# Paul's Prologue

#### Galatians 5

...of the wicked

12 I would they were even cut off which trouble you.

<u>Cut off</u> – <u>NT:609</u> ἀποκόπτω **apokopto** (ap-ok-op'-to); from <u>NT:575</u> and <u>NT:2875</u>; to amputate; reflexively (by irony) to mutilate (the privy parts): **KJV** - cut off. <u>Trouble</u> – <u>NT:387</u> ἀναστατόω **anastatoo** (an-as-tat-o'-o); from a derivative of <u>NT:450</u> (in the sense of removal); properly, to drive out of home, i.e. (by implication) to disturb (literally or figuratively):

KJV - trouble, turn upside down, make an uproar.

... of the saints

13 For, brethren, ye have been called unto liberty [freedom]; only use not liberty for an occasion to the flesh, but by love serve one another.

Occasion – NT:874 a)formh/ aphorme (af-or-may'); from a compound of NT:575 and NT:3729; a starting-point, i.e. (figuratively) an opportunity: *KJV* - occasion.

...of the conflict between good and evil

- 14 For all the law is fulfilled in one word, even in this; Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself.
- 15 But if ye bite and devour one another, take heed that ye be not consumed one of another.
- 16 This I say then, Walk in the Spirit, and ye shall not fulfil the lust of the flesh.

<u>Lust</u> – <u>NT:1939</u>  $\dot{\epsilon}$ πιθυμία epithumia (ep-ee-thoo-mee'-ah); from <u>NT:1937</u>; a longing (especially for <u>what is forbidden</u>): *KJV* - concupiscence, desire, lust (after).

... of spiritual and natural conflict

17 For the flesh lusteth against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh: and these are <u>contrary</u> the one to the other: So that ye cannot do the things that ye would.

<u>Contrary</u> – <u>NT:480</u> a)nti/keimai antikeimai (an-tik'-i-mahee); from <u>NT:473</u> and <u>NT:2749</u>; to lie opposite, i.e. be adverse (figuratively, repugnant) to:

*KJV* - adversary, be contrary, oppose.

<u>Would</u> – <u>NT:2309</u> θέλω **thelo** (thel'-o); or **ethelo** (eth-el'-o); in certain tenses **theleo** (thel-eh'-o); and **etheleo** (eth-el-eh'-o); which are otherwise obsolete; apparently strengthened from the alternate form of <u>NT:138</u>; to determine (as an active option from subjective impulse; whereas <u>NT:1014</u> properly denotes rather a passive acquiescence in objective considerations), i.e. choose or prefer (literally or figuratively); by implication, to wish, i.e. be inclined to (sometimes adverbially, gladly); impersonally for the future tense, to be about to; by Hebraism, to delight in:

**KJV** - desire, be disposed (forward), intend, list, love, mean, please, have rather, (be) will (have, -ling, -ling [-ly]).

# Things contrary

# 2 Corinthians 7

10 For godly sorrow worketh repentance to salvation not to be repented of: but the sorrow of the world worketh death.

The one says God forgive me that I have sinned...

The other says God I wish I hadn't been caught!

### **Revelation 2**

23 And I will kill her children with death; and all **the churches shall know** that I am he which searcheth the reins and hearts: and I will give unto every one of you according to your works.

#### **Revelation 20**

13 And the sea gave up the dead which were in it; and death and hell delivered up the dead which were in them: and they were judged every man according to their works.

#### Ecclesiastes 12 Contrast of Saints and Wicked...

13 Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: Fear God, and keep his commandments: for this is the whole duty of man.

14 For God shall bring every work into judgment, with every secret thing, whether it be good, or whether it be evil.

### Galatians 2

16 Knowing that a man is not justified by the works of the law, but by the faith of Jesus Christ, even we have believed in Jesus Christ, that we might be justified by the faith of Christ, and not by the works of the law: for by the works of the law shall no flesh be justified.

# **Galatians 5 ...Comforted**

18 But if ye be led of the Spirit, ye are not under the law.

# **Works against God**

# Romans 7 ..in the lives of the saints...in the flesh...

**5** For when we were in the flesh, the <u>motions</u> of sins, which were by the law, did work in our members to bring forth **fruit unto death**.

<u>Motions</u> – <u>NT:3804</u> pa/qhma pathema (path'-ay-mah); from a presumed derivative of <u>NT:3806</u>; something undergone, i.e. hardship or pain; subjectively, an emotion or <u>influence</u>: *KJV* - affection, affliction, motion, suffering.

...from –  $\underline{\text{NT:}3806}$  pa/qo\$ pathos (path'-os); from the alternate of  $\underline{\text{NT:}3958}$ ; properly, suffering ("pathos"), i.e. (subjectively) a passion (especially concupiscence): KJV - (inordinate) affection, lust.

# **Ephesians 2**

3 Among whom also we all had our conversation in times past in the lusts of our flesh, fulfilling the desires of the flesh and of the mind; and were by nature the children of wrath, even as others.

# **Works of Evil**

#### Galatians 5

**19** Now the works of the flesh are manifest, which are these; *Adultery*, <u>fornication</u>, <u>uncleanness</u>, lasciviousness,

Fornication – NT:4202 πορνεία **porneia** (por-ni'-ah); from NT:4203; harlotry (including adultery and incest); figuratively, idolatry:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - fornication.

...from –  $\underline{\text{NT:4203}}$ πορνεύω **porneuo** (porn-yoo'-o); from  $\underline{\text{NT:4204}}$ ; to act the harlot, i.e. (literally) indulge <u>unlawful lust</u> (of either sex), or (figuratively) practise idolatry:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - commit (fornication).

<u>NT:4204</u> πόρνη **porne** (por'-nay); feminine of <u>NT:4205</u>; a strumpet; figuratively, an idolater:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - harlot, whore.

<u>Uncleanness</u> – <u>NT:167</u> ἀκαθαρσία **akatharsia** (ak-ath-ar-see'-ah); from <u>NT:169</u>; impurity (the quality), physically or morally: **KJV** - uncleanness.

...from – NT:169 ἀκάθαρτος **akathartos** (ak-ath'-ar-tos); from NT:1 (as a negative particle) and a presumed derivative of NT:2508 (meaning cleansed); impure (ceremonially, morally [lewd] or specially, [demonic]): **KJV** - foul, unclean.

...from – NT:2508 καθαίρω **kathairo** (kath-ah'-ee-ro); from NT:2513; to cleanse, i.e. (specially) to prune; figuratively, to expiate:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - purge.

Lasciviousness – NT:766 ἀσέλγεια **aselgeia** (as-elg'-i-a); from a compound of NT:1 (as a negative particle) and a presumed **selges** (of uncertain derivation, but apparently meaning continent); licentiousness [lewd, immoral] (sometimes including other vices):  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - filthy, lasciviousness, wantonness [without regard for what is right].

#### Galatians 5

20 <u>Idolatry</u>, <u>witchcraft</u>, <u>hatred</u>, <u>variance</u>, <u>emulations</u>, <u>wrath</u>, <u>strife</u>, seditions, heresies, <u>Idolatry</u> – <u>NT:1495</u> εἰδωλολατρεία **eidololatreia** (i-do-lol-at-ri'-ah); from <u>NT:1497</u> and <u>NT:2999</u>; image-worship (literally or figuratively): **KJV** - idolatry.

...from – NT:1497 εἴδωλον **eidolon** (i'-do-lon); from NT:1491; an image (i.e. for worship); by implication, a heathen god, or (plural) the worship of such:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - idol.

<u>Witchcraft</u> – <u>NT:5331</u> φαρμακεία **pharmakeia** (far-mak-i'-ah); from <u>NT:5332</u>; medication ("pharmacy"), i.e. (by extension) magic (literally or figuratively): **KJV** - sorcery, witchcraft.

...from – NT:5332 φαρμακεύς **pharmakeus** (far-mak-yoos'); from pharmakon (a drug, i.e. spell-giving potion); a druggist ("pharmacist") or poisoner, i.e. (by extension) a magician: **KJV** - sorcerer.

# Galatians 5 (cont)

20 Idolatry, witchcraft, <u>hatred</u>, <u>variance</u>, <u>emulations</u>, <u>wrath</u>, <u>strife</u>, <u>seditions</u>, <u>heresies</u>, <u>Hatred</u> – T:2189 ἔχθρα **echthra** (ekh'-thrah); feminine of <u>NT:2190</u>; hostility; by implication, a reason for opposition: **KJV** - enmity, hatred.

...from – NT:2190 ἐχθρός **echthros** (ech-thros'); from a primary echtho (to hate); hateful (passively, odious, or actively, hostile); usually as a noun, an adversary (especially Satan):  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - enemy, foe.

<u>Variance</u> – <u>NT:2054</u>  $\xi \rho \iota \varsigma$  **eris** (er'-is); of uncertain affinity; a <u>quarrel</u>, i.e. (by implication) wrangling: **KJV** - contention, debate, strife, variance.

Emulations – NT:2205 ζῆλος **zelos** (dzay'-los); from NT:2204; properly, heat, i.e. (figuratively) "zeal" (in a favorable sense, ardor [devotion, passion]; in an unfavorable one, jealousy, as of a husband [figuratively, of God], or an enemy, malice):

KJV - emulation, envy (-ing), fervent mind, indignation, jealousy, zeal.

Wrath – NT:2372 θυμός **thumos** (thoo-mos'); from NT:2380; passion (as if breathing hard):  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - fierceness, indignation, wrath. Compare NT:5590.

NT:2380  $\theta$ ύω **thuo** (thoo'-o); a primary verb; properly, to rush (breathe hard, blow, smoke), i.e. (by implication) to sacrifice (properly, by fire, but genitive case); by extension to immolate (slaughter for any purpose):

KJV - kill, (do) sacrifice, slay.

Strife – NT:2052 ἐριθεία **eritheia** (er-ith-i'-ah); perhaps as the same as NT:2042; properly, intrigue, i.e. (by implication) faction:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - contention (-ious), strife.

...from – NT:2042  $\hat{\epsilon}\rho\epsilon\theta$  ( $\epsilon$ )  $\epsilon$ 0 (er-eth-id'-zo); from a presumed prolonged form of NT:2054; to stimulate (especially to anger): **KJV** - provoke.

<u>Seditions</u> – <u>NT:1370</u> διχοστασία **dichostsis** (dee-khos-tas-ee'-ah); from a derivative of <u>NT:1364</u> and <u>NT:4714</u>; disunion, i.e. (figuratively) dissension: **KJV** - division, sedition.

Heresies – NT:139 αἴρεσις **hairesis** (hah'-ee-res-is); from NT:138; properly, a choice, i.e. (specially) a party or (abstractly) disunion:

**KJV** - heresy [which is the Greek word itself], sect [party, camp, division faction].

...from –  $\underline{\text{NT:}138}$  αἱρέομαι **haireomai** (hahee-reh'-om-ahee); probably akin to  $\underline{\text{NT:}142}$ ; to <u>take for oneself</u>, i.e. to prefer:

*KJV* - <u>choose</u>. Some of the forms are borrowed from a cognate **hellomai** (hel'-lom-ahee); which is otherwise obsolete.

#### Galatians 5

21 Envyings, *murders*, <u>drunkenness</u>, <u>revellings</u>, and <u>such like</u>: of the which I tell you before, as I have also told you in time past, that **they which do such things shall not inherit the kingdom of God.** 

Envyings – NT:5355  $\phi\theta$ όνος **phthonos** (fthon'-os); probably akin to the base of NT:5351; ill-will (as detraction), i.e. jealousy (spite): **KJV** - envy.

...from – NT:5351  $\phi\theta\epsilon$ í $\rho\omega$  **phtheiro** (fthi'-ro); probably strengthened from phthio (to pine or waste); properly, to shrivel or wither, i.e. to spoil (by any process) or (generally) to ruin (especially figuratively, by moral influences, to deprave):

KJV - corrupt (self), defile, destroy.

<u>Drunkenness</u> – NT:3178 μέθη **methe** (meth'-ay); apparently a primary word; an intoxicant, i.e. (by implication) intoxication:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - drunkenness.

Revellings – NT:2970 κῶμος **komos** (ko'-mos); from NT:2749; a carousal (as if letting loose): **KJV** - revelling, rioting. [drunken feast or social gathering]

Such like – toutois and homoios – acting in the manner or character or appearance as they...

# Philippians 3

2 Beware of dogs, beware of evil workers, beware of the concision.

#### Matthew 7

- **15** Beware of false prophets, which come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly they are ravening wolves.
- 16 Ye shall know them by their fruits. Do men gather grapes of thorns, or figs of thistles?
- 17 Even so every good tree bringeth forth good fruit; but a corrupt tree bringeth forth evil fruit.
- 18 A good tree cannot bring forth evil fruit, neither can a corrupt tree bring forth good fruit.
- 19 Every tree that bringeth not forth good fruit is hewn down, and cast into the fire.
- 20 Wherefore by their fruits ye shall know them.

# Psalm 14

1 The fool hath said in his heart, There is no God. They are corrupt, they have done abominable works, there is none that doeth good.

#### Titus 1 Contrast...

- 13 This witness is true. Wherefore **rebuke them sharply**, that they may be sound in the faith:
- 14 Not giving heed to Jewish fables, and commandments of men, that turn from the truth.
- 15 Unto the pure all things are pure: but unto them that are defiled and unbelieving is nothing pure; but even their mind and conscience is defiled.
- 16 They profess that they know God; but in works they deny him, being abominable, and disobedient, and unto every good work <u>reprobate</u> [no good].

Reprobate – NT:96 ἀδόκιμος **adokimos** (ad-ok'-ee-mos); from NT:1 (as a negative particle) and NT:1384; unapproved, i.e. rejected; by implication, worthless (literally or morally): **KJV** - castaway, rejected, reprobate.

# 2 Timothy 4 Comfort...

17 Notwithstanding the Lord stood with me, and strengthened me; that by me the preaching might be fully known, and that all the Gentiles might hear: and I was delivered out of the mouth of the lion.

18 And the Lord shall deliver me from every evil work, and will preserve me unto his heavenly kingdom: to whom be glory for ever and ever. Amen.

# **Works of Good**

Titus 2 ...things we do...

**6** Young men likewise exhort to be sober minded.

Sober minded – NT:4993 σωφρονέω **sophroneo** (so-fron-eh'-o); from NT:4998; to be of sound mind, i.e. sane, (figuratively) moderate:

**KJV** - be in right mind, be sober (minded), soberly.

7 In all things shewing [exhibiting] thyself a <u>pattern</u> of <u>good works</u>: in <u>doctrine</u> shewing <u>uncorruptness</u>, <u>gravity</u>, <u>sincerity</u>,

Pattern – NT:5179 Τύπος **tupos** (too'-pos); from NT:5180; a die (as struck), i.e. (by implication) a stamp or scar; by analogy, a shape, i.e. a statue, (figuratively) style or resemblance; specifically, a sampler ("type"), i.e. a model (for imitation) or instance (for warning):

**KJV** - en- ex-) ample, fashion, figure, form, manner, pattern, print.  $\frac{\text{Good} - \text{NT:}2570}{\text{K}} \text{K} \text{C} \text{A} \text{O} \text{S} \text{ kalos} \text{ (kal-os'); of uncertain affinity; properly, beautiful, but chiefly (figuratively) good (literally or morally), i.e. valuable or virtuous (for appearance or use, and thus distinguished from <math>\frac{\text{NT:}18}{\text{NT:}18}$ , which is properly intrinsic): **KJV** - X better, fair, good (-ly), honest, meet, well, worthy.  $\frac{\text{Works} - \text{NT:}2041}{\text{E}} \text{P} \text{VOV} \text{ ergon (er'-gon); from a primary (but obsolete) ergo (to work); toil (as an effort or occupation); by implication, an act:$ **KJV**- deed, doing, labour, work.

<u>Doctrine</u> – <u>NT:1319</u> διδασκαλία **didaskalia** (did-as-kal-ee'-ah); from <u>NT:1320</u>; instruction (the function or the information):

KJV - doctrine, learning, teaching.

<u>Uncorruptness</u> – <u>NT:862b</u> ἀφθορία **aphthoria** (af-thor-ee'-ah); negative particle prefix (See <u>NT:1</u>); found only in <u>Titus 2:7</u>: incorruption, soundness.

<u>Gravity</u> – <u>NT:4587</u> σεμνότης **semnotes** (sem-not'-ace); from <u>NT:4586</u>; venerableness [honorable], i.e. probity [<u>saintliness</u>]: **KJV** - gravity, honesty.

**8** Sound speech, that cannot be condemned; that he that is of the contrary part may be ashamed, having no evil thing to say of you.

Sound – NT:5199 ὑγιής **hugies** (hoog-ee-ace'); from the base of NT:837; healthy, i.e. well (in body); figuratively, true (in doctrine):

KJV - sound, whole.

<u>Speech</u> – NT:3056 λόγος **logos** (log'-os); from <u>NT:3004</u>; something said (including the thought); by implication a topic (subject of discourse), also reasoning (the mental faculty) or motive; by extension, a computation; specifically (with the article in John) the Divine Expression (i.e. Christ): *KJV* - account, cause, communication, <sup>X</sup> concerning, doctrine, fame, <sup>X</sup> have to do, intent, matter, mouth, preaching, question, reason, <sup>+</sup> reckon, remove, say (-ing), shew, <sup>X</sup> speaker, speech, talk, thing, <sup>+</sup> none of these things move me, tidings, treatise, utterance, word, work.

# Works of Good (Cont)

# Titus 2 ...things we do not do...

- **9** Exhort servants to be obedient unto their own masters, and to please them well in all things; not answering again;
- 10 Not <u>purloining</u>, but shewing all good fidelity; that they may adorn the doctrine of God our Saviour in all things.

Purloining – NT:3557 νοσφίζομαι **nosphizomai** (nos-fid'-zom-ahee); middle voice from nosphi (apart or clandestinely); to sequestrate keep for oneself, i.e. embezzle: **KJV** - keep back, purloin.

- 11 For the grace of God that bringeth salvation hath appeared to all men,
- 12 Teaching us that, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live **soberly** [sound mind moderately], <u>righteously</u>, and godly, in this **present world**;

righteously – NT:1346 δικαίως **dikaios** (dik-ah'-yoce); adverb from NT:1342; equitably:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - justly, (to) righteously (-ness).

# **Titus 3 Warning!**

- 7 That being justified by his grace, we should be made heirs according to the hope of eternal life.
- **8** This is a faithful saying, and these things I will that thou affirm constantly, that they which have believed in God might be careful to maintain good works. These things are good and profitable unto men.
- **9** But avoid foolish questions, and genealogies, and contentions, and strivings about the law; for they are unprofitable and vain.
- 10 A man that is an **heretick** after the first and second admonition reject;
- 11 Knowing that he that is such is subverted, and sinneth, being condemned of himself.
- 12 When I shall send Artemas unto thee, or Tychicus, be diligent to come unto me to Nicopolis: for I have determined there to winter.
- 13 Bring Zenas the lawyer and Apollos on their journey diligently, that nothing be wanting unto them.
- 14 And let our's also learn to maintain good works for necessary uses, that they be not unfruitful.

# Works of Good (Cont)

#### Galatians 5

**22** But the fruit of the Spirit is <u>love</u>, <u>joy</u>, <u>peace</u>, <u>longsuffering</u>, <u>gentleness</u>, <u>goodness</u>, <u>faith</u>, <u>NT:2590</u> καρπός **karpos** (kar-pos'); probably from the base of <u>NT:726</u>; fruit (as plucked), literally or figuratively: **KJV** - fruit.

<u>Love</u> – <u>NT:26</u> ἀγάπη **agape** (ag-ah'-pay); from <u>NT:25</u>; love, i.e. affection or benevolence; specially (plural) a love-feast:

KJV - (feast of) charity ([-ably]), dear, love.

<u>Joy</u> – <u>NT:5479</u> χαρά **chara** (khar-ah'); from <u>NT:5463</u>; cheerfulness, i.e. calm delight: **KJV** - gladness, <sup>X</sup> greatly, (X be exceeding) joy (-ful, -fully, -fulness, -ous).

...from – NT:5463  $\chi\alpha i\rho\omega$  **chairo** (khah'-ee-ro); a primary verb; to be "cheerful", i.e. calmly happy or well-off; impersonally, especially as salutation (on meeting or parting), be well: **KJV** - farewell, be glad, God speed, greeting, hall, joy (-fully), rejoice.

Peace – NT:1515 εἰρήνη **eirene** (i-ray'-nay); probably from a primary verb eiro (to join); peace (literally or figuratively); by implication, prosperity: **KJV** - one, peace, quietness, rest, \* set at one again.

Longsuffering – NT:3115 μακροθυμία **makrothumia** (mak-roth-oo-mee'-ah); from the same as NT:3116; longanimity, i.e. (objectively) forbearance [self control] or (subjectively) fortitude:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - longsuffering, patience.

<u>Gentleness</u> – <u>NT:5544</u> χρηστότης **chrestotes** (khray-stot'-ace); from <u>NT:5543</u>; <u>usefulness</u>, i.e. <u>moral excellence</u> (in <u>character or demeanor</u>): **KJV** - gentleness, good (-ness), kindness.

...from - <u>NT:5543</u> χρηστός **chrestos** (khrase-tos'); from <u>NT:5530</u>; employed, i.e. (by implication) useful (in manner or morals): **KJV** - better, easy, good (-ness), gracious, kind.

Goodness – NT:19 ἀγαθωσύνη **agathosune** (ag-ath-o-soo'-nay); from NT:18; goodness, i.e. virtue or beneficence:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - goodness. [kind, charitable]

Faith – NT:4102 πίστις **pistis** (pis'-tis); from NT:3982; persuasion, i.e. credence; moral conviction (of religious truth, or the truthfulness of God or a religious teacher), especially reliance upon Christ for salvation; abstractly, constancy in such profession; by extension, the system of religious (Gospel) truth itself:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - assurance, belief, believe, faith, fidelity.

# Works of Good (Cont)

#### Galatians 5

23 Meekness, temperance: against such there is no law.

<u>Meekness</u> – <u>NT:4240</u> πραύτης **prautes** (prah-oo'-tace); from <u>NT:4239</u>; mildness, i.e. (by implication) humility [modesty, humbleness, meekness]: **KJV** - meekness.

<u>Temperance</u> – <u>NT:1466</u> ἐγκράτεια **egkrateia** (eng-krat'-i-ah); from <u>NT:1468</u>; <u>self-control</u> (especially continence [*self restraint against worldly lusts*]):

**KJV** - temperance.

- **24** And they that are Christ's have crucified the flesh with the affections and lusts.
- 25 If we live in the Spirit, let us also walk in the Spirit.

Else we walk according to the world, according to the flesh...

26 Let us not be desirous of vain glory, provoking one another, envying one another.

# Hebrews 10 encourage love and good works...assemble together!

- 22 Let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, having our hearts sprinkled from an evil conscience, and our bodies washed with pure water.
- 23 Let us hold fast the profession of our faith without wavering; (for he is faithful that promised;)
- 24 And let us consider one another to provoke unto love and to good works:
- **25** Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching.

#### **Hebrews 13**

- **20** Now the God of peace, that brought again from the dead our Lord Jesus, that great shepherd of the sheep, through the blood of the everlasting covenant,
- 21 Make you perfect in every good work to do his will, working in you that which is wellpleasing in his sight, through Jesus Christ; to whom be glory for ever and ever. Amen.

#### 1 Peter 2

12 Having your conversation honest among the Gentiles: that, whereas they speak against you as evildoers, they may by your good works, which they shall behold, glorify God in the day of visitation.

#### James 3

- 12 Can the fig tree, my brethren, bear olive berries? either a vine, figs? so can no fountain both yield salt water and fresh.
- 13 Who is a wise man and endued with knowledge among you? let him shew out of a good conversation his works with meekness of wisdom.
- 14 But if ye have bitter envying and strife in your hearts, glory not, and lie not against the truth
- 15 This wisdom descendeth not from above, but is earthly, sensual, devilish.
- 16 For where envying and strife is, there is confusion and every evil work.
- 17 But the wisdom that is from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, and easy to be intreated, full of mercy and good fruits, without partiality, and without hypocrisy.
- 18 And the fruit of righteousness is sown in peace of them that make peace.

# **Works of God**

#### John 6

- 27 Labour not for the meat which perisheth, but for that meat which endureth unto everlasting life, which the Son of man shall give unto you: for him hath God the Father sealed.
- 28 Then said they unto him, What shall we do, that we might work the works of God?
- 29 Jesus answered and said unto them, This is the work of God, that ye believe on him whom he hath sent.

#### Genesis 1

Stablish – NT:4741\_sthri/zw sterizo (stay-rid'-zo); from a presumed derivative of NT:2476 (like NT:4731); to set fast, i.e. (literally) to turn resolutely in a certain direction, or (figuratively) to confirm: *KJV* - fix, (e-) stablish, stedfastly set, strengthen.

#### Matthew 5

**16** Let your light so shine before men, that they may see **your good works**, and glorify your Father which is in heaven.

# **Matthew 7 ...Contrast**

- 21 Not every one that saith unto me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he that doeth the will of my Father which is in heaven.
- 22 Many will say to me in that day, Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in thy name? and in thy name have cast out devils? and in thy name done many wonderful works?
- 23 And then will I profess unto them, I never knew you: depart from me, ye that work iniquity.
- **24** Therefore whosoever **heareth these sayings of mine, and doeth them**, I will liken him unto a wise man, which built his house upon a rock:

#### As God works...

### John 10

37 If I do not the works of my Father, believe me not.

**38** But if I do, though ye believe not me, **believe the works**: that ye may know, and believe, that the Father is in me, and I in him.

#### John 14

**11 Believe me** that I am in the Father, and the Father in me: or else **believe me** for the very **works' sake**.

#### Jude 1

12 These are spots in your feasts of charity, when they feast with you, feeding themselves without fear: clouds they are without water, carried about of winds; trees whose fruit withereth, without fruit, twice dead, plucked up by the roots;

#### ...So should the saints work

#### 1 Thessalonians 5

- 12 And we beseech you, brethren, to **know them which labour among you**, and are over you in the Lord, and admonish you;
- 13 And to esteem them very highly in love for their work's sake. And be at peace among yourselves.
- 14 Now we exhort you, brethren, warn them that are unruly, comfort the feebleminded, support the weak, be patient toward all men.
- 15 See that none render evil for evil unto any man; but ever follow that which is good, both among yourselves, and to all men.

Provision – NT:4307 πρόνοια **pronoia** (pron'-oy-ah); from NT:4306; forethought, i.e. provident care or supply: **KJV** - providence, provision.

# Philippians 4:8

Finally, brethren, whatsoever things are true, whatsoever things are honest, whatsoever things are just, whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are **lovely**, whatsoever things are of good report; if there be any virtue, and if there be any praise, **think** on these things.

### Works against vourselves...

#### Galatians 5:16

This I say then, Walk in the Spirit, and ye shall not <u>fulfil</u> the lust of the flesh.

<u>Fulfil</u> – <u>NT:5055</u> Τελέω **teleo** (tel-eh'-o); from <u>NT:5056</u>; to end, ie. <u>complete</u>, <u>execute</u>, <u>conclude</u>, discharge (a debt):

KJV - accomplish, make an end, expire, fill up, finish, go over, pay, perform.
