<u>With</u> – <u>NT:4314</u> πρός **pros** (pros); a strengthened form of <u>NT:4253</u>; a preposition of direction; forward to, i.e. toward (with the genitive case the side of, i.e. pertaining to; with the dative case by the side of, i.e. near to; usually with the accusative case the place, time, occasion, or respect, which is the destination of the relation, i.e. whither or for which it is predicated):

KJV - about, according to against, among, at, because of, before, between, ([where-]) by, for, ^x at thy house, in, for intent, nigh unto, of, which pertain to, that, to (the end that), ^x together, to ([you]) -ward, unto, with (-in). In comparison it denotes essentially the same applications, namely, motion towards, accession to, or nearness at.

Commandment – NT:1785 ἐντολή **entole** (en-tol-ay'); from NT:1781; injunction, i.e. an authoritative prescription: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - commandment, precept.

<u>True</u> – <u>NT:227</u> ἀληθής **alethes** (al-ay-thace'); from <u>NT:1</u> (as a negative particle) and <u>NT:2990</u>; true (as not concealing): **KJV** - true, truly, truth.

<u>Darkness</u> – <u>NT:4653</u> σκοτία **skotia** (skot-ee'-ah); from <u>NT:4655</u>; dimness, obscurity (literally or figuratively): *KJV* - dark (-ness).

Past – NT:3855 παράγω **parago** (par-ag'-o); from NT:3844 and NT:71; to lead near, i.e. (reflexively or intransitively) to go along or away:

KJV - depart, pass (away, by, forth).

<u>Light</u> – <u>NT:5457</u> $\phi \widehat{\omega} \varsigma$ **phos** (foce); from an obsolete phao (to shine or make manifest, especially by rays; compare <u>NT:5316</u>, <u>NT:5346</u>); luminousness (in the widest application, nat. or artificial, abstract or concrete, literal or figurative): **KJV** - fire, light.

Shineth – NT:5316 $\phi\alpha i\nu\omega$ **phaino** (fah'-ee-no); prolongation for the base of NT:5457; to lighten (shine), i.e. show (transitive or intransitive, literal or figurative): **KJV** - appear, seem, be seen, shine, X think.

Darkness – NT:4653 σκοτία **skotia** (skot-ee'-ah); from NT:4655; dimness, obscurity (literally or figuratively): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - dark (-ness).

<u>Blinded</u> – <u>NT:5186</u> τυφλόω **tuphloo** (toof-lo'-o); from <u>NT:5185</u>; to make blind, i.e. (figuratively) to obscure: **KJV** - blind.

John 3

¹⁹ And this is the condemnation, that **light is come into the world**, and **men loved darkness rather than light**, because **their deeds were evil**.

Occasion of stumbling – NT:4625 σκάνδαλον **skandalon** (skan'-dal-on) ("scandal"); probably from a derivative of NT:2578; a trap-stick (bent sapling), i.e. snare (figuratively, cause of displeasure or sin):

KJV - occasion to fall (of stumbling), offence, thing that offends, stumblingblock.

John 8

Then spake Jesus again unto them, saying, **I am the light of the world**: he that **followeth me shall not walk in darkness**, but shall have the **light** of life.

2 Corinthians 4
