Without Partiality

1 Peter 1

¹⁷ And **if** ye call on the Father, who <u>without respect of persons</u> judgeth [decides] according to every man's work, <u>pass</u> the time of your <u>sojourning</u> here in fear: <u>Without respect of persons</u> – <u>NT:678</u> ἀπροσωπολήπτως **aprosopoleptos** (ap-ros-o-pol-ape'-tos); adverb from a compound of <u>NT:1</u> (as a negative particle) and a presumed derivative of a presumed compound of <u>NT:4383</u> and <u>NT:2983</u> [compare <u>NT:4381</u>]; in a way not accepting the person, i.e. impartially: **KJV** - without respect of persons.

2 Chronicles 19

⁷ Wherefore now let the fear of the LORD be upon you; take heed and do it: for there is no iniquity with the LORD our God, nor **respect of persons**, nor taking of gifts.

Romans 2

¹¹ For there is no **respect of persons** with God.

Ephesians 6 employers warned...

⁹ And, ye masters, do the same things unto them, forbearing threatening: knowing that your Master also is in heaven; neither is there **respect of persons** with him.

<u>Pass</u> – <u>NT:390</u> ἀναστρέφο **anastrepho** (an-as-tref-o); from <u>NT:303</u> and <u>NT:4762</u>; to overturn; also to return; by implication, to <u>busy oneself</u>, i.e. <u>remain</u>, <u>live</u>: *KJV* - abide, <u>behave</u> self, have conversation, live, overthrow, pass, return, be used.

<u>Sojourning</u> – <u>NT:3940</u> παροικία **paroikia** (par-oy-kee'-ah); from <u>NT:3941</u>; foreign residence: *KJV* - sojourning, ^x as strangers.

2 Chronicles 29

¹¹ My sons, be not now negligent: for the LORD hath **chosen you to stand before him**, to **serve him**, and that ye should **minister unto him**, and burn incense.

Isaiah 43

¹⁰ Ye are my witnesses, saith the LORD, and my servant whom I have chosen: that ye may know and believe me, and understand that I am he: before me there was no God formed, neither shall there be after me.

Without the Help of Man

1 Peter 1

¹⁸ *Forasmuch* as ye know that ye were **not** <u>redeemed</u> with <u>corruptible</u> things, as silver and gold, from [ek – out of] your <u>vain conversation</u> <u>received by</u> tradition from your fathers;

<u>Redeemed</u> - <u>NT:3084</u> λ υτρόω **lutroo** (loo-tro'-o); from <u>NT:3083</u>; to <u>ransom</u> (literally or figuratively): *KJV* - redeem.

<u>Corruptible</u> - <u>NT:5349</u> ϕ θαρτός **phthartos** (fthar-tos'); from <u>NT:5351</u>; <u>decayed</u>, i.e. (by implication) <u>perishable</u>: **KJV** - corruptible.

<u>Vain</u> - <u>NT:3152</u>μάταιος **mataios** (mat'-ah-yos); from the base of <u>NT:3155</u>; <u>empty</u>, i.e. (literally) profitless, or (specifically) an idol: *KJV* - vain, vanity.

<u>Conversation</u> - <u>NT:391</u> ἀναστροφή **anastrophe** (an-as-trof-ay'); from <u>NT:390</u>; behavior: *KJV* - conversation.

<u>Received by tradition from your fathers</u> - <u>NT:3970</u> πατροπαράδοτος **patroparadotos** (pat-rop-ar-ad'-ot-os); from <u>NT:3962</u> and a derivative of <u>NT:3860</u> (in the sense of <u>handing over or down</u>); <u>traditional</u>: *KJV* - received by tradition from fathers.

1 Corinthians 9

²⁴ Know ye not that they which run in a race run all, but one receiveth the prize? So run, that ye may obtain.

²⁵ And every man that <u>striveth for the mastery</u> is temperate in all things. Now **they** do it

to obtain a corruptible crown; but we an incorruptible.

Striveth for the mastery – <u>NT:75</u> ἀγωνίζομαι **agonizomai** (ag-o-nid'-zom-ahee); from <u>NT:73</u>; to struggle, literally (to compete for a prize), figuratively (to contend with an adversary), or genitive case (to endeavor to accomplish something): **KJV** - fight, labor fervently, strive. ²⁶ I therefore so run, not as uncertainly; so fight I, not as one that beateth the air:

1 Peter 2

¹² Having your **conversation honest among the Gentiles**: that, whereas they speak against you as evildoers, they may **by your good works**, which they shall behold, **glorify God** in the day of visitation.

Ephesians 5

⁶Let no man deceive you with vain words: for because of these things cometh the wrath of God upon the children of disobedience.

Without Blemish or Spot

1 Peter 1

¹⁹ But with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot:

<u>Precious</u> - <u>NT:5093</u> τίμιος **timios** (tim'-ee-os); including the comparative timioteros (tim-ee-o'- ter-os); and the superlative timiotatos (tim-ee-o'-tat-os); from <u>NT:5092</u>; <u>valuable</u>, i.e. (objectively) costly, or (subjectively) <u>honored</u>, <u>esteemed</u>, or (figuratively) beloved:

KJV - dear, honourable, (more, most) precious, had in reputation.

Matthew 27

⁹ Then was fulfilled that which was spoken by Jeremy the prophet, saying, And they took the thirty (30) pieces of silver, the **price of him that was valued** [$\tau\iota\mu\dot{\alpha}\omega$ - **revered**], whom they of the children of Israel did **value**;

<u>blood</u> - <u>NT:129</u> αἶμα **haima** (hah'-ee-mah); of uncertain derivation; blood, literally (of men or animals), figuratively (the juice of grapes) or specially (the atoning blood of Christ); by implication bloodshed, also kindred: **KJV** - blood.<u>without blemish</u> - <u>NT:299</u> ἄμωμος **amomos** (am'-o-mos); from <u>NT:1</u> (as a negative particle) and <u>NT:3470</u>; unblemished (literally or figuratively):

KJV - without blame (blemish, fault, spot), faultless, unblameable. <u>Without spot</u> - <u>NT:784</u> ἄσπιλος **aspilos** (as'-pee-los); from <u>NT:1</u> (as a negative particle) and <u>NT:4695</u>; unblemished (physically or morally): *KJV* - without spot, unspotted.

2 Peter 2

¹³ And shall receive the **reward of unrighteousness**, as they that count it pleasure to **riot** in **the day time**. **Spots they are and blemishes**, sporting themselves with **their own deceivings** while they feast with you;

Hebrews 9

¹³ For if the blood of bulls and of goats, and the ashes of an heifer sprinkling the unclean, sanctifieth to the purifying of the flesh:

¹⁴ How much more shall the **blood of Christ**, who through the eternal Spirit **offered himself without spot to God**, purge your conscience from dead works to serve the living God?

¹⁵ And for this cause he is the mediator of the new testament, that **by means of death**, for the **redemption of the transgressions** that were under the first testament, **they which are called** might receive the promise of **eternal inheritance**.

Without Works

1 Peter 1

²⁰ Who verily was **foreordained** before the <u>foundation</u> of the world, but was <u>manifest</u> in these last times for you,

<u>Verily</u> - <u>NT:3303</u> $\mu \acute{\epsilon} \nu$ **men** (men); a primary particle; properly, indicative of affirmation or concession (in fact); usually followed by a contrasted clause with <u>NT:1161</u> (this one, the former, etc):

KJV - even, indeed, so, some, truly, verily. Often compounded with other particles in an intensive or asseverative sense.

<u>Foreordained</u> - <u>NT:4267</u> προγινώσκω **proginosko** (prog-in-oce'-ko); from <u>NT:4253</u> and <u>NT:1097</u>; to know beforehand, i.e. foresee:

KJV - foreknow (ordain), know (before).

<u>Foundation</u> - <u>NT:2602</u> καταβολή **katabole** (kat-ab-ol-ay'); from <u>NT:2598</u>; a deposition, i.e. founding; figuratively, conception: *KJV* - conceive, foundation.

<u>Manifest</u> - <u>NT:5319</u> ϕ ανερόω **phaneroo** (fan-er-o'-o); from <u>NT:5318</u>; to render apparent (literally or figuratively):

KJV - appear, manifestly declare, (make) manifest (forth), shew (self).

<u>Times</u> - <u>NT:5550</u> $\chi\rho\delta\nu\sigma\zeta$ **chronos** (khron'-os); of uncertain derivation; a space of time (in general, and thus properly distinguished from <u>NT:2540</u>, which designates a fixed or special occasion; and from <u>NT:165</u>, which denotes a particular period) or interval; by extension, an individual opportunity; by implication, delay: *KJV* - + years old, season, space, (X often-) time (-s), (a) while.

Romans 4

⁵ But to him that worketh not, but believeth on him that justifieth the ungodly, his faith is counted for righteousness.

⁶Even as David also describeth the **blessedness** of the man, unto whom **God imputeth righteousness without works**,

⁷Saying, Blessed are they whose iniquities are forgiven, and whose sins are covered.

Hebrews 9

¹⁴ How much more shall the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself **without spot** to God, **purge your conscience from dead works** to serve the living God?

1 Corinthians 2

⁹ Who hath **saved us**, and **called us** with an holy calling, **not according to our works**, but according to **his own purpose and grace**, which was **given us** in Christ Jesus **before the world began**,

¹⁰ But is **now made manifest** by the **appearing of our Saviour** Jesus Christ, who hath **abolished death**, and hath **brought life and immortality to light** through the gospel:

³Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who hath blessed us with all spiritual blessings in heavenly places in Christ:

⁴According as he hath chosen us in him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and without blame before him in love:

⁶ To the praise of the glory of his grace, wherein he hath **made us accepted** in the beloved.

⁷ In whom we have **redemption through his blood**, the **forgiveness of sins**, according to the riches of his grace;

1 Peter 1

²¹ Who **by him** [**you**] do <u>**believe**</u> in God, that <u>raised him up</u> from the <u>dead</u>, and **gave Him <u>glory</u>**; that your <u>**faith**</u> and <u>**hope**</u> <u>**might**</u> **be** in God.

Believe – <u>NT:4103</u> πιστός **pistos** (pis-tos'); from <u>NT:3982</u>; objectively, trustworthy; subjectively, trustful: **KJV** - believe (-ing, -r), faithful (-ly), sure, true. <u>Raised up</u> – <u>NT:1453</u> έγείρω **egeiro** (eg-i'-ro); probably akin to the base of <u>NT:58</u> (through the idea of collecting one's faculties); to waken (transitively or intransitively), i.e. rouse (literally, from sleep, from sitting or lying, from disease, from death; or figuratively, from obscurity, inactivity, ruins, nonexistence): **KJV** - awake, lift (up), raise (again, up), rear up, (a-) rise (again, up), stand, take up.

<u>Dead</u> – <u>NT:3498</u> νεκρός **nekros** (nek-ros'); from an apparently primary nekus (a corpse); dead (literally or figuratively; also as noun): **KJV** - dead.

<u>Glory</u> – <u>NT:1391</u> $\delta\delta\xi\alpha$ **doxa** (dox'-ah); from the base of <u>NT:1380</u>; glory (as very apparent), in a wide application (literal or figurative, objective or subjective): **KJV** - dignity, glory (-ious), honour, praise, worship.

<u>Faith</u> – <u>NT:4102</u> π í σ TI ζ **pistis** (pis'-tis); from <u>NT:3982</u>; persuasion, i.e. credence; moral conviction (of religious truth, or the truthfulness of God or a religious teacher), especially reliance upon Christ for salvation; abstractly, constancy in such profession; by extension, the system of religious (Gospel) truth itself: *KJV* - assurance, belief, believe, faith, fidelity.

<u>Hope</u> – <u>NT:1680</u> $\dot{\epsilon}\lambda\pi$ ίς **elpis** (el-pece'); from a primary **elpo** (to anticipate, usually with pleasure); expectation (abstractly or concretely) or confidence: **KJV** - faith, hope.

<u>might be</u> – <u>NT:1510</u> ϵ iµi (i-mee'); the first person singular present indicative; a prolonged form of a primary and defective verb; I exist (used only when emphatic):

KJV - am, have been, ^x it is I, was. See also <u>NT:1488</u>, <u>NT:1498</u>, <u>NT:1511</u>, <u>NT:2258</u>, <u>NT:2071</u>, <u>NT:2070</u>, <u>NT:2075</u>, <u>NT:2076</u>, <u>NT:2468</u>, <u>NT:5600</u>, <u>NT:5607</u>.

Matthew 16

²¹ From that time forth began Jesus to shew unto his disciples, how that he must go unto Jerusalem, and suffer many things of the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and be **raised** again the third day.

³⁰ The **God of our fathers raised up Jesus**, whom ye slew and hanged on a tree.

²² Seeing ye have **<u>purified</u>** your <u>souls</u> in <u>obeying</u> the truth through the Spirit unto <u>unfeigned love</u> of the brethren, see that ye love one another with a pure heart fervently: Purified – NT:48 ἁγνίζω hagnizo (hag-nid'-zo); from NT:53; to make clean, i.e. (figuratively) sanctify (ceremonially or morally): **KJV** - purify (self). <u>Souls</u> – <u>NT:5590</u> $\psi \cup \chi \eta$ **psuche** (psoo-khay'); from NT:5594; breath, i.e. (by implication) spirit, abstractly or concretely (the animal sentient principle only; thus distinguished on the one hand from NT:4151, which is the rational and immortal soul; and on the other from NT:2222, which is mere vitality, even of plants: these terms thus exactly correspond respectively to the Hebrew OT:5315, **KJV** - heart (+-ily), life, mind, soul, +us, +you. OT:7307 and OT:2416): Obeying – NT:5218 ὑπακοή **hupakoe** (hoop-ak-o-ay'); from NT:5219; attentive hearkening, i.e. (by implication) compliance or submission: KJV - obedience, (make) obedient, obey (-ing). <u>Unfeigned</u> – <u>NT:505</u> άνυπόκριτος **anupokritos** (an-oo-pok'-ree-tos); from NT:1 (as a negative particle) and a presumed derivative of NT:5271; undissembled, i.e. **KJV** - without dissimulation (hypocrisy), unfeigned. sincere:

Love of the brethren – <u>NT:5360</u> ϕ ιλαδελ ϕ ία **philadelphia** (fil-ad-el-fee'-ah); from <u>NT:5361</u>; fraternal affection:*KJV* - brotherly love (kindness), love of the brethren. <u>Pure</u> – <u>NT:2513</u> καθαρός **katharos** (kath-ar-os'); of uncertain affinity; clean (literally or figuratively): *KJV* - clean, clear, pure.

<u>Fervently</u> – <u>NT:1619</u> ἐκτενῶς **ektenos** (ek-ten-oce'); adverb from <u>NT:1618</u>; <u>intently</u> [carefully, attentively]: **KJV** - fervently.

1 John 4

¹⁰ Herein is love, **not** that we loved God, but that **He loved us**, and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins.

2 Corinthians 6

⁴But in all things **approving ourselves as the ministers of God**, in much patience, in afflictions, in necessities, in distresses,

⁵ In stripes, in imprisonments, in tumults, in labours, in watchings, in fastings;

Born again – <u>NT:313</u> ἀναγεννάω **anagennao** (an-ag-en-nah'-o); from <u>NT:303</u> and <u>NT:1080</u>; to <u>beget</u> or (by extension) bear (again):

KJV - beget, (bear) × (again).

<u>Corruptible</u> – <u>NT:5349</u> ϕ θαρτός **phthartos** (fthar-tos'); from <u>NT:5351</u>; decayed, i.e. (by implication) perishable: *KJV* - corruptible.

<u>Incorruptible</u> – <u>NT:862</u> άφθαρτος **aphthartos** (af-thar-tos); from <u>NT:1</u> (as a negative particle) and a derivative of <u>NT:5351</u>; undecaying (in essence or continuance): *KJV* - not (in-, un-) corruptible, immortal.

<u>Abideth</u> –<u>NT:3306</u> μ ένω **meno** (men'-o); a primary verb; to stay (in a given place, state, relation or expectancy):

KJV - abide, continue, dwell, endure, be present, remain, stand, tarry (for), ^x thine own. John 1:13; James 1:18

Galatians 6

¹⁵ For in Christ Jesus **neither circumcision availeth any thing, nor uncircumcision**, but **a new creature**.

2 Corinthians 5

¹⁷ Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new.

Psalm 100

³ Know ye that the LORD he is God: it is he that hath made us, and not we ourselves; we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture.

²⁴ <u>For</u> all <u>flesh</u> is as <u>grass</u>, and all the <u>glory</u> of man as the <u>flower</u> of grass. The grass <u>withereth</u>, and the flower thereof <u>falleth away</u>:

<u>For</u> – <u>NT:1360</u>διότι **dioti** (dee-ot'-ee); from <u>NT:1223</u> and <u>NT:3754</u>; on the very account that, or inasmuch as: **KJV** - because (that), for, therefore. <u>Flesh</u> – <u>NT:4561</u>σάρξ **sarx** (sarx); probably from the base of <u>NT:4563</u>; flesh (as stripped of the skin), i.e. (strictly) the meat of an animal (as food), or (by extension) the body (as opposed to the soul [or spirit], or as the symbol of what is external, or as the means of kindred), or (by implication) human nature (with its frailties [physically or morally] and passions), or (specifically) a human being (as such): **KJV** - carnal (-ly, ⁺-ly minded), flesh ([-ly]).

<u>Grass</u> – <u>NT:5528</u> χόρτος **chortos** (khor'-tos); apparently a primary word; a "court" or "garden", i.e. (by implication, of pasture) herbage or vegetation:

KJV - blade, grass, hay.

<u>Glory</u> – <u>NT:1391</u> $\delta\delta\xi\alpha$ **doxa** (dox'-ah); from the base of <u>NT:1380</u>; glory (as very apparent), in a wide application (literal or figurative, objective or subjective): *KJV* - dignity, glory (-ious), honour, praise, worship.

<u>Flower</u> – <u>NT:438</u> άνθος **anthos** (anth'-os); a primary word; a <u>blossom</u>: *KJV* - flower. <u>Withereth</u> – <u>NT:3583</u> ξηραίνω **xeraino** (xay-rah'-ee-no); from <u>NT:3584</u>; to desiccate; by implication to shrivel, to mature:

KJV - dry up, pine away, be ripe, wither (away).

<u>Falleth away</u> – <u>NT:1601</u> $\dot{\epsilon}$ K π í π T ω **ekpipto** (ek-pip'-to); from <u>NT:1537</u> and <u>NT:4098</u>; to drop away; specially, be driven out of one's course; figuratively, to lose, become inefficient: **KJV** - be cast, fail, fall (away, off), take none effect.

Isaiah 40

⁷ The **grass withereth**, the flower fadeth: because the spirit of the LORD bloweth upon it: surely the **people is grass**.

⁸ The grass withereth, the flower fadeth: but the word of our God shall stand for ever. ⁹ O Zion, that bringest good tidings, get thee up into the high mountain; O Jerusalem, that bringest good tidings, lift up thy voice with strength; lift it up, be not afraid; say unto the cities of Judah, Behold your God!

Psalm 102

<u>But</u> – <u>NT:1161</u> $\delta \hat{\epsilon}$ **de** (deh); a primary particle (adversative or continuative); but, and, etc.: **KJV** - also, and, but, moreover, now [often unexpressed in English]. <u>Word</u> – <u>NT:4487</u> $\hat{\rho}$ $\hat{\eta}\mu\alpha$ **rhema** (hray'-mah); from <u>NT:4483</u>; an utterance (individually, collectively or specifically); by implication, a matter or topic (especially of narration, command or dispute); with a negative naught whatever: **KJV** - ⁺ evil, ⁺ nothing, saying, word.

<u>Endureth</u> – <u>NT:3306</u> μ $\dot{\epsilon}\nu\omega$ **meno** (men'-o); a primary verb; to <u>stay</u> (in a given place, state, relation or expectancy):

KJV - abide, <u>continue</u>, dwell, endure, be present, <u>remain</u>, stand, tarry (for), ^X thine own.

<u>Gospel is preached</u> – <u>NT:2097</u> εὐαγγελίζω **euaggelizo** (yoo-ang-ghel-id'-zo); from <u>NT:2095</u> and <u>NT:32</u>; to announce good news ("evangelize") especially the gospel: *KJV* - declare, bring (declare, show) glad (good) tidings, preach (the gospel).
