the eyes of the Lord are over the righteous, and his ears are open unto their prayers: but the face of the Lord is against them that do evil.

# Love is Good (cont)

# 1 Timothy 6

<sup>17</sup> Charge them that are rich in this world, that they be not highminded, nor trust in **uncertain [unreliable] riches**, but in the **living God**, who giveth us richly all things to **enjoy**;

<sup>18</sup> That they **do good**, that they be **rich in good works**, ready to **distribute**, <u>willing</u> to **communicate**;

<u>Distribute</u> – NT:2130 εὐμετάδοτος **eumetadotos** (yoo-met-ad'-ot-os); from NT:2095 and a presumed derivative of NT:3330; good at imparting, i.e. liberal:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - ready to distribute.

<u>Willing to communicate</u> – <u>NT:2843</u> ΚΟΙνωνικός **koinonikos** (koy-no-nee-kos'); from <u>NT:2844</u>; communicative, i.e. (pecuniarily) liberal: *KJV* - willing to communicate.

<sup>19</sup> <u>Laying up in store</u> for themselves a good foundation against the time to come, that they may lay hold on eternal life.

Laying up in store – NT:597 ἀποθησαυρίζω **apothesaurizo** (ap-oth-ay-sow-rid'-zo); from NT:575 and NT:2343; to treasure away:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - lay up in store.

#### Matthew 5

- <sup>43</sup> Ye have heard that it hath been said, Thou shalt love thy neighbour, and hate thine enemy.
- <sup>44</sup> But I say unto you, **Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you**, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you;
- <sup>45</sup> That **ye** may be the children of your Father which is in heaven: for he **maketh His sun to** rise on the evil and on the good, and sendeth rain on the just and on the unjust.

#### Galatians 6

<sup>10</sup> As we have therefore opportunity, **let us do good unto all men**, especially unto them who are of the household of faith.

## **Hebrews 13**

Pray for us: for we trust we have a good conscience, in all things willing to live honestly. Conscience – NT:4893 συνείδησις suneidesis (soon-i'-day-sis); from a prolonged form of NT:4894; coperception, i.e. moral consciousness:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - conscience. Honestly – NT:2573 καλῶς kalos (kal-oce'); adverb from NT:2570; well (usually morally):  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - (in a) good (place), honestly, + recover, (full) well.

#### ...as it is manifest from within...

#### **Hebrews 13**

<sup>19</sup> But I beseech you the rather to do this, that I may be <u>restored</u> to you the <u>sooner</u>.

Restored – NT:600 ἀποκαθίστημι **apokathistemi** (ap-ok-ath-is'-tay-mee); from NT:575 and NT:2525; to reconstitute (in health, home or organization):  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - restore (again).

Sooner – NT:5032 Τάχιον **tachion** (takh'-ee-on); neuter singular of the comparative of NT:5036 (as adverb); more swiftly, i.e. (in manner) more rapidly, or (in time) more speedily:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - out [run], quickly, shortly, sooner.

## Philippians 1:10

That ye may **approve things that are excellent**; that ye may **be sincere** and **without offence** till the day of Christ.

# **Hebrews 13**

<sup>21</sup> Make you <u>perfect</u> in every good work to **do his will**, **working in you** that which is **wellpleasing in his sight**, through Jesus Christ; to whom be glory for ever and ever. Amen. <u>Perfect</u> – <u>NT:2675</u> καταρτίζω **katartizo** (kat-ar-tid'-zo); from <u>NT:2596</u> and a derivative of <u>NT:739</u>; to complete thoroughly, i.e. repair (literally or figuratively) or adjust: **KJV** - fit, frame, mend, (make) perfect (-ly join together), prepare, restore.

Wellpleasing – NT:2101 εὐάρεστος **euarestos** (yoo-ar'-es-tos); from NT:2095 and NT:701; fully agreeable: KJV - acceptable (-ted), wellpleasing.

Sight – NT:1799 ἐνώπιον **enopion** (en-o'-pee-on); neuter of a compound of NT:1722 and a derivative of NT:3700; in the face of (literally or figuratively):  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - before, in the presence (sight) of, to.

# Philippians 4

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>15</sup> Now ye Philippians know also, that in the beginning of the gospel, when I departed from Macedonia, no church communicated with me as concerning giving and receiving, but ye only.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>16</sup> For even in Thessalonica ye sent once and again unto my necessity.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>17</sup> Not because I desire a gift: but I desire fruit that may abound to your account.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>18</sup> But I have all, and abound: I am full, having received of Epaphroditus the things which were sent from you, an odour of a sweet smell, a sacrifice acceptable, **wellpleasing to God**.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>19</sup> But my God shall supply all your need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus.

## **Hebrews 13**

<sup>22</sup> And I beseech you, brethren, <u>suffer</u> the **word of exhortation**: for I have written a letter unto you in few words.

Suffer – NT:430 ἀνέχομαι **anechomai** (an-ekh'-om-ahee); middle voice from NT:303 and NT:2192; to hold oneself up against, i.e. (figuratively) put up with: **KJV** - bear with, endure, forbear, suffer.

# **Love is Liberty**

#### **Hebrews 13**

<sup>23</sup> Know ye that our brother Timothy is **set at <u>liberty</u>**; with whom, if he come shortly, I will see you.

<u>Liberty</u> – <u>NT:630</u> ἀπολύω **apoluo** (ap-ol-oo'-o); from <u>NT:575</u> and <u>NT:3089</u>; to free fully, i.e. (literally) relieve, release, dismiss (reflexively, depart), or (figuratively) let die, pardon or (specially) divorce:

**KJV** - (let) depart, dismiss, divorce, forgive, let go, loose, put (send) away, release, set at liberty.

## **Galatians 5**

<sup>1</sup> Stand fast therefore in the liberty wherewith Christ hath made us free, and be not entangled again with the yoke of bondage.

# James 1

<sup>24</sup> For he beholdeth himself, and goeth his way, and straightway forgetteth what manner of man he was.

<sup>25</sup> But whoso looketh into the **perfect [complete] law of liberty**, and continueth therein, he **being not a forgetful hearer**, but a **doer of the work**, this man shall be **blessed in his deed**.

<u>Liberty NT:1657</u> ἐλευθερία **eleutheria** (el-yoo-ther-ee'-ah); from <u>NT:1658</u>; freedom (legitimate or licentious, chiefly moral or ceremonial): **KJV** - liberty.

<sup>26</sup> If any man among you seem to be religious, and **bridleth not his tongue**, but **deceiveth his own heart**, this man's **religion is vain**.

#### 2 Corinthians 3

<sup>17</sup> Now the Lord is that Spirit: and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty.

# **Love is Spiritual Graciousness**

## **Hebrews 13**

<sup>25</sup> <u>Grace</u> be with you all. Amen.

<u>Grace</u> – <u>NT:5485</u> χάρις **charis** (khar'-ece); from <u>NT:5463</u>; <u>graciousness</u> (as gratifying), of manner or act (abstract or concrete; literal, figurative or spiritual; especially the <u>divine influence upon the heart</u>, and its <u>reflection in the life</u>; including gratitude):

**KJV** - acceptable, <u>benefit</u>, <u>favour</u>, gift, grace (-ious), joy, liberality, pleasure, thank (-s, -worthy).

# Love is Shared

#### **Hebrews 13**

<sup>24</sup> <u>Salute</u> all them that have the <u>rule over</u> you, and all the saints. They of **Italy** salute you. <u>Salute</u> – <u>NT:782</u> ἀσπάζομαι **aspazomai** (as-pad'-zom-ahee); from <u>NT:1</u> (as a particle of union) and a presumed form of <u>NT:4685</u>; to enfold in the arms, i.e. (by implication) to salute, (figuratively) to welcome: **KJV** - embrace, greet, salute, take leave. <u>Rule over</u> – <u>NT:2233</u> ἡγέομαι **hegeomai** (hayg-eh'-om-ahee); middle voice of a (presumed) strengthened form of <u>NT:71</u>; to lead, i.e. command (with official authority); figuratively, to deem, i.e. consider: **KJV** - account, (be) chief, count, esteem, governor, judge, have the rule over, suppose, think.

#### 2 Corinthians 13

<sup>11</sup> Finally, brethren, farewell. Be perfect, be of good comfort, be of one mind, live in peace; and the God of love and peace shall be with you.
