 $\underline{\text{Form}} - \underline{\text{NT:5296}}$ ὑποτύπωσις **hupotuposis** (hoop-ot-oop'-o-sis); from a compound of $\underline{\text{NT:5259}}$ and a derivative of $\underline{\text{NT:5179}}$; typification under (after), i.e. (concretely) **a sketch** (figuratively) for imitation: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - form, pattern.

Typification – to have all or most of the characteristics of a particular type of person or thing and therefore be a suitable example of it *What picture are you drawing from...?*.

...and then, what picture are you drawing others to?

We should draw with pictures of...words...

¹I <u>charge</u> thee therefore before God, and the Lord Jesus Christ, who shall <u>judge</u> the <u>quick</u> and the <u>dead</u> at his <u>appearing</u> and his <u>kingdom</u>;

...authoritative

<u>Charge</u> – <u>NT:1263</u> διαμαρτύρομαι **diamarturomai** (dee-am-ar-too'-rom-ahee); from <u>NT:1223</u> and <u>NT:3140</u>; to <u>attest</u> or protest <u>earnestly</u>, or (by implication) hortatively: **KJV** - charge, testify (unto), witness. [To instruct authoritatively]

1 Timothy 6

¹³ I give thee **charge** in the sight of God, who quickeneth all things, and before Christ Jesus, who before Pontius Pilate witnessed **a good confession**;

1 Thessalonians 2

¹¹ As ye know how we exhorted and comforted and **charge**d every one of you, **as a father** doth his children.

1 Thessalonians 5

²⁷ I **charge** you by the Lord that this epistle be **read** unto all the holy brethren.

1 Timothy 1

- ²Unto Timothy, my own son in the faith: Grace, mercy, and peace, from God our Father and Jesus Christ our Lord.
- ³ As I besought thee to abide still at Ephesus, when I went into Macedonia, that thou mightest **charge** some that they **teach no other doctrine**,

...lawful

<u>Judge</u> – NT:2919 κρίνω **krino** (kree'-no); properly, to distinguish, i.e. decide (mentally or judicially); by implication, to try, condemn, punish:

KJV - avenge, conclude, condemn, damn, decree, determine, esteem, judge, go to (sue at the) law, ordain, call in question, sentence to, think.

Romans 3

³¹ Do we then make void the law through faith? God forbid: yea, we establish the law.

...separate

Quick – NT:2198 ζάω **zao** (dzah'-o); a primary verb; to live (literally or figuratively):

KJV - life (-time), (a-) live (-ly), quick. [alive]

Dead – NT:3498 νεκρός **nekros** (nek-ros'); from an apparently primary nekus (a corpse); dead (literally or figuratively; also as noun): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - dead.

Romans 1

¹Paul, a servant of Jesus Christ, called to be an apostle, separated unto the gospel of God,

² (Which he had promised afore by his prophets in the holy scriptures,)

Romans 8

³⁵ Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword?

³⁶ As it is written, For thy sake we are killed all the day long; we are accounted as sheep for the slaughter.

¹I charge thee therefore before God, and the Lord Jesus Christ, who shall judge the quick and the dead at his <u>appearing</u> and his <u>kingdom</u>;

...manifestation

Appearing – NT:2015 ἐπιφάνεια **epiphaneia** (ep-if-an'-i-ah); from NT:2016; a manifestation, i.e. (specially) the advent of Christ (past or future): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - appearing, brightness.

<u>Kingdom</u> – <u>NT:932</u> βασιλεία **basileia** (bas-il-i'-ah); from <u>NT:935</u>; properly, royalty, i.e. (abstractly) rule, or (concretely) a realm (literally or figuratively): **KJV** - kingdom, $^+$ reign.

Luke 8

¹⁷ For nothing is secret, that shall not be made **manifest**; neither any thing hid, that shall not be **known and come abroad**.

John 3

²¹ But he that doeth truth cometh to the light, that his deeds may be made **manifest**, that they are wrought in God.

Romans 1

- ¹⁸ For the **wrath of God** is **revealed** from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who hold the truth in **unrighteousness**;
- ¹⁹ Because that which may be **known of God** is **manifest in them**; for **God hath shewed it unto them**.

Evangelism

2 Timothy 4

² <u>Preach</u> the <u>word</u>; be <u>instant</u> in <u>season</u>, <u>out of season</u>; <u>reprove</u>, <u>rebuke</u>, <u>exhort</u> with all <u>long suffering</u> and doctrine.

Preach – NT:2784 κηρύσσω **kerusso** (kay-roos'-so); of uncertain affinity; to herald (as a public crier), especially divine truth (the gospel):

KJV - preacher (-er), proclaim, publish.

Word – NT:3056 λόγος **logos** (log'-os); from NT:3004; something said (including the thought); by implication a topic (subject of discourse), also reasoning (the mental faculty) or motive; by extension, a computation; specifically (with the article in John) the Divine Expression (i.e. Christ):

KJV - account, cause, communication, ^x concerning, doctrine, fame, ^x have to do, intent, matter, mouth, preaching, question, reason, ⁺ reckon, remove, say (-ing), shew, ^x speaker, speech, talk, thing, ⁺ none of these things move me, tidings, treatise, utterance, word, work.

<u>Instant</u> – <u>NT:2186</u> ἐφίστημι **ephistemi** (ef-is'-tay-mee); from <u>NT:1909</u> and <u>NT:2476</u>; to <u>stand upon</u>, i.e. be present (in various applications, friendly or otherwise, usually literal); KJV - assault, come (in, to, unto, upon), be at hand (instant), present, stand (before, by, over).

<u>Season</u> – <u>NT:2122</u> εὐκαίρως **eukairos** (yoo-kah'-ee-roce); adverb from <u>NT:2121</u>; <u>opportunely</u>: *KJV* - conveniently, in season. [**Convenient**]

...from – $\underline{\text{NT:2121}}$ εὔκαιρος **eukairos** (yoo'-kahee-ros); from $\underline{\text{NT:2095}}$ and $\underline{\text{NT:2540}}$; well-timed, i.e. opportune: **KJV** - convenient, in time of need.

Out of season – NT:171 ἀκαίρως **akairos** (ak-ah'-ee-roce); adverb from the same as NT:170; inopportunely: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - out of season. [Inconvenient]

Reprove – NT:1651 ἐλέγχω **elegcho** (el-eng'-kho); of uncertain affinity; to confute, admonish [warn]: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - convict, convince, tell a fault, rebuke, reprove.

Rebuke – NT:2008 ἐπιτιμάω **epitimao** (ep-ee-tee-mah'-o); from NT:1909 and NT:5091; to tax upon, i.e. censure or admonish; by implication, forbid: **KJV** - (straitly) charge, rebuke, scold.

Exhort – ΝΤ:3870 παρακαλέω **parakaleo** (par-ak-al-eh'-o); from NT:3844 and NT:2564; to call near, i.e. invite, invoke (by imploration, hortation or consolation): **KJV** - beseech, call for, (be of good) comfort, desire, (give) exhort (-ation), intreat, pray.

Encourage

<u>Long suffering</u> – <u>NT:3115</u> μακροθυμία **makrothumia** (mak-roth-oo-mee'-ah); from the same as <u>NT:3116</u>; longanimity, i.e. (objectively) forbearance or (subjectively) fortitude: **KJV** - longsuffering, patience. [**Self control**]

<u>Doctrine</u> – <u>NT:1322</u> διδαχή **didache** (did-akh-ay'); from <u>NT:1321</u>; <u>instruction</u> (the act or the matter): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - doctrine, hath been taught.

Evangelism (cont)

2 Timothy 4 (cont)

²Preach the word; be instant in season, out of season; reprove, rebuke, exhort with all long suffering and doctrine.

Ephesians 4

¹¹ And he gave some, **apostles**; and some, **prophets**; and some, **evangelists**; and some, **pastors** and **teachers**;

Mark 16

¹⁵ And he said unto them, Go ye into all the world, and **preach** the gospel **to every creature**.

Acts 14

²⁵ And when they had **preached the word** in Perga, they went down into Attalia:

Luke 3

³ And he came into all the country about Jordan, **preaching the baptism of repentance** for the **remission of sins**;

Luke 4

¹⁸ The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he hath anointed me to **preach the gospel to the poor**; he hath sent me to heal the brokenhearted, to **preach deliverance** to the captives, and recovering of sight to the blind, to **set at liberty** them that are bruised,

²³ But we **preach Christ crucified**, unto the Jews a stumblingblock, and unto the Greeks foolishness:

1 Corinthians 1

²¹ For after that in the wisdom of God the world by wisdom knew not God, it pleased God by the foolishness of **preaching to save them that believe**.

¹⁸ For the **preaching of the cross** is to them that perish foolishness; but unto us which are saved it is the power of God.

Heathenism

2 Timothy 4

³ For the <u>time will come</u> when they will not <u>endure sound doctrine</u>; but after their own <u>lusts</u> shall they <u>heap</u> to themselves <u>teachers</u>, having <u>itching ears</u>;

<u>Time</u> – <u>NT:2540</u> καιρός **kairos** (kahee-ros'); of uncertain affinity; an occasion, i.e. set or proper time:

KJV - ^X always, opportunity, (convenient, due) season, (due, short, while) time, a while. Compare NT:5550.

Will come – NT:2071 ἔσομαι **esomai** (es'-om-ahee); future of NT:1510; will be:

 $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - shall (should) be (have), (shall) come (to pass), ^x may have, ^x fall, what would follow, ^x live long, ^x sojourn.

Endure – NT:430 ἀνέχομαι **anechomai** (an-ekh'-om-ahee); middle voice from NT:303 and NT:2192; to hold oneself up against, i.e. (figuratively) put up with:

KJV - bear with, endure, forbear, suffer.

Sound – NT:5198 ὑγιαίνω **hugiaino** (hoog-ee-ah'-ee-no); from NT:5199; to have sound health, i.e. be well (in body); figuratively, to be uncorrupt (true in doctrine):

KJV - be in health, (be safe and) sound, (be) whole (-some).

Doctrine – NT:1319 διδασκαλία **didaskalia** (did-as-kal-ee'-ah); from NT:1320; instruction (the function or the information): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - doctrine, learning, teaching.

Proverbs 4

² For I give you **good doctrine**, forsake ye not my law. *Heathenism is not lawful*

1 Timothy 4

⁶ If thou put the brethren in remembrance of these things, thou shalt be a **good minister** of Jesus Christ, nourished up in the **words of faith and of good doctrine**, whereunto thou hast attained.

<u>Lusts</u> – NT:1939 ἐπιθυμία **epithumia** (ep-ee-thoo-mee'-ah); from NT:1937; a longing (especially for what is forbidden): **KJV** - concupiscence, desire, lust (after).

<u>Heap</u> – <u>NT:2002</u> ἐπισωρεύω **episoreuo** (ep-ee-so-ryoo'-o); from <u>NT:1909</u> and <u>NT:4987</u>; to accumulate further, i.e. (figuratively) seek additionally: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - heap.

Teachers – NT:1320 διδάσκαλος **didaskalos** (did-as'-kal-os); from NT:1321; an instructor (genitive case or specially): KJV - doctor, master, teacher.

Titus 1

9 Holding fast the faithful word as he hath been taught, that he may be able by sound **doctrine** both to exhort and to convince the gainsayers.

<u>Itching</u> – <u>NT:2833</u> κνήθω **knetho** (knay'-tho); from a primary knao (to scrape); to <u>scratch</u>, i.e. (by implication) to tickle: *KJV* - ^X itching.

Ears – NT:189 ἀκοή **akoe** (ak-o-ay'); from NT:191; hearing (the act, the sense or the thing heard): **KJV** - audience, ear, fame, which ye heard, hearing, preached, report, rumor.

The world has an itch and wants someone to scratch it...

Heathenism (cont)

2 Timothy 4 (cont)

3 For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but after their own lusts shall they heap to themselves teachers, having itching ears;

2 John 1

- ⁸Look to yourselves, that we lose not those things which we have wrought, but that we receive a full reward.
- ⁹ Whosoever transgresseth, and abideth not in the doctrine of Christ, hath not God. He that abideth in the doctrine of Christ, he hath both the Father and the Son.
- ¹⁰ If there come any unto you, and bring not this doctrine, receive him not into your house, neither bid him God speed:

Heathenism (cont)

2 Timothy 4 (cont)

⁴ And they shall <u>turn away</u> their ears from the <u>truth</u>, and shall be <u>turned</u> unto <u>fables</u>.

<u>Turn away</u> – <u>NT:654</u> ἀποστρέφω **apostrepho** (ap-os-tref'-o); from <u>NT:575</u> and <u>NT:4762</u>; to turn away or back (literally or figuratively):

KJV - bring again, pervert, turn away (from).

Ears – NT:189 ἀκοή **akoe** (ak-o-ay'); from NT:191; hearing (the act, the sense or the thing heard): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - audience, ear, fame, which ye heard, hearing, preached, report, rumor.

 $\underline{\text{Truth}} - \underline{\text{NT:225}} \dot{\alpha} \lambda \dot{\eta} \theta \epsilon \iota \alpha$ aletheia (al-ay'-thi-a); from $\underline{\text{NT:227}}$; truth:

KJV - true, ^x truly, truth, verity.

<u>Turned</u> – <u>NT:1624</u> ἐκτρέπω **ektrepo** (ek-trep'-o); from <u>NT:1537</u> and the base of <u>NT:5157</u>; to deflect, i.e. turn away (literally or figuratively):

KJV - avoid, turn (aside, out of the way).

Fables – NT:3454 μῦθος **muthos** (moo'-thos); perhaps from the same as NT:3453 (through the idea of tuition); a tale, i.e. fiction ("myth"): **KJV** - fable.

Hebrews 12 ...the mediator testifies

²⁴ And to Jesus the mediator of the new covenant, and to the blood of sprinkling, that speaketh better things than that of Abel.

²⁵ See that ye refuse not him that speaketh. For if they escaped not who refused him that spake on earth, much more shall not we escape, if we **turn away** from him that speaketh from heaven:

²⁶ Whose voice then shook the earth: but now he hath promised, saying, Yet once more I shake not the earth only, but also heaven.

Proverbs 28

⁹ He that turneth away his ear from hearing the law, even his prayer shall be abomination.

Biblism

2 Timothy 4

⁵But <u>watch</u> thou in all things, <u>endure afflictions</u>, do the <u>work</u> of an <u>evangelist</u>, <u>make full proof</u> of thy <u>ministry</u>.

<u>Watch</u> – <u>NT:3525</u> νήφω **nepho** (nay'-fo); of uncertain affinity: to abstain from wine (keep sober), i.e. (figuratively) be discreet: **KJV** - be sober, watch.

Endure afflictions – NT:2553 κακοπαθέω **kakopatheo** (kak-op-ath-eh'-o); from the same as NT:2552; to undergo hardship:

KJV - be afflicted, endure afflictions (hardness), suffer trouble.

Work – NT:2041 ἔργον **ergon** (er'-gon); from a primary (but obsolete) ergo (to work); toil (as an effort or occupation); by implication, an act: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - deed, doing, labour, work. <u>Evangelist</u> – NT:2099 εὐαγγελιστής **euaggelistes** (yoo-ang-ghel-is-tace'); from NT:2097; a preacher of the gospel: **KJV** - evangelist.

Make full proof – NT:4135 πληροφορέω **plerophoreo** (play-rof-or-eh'-o); from NT:4134 and NT:5409; to carry out fully (in evidence), i.e. completely assure (or convince), entirely accomplish: **KJV** - most surely believe, fully know (persuade), make full proof of. Ministry – NT:1248 διακονία **diakonia** (dee-ak-on-ee'-ah); from NT:1249; attendance (as a servant, etc.); figuratively (eleemosynary) aid, (official) service (especially of the

KJV - (ad-) minister (-ing, -tration, -try), office, relief, service (-ing).

Christian teacher, or techn. of the diaconate):

...from – NT:1249 διάκονος **diakonos** (dee-ak'-on-os); probably from an obsolete **diako** (to run on errands; compare NT:1377); an attendant, i.e. (genitive case) a waiter (at table or in other menial duties); specially, a Christian teacher and pastor (technically, a deacon or deaconess): KJV - deacon, minister, servant.

2 Corinthians 13

⁵ Examine yourselves, whether ye be in the faith; **prove your own selves**. Know ye not your own selves, how that Jesus Christ is in you, except ye be reprobates?

Romans 12

And be not conformed to this world: but **be ye transformed** by the **renewing of your mind**, that ye may **prove what is that good**, and **acceptable**, and **perfect, will of God**.

Galatians 6

⁴ But **let every man prove his own work**, and then shall he have rejoicing in himself alone, and not in another.
