KJV - (most) holy (one, thing), saint.

...from – NT:40 – hagios (hag'-ee-os); from hagos (an awful thing) [compare NT:53, NT:2282]; sacred (physically, pure, morally blameless or religious, ceremonially, consecrated):

KJV - (most) holy (one, thing), saint.

2 Thessalonians 2

But we are bound to give thanks alway to God for you, brethren beloved of the Lord, because God hath from the beginning **chosen you** to salvation through <u>sanctification</u> of the Spirit and belief of the truth:

Job 1

There was a man in the land of Uz, whose name was Job; and that man was perfect and upright [right or just], and one that feared God, and eschewed evil. Perfect – tam (tawm); from OT:8552; complete; usually (morally) pious; specifically, gentle, dear: KJV - coupled together, perfect, plain, undefiled, upright.

Be holy

Exodus 22

And <u>ye shall be holy</u> men <u>unto me</u>: neither shall ye eat any flesh that is torn of beasts in the field; ye shall cast it to the dogs.

<u>Ye shall be</u> – OT:1961 – hayah (haw-yaw); a primitive root [compare OT:1933]; to exist, i.e. be or become, come to pass (always emphatic, and not a mere copula or auxiliary): KJV - beacon, X altogether, be (-come), accomplished, committed, like), break, cause, come (to pass), do, faint, fall, + follow, happen, X have, last, pertain, quit (oneself-), require, X use.

<u>Holy</u> – OT:6944 – qodesh (ko'-desh); from OT:6942; a sacred place or thing; rarely abstract, sanctity:

KJV - consecrated (thing), dedicated (thing), hallowed (thing), holiness, (X most) holy (X day, portion, thing), saint, sanctuary.

...from – OT:6942 – qadash (kaw-dash'); a primitive root; to be (causatively, make, pronounce or observe as) clean (ceremonially or morally):

KJV - appoint, bid, consecrate, dedicate, defile, hallow, (be, keep) holy (-er, place), keep, prepare, proclaim, purify, sanctify (-ied oneself,), X wholly.

Unto –OT:3807a – le- (le); a prefixed (inseparable) preposition; sometimes it appears with the definite article (la-, le-). It means: (1) to, toward; (2) at, in; (3) till, until; (4) in order to, **for the purpose** of; (5) for, **belonging to**, with respect to, in regard to, **according to**. It is frequently found combined with lahen (therefore), laken (so, thus, therefore), lamah (why?). When it is joined with substantives and or adjectives, it sometimes can be translated as an adverb, e. g. lesheqer (falsely), letsedeq (fairly). Sometimes it is equivalent to the direct object marker (see OT:853). It can be combined with a wide variety of pronominal suffixes.

<u>Holy</u> – hagios (hag'-ee-os); from hagos (an awful thing) [compare NT:53, NT:2282]; sacred (physically, pure, morally blameless or religious, ceremonially, consecrated): KJV - (most) holy (one, thing), saint.

Hebrews 7

For such an high priest became us, who is holy, harmless, undefiled, separate from sinners, and made higher than the heavens;

Colossians 1

And you, that were sometime alienated and enemies in your mind by wicked works, yet now hath he reconciled

...from – OT:6942 – qadash (kaw-dash'); a primitive root; to be (causatively, make, pronounce or observe as) clean (ceremonially or morally):

KJV - appoint, bid, consecrate, dedicate, defile, hallow, (be, keep) holy (-er, place), keep, prepare, proclaim, purify, sanctify (-ied oneself,), X wholly.

KJV - appoint, bid, consecrate, dedicate, defile, hallow, (be, keep) holy (-er, place), keep, prepare, proclaim, purify, sanctify (-ied oneself,), X wholly.

Sanctified

Ephesians 5

³ But fornication, and all uncleanness, or covetousness, let it not be once named among you, as becometh saints;

<u>Becometh</u> – prepo (prep'-o); apparently a primary verb; to tower up (be conspicuous), i.e. (by implication) to be suitable or proper (third person singular present indicative, often used impersonally, it is fit or right):

KJV - become, comely.

<u>Saints</u> – hagios (hag'-ee-os); from hagos (an awful thing) [compare NT:53, NT:2282]; sacred (physically, pure, morally blameless or religious, ceremonially, consecrated): KJV - (most) holy (one, thing), saint.

Revelation 22

- And he saith unto me, Seal not the sayings of the prophecy of this book: for the time is at hand.
- He that is unjust, let him be unjust still: and he which is filthy, let him be filthy still: and he that is righteous, let him be righteous still: and he that is holy, let him be holy still.
- And, behold, I come quickly; and my reward is with me, to give every man according as his work shall be.

The Church is to be holy

Romans 11

¹⁶ For if the firstfruit be holy, the lump is also holy: and if the root be holy, so are the branches.

Ephesians 5

That he might present it to himself a glorious church, not having <u>spot</u>, or <u>wrinkle</u>, or any such thing; but that it should be holy and <u>without blemish</u>.

<u>Spot</u> – spilos (spee'-los); of uncertain derivation; a stain or blemish, i.e. (figuratively) defect, disgrace: KJV - spot.

<u>Wrinkle</u> – rhutis (hroo-tece'); from NT:4506; a fold (as drawing together), i.e. a wrinkle (especially on the face): KJV - wrinkle.

...from – NT:4506 – rhoumai (hroo'-om-ahee); middle voice of an obsolete verb, akin to NT:4482 (through the idea of a current; compare NT:4511); to rush or draw (for oneself), i.e. rescue: KJV - deliver (-er).

Without blemish – amomos – unblameable, faultless, innocent

How then should we BE HOLY

1 John 3 (read)

And every man that hath this hope in him [you] <u>purifieth</u> himself, even as he [you] is <u>pure</u>.

<u>Purifieth</u> – hagnizo (hag-nid'-zo); from NT:53; to make clean, i.e. (figuratively) sanctify (ceremonially or morally): KJV - purify (self). <u>Pure</u> – hagnos (hag-nos'); from the same as NT:40; properly, clean, i.e. (figuratively) innocent, modest, perfect: KJV - chaste, clean, pure.

Psalm 29

² Give unto the LORD the glory due unto his name; worship the LORD in the <u>beauty</u> of holiness.

Beauty – hadarah (had-aw-raw'); feminine of OT:1926; decoration:

KJV - beauty, honour.

...from – OT:1926 – hadar (haw-dawr'); from OT:1921; magnificence, i.e. ornament or splendor: -beauty, comeliness, excellency, glorious, glory, goodly, honour, majesty.

Psalm 30

⁴ Sing unto the LORD, O ye saints of his, and give thanks at the <u>remembrance</u> of his holiness.

<u>Remembrance</u> – zeker (zay'-ker); or zeker (zeh'-ker); from OT:2142; a memento, abstr. **recollection** (rarely if ever); by implication, commemoration:

KJV - memorial, memory, remembrance, scent.

....from – OT:2142 – zakar (zaw-kar'); a primitive root; properly, to mark (so as to be recognized), i.e. to remember; by implication, to mention; also (as denominative from OT:2145) to be male:

KJV - X burn [incense], X earnestly, be male, (make) **mention** (of), be mindful, recount, record (-er), remember, make to be remembered, bring (call, come, keep, put) to (in) remembrance, X still, think on, X well.

Matthew 10

Whosoever therefore shall confess me before men, him will I confess also before my Father which is in heaven.

Psalm 47

- ⁸ God reigneth over the heathen: God sitteth [judges] upon the <u>throne</u> of his holiness. Matthew 10
- 32 Whosoever therefore shall confess me before men, him will I confess also before my Father which is in heaven.

<u>Throne</u> – OT:3678 kicce' (kis-say'); or kicceh (kis-say'); from OT:3680; properly, covered, i.e. a throne (as canopied):

KJV - seat, stool, throne.

...from – OT:3680 – kacah (kaw-saw'); a primitive root; properly, to plump, i.e. fill up hollows; by implication, to cover (for clothing or secrecy):

KJV - cladself, close, clothe, conceal, cover (self), (flee to) hide, overwhelm.

Psalm 48

Great is the LORD, and greatly to be praised in the city of our God, in the <u>mountain</u> of his holiness.

Mountain – mountain range from ? Heb word meaning to loom up

Psalm 60

⁶ God hath <u>spoken</u> in his holiness; I will rejoice, I will divide Shechem, and mete out the valley of Succoth.

<u>Spoken</u> – dabar (daw-bar'); a primitive root; perhaps properly, to arrange; but used figuratively (of words), to speak; rarely (in a destructive sense) to subdue:

KJV - answer, appoint, bid, command, commune, declare, destroy, give, name, promise, pronounce, rehearse, say, speak, be spokesman, subdue, talk, teach, tell, think, use [entreaties], utter, X well, X work.

Psalm 89

Once have I sworn by my holiness that I will not <u>lie</u> unto David.

<u>Lie</u> –OT:3576 kazab (kaw-zab'); a primitive root; to lie (i.e. deceive), literally or figuratively: KJV - fail, (be found a, make a) liar, lie, lying, be in vain.

Proverbs 17

⁷ Excellent speech becometh not a fool: much less do lying lips a prince.

Psalm 93

Thy testimonies are very <u>sure</u>: holiness **becometh** thine house, O LORD, for ever. <u>Sure</u> – 'aman (aw-man'); a primitive root; properly, **to build up** or **support**; to **foster as a parent** or nurse; figuratively to render (or be) firm or faithful, **to trust or believe**, to be **permanent** or quiet; **morally to be true** or **certain**; once (Isa 30:21; interchangeable with OT:541) to go to the right hand:

KJV - hence, assurance, believe, bring up, establish, + fail, be faithful (of long continuance, stedfast, sure, surely, trusty, verified), nurse, (-ing father), (put), trust, turn to the right.

...and so are we sure if we rely upon only the Lord's testimonies...

Psalm 97

Rejoice in the LORD, ye righteous; and give thanks at the remembrance of his holiness.

Psalm 110

Thy people shall be <u>willing</u> in the day of thy power, in the beauties of holiness from the womb of the morning: thou hast the dew of thy youth.

<u>Willing</u> – nedabah (ned-aw-baw'); from OT:5068; properly (abstractly) spontaneity, or (adjectively) spontaneous; also (concretely) a spontaneous or (by inference, in plural) abundant gift:

KJV - free (-will) offering, freely, plentiful, voluntary (-ily, offering), willing (-ly), offering).

1 Peter 1 (repeated)

- But as he which hath **called you is holy, so be ye holy** in all manner of conversation:
- ¹⁶ Because it is written, Be ye holy; for I am holy.

Luke 1

- That he would grant unto us, that we being delivered out of the hand of our enemies might serve him without fear,
- ⁷⁵ In holiness and righteousness before him, all the days of our life.
- And thou, child, shalt be called the prophet of the Highest: for thou shalt go before the face of the Lord to prepare his ways;

Romans 1

- ³ Concerning his Son Jesus Christ our Lord, which was made of the seed of David according to the flesh;

KJV - divide, separate, sever.

 \dots from - NT:3724 - horizo (hor-id'-zo); from NT:3725; to **mark** out or bound ("horizon"), i.e. (figuratively) to appoint, decree, **specify**:

KJV - declare, determine, limit, ordain.

Holy conversation

Jeremiah 23

⁹ Mine heart within me is broken because of the prophets; all my bones shake; I am like a drunken man, and like a man whom wine hath overcome, because of the LORD, and because of **the words of his holiness**.

Philippians 1

Only let your **conversation** be as it becometh the gospel of Christ: that whether I come and see you, or else be absent, I may hear of your affairs, that ye stand fast in one spirit, with one mind striving together for the faith of the gospel;

Psalm 12

⁶ The **words of the LORD are <u>pure</u> words**: as silver tried in a furnace of earth, purified seven times.

<u>Pure</u> – tahowr (taw-hore'); or tahor (taw-hore'); from OT:2891; pure (in a physical, chemical, ceremonial or moral sense):

KJV - clean, fair, pure (-ness).

...from – OT:2891 – taher (taw-hare'); a primitive root; properly, **to be bright**; i.e. (by implication) **to be pure** (physical sound, clear, unadulterated; Levitically, uncontaminated; morally, **innocent or holy**):

KJV - be (make, makeself, pronounce) clean, cleanse (self), purge, purify (-ierself,).

Psalm 19

⁸ The <u>statutes</u> of the LORD are **right**, rejoicing the heart: the commandment of the LORD is **pure**, enlightening the eyes.

<u>Statutes</u> – piqquwd (pik-kood'); or piqqud (pik-kood'); from OT:6485; properly, appointed, i.e. a mandate (of God; plural only, collectively, for the Law): KJV - commandment, precept, statute.

Proverbs 15

The thoughts of the wicked are an abomination to the LORD: but the words of the **pure** are pleasant words.

<u>Pleasant</u> – no` am (no'-am); from OT:5276; agreeableness, i.e. delight, suitableness, splendor or grace:

KJV - beauty, pleasant (-ness).

...from – OT:5276 – na` em (naw-ame'); a primitive root; to be agreeable (literally or figuratively): KJV - pass in beauty, be delight, be pleasant, be sweet.

Proverbs 30

⁵ Every word of God is pure: he is a shield unto them that put their trust in him.

Hebrews 5

For when for the **time ye ought to be teachers**, ye have need that one teach you again which be the first principles of the oracles of God; and are become such as have need of milk, and not of strong meat.

How then should we speak...

1 Peter 4

If any man speak, let him **speak as the <u>oracles</u> of God**; if any man minister, let him do it as of the ability which God giveth: **that God in all things may be <u>glorified</u>** through Jesus Christ, to whom be praise and dominion for ever and ever. Amen. oracles – NT:3051 – logion (log'-ee-on); neuter of NT:3052; an utterance (of God):

<u>oracles</u> – NT:3051 – logion (log'-ee-on); neuter of NT:3052; an utterance (of God): KJV - oracle.

...from – NT:3052 – logios (log'-ee-os); from NT:3056; fluent, i.e. an orator: KJV - eloquent.

...from – NT:3056 – logos (log'-os); from NT:3004; something said (including the thought); by implication a topic (subject of discourse), also reasoning (the mental faculty) or motive; by extension, a computation; specifically (with the article in John) the Divine Expression (i.e. Christ):

KJV - account, cause, communication, X concerning, doctrine, fame, X have to do, intent, matter, mouth, preaching, question, reason, + reckon, remove, say (-ing), shew, X speaker, speech, talk, thing, + none of these things move me, tidings, treatise, utterance, word, work.

<u>Glorified</u> – doxazo (dox-ad'-zo); from NT:1391; to render (or esteem) glorious (in a wide application):

KJV - (make) glorify (-ious), full of (have) glory, honour, magnify.

2 Corinthians 5

To wit, that God was in Christ, reconciling the world unto himself, not imputing their trespasses unto them; and hath committed unto us the **word of reconciliation**.

Reconciliation – katallage (kat-al-lag-ay'); from NT:2644; **exchange** (figuratively, adjustment), i.e. **restoration to (the divine) favor**:

KJV - atonement, reconciliation (-ing).

...from – NT:2644 – katallasso (kat-al-las'-so); from NT:2596 and NT:236; **to change mutually**, i.e. (figuratively) to compound a difference: KJV - reconcile.

Holy behavior

1 Samuel 18

And David <u>behaved himself wisely</u> in all his ways; and the LORD was with him. <u>behaved himself wisely</u> – sakal (saw-kal'); a primitive root; to be (causatively, make or act) circumspect [careful, guarded, cautious, watching] and hence, intelligent: KJV - consider, **expert**, instruct, prosper, (deal) prudent (-ly), (give) **skill** (-ful), have good success, teach, (have, make to) understand (-ing), wisdom, (be, behaveself,

Ephesians 5

consider, make) wise (-ly), guide wittingly.

- See then that ye walk circumspectly, not as fools, but as wise,
- Redeeming the time, because the days are evil.

Psalm 18

With the pure thou wilt **shew thyself pure**; and with the froward thou wilt shew thyself froward.

<u>shew thyself pure</u> – barar (baw-rar'); a primitive root; to clarify (i.e. brighten), examine, select:

KJV - **make bright**, choice, chosen, cleanse (be clean), clearly, polished, (shewself) pure (-ify), purge (out).

Psalm 35

¹⁴ I behaved myself **as though** he had been my friend or brother: I bowed down heavily, as one that mourneth for his mother.

Psalm 101

² I will behave myself wisely in a <u>perfect</u> way. O when wilt thou come unto me? I will walk within my house with a perfect heart.

<u>Perfect</u> – tamiym (taw-meem'); from OT:8552; entire (literally, figuratively or morally); also (as noun) integrity, truth:

KJV - without blemish, complete, full, perfect, sincerely (-ity), sound, without spot, undefiled, upright (-ly), whole.

...from – OT:8552 – tamam (taw-mam'); a primitive root; to complete, in a good or a bad sense, literal, or figurative, transitive or intransitive (as follows):

KJV - accomplish, cease, be clean [passed-], consume, have done, (come to an, have an, make an) end, fail, come to the full, be all gone, X be all here, be (make) perfect, be spent, sum, be (shewself) upright, be wasted, whole.

Psalm 131

² Surely I have behaved and quieted myself, as a child that is weaned of his mother: my soul is even as a weaned child.

1 Thessalonians 2

- ⁹ For ye remember, brethren, our labour and travail: for labouring night and day, because we would not be chargeable unto any of you, we preached unto you the gospel of God.
- 10 Ye are witnesses, and God also, how holily and justly and unblameably we behaved ourselves among you that believe:

KJV - accomplish, do, finish, (make) (perfect), perform (X -ance).

...from – NT:5055 – teleo (tel-eh'-o); from NT:5056; to end, ie. complete, execute, conclude, discharge (a debt):

KJV - accomplish, make an end, expire, fill up, finish, go over, pay, perform.

...we are to execute in holiness according to the holiness of God in us....

1 Thessalonians 4

⁷ For God hath not called us unto uncleanness, but unto holiness.

Titus 2

³ The aged women likewise, that they be in behaviour as <u>becometh holines</u>s, not false accusers, not given to much wine, **teachers of good things**;

<u>becometh holiness</u> – hieroprepes (hee-er-op-rep-ace'); from NT:2413 and the same as NT:4241; reverent: KJV - as becometh holiness.

... from-NT: 2413-hieros~(hee-er-os');~of~uncertain~affinity;~sacred:~~KJV~-~holy.

James 3

But the wisdom that is from above is first pure, then <u>peaceable</u>, gentle, and easy to be intreated, full of mercy and good fruits, without partiality, and without hypocrisy. <u>peaceable</u> – eirenikos (i-ray-nee-kos'); from NT:1515; pacific; by implication, <u>salutary</u>:[helpful, constructive, useful, beneficial] KJV - peaceable. <u>James 1</u>

²⁷ Pure religion and undefiled before God and the Father is this, To visit the fatherless and widows in their affliction, and to **keep himself unspotted from the world**.

2 Peter 3

Wherefore, beloved, seeing that ye look for such things, be diligent that ye may be found of him in peace, without spot, and blameless.

Not always pleasant...becoming holy

Hebrews 12

- ⁹ Furthermore we have had fathers of our flesh which corrected us, and we gave them reverence: shall we not much rather be in subjection unto the Father of spirits, and live?
- For they verily for a few days chastened us after their own pleasure; but he for our profit, that we might be partakers of his holiness.
- Now no chastening for the present seemeth to be joyous, but grievous: nevertheless afterward it yieldeth the peaceable fruit of righteousness unto them which are exercised thereby.

Not always pleasant...being holy

1 Thessalonians 2

- For yourselves, brethren, know our entrance in unto you, that it was not in vain:
- ² But even after that we had **suffered** before, and were **shamefully entreated**, as ye know, at Philippi, we were bold in our God to speak unto you the gospel of God with much **contention [effort, anxiousness]**.
- For our exhortation was not of deceit, nor of uncleanness, nor in guile:
- ⁴ But as we were allowed of God to be put in trust with the gospel, **even so we speak; not as pleasing men, but God**, which trieth our hearts.
- ⁵ For **neither at any time used we flattering words**, as ye know, nor a cloke of covetousness; God is witness:
- ⁶ Nor of men sought we glory, neither of you, nor yet of others, when we might have been burdensome, as the apostles of Christ.
- ⁷ But we were **gentle among you**, even as a nurse cherisheth her children:
- ⁸ So being **affectionately desirous of you**, we were **willing** to have imparted unto you, not the gospel of God only, but also our own souls, because ye were **dear unto us**.
- ⁹ For ye **remember**, brethren, our **labour and travail**: for **labouring night and day**, because **we would not be chargeable unto any of you**, we preached unto you the gospel of God.
- Ye are witnesses, and God also, **how holily and justly and <u>unblameably</u> we behaved ourselves among you that believe:**

<u>Unblameably</u> – NT:274 amemptos (am-emp'-toce); adverb from NT:273; faultlessly: KJV - blameless, unblamably.

...FROM – NT:273 – amemptos (am'-emp-tos);

from NT:1 (as a negative particle) and a derivative of NT:3201; irreproachable [Perfectly]:

KJV - blameless, faultless, unblamable.

- As ye know how we exhorted and comforted and charged every one of you, as a father doth his children,
- ¹² That ye would **walk worthy of God**, who hath called you unto his kingdom and glory.

1 Peter 4

Wherefore **let them that suffer according to the will of God** commit the keeping of their souls to him in **well doing**, as unto a faithful Creator.

Hebrews 12

14 Follow [pursue] peace with all men, and holiness, without which no man shall see the Lord:

Matthew 5

8 Blessed are the pure in heart: for they shall see God.

Acts 20
²⁶ Wherefore I take you to record this day, that I am pure from the blood of all men.

Our mission statement:

2 Corinthians 6

- We then, as workers together with him, beseech you also that ye receive not the grace of God in vain.
- ² (For he saith, I have heard thee in a time accepted, and in the day of salvation have I succoured thee: behold, now is the accepted time; behold, now is the day of salvation.)
- ³ Giving no offence in any thing, that the ministry be not blamed:
- ⁴ But in all things **approving ourselves** as the ministers of God, in much patience, in afflictions, in necessities, in distresses,
- ⁵ In stripes, in imprisonments, in tumults, in labours, in watchings, in fastings;
- ⁶ By pureness, by knowledge, by long suffering, by kindness, by the Holy Ghost, by love unfeigned,
- ⁷ By the word of truth, by the power of God, by the armour of righteousness on the right hand and on the left,
- ⁸ By honour and dishonour, by evil report and good report: as deceivers, and yet true;
- ⁹ As unknown, and yet well known; as dying, and, behold, we live; as chastened, and not killed;
- As sorrowful, yet alway rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing all things.
 - Wherefore come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean thing; and I will receive you.

Philippians 4

⁸ Finally, brethren, whatsoever things are true, whatsoever things are honest, whatsoever things are just, whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are of good report; if there be any virtue, and if there be any praise, think on these things.

1 Timothy 5

Lay hands suddenly on no man, neither be partaker of other men's sins: **keep thyself pure**.

<u>pure</u> – hagnos (hag-nos'); from the same as NT:40; properly, clean, i.e. (figuratively) innocent, modest, perfect: KJV - chaste, clean, pure.

Titus 1

Unto the pure all things are pure: but unto them that are defiled and unbelieving is nothing pure; but even their mind and conscience is defiled.

1 Peter 1

Seeing ye have purified your souls in obeying[harkening, submissive] the truth through the Spirit unto unfeigned love of the brethren, see that ye love one another with a pure heart fervently [intently=attentively]:

We should behave as always in the sight of the Lord, being in the sight of men...

2 Corinthians 8

- And not that only, but who was also chosen of the churches to travel with us with this grace, which is administered by us to the glory of the same Lord, and declaration of your ready mind:
- Avoiding this, that no man should blame us in this abundance which is administered by us:
- Providing for honest things, not only in the sight of the Lord, but also in the sight of men.

Philippians 2

That ye may be blameless and <u>harmless</u>, the sons of God, without rebuke, in the midst of a crooked and perverse nation, among whom ye shine as lights in the world; <u>harmless</u> – akeraios (ak-er'-ah-yos); from NT:1 (as a negative particle) and a presumed derivative of NT:2767; unmixed, i.e. (figuratively) innocent: KJV - harmless, simple.

...from – NT:2767 – kerannumi (ker-an'-noo-mee); a prolonged form of a more primary kerao (ker-ah'-o) (which is used in certain tenses); to mingle, i.e. (by implication) to pour out (for drinking): KJV - fill, pour out. Compare NT:3396.

Especially officers of the church

1 Timothy 3

² A <u>bishop</u> then must be blameless, the husband of one wife, vigilant, sober, of good behaviour, given to hospitality, apt to teach;

<u>bishop</u> – episkopos (ep-is'-kop-os); from NT:1909 and NT:4649 (in the sense of NT:1983); a superintendent, i.e. Christian officer in genitive case charge of a (or the) church (literally or figuratively):

KJV - bishop, overseer.

Future Holy place on earth

Joel 3

So shall ye know that I am the LORD your God dwelling in Zion, my holy mountain: then shall Jerusalem be holy, and there shall no strangers pass through her any more.

If any be blameless...

Titus 1

- ¹ Paul, a servant of God, and an apostle of Jesus Christ, according to the faith of God's elect, and the acknowledging of the truth which is after godliness;
- ² In hope of eternal life, which God, that cannot lie, promised before the world began;
- ³ But hath in due times manifested his word through preaching, which is committed unto me according to the commandment of God our Saviour;
- ⁴ To Titus, mine own son after the common faith: Grace, mercy, and peace, from God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ our Saviour.
- ⁵ For this cause left I thee in Crete, that thou shouldest set in order the things that are wanting, and ordain elders in every city, as I had appointed thee:
- ⁶ If any be blameless, the husband of one wife, having faithful children not accused of riot or unruly.
- ⁷ For a bishop must be blameless, as the steward of God; not selfwilled, not soon angry, not given to wine, no striker, not given to filthy lucre;
- ⁸ But a lover of hospitality, a lover of good men, sober, just, holy, temperate;
- ⁹ Holding fast the faithful word as he hath been taught, that he may be able by sound doctrine both to exhort and to convince the gainsayers.
- ¹⁰ For there are many unruly and vain talkers and deceivers, specially they of the circumcision:
- Whose mouths must be stopped, who subvert whole houses, teaching things which they ought not, for filthy lucre's sake.
- One of themselves, even a prophet of their own, said, the Cretians are alway liars, evil beasts, slow bellies.
- 13 This witness is true. Wherefore rebuke them sharply, that they may be sound in the faith;
- Not giving heed to Jewish fables, and commandments of men, that turn from the truth.
- Unto the pure all things are pure: but unto them that are defiled and unbelieving is nothing pure; but even their mind and conscience is defiled.
- They profess that they know God; but in works they deny him, being abominable, and disobedient, and unto every good work reprobate.

We have an example

2 Thessalonians 3

⁷ For yourselves know how ye ought to follow us: for we **behaved not ourselves disorderly** among you;

We are the example

1 Timothy 4

Let no man despise thy youth; but **be thou an example** of the believers, in word, in conversation, in charity, in spirit, in faith, in purity.

John 13 ..doing unto others as you would they do unto you...

For I have given you an example, that ye should **do as I have done to you**.

Examples of ungodliness and unbelief...

1 Corinthians 10

- ⁵ But with many of them God was not well pleased: for they were overthrown in the wilderness.
- ⁶ Now these things were our examples, to the intent we should not **lust after evil things**, as they also lusted.
- Neither be ye idolaters, as were some of them; as it is written, The people sat down to eat and drink, and rose up to play.

1 Corinthians 10

Now all these things happened unto them for examples: and they are written for our admonition, upon whom the ends of the world are come.

Jude 1

⁷ Even as **Sodom and Gomorrha**, and the cities about them in like manner, **giving themselves over to fornication**, and going after **strange flesh**, are set forth for an example, **suffering the vengeance of eternal fire**.

Hebrews 4

Let us labour therefore to enter into that rest, lest any man fall after the same example of unbelief.

The prophet of God is an example to the brethren

James 5

- ⁹ Grudge not one against another, brethren, lest ye be condemned: behold, the judge standeth before the door.
- Take, my brethren, the prophets, who have spoken in the name of the Lord, for an **example of suffering affliction, and of patience**.
- Behold, we **count them happy which endure**. Ye have heard of the patience of Job, and have seen the end of the Lord; that the Lord is very pitiful, and of tender mercy.

Christ is our example

1 Peter 2

- For what glory is it, if, when ye be buffeted for your faults, ye shall take it patiently? but if, when ye do well, and suffer for it, ye take it patiently, this is acceptable with God.
- For even hereunto were ye called: because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that ye should follow his steps:
- Who did no sin, neither was guile found in his mouth:
- Who, when he was reviled, reviled not again; when he suffered, he threatened not; but committed himself to him that judgeth righteously:
- Who his own self bare our sins in his own body on the tree, that we, being dead to sins, should live unto righteousness: by whose stripes ye were healed.
- For ye were as sheep going astray; but are now returned unto the Shepherd and Bishop of your souls.

so be holy as he is holy and example

1 Peter 5

³ Neither as being lords over God's heritage, but being examples to the flock.

1 Thessalonians 2

- For this cause also thank we God without ceasing, because, when ye received the word of God which ye heard of us, ye received it not as the word of men, but as it is in truth, the word of God, which effectually worketh also in you that believe.
- For ye, brethren, became followers of the churches of God which in Judaea are in Christ Jesus: for ye also have suffered like things of your own countrymen, even as they have of the Jews:
- Who both killed the Lord Jesus, and their own prophets, and have persecuted us; and they please not God, and are contrary to all men:
- Forbidding us to speak to the Gentiles that they might be saved, to fill up their sins alway: for the wrath is come upon them to the uttermost.
- But we, brethren, being taken from you for a short time in presence, not in heart, endeavoured the more abundantly to see your face with great desire.
- Wherefore we would have come unto you, even I Paul, once and again; but Satan hindered us.
- ¹⁹ For what is our hope, or joy, or crown of rejoicing? Are not even ye in the presence of our Lord Jesus Christ at his coming?
- ²⁰ For ye are our glory and joy.

Ephesians 4

From whom the whole body fitly joined together and compacted by that which every joint supplieth, **according to the effectual working** in the measure of every part, maketh increase of the body unto the edifying of itself in love.

Titus 3

⁸ This is a faithful saying, and these things I will that thou affirm constantly, that they which have believed in God might **be careful to maintain good works**. These things are good and profitable unto men.

All that is unholy are examples of unholiness...

Galatians 5

- Now the works of the flesh are manifest, which are these; Adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lasciviousness,
- ²⁰ Idolatry, witchcraft, hatred, variance, emulations, wrath, strife, seditions, heresies,
- Envyings, murders, drunkenness, revellings, and such like: of the which I tell you before, as I have also told you in time past, that they which do such things shall not inherit the kingdom of God.

All that is holy are examples of holiness...

- But the **fruit of the Spirit** is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith,
- Meekness, temperance: against such there is no law.
