Deliverer – OT:6403 D palat (paw-lat'); a primitive root; to slip out, i.e. escape; causatively, to deliver: **KJV** - calve, carry away safe, deliver, (cause to) escape.

Strength – OT:6697 The tsuwr (tsoor); or tsur (tsoor); from OT:6696; properly, a cliff (or sharp rock, as compressed); generally, a rock or boulder; figuratively, a refuge; also an edge (as precipitous):

KJV - edge, ^X (mighty) God (one), rock, ^X sharp, stone, ^X strength, ^X strong. See also OT:1049.

...from - OT:6696 TE tsuwr (tsoor); a primitive root; to cramp, i.e. confine (in many applications, literally and figuratively, formative or hostile):

**KJV* - adversary, assault, beset, besiege, bind (up), cast, distress, fashion, fortify, inclose, lay siege, put up in bags.

Buckler – OT:4043 מְלֵלְן magen (maw-gane'); also (in plural) feminine meginnah (meg-in-naw'); from OT:1598; a shield (i.e. the small one or buckler); figuratively, a protector; also the scaly hide of the crocodile:

**EJV - X armed, buckler, defence, ruler, + scale, shield.

...from - OT:1598 [] ganan (gaw-nan'); a primitive root; to hedge about, i.e. (generally) protect: **KJV** - defend.

KJV - have horns, shine.

...from $-\underline{OT:7682}$ sagab (saw-gab'); a primitive root; to be (causatively, make) lofty, especially inaccessible; by implication, safe, strong; used literally and figuratively KJV - defend, exalt, be excellent, (be, set on) high, lofty, be safe, set up (on high), be too strong.

Enemies – OT:341 \square 'oyeb (o-yabe'); or (fully) 'owyeb (o-yabe'); active participle of OT:340; hating; an adversary: KJV - enemy, foe.

Rock Fortress Deliverer Strength Trust Protector hope lofty place
