KJV - ghost, life, spirit (-ual, -ually), mind. Compare NT:5590.

...from – NT:4154>pne/w > pneo (pneh'-o); a primary word; to breathe hard, i.e. breeze: KJV - blow. Compare NT:5594.

<u>Brethren</u> – NT:80 >a)delfo/\$ > adelphos (ad-el-fos'); from NT:1 (as a connective particle) and delphus (the womb); a brother (literally or figuratively) near or remote [much like NT:1]: KJV - brother.

<u>Ignorant</u> – NT:50>a)gnoe/w > agnoeo (ag-no-eh'-o); from NT:1 (as a negative particle) and NT:3539; not to know (through lack of information or intelligence); by implication, to ignore (through disinclination):

KJV - (be) ignorant (-ly), not know, not understand, unknown.

...from - NT:3539 >noie/w > noeo (no-eh'-o) or noieo (noy-eh'-o); from NT:3563; to exercise the mind (observe), i.e. (figuratively) to comprehend, heed:

KJV - consider, perceive, think, understand.

(divine) God, Christ's spirit, the Holy Spirit:

### 1 Corinthians 12

Know – NT:1492 >ei&dw > eido (i'-do); a primary verb; used only in certain past tenses, the others being borrowed from the equivalent NT:3700 and NT:3708; properly, to see (literally or figuratively); by implication (in the perf. only) to know:

<u>Dumb</u> – NT:880 >a&fwno\$ > aphonos (af'-o-nos); from NT:1 (as a negative particle) and NT:5456; voiceless, i.e. mute (by nature or choice); figuratively, unmeaning: KJV - dumb, without signification.

...from – NT:5456 >fwnh/ > phone (fo-nay'); probably akin to NT:5316 through the idea of disclosure; a tone (articulate, bestial or artificial); by implication, an address (for any purpose), saying or language: KJV - noise, sound, voice.

<u>Idols</u> – NT:1497 >ei&dwlon > eidolon (i'-do-lon); from NT:1491; an image (i.e. for worship); by implication, a heathen god, or (plural) the worship of such: KJV - idol.

...from – NT:1491 >ei@do\$ > eidos (i'-dos); from NT:1492; a view, i.e. form (literally or figuratively): KJV - appearance, fashion, shape, sight.

<u>Led</u> – NT:520 >a)pa/gw > apago (ap-ag'-o); from NT:575 and NT:71; to take off (in various senses):

KJV - bring, carry away, lead (away), put to death, take away.

No man – NT:3762 >ou)dei/\$ > oudeis (oo-dice'); including feminine oudemia (oo-dem-ee'-ah); and neuter ouden (oo-den'); from NT:3761 and NT:1520; not even one (man, woman or thing), i.e. none, nobody, nothing:

KJV - any (man), aught, man, neither any (thing), never (man), no (man), none (+of these things), not (any, at all, -thing), nought.

<u>Spirit</u> – NT:4151 >pneu=ma > pneuma (pnyoo'-mah); from NT:4154; a current of air, i.e. breath (blast) or a breeze; by analogy or figuratively, a spirit, i.e. (human) the rational soul, (by implication) vital principle, mental disposition, etc., or (superhuman) an angel, demon, or (divine) God, Christ's spirit, the Holy Spirit:

KJV - ghost, life, spirit (-ual, -ually), mind. Compare NT:5590.

<u>God</u> – NT:2316 >qeo/\$ > theos (theh'-os); of uncertain affinity; a deity, especially (with NT:3588) the supreme Divinity; figuratively, a magistrate; by Hebraism, very: KJV - exceeding, God, god [-ly, -ward].

<u>Speaking</u> – NT:2980 >lale/w > laleo (lal-eh'-o); a prolonged form of an otherwise obsolete verb; to talk, i.e. utter words:

KJV - preach, say, speak (after), talk, tell, utter. Compare NT:3004.

<u>Accursed</u> – NT:331 >a)na/qema > anathema (an-ath'-em-ah); from NT:394; a (religious) ban or (concretely) excommunicated (thing or person):

KJV - accused, anathema, curse, great.

<u>Can</u> – NT:1410 >du/namai > dunamai (doo'-nam-ahee); of uncertain affinity; to be able or possible:

KJV - be able, can (do, -not), could, may, might, be possible, be of power.

<u>Holy</u> – NT:40 >a%gio\$ > hagios (hag'-ee-os); from hagos (an awful thing) [compare NT:53, NT:2282]; sacred (physically, pure, morally blameless or religious, ceremonially, consecrated): KJV - (most) holy (one, thing), saint.

KJV - (ad-) minister (-ing, -tration, -try), office, relief, service (-ing).

...from – NT:1249 >dia/kono\$ > diakonos (dee-ak'-on-os); probably from an obsolete diako (to run on errands; compare NT:1377); an attendant, i.e. (genitive case) a waiter (at table or in other menial duties); specially, a Christian teacher and pastor (technically, a deacon or deaconess):

God – NT:2316 >qeo/\$ > theos (theh'-os); of uncertain affinity; a deity, especially (with NT:3588) the supreme Divinity; figuratively, a magistrate; by Hebraism, very: KJV - exceeding, God, god [-ly, -ward].

<u>Profit</u> – NT:4851 >sumfe/rw > sumphero (soom-fer'-o); from NT:4862 and NT:5342 (including its alternate); **to bear together** (contribute), i.e. (literally) **to collect**, or (figuratively) to conduce; especially (neuter participle as a noun) advantage:

KJV - be better for, bring together, be expedient (for), be good, (be) profit (-able for).

...from – NT:4862 >su/n > sun (soon); a primary preposition **denoting union**; with or together (but much closer than NT:3326 or NT:3844), i.e. by association, companionship, process, resemblance, possession, instrumentality, addition, etc.:

KJV - beside, with. In composition it has similar applications, including completeness.

...and from – NT:5342>fe/rw > phero (fer'-o); a primary verb (for which other and apparently not cognate ones are used in certain tenses only; namely, oio (oy'-o); and enegko (en-eng'-ko); to "bear" or carry (in a very wide application, literally and figuratively, as follows):

KJV - be, bear, bring (forth), carry, come, let her drive, be driven, endure, go on, lay, lead, move, reach, rushing, uphold.

<u>Word</u> – NT:3056 >lo/go\$ > logos (log'-os); from NT:3004; something said (including the thought); by implication a topic (subject of discourse), also reasoning (the mental faculty) or motive; by extension, a computation; specifically (with the article in John) the Divine Expression (i.e. Christ):

KJV - account, cause, communication, concerning, doctrine, fame, have to do, intent, matter, mouth, preaching, question, reason, reckon, remove, say (-ing), shew, speaker, speech, talk, thing, none of these things move me, tidings, treatise, utterance, word, work.

<u>Wisdom</u> – NT:4678 >sofi/a > sophia (sof-ee'-ah); from NT:4680; <u>wisdom</u> (higher or lower, worldly or spiritual): KJV - wisdom.

<u>Knowledge</u> – NT:1108 >gnw=si\$ > gnosis (gno'-sis); from NT:1097; knowing (the act), i.e. (by implication) knowledge: KJV - knowledge, science.

<u>Miracles</u> – NT:1411>du/nami\$ > dunamis (doo'-nam-is); from NT:1410; force (literally or figuratively); specially, miraculous power (usually by implication, a miracle itself):

KJV - ability, abundance, meaning, might (-ily, -y, -y deed), (worker of) miracle (-s), power, strength, violence, mighty (wonderful) work.

...from – NT:1410 >du/namai > dunamai (doo'-nam-ahee); of uncertain affinity; to be able or possible:

KJV - be able, can (do, -not), could, may, might, be possible, be of power.

KJV - accept, be amazed, assay, attain, bring, when I call, catch, come on (X unto), forget, have, hold, obtain, receive (X after), take (away, up).

<u>Edifying</u> – NT:3619 >oi)kodomh/ > oikodome (oy-kod-om-ay'); feminine (abstract) of a compound of NT:3624 and the base of NT:1430; architecture, i.e. (concretely) a structure; figuratively, confirmation: KJV - building, edify (-ication, -ing).

# Philippians 1

**7** Even as it is meet for me to think this of you all, because I have you in my **heart**; inasmuch as both in my bonds, and in the defence and **confirmation** of the gospel, ye all are partakers of my grace.

<u>Confirmation</u> – NT:951 >bebai/wsi\$ > bebaiosis (beb-ah'-yo-sis); from NT:950; stabiliment: KJV - confirmation. Balanced...

<u>Instruction</u> – NT:3809 >paidei/a > paideia (pahee-di'-ah); from NT:3811; tutorage, i.e. education or training; by implication, disciplinary correction:

KJV - chastening, chastisement, instruction, nurture.

**17** That the man of God may be <u>perfect</u>, thoroughly <u>furnished</u> unto all good <u>works</u>. <u>Perfect</u> – NT:739 >a&rtio\$ > artios (ar'-tee-os); from NT:737; fresh, i.e. (by implication) complete: KJV - perfect.

<u>Furnished</u> – NT:1822 >e)carti/zw > exartizo (ex-ar-tid'-zo); from NT:1537 and a derivative of NT:739; to finish out (time); figuratively, to equip fully (a teacher): KJV - accomplish, thoroughly furnish.

<u>Works</u> – NT:2041 >e&rgon > ergon (er'-gon); from a primary (but obsolete) ergo (to work); toil (as an effort or occupation); by implication, an act: KJV - deed, doing, labour, work.

- 13 Wherefore let him that speaketh in an unknown [foreign] tongue pray that he may interpret. Tongue NT:1100 >glw=ssa > glossa (gloce-sah'); of uncertain affinity; the tongue; by implication, a language (specially, one naturally unacquired): KJV tongue. Interpret NT:1329 >diermhneu/w > diermeneuo (dee-er-main-yoo'-o); from NT:1223 and NT:2059; to explain thoroughly, by implication, to translate: KJV expound, interpret (-ation).
- **14** For if I pray in an unknown tongue, my spirit <u>prayeth</u>, but my <u>understanding</u> is <u>unfruitful</u>. <u>Prayeth</u> – NT:4336 >proseu/xomai > proseuchomai (pros-yoo'-khom-ahee); from NT:4314 and NT:2172; to pray to God, i.e. supplicate, worship: KJV - pray (X earnestly, for), make prayer. <u>Understanding</u> – NT:3563 >nou=\$ > nous (nooce); probably from the base of NT:1097; the intellect, i.e. mind (divine or human; in thought, feeling, or will); by implication meaning: KJV - mind, understanding. Compare NT:5590.

<u>Unfruitful</u> – NT:175 >a&karpo\$ > akarpos (ak'-ar-pos); from NT:1 (as a negative particle) and NT:2590; barren (literally or figuratively): KJV - without fruit, unfruitful.

- **15** What is it then? I will pray with the spirit, and I will pray with the <u>understanding</u> also: I will sing with the spirit, and I will sing with the <u>understanding</u> also. <u>Understanding</u> NT:3563 >nou=\$ > nous (nooce); probably from the base of NT:1097; the intellect, i.e. mind (divine or human; in thought, feeling, or will); by implication <u>meaning</u>: KJV mind, understanding. Compare NT:5590.
- **16** Else when thou shalt bless with the spirit, how shall he that <u>occupieth</u> the room of the unlearned say <u>Amen</u> at thy giving of thanks, seeing he understandeth not what thou sayest? <u>Occupieth</u> NT:378 >a)naplhro/w > anapleroo (an-ap-lay-ro'-o); from NT:303 and NT:4137; to complete; by implication, to occupy, supply; figuratively, to accomplish (by coincidence ot obedience): KJV fill up, fulfill, occupy, supply. <u>Amen</u> NT:281 >a)mh/n > amen (am-ane'); of Hebrew origin [OT:543]; properly, firm, i.e. (figuratively) trustworthy; adverbially, surely (often as interj. so be it): KJV amen, verily.
- 17 For thou verily givest thanks well, but the other is not <u>edified</u>.

  <u>Edified</u> NT:3618 >oi)kodome/w > oikodomeo (oy-kod-om-eh'-o); from the same as NT:3619; to be a house-builder, i.e. construct or (figuratively) confirm:

  KJV (be in) build (-er, -ing, up), edify, embolden.

### 1 Corinthians 14

**18** I thank my God, I speak with tongues more than ye all:

- 22 Wherefore tongues are for a <u>sign</u>, not to them that believe, but to them that believe not: but prophesying serveth not for them that believe not, but for them which believe.

...from – NT:4591 >shmai/nw > semaino (say-mah'-ee-no); from sema (a mark; of uncertain derivation); to indicate: KJV - signify.

- 23 If therefore the whole church be come together into one place, and all speak with tongues, and there come in those that are unlearned, or unbelievers, will they not say that ye are mad? ...it is a cacophonous noise!
- **24** But if all prophesy, and there come in one that believeth not, or one <u>unlearned</u>, he is <u>convinced</u> of all, he is judged of all:

<u>unlearned</u> – NT:2399 >i)diw/th\$ > idiotes (id-ee-o'-tace); from NT:2398; a private person, i.e. (by implication) an ignoramus (compare "idiot"): KJV - ignorant, rude, unlearned.\

<u>Convinced</u> – NT:1651>e)le/gxw > elegcho (el-eng'-kho); of uncertain affinity; to confute, admonish: KJV - convict, convince, tell a fault, rebuke, reprove.

### 1 Corinthians 14

**25** And thus are the <u>secrets</u> of his heart made <u>manifest</u>; and so falling down on his face he will worship God, and report that God is in you of a truth.

<u>Secrets</u> – NT:2927 >krupto/\$ > kruptos (kroop-tos'); from NT:2928; concealed, i.e. private: KJV - hid (-den), inward [-ly], secret.

<u>Manifest</u> – NT:5318 >fanero/\$ > phaneros (fan-er-os'); from NT:5316; shining, i.e. apparent (literally or figuratively); neuter (as adverb) publicly, externally:

KJV - abroad, appear, known, manifest, open [+-ly], outward ([+-ly]).

**26** How is it then, brethren? when ye come together, every one of you hath a psalm, hath a doctrine, hath a tongue, hath a revelation, hath an interpretation. Let all things be done unto <u>edifying</u>.

<u>Edifying</u> – NT:3619 >oi)kodomh/ > oikodome (oy-kod-om-ay'); feminine (abstract) of a compound of NT:3624 and the base of NT:1430; architecture, i.e. (concretely) a structure; figuratively, confirmation: KJV - building, edify (-ication, -ing).

**27** If any man speak in an unknown tongue, let it be by two, or at the most by three, and that by course; and **let one interpret**.

28 But if there be no interpreter, let him keep silence in the church; and let him speak to himself, and to God.

29 Let the prophets speak two or three, and let the other judge.

<u>Prophets</u> – NT:4396>profh/th\$ > prophetes (prof-ay'-tace); from a compound of NT:4253 and NT:5346; a foreteller ("prophet"); by analogy, an inspired speaker; by extension, a poet: KJV - prophet.

<u>Judge</u> – NT:1252 >diakri/nw > diakrino (dee-ak-ree'-no); from NT:1223 and NT:2919; to separate thoroughly, i.e. (literally and reflexively) to withdraw from, or (by implication) oppose; figuratively, to discriminate (by implication, decide), or (reflexively) hesitate:

KJV - contend, make (to) differ (-ence), discern, doubt, judge, be partial, stagger, waver.

**30** If any thing be revealed to another that sitteth by, let the first hold his peace.

**31** For ye may all **prophesy one by one**, that all may <u>learn</u>, and all may be <u>comforted</u>. <u>Learn</u> – NT:3129 >manqa/nw > manthano (man-than'-o); prolongation from a primary verb, another form of which, matheo, is used as an alternate in certain tenses; to learn (in any way): KJV - learn, understand.

<u>Comforted</u> – NT:3870 >parakale/w > parakaleo (par-ak-al-eh'-o); from NT:3844 and NT:2564; to call near, i.e. invite, invoke (by imploration, hortation or consolation):

KJV - beseech, call for, (be of good) comfort, desire, (give) exhort (-ation), intreat, pray.

### 1 Corinthians 14

**32** And the spirits of the prophets are subject to the prophets.

<u>Subject</u> – NT:5293 >u(pota/ssw > hupotasso (hoop-ot-as'-so); from NT:5259 and NT:5021; to subordinate; reflexively, to obey:

KJV - be under obedience (obedient), put under, subdue unto, (be, make) subject (to, unto), be (put) in subjection (to, under), submitself unto.

#### Romans 13

**1** Let every soul be **subject** unto the higher powers. For there is no power but of God: the powers that be are ordained of God.

**33** For **God is not the author of <u>confusion</u>**, but of peace, as in all churches of the saints. <u>Confusion</u> – NT:181>a)katastasi/a > akatastasia (ak-at-as-tah-see'-ah); from NT:182; instability, i.e. disorder: KJV - commotion, confusion, tumult. ...from – NT:182 >a)kata/stato\$ > akatastatos (ak-at-as'-tat-os); from NT:1 (as a negative particle) and a derivative of NT:2525; inconstant: KJV - unstable.

#### Hebrews 12

**9** Furthermore we have had fathers of our flesh which corrected us, and we gave them reverence: shall we not much rather be in **subject**ion unto the Father of spirits, and live?

#### James 1

- **8** A double minded man is unstable in **all his ways**.
- **34** Let your women keep silence in the churches: for it is not permitted unto them to speak; but they are commanded to be under obedience as also saith the law.
- **35** And if they will learn any thing, let them ask their husbands at home: for it is a shame for women to speak in the church.
- **36** What? came the word of God out from you? or came it unto you only?
- **37 If any man think himself** to be a prophet, or spiritual, let him acknowledge that the things that I write unto you are the commandments of the Lord.
- **38** But if any man be ignorant, let him be ignorant.
- **39** Wherefore, brethren, covet to prophesy, and **forbid not to speak with tongues**.

### 40 Let all things be done decently and in order.

<u>Decently</u> – NT:2156 >eu)sxhmo/nw\$ > euschemonos (yoo-skhay-mon'-ose); adverb from NT:2158; decorously: KJV - decently, honestly.

<u>Order</u> – NT:5010 >ta/ci\$ > taxis (tax'-is); from NT:5021; regular arrangement, i.e. (in time) fixed succession (of rank or character), official dignity: KJV - order.

### **Romans 11:29**

For the **gifts** and calling of God are without repentance.

### Romans 12

- **5** So we, being many, are one body in Christ, and every one members one of another.
- **6** Having then gifts differing according to the grace that is given to us, whether prophecy, let us prophesy according to the proportion of faith;
- **7** Or ministry, let us wait on our ministering: or he that teacheth, on teaching;
- **8** Or he that exhorteth, on exhortation: he that giveth, let him do it with simplicity; he that ruleth, with diligence; he that sheweth mercy, with cheerfulness.
- **9** Let love be without dissimulation. Abhor that which is evil; cleave to that which is good.
- **10** Be kindly affectioned one to another with brotherly love; in honour preferring one another;
- 11 Not slothful in business; fervent in spirit; serving the Lord;

- **14** Bless them which persecute you: bless, and curse not.
- **15** Rejoice with them that do rejoice, and weep with them that weep.
- **16** Be of the same mind one toward another. Mind not high things, but condescend to men of low estate. Be not wise in your own conceits.
- **17** Recompense to no man evil for evil. Provide things honest in the sight of all men.
- **18** If it be possible, as much as lieth in you, live peaceably with all men.
- **19** Dearly beloved, avenge not yourselves, but rather give place unto wrath: for it is written, Vengeance is mine; I will repay, saith the Lord.
- **20** Therefore if thine enemy hunger, feed him; if he thirst, give him drink: for in so doing thou shalt heap coals of fire on his head.
- 21 Be not overcome of evil, but overcome evil with good.
