Worldly Works - Results from Impatience

Calamity

James 5

¹Go to now, ye <u>rich</u> men, weep and howl for your <u>miseries</u> that shall <u>come upon</u> you. <u>Rich</u> – <u>NT:4145</u> πλούσιος **plousios** (ploo'-see-os); from <u>NT:4149</u>; wealthy; figuratively, abounding with: **KJV** - rich.

Miseries – NT:5004 ταλαιπωρία **talaiporia** (tal-ahee-po-ree'-ah); from NT:5005; wretchedness, i.e. calamity: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - misery.

...from – NT:5005 ταλαίπωρος **talaiporos** (tal-ah'-ee-po-ros); from the base of NT:5007 and a derivative of the base of NT:3984; enduring trial, i.e. miserable: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - wretched.

Come upon – NT:1904 ἐπέρχομαι **eperchomai** (ep-er'-khom-ahee); from NT:1909 and NT:2064; to supervene, i.e. arrive, occur, impend, attack, (figuratively) influence: **KJV** - come (in, upon).

Psalm 37

¹⁶ A little that a righteous man hath is better than the riches of many wicked.

Matthew 19

²⁴ And again I say unto you, It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle, than for a **rich man** to enter into the kingdom of God.

1 Timothy 6

⁸ And having food and raiment let us be therewith content.

⁹ But they that will be rich fall into temptation and a snare, and into **many foolish and hurtful lusts**, which **drown men in destruction and perdition**.

¹⁰ For the **love of money is the root of all evil**: which while some coveted after, they have erred from the faith, and **pierced themselves** through with many sorrows.

Worldly Works - Results from Impatience (cont)

Corruption

James 5

² Your riches are <u>corrupted</u>, and your garments are motheaten.

<u>Corrupted</u> – <u>NT:4595</u> σήπω **sepo** (say'-po); apparently a primary verb; to putrefy, i.e. (figuratively) perish: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - be corrupted.

Isaiah 50

⁹Behold, the Lord GOD will help me; who is he that shall condemn me? lo, they all shall wax old as a garment; the moth shall eat them up.

Isaiah 51

⁶ Lift up your eyes to the heavens, and look upon the earth beneath: for the heavens shall vanish away like smoke, and the earth shall **wax** old like a **garment**, and they that dwell therein shall die in like manner: but my salvation shall be for ever, and my righteousness shall not be abolished.

Psalm 102

²⁵ Of old hast thou laid the foundation of the earth: and the heavens are the work of thy hands.

²⁶ They shall perish, but thou shalt endure: yea, **all of them shall wax old like a garment**; as a vesture shalt thou change them, and they shall be changed:

Corrosion

James 5

³ Your gold and silver is <u>cankered</u>; and the <u>rust</u> of them shall be a <u>witness</u> against you, and shall eat your <u>flesh</u> as it were fire. Ye have <u>heaped treasure together</u> for the last days.

<u>Cankered</u> – <u>NT:2728</u> κατιόω **katioo** (kat-ee-o'-o); from <u>NT:2596</u> and a derivative of <u>NT:2447</u>; to rust down, i.e. corrode: *KJV* - canker.

<u>Rust</u> – <u>NT:2447</u> ió ς **ios** (ee-os'); perhaps from eimi (to go) or hiemi (to send); rust (as if emitted by metals); also venom (as emitted by serpents): **KJV** - poison, rust.

<u>Witness</u> – <u>NT:3142</u> μαρτύριον **marturion** (mar-too'-ree-on); neuter of a presumed derivative of <u>NT:3144</u>; something evidential, i.e. (genitive case) evidence given or (specifically) the Decalogue (in the sacred Tabernacle):

KJV - to be testified, testimony, witness.

Flesh – NT:4561 σάρξ **sarx** (sarx); probably from the base of NT:4563; flesh (as stripped of the skin), i.e. (strictly) the meat of an animal (as food), or (by extension) the body (as opposed to the soul [or spirit], or as the symbol of what is external, or as the means of kindred), or (by implication) human nature (with its frailties [physically or morally] and passions), or (specifically) a human being (as such):

KJV - carnal (-ly, +-ly minded), flesh ([-ly]).

<u>Heaped treasure together</u> – <u>NT:2343</u> θησαυρίζω **thesaurizo** (thay-sow-rid'-zo); from <u>NT:2344</u>; to amass or reserve (literally or figuratively):

KJV - lay up (treasure), (keep) in store, (heap) treasure (together, up)

2 Timothy 2

<u>Canker</u> – <u>NT:1044</u> γάγγραινα **gaggraina** (gang'-grahee-nah); from **graino** (to gnaw); an ulcer ("gangrene"): **KJV** - canker.

¹⁵ Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth.

¹⁶ But shun **profane and vain babblings**: for they will increase unto more **ungodliness**.

¹⁷ And their word will eat as doth a <u>canker</u>: of whom is Hymenaeus and Philetus;

¹⁸ Who concerning the truth have **erred**, saying that the resurrection is past already; and **overthrow the faith of some**.

Worldly Works - Results from Impatience (cont)

Criminal

James 5

⁴Behold, the hire of the labourers who have <u>reaped down</u> your fields, which is of you kept back by <u>fraud</u>, <u>crieth</u>: and the <u>cries</u> of them which have <u>reaped</u> are entered into the ears of the Lord of Sabaoth.

Reaped down – NT:270 ἀμάω **amao** (am-ah'-o); from NT:260; properly, to collect, i.e. (by implication) reap: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - reap down.

<u>Fraud</u> – <u>NT:650</u> ἀποστερέω **apostereo** (ap-os-ter-eh'-o); from <u>NT:575</u> and stereo (to <u>deprive</u>); to despoil:

KJV - defraud, destitute, kept back by fraud.

<u>Crieth</u> – <u>NT:2896</u> κράζω **krazo** (krad'-zo); a primary verb; properly, to "croak" (as a raven) or scream, i.e. (genitive case) <u>to call aloud</u> (shriek, exclaim, intreat): *KJV* - cry (out).

 $\underline{\text{Cries}}$ – $\underline{\text{NT:995}}\beta$ o $\acute{\eta}$ **boe** (bo-ay'); from $\underline{\text{NT:994}}$; a halloo, i.e. call (for aid, etc.): $\pmb{\textit{KJV}}$ - cry.

Reaped – NT:2325 θερίζω **therizo** (ther-id'-zo); from NT:2330 (in the sense of the crop); to harvest: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - reap.

<u>Sabaoth</u> – <u>NT:4519</u> σαβαώθ **sabaoth** (sab-ah-owth'); of Hebrew origin [<u>OT:6635</u> in feminine plural]; armies; sabaoth (i.e. tsebaoth), a military epithet of God: **KJV** - sabaoth.

...from – OT:6635 * tsaba' (tsaw-baw'); or (feminine) tseba'ah (tseb-aw-aw'); from OT:6633; a mass of persons (or figuratively, things), especially reg. organized for war (an army); by implication, a campaign, literally or figuratively (specifically, hardship, worship):

**KJV* - appointed time, (+)army, (+)battle, company, host, service, soldiers, waiting upon, war (-fare).

Worldly Works - Results from Impatience (cont)

Conceitedness

James 5

⁵ Ye have <u>lived in pleasure</u> on the earth, and been <u>wanton</u>; ye have <u>nourished</u> your hearts, as in a day of slaughter.

<u>Lived in pleasure</u> – <u>NT:5171</u> τρυφάω **truphao** (troo-fah'-o); from <u>NT:5172</u>; to indulge in luxury: *KJV* - live in pleasure.

<u>Wanton</u> – <u>NT:4684</u> σπαταλάω **spatalao** (spat-al-ah'-o); from spatale (luxury); to be voluptuous: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - live in pleasure, be wanton.

Nourished – NT:5142 Τρέφω **trepho** (tref-o); a primary verb (properly, threpho; but perhaps strength. from the base of NT:5157 through the idea of convolution); properly, to stiffen, i.e. fatten (by implication, to cherish [with food, etc.], pamper, rear): **KJV** - bring up, feed, nourish.

Romans 1

³² Who knowing the judgment of God, that they which **commit such things** are **worthy of death**, **not only do the same**, but have **pleasure in them that do them**.

2 Thessalonians 2

⁸ And then shall **that Wicked be revealed**, whom the Lord shall consume with the spirit of his mouth, and shall **destroy with the brightness of his coming**:

⁹Even him, whose coming is after the working of Satan with all power and signs and lying wonders,

- ¹⁰ And with all **deceivableness of unrighteousness** in them that **perish**; because they **received not the love of the truth**, that they might be saved.
- ¹¹ And for this cause God shall send them strong delusion, that they should believe a lie:

Condemnation

James 5

⁶ Ye have condemned and killed the just; and he doth not resist you.

Condemned – NT:2613 καταδικάζω **katadikazo** (kat-ad-ik-ad'-zo); from NT:2596 and a derivative of NT:1349; to adjudge against, i.e. pronounce guilty: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - condemn.

 $\underline{\text{Killed}} - \underline{\text{NT:5407}}$ φονεύω **phoneuo** (fon-yoo'-o); from $\underline{\text{NT:5406}}$; to be a murderer (of): *KJV* - kill, do murder, slay.

<u>Just</u> – <u>NT:1342</u> δίκαιος **dikaios** (dik'-ah-yos); from <u>NT:1349</u>; equitable (in character or act); by implication, innocent, holy (absolutely or relatively): **KJV** - just, meet, right (-eous).

Doth not resist – NT:498 ἀντιτάσσομαι **antitassomai** (an-tee-tas'-som-ahee); from NT:473 and the middle voice of NT:5021; to range oneself against, i.e. oppose: **KJV** - oppose themselves, resist.

Psalm 109

¹Hold not thy peace, O God of my praise;

² For the mouth of the wicked and the mouth of the deceitful are opened against me: they have spoken against me with a lying tongue.

³ They **compassed me** about also with **words of hatred**; and **fought against** me **without a cause**.

⁴ For my love they are my adversaries: but I give myself unto prayer.

⁵ And they have **rewarded me evil for good**, and **hatred for my love.**

⁶ Set thou a wicked man over him: and let Satan stand at his right hand.

⁷When he shall be judged, let him be condemned: and let his prayer become sin.

⁸ Let his days be few; and let another take his office.

Patience

James 5

⁷ Be <u>patient</u> therefore, brethren, unto the <u>coming</u> of the Lord. Behold, the Husbandman <u>waiteth</u> for the <u>precious</u> fruit of the earth, and hath <u>long patience</u> for it, until he receive the <u>early</u> and <u>latter rain</u>.

Patient – NT:3114 μακροθυμέω **makrothumeo** (mak-roth-oo-meh'-o); from the same as NT:3116; to be long-spirited, i.e. (objectively) forbearing or (subjectively) patient:

KJV - bear (suffer) long, be longsuffering, have (long) patience, be patient, patiently endure.

<u>Coming</u> – <u>NT:3952</u> παρουσία **parousia** (par-oo-see'-ah); from the present participle of <u>NT:3918</u>; a being near, i.e. advent (often, return; specifically, of Christ to punish Jerusalem, or finally the wicked); (by implication) physically, aspect: *KJV* - coming, presence.

<u>Waiteth</u> – <u>NT:1551</u> ἐκδέχομαι **ekdechomai** (ek-dekh'-om-ahee); from <u>NT:1537</u> and <u>NT:1209</u>; to accept from some source, i.e. (by implication) to await: **KJV** - expect, look (tarry) for, wait (for).

<u>Precious</u> – <u>NT:5093</u> τίμιος **timios** (tim'-ee-os); including the comparative timioteros (tim-ee-o'- ter-os); and the superlative timiotatos (tim-ee-o'-tat-os); from <u>NT:5092</u>; valuable, i.e. (objectively) costly, or (subjectively) honored, esteemed, or (figuratively) beloved:

KJV - dear, honourable, (more, most) precious, had in reputation.

2 Thessalonians 3

⁵ And **the Lord direct your hearts** into the **love of God**, and into the <u>patient waiting</u> for Christ.

Patient waiting – NT:5281 ὑπομονή **hupomone** (hoop-om-on-ay'); from NT:5278; cheerful (or hopeful) endurance, constancy: **KJV** - enduring, patience, patient continuance (waiting).

Hebrews 6

Patiently endured – NT:3114 μακροθυμέω **makrothumeo** (mak-roth-oo-meh'-o); from the same as NT:3116; to be long-spirited, i.e. (objectively) forbearing or (subjectively) patient:

KJV - bear (suffer) long, be longsuffering, have (long) patience, be patient, patiently endure.

¹⁴ Saying, Surely blessing I will bless thee, and multiplying I will multiply thee.

¹⁵ And so, after he [Abraham] had <u>patiently endured</u>, he **obtained the** promise.

Patience (cont)

James 5

⁸ Be ye also <u>patient</u>; <u>stablish</u> your hearts: for the coming of the Lord draweth nigh.

Patient – NT:3114 μακροθυμέω **makrothumeo** (mak-roth-oo-meh'-o); from the same as NT:3116; to be long-spirited, i.e. (objectively) forbearing or (subjectively) patient:

KJV - bear (suffer) long, be longsuffering, have (long) patience, be patient, patiently endure.

<u>Stablish</u> – <u>NT:4741</u> στηρίζω **sterizo** (stay-rid'-zo); from a presumed derivative of <u>NT:2476</u> (like <u>NT:4731</u>); to set fast, i.e. (literally) to turn resolutely in a certain direction, or (figuratively) to <u>confirm</u>:

KJV - fix, (e-) stablish, stedfastly set, strengthen.

2 Thessalonians 2

¹⁶ Now our Lord Jesus Christ himself, and God, even our Father, which hath loved us, and hath given us everlasting consolation and good hope through grace,

¹⁷Comfort your hearts, and stablish you in every good word and work.

2 Thessalonians 3

³ But the **Lord is faithful**, who shall **stablish** you, and **keep you from evil**.

Godly Works - Results from Patience (cont)

Brotherly Love

James 5

⁹ Grudge not one against another, brethren, lest ye be condemned: behold, the judge standeth before [in front of] the door.

Grudge – NT:4727 στενάζω **stenazo** (sten-ad'-zo); from NT:4728; to make (intransitively, be) in straits, i.e. (by implication) to sigh, murmur, pray inaudibly: KJV - with grief, groan, grudge, sigh.

Condemned – NT:2919 κρίνω **krino** (kree'-no); properly, to distinguish, i.e. decide (mentally or judicially); by implication, to try, condemn, punish:

KJV - avenge, conclude, condemn, damn, decree, determine, esteem, judge, go to (sue at the) law, ordain, call in question, sentence to, think.

Judge – NT:2923 Κριτής **krites** (kree-tace'); from NT:2919; a judge (genitive case or specially): KJV - judge.

James 5

10 <u>Take</u>, my brethren, the prophets, who have <u>spoken</u> in the name of the Lord, **for an <u>example</u>** of suffering affliction, and of patience.

Take – NT:2983 λαμβάνω **lambano** (lam-ban'-o); a prolonged form of a primary verb, which is use only as an alternate in certain tenses; to take (in very many applications, literally and figuratively [properly objective or active, to get hold of; whereas NT:1209 is rather subjective or passive, to have offered to one; while NT:138 is more violent, to seize or remove]):

KJV - accept, + be amazed, assay, attain, bring, \(^{\text{V}}\) when I call, catch, come on (X unto), + forget, have, hold, obtain, receive (X after), take (away, up).

Spoken – NT:2980 λαλέω **laleo** (lal-eh'-o); a prolonged form of an otherwise obsolete verb; to talk, i.e. utter words:

KJV - preach, say, speak (after), talk, tell, utter. Compare NT:3004.

Example – NT:5262 ὑπόδειγμα **hupodeigma** (hoop-od'-igue-mah); from NT:5263; an exhibit for imitation or warning (figuratively, specimen, adumbration): *KJV* - en- ex-) ample, pattern.

Suffering affliction – NT:2552 κακοπάθεια **kakopatheia** (kak-op-ath'-i-ah); from a compound of NT:2556 and NT:3806; hardship:

KJV - suffering affliction.

Patience – NT:3115 μακροθυμία **makrothumia** (mak-roth-oo-mee'-ah); from the same as NT:3116; long animity, i.e. (objectively) forbearance [self-control, mercy or (subjectively) fortitude [force, strength, courage, staying power]: **KJV** - longsuffering, patience.

Godly Works - Results from Patience (cont) Happiness

James 5

¹¹ Behold, we <u>count them happy</u> which <u>endure</u>. Ye have heard of the <u>patience</u> of Job, and have seen the end of the Lord; that the Lord is <u>very pitiful</u>, and of <u>tender</u> mercy.

Count them happy – NT:3106 μακαρίζω **makarizo** (mak-ar-id'-zo); fom NT:3107; to beatify [bless, sanctify, consecrate], i.e. <u>pronounce (or esteem) fortunate</u>: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - call blessed, count happy.

Endure – NT:5278 ὑπομένω **hupomeno** (hoop-om-en'-o); from NT:5259 and NT:3306; to stay under (behind), i.e. remain; figuratively, to undergo, i.e. bear (trials), have fortitude, persevere:

KJV - abide, endure, (take) patient (-ly), suffer, tarry behind.

Patience – NT:5281 ὑπομονή **hupomone** (hoop-om-on-ay'); from NT:5278; cheerful (or hopeful) endurance, constancy:

KJV - enduring, patience, patient continuance (waiting).

<u>Very pitiful</u> – <u>NT:4184</u> πολύσπλαγχνος **polusplagchnos** (pol-oo'-splankh-nos); from <u>NT:4183</u> and <u>NT:4698</u> (figuratively); extremely compassionate: **KJV** - very pitiful.

Tender mercy – NT:3629 οἰκτίρμων **oiktirmon** (oyk-tir'-mone); from NT:3627; compassionate: **KJV** - merciful, of tender mercy.

Honesty

James 5

¹² But above all things, my brethren, <u>swear</u> not, neither by heaven, neither by the earth, neither by any other oath: but let your yea be yea; and your nay, nay; lest ye fall into condemnation.

Swear – NT:3660 ὀμνύω **omnuo** (om-noo'-o); a prolonged form of a primary but obsolete omo, for which another prolonged form (omoo (om-o'-o)) is used in certain tenses; to swear, i.e. take (or <u>declare on</u>) <u>oath</u>: **KJV** - swear.

Jeremiah 5

² And though they say, The LORD liveth; surely they swear falsely.

Malachi 3

⁵ And I will come near to you to judgment; and I will be a swift witness against the sorcerers, and against the adulterers, and **against false swearers**, and against those that oppress the hireling in his wages, the widow, and the fatherless, and that turn aside the stranger from his right, and fear not me, saith the LORD of hosts.

Godly Works - Results from Patience (cont)

Honesty (cont)

Matthew 5

- ³³ Again, ye have heard that it hath been said by them of old time, Thou shalt not forswear thyself, but shalt perform unto the Lord thine oaths:
- ³⁴ But I say unto you, Swear not at all; neither by heaven; for it is God's throne:
- ³⁵ Nor by the earth; for it is his footstool: neither by Jerusalem; for it is the city of the great King.

 36 Neither shalt thou swear by thy head, because thou canst not make one hair white or
- black.
- ³⁷ But let your communication be, Yea, yea; Nay, nay: for whatsoever is more than these cometh of evil.

Prayerfulness Your needs

James 5

¹³ Is any among you <u>afflicted</u>? let him pray. Is any merry? let him <u>sing psalms</u>.

Afflicted – NT:2553 κακοπαθέω **kakopatheo** (kak-op-ath-eh'-o); from the same as NT:2552; to undergo hardship:

KJV - be afflicted, endure afflictions (hardness), suffer trouble.

Sing psalms – NT:5567 $\psi \acute{\alpha} \lambda \lambda \omega$ psallo (psal'-lo); probably strengthened from psao (to rub or touch the surface; compare NT:5597); to twitch or twang, i.e. to play on a stringed instrument (celebrate the divine worship with music and accompanying odes): **KJV** - make melody, sing (psalms).

Godly Works - Results from Patience (cont)

Needs of Others

James 5

¹⁴ Is any sick among you? let him call [summon] for the <u>elders</u> of the church; and **let them** <u>pray</u> over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord:

<u>Elders</u> – <u>NT:4245</u> πρεσβύτερος **presbuteros** (pres-boo'-ter-os); comparative of presbus (elderly); older; as noun, a senior; specifically, an Israelite Sanhedrist (also figuratively, member of the celestial council) or Christian "presbyter": **KJV** - elder (-est), old.

Pray – NT:4336 προσεύχομαι **proseuchomai** (pros-yoo'-khom-ahee); from NT:4314 and NT:2172; to pray to God, i.e. supplicate, worship: **KJV** - pray (X earnestly, for), make prayer.

Psalm 25

¹⁸ Look upon mine affliction and my pain; and forgive all my sins.

Matthew 9

⁴ And Jesus knowing their thoughts said, Wherefore think ye evil in your hearts?

⁵ For whether is easier, to say, **Thy sins be forgiven thee**; or to say, **Arise, and walk?**⁶ But that we may know that the Son of man bath power on earth to forgive sins (then

⁶But that ye may know that the Son of man hath power on earth to forgive sins, (then saith he to the sick of the palsy,) **Arise, take up thy bed**, and go unto thine house.

James 5

¹⁵ And the **prayer of faith** shall **save the sick**, and the Lord shall **raise him up**; and if he have **committed sins**, **they shall be** <u>forgiven</u> him.

Forgiven – NT:863 $\dot{\alpha}\phi$ í $\eta\mu\iota$ **aphiemi** (af-ee'-ay-mee); from NT:575 and hiemi (to send; an intens. form of eimi, to go); to send forth, in various applications (as follow):

KJV - cry, forgive, forsake, lay aside, leave, let (alone, be, go, have), omit, put (send) away, remit, suffer, yield up.

Godly Works - Results from Patience (cont)

Forgiveness

James 5

16 <u>Confess</u> your faults one to another, and <u>pray</u> one for another, that ye may be <u>healed</u>. The <u>effectual fervent</u> prayer of a <u>righteous</u> man <u>availeth</u> much.

Confess – NT:1843 ἐξομολογέω **exomologeo** (ex-om-ol-og-eh'-o); from NT:1537 and NT:3670; to acknowledge or (by implication of assent) agree fully: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - confess, profess, promise.

Pray – NT:2172 εὔχομαι **euchomai** (yoo'-khom-ahee); middle voice of a primary verb; to wish; by implication, to pray to God:

KJV - pray, will, wish.

<u>Healed</u> – <u>NT:2390</u> ἰάομαι **iaomai** (ee-ah'-om-ahee); middle voice of apparently a primary verb; to cure (literally or figuratively):

KJV - heal, make whole.

<u>Effectual fervent</u> – <u>NT:1754</u> ἐνεργέω **energeo** (en-erg-eh'-o); from <u>NT:1756</u>; to be active, efficient:

KJV - do, (be) effectual (fervent), be mighty in, shew forthself, work (effectually in).

<u>Righteous</u> – <u>NT:1342</u> δίκαιος **dikaios** (dik'-ah-yos); from <u>NT:1349</u>; equitable (in character or act); by implication, innocent, holy (absolutely or relatively): **KJV** - just, meet, right (-eous).

<u>Availeth</u> – <u>NT:2480</u> ἰσχύω **ischuo** (is-khoo'-o); from <u>NT:2479</u>; to have (or exercise) force (literally or figuratively):

KJV - be able, avail, can do ([-not]), could, be good, might, prevail, be of strength, be whole, + much work.

Mark 3

²⁹ But he that shall **blaspheme against the Holy Ghost** hath **never forgiveness**, but is **in danger of eternal damnation.**

Luke 11

⁴ And **forgive us our sins**; **for we also forgive every one that is indebted to us.** And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil.

1 John 1

⁹ If we <u>confess</u> our sins, he is faithful and **just to forgive** us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Confess – NT:3670 δμολογέω **homologeo** (hom-ol-og-eh'-o); from a compound of the base of NT:3674 and NT:3056; to assent, i.e. covenant, acknowledge:

KJV - con- (pro-) fess, confession is made, give thanks, promise.

Those who are forgiven are forgiving

Godly Works - Results from Patience (cont)

Earnestness

James 5 ...an example

17 Elias was a man <u>subject to like passions</u> as we are, and he <u>prayed earnestly</u> that it might not rain: and it rained not on the earth by the space of three years and six months.

Subject to like passions – NT:3663 δμοιοπαθής **homoiopathes** (hom-oy-op-ath-ace'); from NT:3664 and the alternate of NT:3958; similarly affected:

KJV - of (subject to) like passions.

Prayed – NT:4336 προσεύχομαι **proseuchomai** (pros-yoo'-khom-ahee); from NT:4314 and NT:2172; to pray to God, i.e. supplicate, worship:

KJV - pray (X earnestly, for), make prayer.

Earnestly – NT:4335 προσευχή **proseuche** (pros-yoo-khay'); from NT:4336; prayer (worship); by implication, an oratory (chapel):

KJV - ^X pray earnestly, prayer.

James 5

¹⁸ And he prayed again, and the **heaven gave rain**, and **the earth brought forth** her fruit.

Conversions

James 5

¹⁹ Brethren, **if any of you do err from the truth**, and **one convert him**;

Err - NT:4105 πλανάω **planao** (plan-ah'-o); from NT:4106; to (properly, cause to) roam (from safety, truth, or virtue):

KJV - go astray, deceive, err, seduce, wander, be out of the way.

<u>Convert</u> – <u>NT:1994</u> ἐπιστρέφω **epistrepho** (ep-ee-stref'-o); from <u>NT:1909</u> and <u>NT:4762</u>; to revert (literally, figuratively or morally):

KJV - come (go) again, convert, (re-) turn (about, again).

James 5

²⁰ Let him know, that he which <u>converteth</u> the sinner from the <u>error</u> of his way shall <u>save</u> a soul from death, and shall <u>hide</u> a <u>multitude</u> of sins.

<u>Converteth</u> – <u>NT:1994</u> ἐπιστρέφω **epistrepho** (ep-ee-stref-o); from <u>NT:1909</u> and <u>NT:4762</u>; to revert (literally, figuratively or morally):

KJV - come (go) again, convert, (re-) turn (about, again).

<u>Error</u> – <u>NT:4106</u> πλάνη **plane** (plan'-ay); feminine of <u>NT:4108</u> (as abstractly); objectively, fraudulence; subjectively, a straying from orthodoxy or piety: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - deceit, to deceive, delusion, error.

Save – NT:4982 σώζω **sozo** (sode'-zo); from a primary sos (contraction for obsolete saoz, "safe"); to save, i.e. deliver or protect (literally or figuratively): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - heal, preserve, save (self), do well, be (make) whole.

<u>Hide</u> – <u>NT:2572</u> καλύπτω **kalupto** (kal-oop'-to); akin to <u>NT:2813</u> and <u>NT:2928</u>; to cover up (literally or figuratively): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - cover, hide.

<u>Multitude</u> – <u>NT:4128</u> πλ $\hat{\eta}\theta$ ος **plethos** (play'-thos); from <u>NT:4130</u>; a fulness, i.e. a large number, throng, populace:

KJV - bundle, company, multitude.
