¹⁴ And above all these things put on charity, which is the bond of <u>perfectness</u> <u>Perfectness</u> – NT:5047 – teleiotes (tel-i-ot'-ace); from NT:5046; (the state) completeness (mentally or morally): KJV - perfection (-ness).

...from – NT:1909 – epi (ep-ee'); a primary preposition; properly, meaning superimposition (of time, place, order, etc.), as a relation of distribution [with the genitive case], i.e. over, upon, etc.; of rest (with the det.) at, on, etc.; of direction (with the accusative case) towards, upon, etc.:

KJV - about (the times), above, after, against, among, as long as (touching), at, beside, have charge of, (be-, [wherefore-]), in (a place, as much as, the time of, -to), (because) of, (up-) on (behalf of), over, (by, for) the space of, through (-out), (un-) to (-ward), with. In compounds it retains essentially the same import, at, upon, etc. (literally or figuratively).

...from – NT:5091 – timao (tim-ah'-o); from NT:5093; to prize, i.e. fix a valuation upon; by implication, to revere: KJV - honour, value.

<u>Repent</u> – NT:3340 – metanoeo (met-an-o-eh'-o); from NT:3326 and NT:3539; to think differently or afterwards, i.e. reconsider (morally, feel compunction): KJV - repent.

⁴ And if he trespass against thee **seven times in a day**, and **seven times in a day** turn again to thee, saying, I <u>repent</u>; thou shalt <u>forgive</u> him.

<u>Repent</u> – NT:3340 – metanoeo (met-an-o-eh'-o); from NT:3326 and NT:3539; to think differently or afterwards, i.e. reconsider (morally, feel compunction): KJV - repent.

<u>Forgive</u> – NT:863 – aphiemi (af-ee'-ay-mee); from NT:575 and hiemi (to send; an intens. form of eimi, to go); to send forth, in various applications (as follow):

KJV - cry, forgive, forsake, lay aside, leave, let (alone, be, go, have), omit, put (send) away, remit, suffer, yield up.

The Parable

Matthew 18

²³ Therefore is the kingdom of heaven likened unto a certain <u>king</u>, which would <u>take account</u> of his servants.

<u>King</u> – NT:935 – basileus (bas-il-yooce'); probably from NT:939 (through the notion of a foundation of power); a sovereign (abstractly, relatively, or figuratively): KJV - king.

<u>Take</u> – NT:4868 – sunairo (soon-ah'-ee-ro); from NT:4862 and NT:142; to make up together, i.e. (figuratively) to compute (an account): KJV - reckon, take.

<u>Account</u> – NT:3056 – logos (log'-os); from NT:3004; something said (including the thought); by implication a topic (subject of discourse), also reasoning (the mental faculty) or motive; by extension, a computation; specifically (with the article in John) the Divine Expression (i.e. Christ):

KJV - account, cause, communication, concerning, doctrine, fame, have to do, intent, matter, mouth, preaching, question, reason, reckon, remove, say (-ing), shew, speaker, speech, talk, thing, none of these things move me, tidings, treatise, utterance, word, work.

²⁴ And when he had begun to <u>reckon</u>, one was brought unto him, which <u>owed</u> him <u>ten thousand talents</u>. <u>Reckon</u> – NT:4868 – sunairo (soon-ah'-ee-ro); from NT:4862 and NT:142; to make up together, i.e. (figuratively) to compute (an account): KJV - reckon, take.

<u>Owed</u> – NT:3781 – opheiletes (of-i-let'-ace); from NT:3784; an ower, i.e. person indebted; figuratively, a delinquent; morally, a transgressor (against God): KJV - debtor, which owed, sinner.

...from – NT:3784 – opheilo (of-i'-lo); or (in certain tenses) its prolonged form opheileo (of-i-leh'-o); probably from the base of NT:3786 (through the idea of accruing); to owe (pecuniarily); figuratively, to be under obligation (ought, must, should); morally, to fail in duty:

<u>Ten thousand</u> – NT:3463 – murioi (moo'-ree-oi); plural of an apparently primary word (properly, meaning very many); ten thousand; by extension, innumerably many: KJV - ten thousand. <u>Talents</u> – NT:5007 – talanton (tal'-an-ton); neuter of a presumed derivative of the original form of tlao (to bear; equivalent to NT:5342); a balance (as supporting weights), i.e. (by implication) a certain weight (and thence a coin or rather sum of money) or "talent": KJV - talent.

 25 But forasmuch as he had not to <u>pay</u>, his lord <u>commanded</u> him to be <u>sold</u>, and his wife, and children, and **all** that he had, and <u>payment to be made</u>.

<u>Pay</u> – NT:591 – apodidomi (ap-od-eed'-o-mee); from NT:575 and NT:1325; to give away, i.e. up, over, back, etc. (in various applications):

KJV - deliver (again), give (again), (re-) pay (-ment be made), perform, recompense, render, requite, restore, reward, sell, yield.

<u>Commanded</u> – NT:2753 – keleuo (kel-yoo'-o); from a primary kello (to urge on); "hail"; to incite by word, i.e. order: KJV - bid, (at, give) command (-ment).

<u>Sold</u> – NT:4097 – piprasko (pip-ras'-ko); a reduplicated and prolonged form of prao (prah'-o); (which occurs only as an alternate in certain tenses); contracted from perao (to traverse; from the base of NT:4008); to traffic (by travelling), i.e. dispose of as merchandise or into slavery (literally or figuratively): KJV - sell.

<u>Payment</u> – NT:591 – apodidomi (ap-od-eed'-o-mee); from NT:575 and NT:1325; to give away, i.e. up, over, back, etc. (in various applications):

KJV - deliver (again), give (again), (re-) pay (-ment be made), perform, recompense, render, requite, restore, reward, sell, yield.

Matthew 18

²⁶ The servant therefore <u>fell down</u>, and <u>worshipped</u> him, saying, Lord, have <u>patience</u> with me, and I will <u>pay</u> thee all.

<u>Fell down</u> – NT:4098 – pipto (pip'-to); a reduplicated and contracted form of peto (pet'-o); (which occurs only as an alternate in certain tenses); probably akin to NT:4072 through the idea of alighting; to fall (literally or figuratively): KJV - fail, fall (down), light on.

<u>Worshipped</u> – NT:4352 – proskuneo (pros-koo-neh'-o); from NT:4314 and a probable derivative of NT:2965 (meaning to kiss, like a dog licking his master's hand); to fawn or crouch to, i.e. (literally or figuratively) prostrate oneself in homage (do reverence to, adore): KJV - worship. <u>Patience</u> – NT:3114 – makrothumeo (mak-roth-oo-meh'-o); from the same as NT:3116; to be long-

spirited, i.e. (objectively) forbearing or (subjectively) patient:

KJV - bear (suffer) long, be longsuffering, have (long) patience, be patient, patiently endure. Pay – NT:591 – apodidomi (ap-od-eed'-o-mee); from NT:575 and NT:1325; to give away, i.e. up, over,

back, etc. (in various applications):

KJV - deliver (again), give (again), (re-) pay (-ment be made), perform, recompense, render, requite, restore, reward, sell, yield.

²⁷ Then the lord of that servant was <u>moved</u> with <u>compassion</u>, and <u>loosed</u> [...off] him, and <u>forgave</u> him the <u>debt</u>.

<u>Moved</u> with <u>Compassion</u> – NT:4697 – splagchnizomai (splangkh-nid'-zom-ahee); middle voice from NT:4698; to have the bowels yearn, i.e. (figuratively) feel sympathy [kindness, understanding], to pity: KJV - have (be moved with) compassion [consideration, care].

Loosed – NT:630 – apoluo (ap-ol-oo'-o); from NT:575 and NT:3089; to free fully, i.e. (literally) relieve, release, dismiss (reflexively, depart), or (figuratively) let die, pardon or (specially) divorce:

KJV - (let) depart, dismiss, divorce, forgive, let go, loose, put (send) away, release, set at liberty.

<u>Forgave</u> – NT:863 – aphiemi (af-ee'-ay-mee); from NT:575 and hiemi (to send; an intens. form of eimi, to go); to send forth, in various applications (as follow):

KJV - cry, forgive, forsake, lay aside, leave, let (alone, be, go, have), omit, put (send) away, remit, suffer, yield up.

<u>Debt</u> – NT:1156 – daneion (dan'-i-on); from danos (a gift); probably akin to the base of NT:1325; a loan: KJV - debt.

...from – NT:1325 – didomi (did'-o-mee); a prolonged form of a primary verb (which is used as an altern. in most of the tenses); to give (used in a very wide application, properly, or by implication, literally or figuratively; greatly modified by the connection):

KJV - adventure, bestow, bring forth, commit, deliver (up), give, grant, hinder, make, minister, number, offer, have power, put, receive, set, shew, smite (+with the hand), strike (+with the palm of the hand), suffer, take, utter, yield.

Matthew 18

 28 But the same servant went out, and found one of his <u>fellowservants</u>, which owed him an hundred pence: and he <u>laid hands on him</u>, and took him by the <u>throat</u>, saying, Pay me that thou <u>owest</u>.

<u>Fellowservants</u> – NT:4889 – sundoulos (soon'-doo-los); from NT:4862 and NT:1401; a co-slave, i.e. servitor or ministrant of the same master (human or divine): KJV - fellowservant.

<u>Throat</u> – NT:4155 – pnigo (pnee'-go); strengthened from NT:4154; to wheeze, i.e. (cause. by implication) to throttle or strangle (drown): KJV - choke, take by the throat.

<u>Owest</u> – NT:3784 – opheilo (of-i'-lo); or (in certain tenses) its prolonged form opheileo (of-i-leh'-o); probably from the base of NT:3786 (through the idea of accruing); to owe (pecuniarily); figuratively, to be under obligation (ought, must, should); morally, to fail in duty:

KJV - behove, be bound, debt, (be) due (-ty), be guilty (indebted), (must) need (-s), ought, owe, should..

³⁰ And he would not: but went and cast him into <u>prison</u>, till he should pay the <u>debt</u>. <u>Prison</u> – NT:5438 – phulake (foo-lak-ay'); from NT:5442; a guarding or (concretely, guard), the act, the person; figuratively, the place, the condition, or (specifically) the time (as a division of day or night), literally or figuratively: KJV - cage, hold, (im-) prison (-ment), ward, watch.

<u>Debt</u> – NT:3784 – opheilo (of-i'-lo); or (in certain tenses) its prolonged form opheileo (of-i-leh'-o); probably from the base of NT:3786 (through the idea of accruing); to owe (pecuniarily); figuratively, to be under obligation (ought, must, should); morally, to fail in duty:

<u>Lord</u> – NT:2962 – kurios (koo'-ree-os); from kuros (supremacy); supreme in authority, i.e. (as noun) controller; by implication, Mr. (as a respectful title): KJV - God, Lord, master, Sir.

 32 Then his lord, after that he had called him, said unto him, O thou <u>wicked</u> servant, I <u>forgave</u> thee all that debt, because thou <u>desiredst</u> me:

<u>Wicked</u> – NT:4190 – poneros (pon-ay-ros'); from a derivative of NT:4192; hurtful, i.e. evil (properly, in effect or influence, and thus differing from NT:2556, which refers rather to essential character, as well as from NT:4550, which indicates degeneracy from original virtue); figuratively, calamitous; also (passively) ill, i.e. diseased; but especially (morally) culpable, i.e. derelict, vicious, facinorous; neuter (singular) mischief, malice, or (plural) guilt; masculine (singular) the devil, or (plural) sinners: KJV - bad, evil, grievous, harm, lewd, malicious, wicked (-ness).

...from – NT:4192 – ponos (pon'-os); from the base of NT:3993; toil, i.e. (by implication) anguish: KJV - pain.

Desiredst – NT:3870 – parakaleo (par-ak-al-eh'-o); from NT:3844 and NT:2564; to call near, i.e. invite, invoke (by imploration, hortation or consolation):

KJV - beseech, call for, (be of good) comfort, desire, (give) exhort (-ation), intreat, pray.

<u>Forgave</u> – NT:863 – aphiemi (af-ee'-ay-mee); from NT:575 and hiemi (to send; an intens. form of eimi, to go); to send forth, in various applications (as follow):

KJV - cry, forgive, forsake, lay aside, leave, let (alone, be, go, have), omit, put (send) away, remit, suffer, yield up.

<u>Wroth</u> – NT:3710 – orgizo (or-gid'-zo); from NT:3709; to provoke or enrage, i.e. (passively) become exasperated: KJV - be angry (wroth).

...from – NT:3709 – orge (or-gay'); from NT:3713; properly, desire (as a reaching forth or excitement of the mind), i.e. (by analogy,) violent passion (ire, or [justifiable] abhorrence); by implication punishment: KJV - anger, indignation, vengeance, wrath.

<u>Delivered</u> – NT:3860 – paradidomi (par-ad-id'-o-mee); from NT:3844 and NT:1325; to surrender, i.e yield up, intrust, transmit:

KJV - betray, bring forth, cast, commit, deliver (up), give (over, up), hazard, put in prison, recommend. <u>Tormentors</u> – NT:930 – basanistes (bas-an-is-tace'); from NT:928; a torturer: KJV - tormentor.

³⁵ So [in this way] <u>likewise</u> shall my <u>heavenly</u> Father do also unto you, if ye from your hearts <u>forgive</u> not every one his **brother** their <u>trespasses</u>.

<u>Forgive</u> – NT:863 – aphiemi (af-ee'-ay-mee); from NT:575 and hiemi (to send; an intens. form of eimi, to go); to send forth, in various applications (as follow):

KJV - cry, forgive, forsake, lay aside, leave, let (alone, be, go, have), omit, put (send) away, remit, suffer, yield up.

<u>Heavenly</u> – NT:3770 – ouranios (oo-ran'-ee-os); from NT:3772; celestial, i.e. belonging to or coming from the sky: KJV - heavenly.

<u>Forgive</u> – NT:863 – aphiemi (af-ee'-ay-mee); from NT:575 and hiemi (to send; an intens. form of eimi, to go); to send forth, in various applications (as follow):

KJV - cry, forgive, forsake, lay aside, leave, let (alone, be, go, have), omit, put (send) away, remit, suffer, yield up.

Matthew 6

 12 And forgive us our debts, **as** [*in the manner*] we forgive our debtors.

¹³ And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil: For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever. Amen.

¹⁴ For if ye forgive men their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you:

¹⁵ But if ye **forgive not men their trespasses**, **neither will your Father forgive** your trespasses.

Mark 11

²⁴ Therefore I say unto you, What things soever ye desire, when ye pray, believe that ye receive them, and ye shall have them.

²⁵ And when ye stand praying, forgive, if ye have ought against any: that your Father also which is in heaven may forgive you your trespasses.

²⁶ But if ye do not forgive, neither will your Father which is in heaven forgive your trespasses.

Genesis 50

¹⁶ And they sent a messenger unto Joseph, saying, Thy father did command before he died, saying,

¹⁷ So shall ye say unto Joseph, Forgive, I pray thee now, the trespass of thy brethren, and their sin; for they did unto thee evil: and now, we pray thee, **forgive the trespass of the servants** of the God of thy father. And Joseph wept when they spake unto him.

¹⁸ And his brethren also went and fell down before his face; and they said, Behold, we be thy servants.

Proverbs 19

¹⁷ He that hath pity upon the poor lendeth unto the LORD; and that which he hath given will he pay him again.

Exodus 22

²⁵ If thou lend money to any of my people that is poor by thee, thou shalt not be to him as an usurer, neither shalt thou lay upon him usury.

Deuteronomy 23

²⁰ Unto a stranger thou mayest lend upon usury; but unto thy brother thou shalt not lend upon usury: that the LORD thy God may bless thee in all that thou settest thine hand to in the land whither thou goest to possess it.

1 Kings 8

³³When thy people Israel be smitten down before the enemy, because they have sinned against thee, and shall turn again to thee, and confess thy name, and pray, and make supplication unto thee in this house:

³⁴ Then hear thou in heaven, and **forgive the sin of thy people Israel**, and bring them again unto the land which thou gavest unto their fathers.

³⁵ When heaven is shut up, and there is no rain, because they have sinned against thee; **if they pray toward this place**, and **confess thy name**, and **turn from their sin**, when thou <u>afflictest</u> them:

³⁶ Then hear thou in heaven, and forgive the sin of thy servants, and of thy people Israel, that thou teach them the good way wherein they should walk, and give rain upon thy land, which thou hast given to thy people for an inheritance.

<u>Afflictest</u> – OT:6031 – `anah (aw-naw'); a primitive root [possibly rather ident. with OT:6030 through the idea of looking down or <u>browbeating</u>]; to depress literally or figuratively, transitive or intransitive (in various applications, as follows):

KJV - abaseself, afflict (-ionself,), answer [by mistake for OT:6030], chastenself, deal hardly with, defile, exercise, force, gentleness, humble (self), hurt, ravish, sing [by mistake for OT:6030], speak [by mistake for OT:6030], submitself, weaken, in any wise.

Luke 23

³⁴ Then said Jesus, Father, **forgive them; for they know not what they do**. And they parted his raiment, and cast lots.

Psalm 37

²¹ The wicked borroweth, and payeth not again: but the righteous sheweth mercy, and giveth.

2 Corinthians 2

⁹ For to this end also did I write, that I might know the proof of you, whether ye be obedient in all things.

¹¹Lest Satan should get an advantage of us: for we are not ignorant of his devices.
