# How could it be possible that I understand...and still I am discontent?

I knew the Word, I believed the Word, God brought much success in my business, my family was well and our friends were many.

When any of our responsibilities get out of line with the WORD of God, you will be discontent whether in wealth or penury.

When life becomes overwhelming, discontentment is around the corner.

Beware but do not despair!

In the midst of being inundated or flooded with the circumstances of life, we are given responsibilities to keep us in order and CONTENT.

Even my own experience has proven that our relationships with God, Family, Friends, Enemies, and even with myself are not too much to bear when the opportunity to teach the Holy Bible was made possible. I became content in my life WHEN I chose to serve God.

Such and opportunity to teach was more important than all those things that had become a part of my life. My Responsibilities seemed to be in order as my discontentment assuaged with the experience of Bible teaching. God's touch was not to exclude me from being always content.

Therefore, I look back and discover that I was content when I did those things that would proffer the knowledge of who God is. In defiance of worldly manipulation or influence, I was confident and grew content in knowing that the touch of God had not precluded me from my responsibility to serve Him. I am content

Therefore our circumstances without grace bring discontentment, but our circumstances with grace abounding from God, brings sufficiency! Contentment

Then discontentment grows and we respond with sadness or anger or despondency. How could this be possible in my life! I am saved! But how do I behave in those times when God's direction brings suffering even when I am prayerful to God.

How many of us have been discontent with various parts of our life and come to a point when we need answers as problems mount. I have always had answers. It is not faithful to believe that because you are His chosen and a saint of God being saved by grace, you then walk about through life without encountering events in life that threaten to move us off course.

Contentment will never be obtained for those things you have NOT...

Contentment is discovered in all the good and perfect things God alone has brought into your life so that you be content that He alone determined it is sufficient.

Through hard lessons I learned.

And I discovered contentment in such a promise God that can only bring contentment:

Romans 8:28 And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to *His* purpose. (Rom 8:28 KJV)

Because God knows best! ... I am content to rely upon only God NOT me and NOT man.

KJV 1 John 5

I am content knowing that God listens even though I do not feel like He hears. It is still our faith that works to know that God answers, according to His will, if I know He hears.

Listening God's answer to prayer is not sporadic or periodical.

I am to keep listening always as I pray always continuing the process throughout life. Thus, I need to keep **listening for God's answers**. Most certainly, too, I need to recognize **my answers are not God's answers**.

What is this man that thou CREATOR regard me? I most certainly do not think Jehovah, The Self- existing LORD, needs me. Rather I have learned **He wants me to need HIM**.

God does not need me, He wants me to need Him.

My will pleases me only, His will pleases Him and brings contentment to our lives I remain discontent when I please myself!

I seek to remain confident in God.

So, Now, I am not confident in me...

I desire to be content in all things and work to please Him who created us for His pleasure.

Knowing our Father knows our need before we do and provides for our need that we pray for brings contentment as we remain godly in Christ Jesus.

Let us never forget our responsibility in life...

It is our ability to be content in life!

Certainly, Our ability to be content begins with God.

...to remain content in life is to be content with God.
