<u>Alienated</u> – <u>NT:526</u> άπαλλοτριόω **apallotrioo** (ap-al-lot-ree-o'-o); from <u>NT:575</u> and a derivative of <u>NT:245</u>; to estrange away, i.e. (passively and figuratively) to be non-participant: *KJV* - alienate, be alien.

<u>Enemies</u> – <u>NT:2190</u> έχθρός **echthros** (ech-thros'); from a primary echtho (to hate); hateful (passively, odious, or actively, hostile); usually as a noun, an adversary (especially Satan): **KJV** - enemy, foe.

<u>Reconciled</u> – <u>NT:604</u> άποκαταλλάσσω **apokatallasso** (ap-ok-at-al-las'-so); from <u>NT:575</u> and <u>NT:2644</u>; to reconcile fully: **KJV** - reconcile.

...from – <u>NT:575</u> $\dot{\alpha}\pi \dot{\alpha}$ **apo** (apo'); a primary particle; "off," i.e. away (from something near), in various senses (of place, time, or relation; literal or figurative):

KJV - (X here-) after, ago, at, because of, before, by (the space of), for (-th), from, in, (out) of, off, (up-) on (-ce), since, with. In composition (as a prefix) it usually denotes separation, departure, cessation, completion, reversal, etc.

...from – <u>NT:2644</u> καταλλάσσω **katallasso** (kat-al-las'-so); from <u>NT:2596</u> and <u>NT:236</u>; to change mutually, i.e. (figuratively) to compound a difference: *KJV* - reconcile.

<u>Wicked – NT:4190</u> πονηρός **poneros** (pon-ay-ros'); from a derivative of <u>NT:4192</u>; hurtful, i.e. evil (properly, in effect or influence, and thus differing from <u>NT:2556</u>, which refers rather to essential character, as well as from <u>NT:4550</u>, which indicates degeneracy from original virtue); figuratively, calamitous; also (passively) ill, i.e. diseased; but especially (morally) culpable, i.e. derelict, vicious, facinorous; neuter (singular) mischief, malice, or (plural) guilt; masculine (singular) the devil, or (plural) sinners:

KJV - bad, evil, grievous, harm, lewd, malicious, wicked (-ness). See also NT:4191.

<u>Present</u> – <u>NT:3936</u> παρίστημι **paristemi** (par-is'-tay-mee); or **prolonged paristano** (par-is-tan'-o); from <u>NT:3844</u> and <u>NT:2476</u>; to stand beside, i.e. (transitively) to <u>exhibit</u>, proffer, (specifically) <u>recommend</u>, (figuratively) substantiate; or (intransitively) to be at hand (or ready), aid:

KJV - assist, bring before, command, commend, give presently, present, prove, provide, shew, stand (before, by, here, up, with), yield.

<u>Sight</u> – <u>NT:2714</u> κατενώπιον **katenopion** (kat-en-o'-pee-on); from <u>NT:2596</u> and <u>NT:1799; directly in front of</u>: *KJV* - before (the presence of), in the sight of. <u>Holy</u> – <u>NT:40</u> άγιος **hagios** (hag'-ee-os); from **hagos** (an awful thing) [compare <u>NT:53</u>, <u>NT:2282</u>]; sacred (physically, pure, morally blameless or religious, ceremonially, consecrated): *KJV* - (most) holy (one, thing), saint.

<u>Unblameable</u> – <u>NT:299</u> άμωμος **amomos** (am'-o-mos); from <u>NT:1</u> (as a negative particle) and <u>NT:3470</u>; <u>unblemished</u> (literally or figuratively): *KJV* - without blame (blemish, fault, spot), faultless, unblameable.

<u>Unreproveable</u> – <u>NT:410</u> ἀνέγκλητος **anegkletos** (an-eng'-klay-tos); from <u>NT:1</u> (as a negative particle) and a derivative of <u>NT:1458</u>; unaccused, i.e. (by implication) <u>irreproachable</u>: **KJV** - blameless.[faultless, flawless, ..fine!]

<u>Chaste</u> – <u>NT:53</u> άγνός **hagnos** (hag-nos'); from the same as <u>NT:40</u>; properly, clean, i.e. (figuratively) innocent, modest, perfect: **KJV** - chaste, clean, pure.

³But I fear, lest by any means, as the serpent beguiled Eve through his subtilty, so your minds should be corrupted from the simplicity that is in Christ.

<u>Virgin</u> – <u>NT:53</u> άγνός **hagnos** (hag-nos'); from the same as <u>NT:40</u>; properly, clean, i.e. (figuratively) innocent, modest, perfect: *KJV* - chaste, clean, pure.

...from – <u>NT:40</u> $\ddot{\alpha}$ γιος **hagios** (hag'-ee-os); from **hagos** (an awful thing) [compare <u>NT:53</u>, <u>NT:2282</u>]; sacred (physically, pure, morally blameless or religious, ceremonially, consecrated): **KJV** - (most) holy (one, thing), saint.

<u>Falling</u> – <u>NT:679</u> $\mathring{\alpha}$ πταιστος **aptaistos** (ap-tah'-ee-stos); from <u>NT:1</u> (as a negative particle) and a derivative of <u>NT:4417</u>; not stumbling, i.e. (figuratively) without sin: *KJV* - from falling.

<u>Faultless</u> – <u>NT:299</u> $\ddot{\alpha}$ μωμος **amomos** (am'-o-mos); from <u>NT:1</u> (as a negative particle) and NT:3470; unblemished (literally or figuratively):

KJV - without blame (blemish, fault, spot), faultless, unblameable.

²⁵ To the only wise God our Saviour, be glory and majesty, dominion and power, both now and ever. Amen.

<u>**Harmless**</u> – <u>NT:185</u> ἀκέραιος **akeraios** (ak-er'-ah-yos); from <u>NT:1</u> (as a negative particle) and a presumed derivative of <u>NT:2767</u>; <u>unmixed</u>, i.e. (figuratively) <u>innocent</u>: *KJV* - harmless, simple.

<u>Without rebuke</u> – <u>NT:299</u> άμωμος **amomos** (am'-o-mos); from <u>NT:1</u> (as a negative particle) and <u>NT:3470</u>; unblemished (literally or figuratively):

KJV - without blame (blemish, fault, spot), faultless, unblameable.

¹⁶ Holding forth the word of life; that I may rejoice in the day of Christ, that I have not run in vain, neither laboured in vain.

<u>Conscience</u> – <u>NT:4893</u> συνείδησις **suneidesis** (soon-i'-day-sis); from a prolonged form of <u>NT:4894</u>; coperception, i.e. moral consciousness: **KJV** - conscience.

1 Timothy 6 ... follow after Him

¹¹But thou, O man of God, flee these things; and **follow after righteousness**, **godliness**, **faith**, **love**, **patience**, **meekness**.

¹²Fight the good fight of faith, lay hold on eternal life, whereunto thou art also called, and hast professed a good profession before many witnesses.

<u>Continue</u> – <u>NT:1961</u> $\dot{\epsilon}\pi\iota\mu\dot{\epsilon}\nu\omega$ **epimeno** (ep-ee-men'-o); from <u>NT:1909</u> and <u>NT:3306</u>; to stay over, i.e. remain (figuratively, <u>persevere</u>): **KJV** - abide (in), continue (in), tarry.

Grounded

<u>Grounded</u> – <u>NT:2311</u> θ εμελιόω **themelioo** (them-el-ee-o'-o); from <u>NT:2310</u>; to lay a basis for, i.e. (literally) erect, or (figuratively) consolidate: **KJV** - (lay the) found (-ation), ground, settle.

Settled

<u>Settled</u> – <u>NT:1476</u> έδραῖος **hedraios** (hed-rah'-yos); from a derivative of **hezomai** (to sit); sedentary, i.e. (by implication) immovable: **KJV** - settled, stedfast.

<u>Moved away</u> – <u>NT:3334</u>μετακινέω **metakineo** (met-ak-ee-neh'-o); from <u>NT:3326</u> and <u>NT:2795</u>; to stir to a place elsewhere, i.e. remove (figuratively): *KJV* - move away.

Hopeful

<u>Hope – NT:1680</u> $\dot{\epsilon}\lambda\pi$ í ζ **elpis** (el-pece'); from a primary **elpo** (to anticipate, usually with pleasure); expectation (abstractly or concretely) or confidence: *KJV* - faith, hope.

<u>Preached</u> – <u>NT:2784</u> κηρύσσω **kerusso** (kay-roos'-so); of uncertain affinity; to herald (as a public crier), especially divine truth (the gospel): **KJV** - preacher (-er), proclaim, publish.

<u>Creature</u> – <u>NT:2937</u> κτίσις **ktisis** (ktis'-is); from <u>NT:2936</u>; original formation (properly, the act; by implication, the thing, literally or figuratively): **KJV** - building, creation, creature, ordinance.

<u>Minister</u> – <u>NT:1249</u>διάκονος **diakonos** (dee-ak'-on-os); probably from an obsolete **diako** (to run on errands; compare <u>NT:1377</u>); an attendant, i.e. (genitive case) a waiter (at table or in other menial duties); specially, a Christian teacher and pastor (technically, a deacon or deaconess): *KJV* - deacon, minister, servant.

¹⁶ Take heed unto thyself, and unto the doctrine; continue in them: for in doing this thou shalt both save thyself, and them that hear thee.

2 Timothy 3

Afflictions

Colossians 1

²⁴ Who now <u>rejoice</u> in my <u>sufferings</u> for you, and fill up that which is <u>behind</u> of the <u>afflictions</u> of Christ [Messiah] in my flesh for his body's sake, which is the <u>church</u>:

We suffer but not to the extent that Christ suffered yet following after and fulfilling His suffer through the living sacrifice of ourselves for the body of Christ, for His sake, for the church.

<u>Rejoice</u> – <u>NT:5463</u> $\chi \alpha i \rho \omega$ **chairo** (khah'-ee-ro); a primary verb; to be "cheerful", i.e. calmly happy or well-off; impersonally, especially as salutation (on meeting or parting), be well:

KJV - farewell, be glad, God speed, greeting, hall, joy (-fully), rejoice.

<u>Sufferings</u> – <u>NT:3804</u> πάθημα **pathema** (path'-ay-mah); from a presumed derivative of <u>NT:3806</u>; something undergone, i.e. hardship or pain; subjectively, an emotion or influence: **KJV** - affection, affliction, motion, suffering.

...from – <u>NT:3806</u>πάθος **pathos** (path'-os); from the alternate of <u>NT:3958</u>; properly, suffering ("pathos"), i.e. (subjectively) a passion (especially concupiscence): *KJV* - (inordinate) affection, lust.

<u>Behind</u> – <u>NT:5303</u> ὑστέρημα **husterema** (hoos-ter'-ay-mah); from <u>NT:5302</u>; a deficit; specifically, poverty:

KJV - that which is behind, (that which was) lack (-ing), penury, want.

...from – <u>NT:5302</u> ὑστερέω **hustereo** (hoos-ter-eh'-o); from <u>NT:5306</u>; to be later, i.e. (by implication) to be inferior; generally, to fall short (be deficient): *KJV* - come behind (short), be destitute, fail, lack, suffer need, (be in) want, be the worse.

...from – <u>NT:5306</u> ὕστερος **husteros** (hoos'-ter-os); comparative from <u>NT:5259</u> (in the sense of behind); later: *KJV* - latter.

<u>Afflictions</u> – <u>NT:2347</u> $\theta\lambda$ i $\psi\iota\varsigma$ **thlipsis** (thlip'-sis); from <u>NT:2346</u>; pressure (lit or fig):

KJV - afflicted (-tion), anguish, burdened, persecution, tribulation, trouble.

...from – <u>NT:2346</u> $\theta\lambda$ í $\beta\omega$ **thlibo** (thlee'-bo); akin to the base of <u>NT:5147</u>; to crowd (literally or figuratively):

KJV - afflict, narrow, throng, suffer tribulation, trouble.

<u>Church</u> – <u>NT:1577</u> ἐκκλησία **ekklesia** (ek-klay-see'-ah); from a compound of <u>NT:1537</u> and a derivative of <u>NT:2564</u>; a calling out, i.e. (concretely) a popular meeting, especially a religious congregation (Jewish synagogue, or Christian community of members on earth or saints in heaven or both): **KJV** - assembly, church.

Afflictions (cont)

Colossians 1

²⁴ Who now rejoice in my sufferings for you, and fill up that which is behind of the afflictions of Christ [Messiah] in my flesh for his body's sake, which is the church:

Psalm 22

 24 For he hath not despised nor abhorred the **affliction** of the afflicted; neither hath he hid his face from him; but when he cried unto him, he heard.

Jonah 2

 2 And said, I cried by reason of mine **affliction** unto the LORD, and he heard me; out of the belly of hell cried I, and thou heardest my voice.

Psalm 34

¹⁹ Many are the **affliction**s of the righteous: but the LORD delivereth him out of them all.

2 Corinthians 4

Dispensation

<u>Dispensation</u> – <u>NT:3622</u> οἰκονομία **oikonomia** (oy-kon-om-ee'-ah); from <u>NT:3623</u>; <u>administration</u> (of a household or estate); specifically, a (religious) "economy": *KJV* - dispensation, stewardship.

<u>Fulfil</u> – <u>NT:4137</u> πληρόω **pleroo** (play-ro'-o); from <u>NT:4134</u>; to make replete, i.e. (literally) to cram (a net), level up (a hollow), or (figuratively) to furnish (or imbue, diffuse, influence), satisfy, execute (an office), finish (a period or task), verify (or coincide with a prediction), etc.:

KJV - accomplish, [×] after, (be) complete, end, expire, fill (up), fulfil, (be, make) full (come), fully preach, perfect, supply.

...from – <u>NT:4134</u> πλήρης **pleres** (play'-race); from <u>NT:4130</u>; replete, or covered over; by analogy, complete: *KJV* - full.

Ephesians 1

¹⁰ That in the **dispensation** of the fulness of times he might gather together in one all things in Christ, both which are in heaven, and which are on earth; even in him:

Ephesians 3

¹For this cause I Paul, the prisoner of Jesus Christ for you Gentiles,

Manifestation

Colossians 1

²⁶ Even the <u>mystery</u> which hath been hid from <u>ages</u> and from <u>generations</u>, but now is made <u>manifest</u> to his saints:

<u>Mystery</u> – <u>NT:3466</u> μ UOT η ρ IOV **musterion** (moos-tay'-ree-on); from a derivative of muo (to shut the mouth); a secret or "mystery" (through the idea of silence imposed by initiation into religious rites): **KJV** - mystery.

<u>Ages</u> – <u>NT:165</u> α i $\dot{\omega}\nu$ **aion** (ahee-ohn'); from the same as <u>NT:104</u>; properly, an age; by extension, perpetuity (also past); by implication, the world; specially (Jewish) a Messianic period (present or future):

KJV - age, course, eternal, (for) ever (-more), [n-] ever, (beginning of the while the) world (began, without end). Compare <u>NT:5550</u>.

<u>Generations</u> – <u>NT:1074</u> $\gamma \epsilon \nu \epsilon \dot{\alpha}$ **genea** (ghen-eh-ah'); from (a presumed derivative of) <u>NT:1085</u>; a generation; by implication, an age (the period or the persons): *KJV* - age, generation, nation, time.

<u>Manifest</u> – <u>NT:5319</u> ϕ ανερόω **phaneroo** (fan-er-o'-o); from <u>NT:5318</u>; to render apparent (literally or figuratively):

KJV - appear, manifestly declare, (make) manifest (forth), shew (self).

...from – <u>NT:5318</u> ϕ ανερός **phaneros** (fan-er-os'); from <u>NT:5316</u>; shining, i.e. apparent (literally or figuratively); neuter (as adverb) publicly, externally: *KJV* - abroad, + appear, known, manifest, open [+-ly], outward ([+-ly]).

Mark 4

<u>Riches</u> – <u>NT:4149</u> πλοῦτος **ploutos** (ploo'-tos); from the base of <u>NT:4130</u>; wealth (as fulness), i.e. (literally) money, possessions, or (figuratively) abundance, richness, (specifically) valuable bestowment: **KJV** - riches.

<u>Glory – NT:1391</u> $\delta\delta\xi\alpha$ **doxa** (dox'-ah); from the base of <u>NT:1380</u>; <u>glory</u> (as <u>very</u> <u>apparent</u>), in a wide application (literal or figurative, objective or subjective): **KJV** - dignity, glory (-ious), honour, praise, worship.

1 Timothy 3

16 And without controversy great is the **mystery** of godliness: God was manifest in the flesh, justified in the Spirit, seen of angels, preached unto the Gentiles, believed on in the world, received up into glory.

Ephesians 1:9

Having made known unto us the **mystery** of his will, according to his good pleasure which he hath purposed in himself:

Perfection

Colossians 1

²⁸ Whom we preach, <u>warning</u> every man, and <u>teaching</u> every man in all wisdom; that we may <u>present</u> every man <u>perfect</u> in Christ Jesus:

<u>Warning</u> – <u>NT:3560</u> VOU $\theta \epsilon \tau \dot{\epsilon} \omega$ **noutheteo** (noo-thet-eh'-o); from the same as <u>NT:3559</u>; to put in mind, i.e. (by implication) to caution or <u>reprove gently [criticize, scold, admonish, tell off]</u>: *KJV* - admonish, warn.

...from – <u>NT:3559</u> VOU $\theta \epsilon \sigma i \alpha$ **nouthesia** (noo-thes-ee'-ah); from <u>NT:3563</u> and a derivative of <u>NT:5087</u>; calling attention to, i.e. (by implication) mild rebuke or warning: *KJV* - admonition.

Psalm 141

⁵ Let the righteous smite me; it shall be a kindness: and let him **reprove** me; it shall be an excellent oil, which shall not break my head: for yet my prayer also shall be in their calamities.

Proverbs 9

⁸ **Reprove** not a scorner, lest he hate thee: **rebuke a wise man, and he will love thee.**

Proverbs 29

¹ He, that being often **reprove**d hardeneth his neck, shall suddenly be destroyed, and that without remedy.

<u>Teaching</u> – <u>NT:1321</u>διδάσκω **didasko** (did-as'-ko); a prolonged (causative) form of a primary verb dao (to learn); to teach (in the same broad application): **KJV** - teach.

<u>Present</u> – <u>NT:3936</u> παρίστημι **paristemi** (par-is'-tay-mee); or **prolonged paristano** (par-is-tan'-o); from <u>NT:3844</u> and <u>NT:2476</u>; to stand beside, i.e. (transitively) to exhibit, proffer, (specifically) recommend, (figuratively) substantiate; or (intransitively) to be at hand (or ready), aid:

KJV - assist, bring before, command, commend, give presently, present, prove, provide, shew, stand (before, by, here, up, with), yield.

Perfect – <u>NT:5046</u> τέλειος **teleios** (tel'-i-os); from <u>NT:5056</u>; <u>complete</u> (in various applications of labor, growth, mental and moral character, etc.); neuter (as noun, with <u>NT:3588</u>) completeness: *KJV* - of full age, man, perfect. ...[mature]

Operation

Colossians 1

²⁹ Whereunto I also <u>labour</u>, <u>striving</u> according to his <u>working</u>, which worketh in me mightily. <u>Labour</u> – <u>NT:2872</u> KOΠιάω **kopiao** (kop-ee-ah'-o); from a derivative of <u>NT:2873</u>; to feel fatigue; by implication, to work hard: **KJV** - (bestow) labour, toil, be wearied. <u>Striving</u> – <u>NT:75</u> ἀγωνίζομαι **agonizomai** (ag-o-nid'-zom-ahee); from <u>NT:73</u>; to struggle, literally (to compete for a prize), figuratively (to contend with an adversary), or genitive case (to endeavor to accomplish something): **KJV** - fight, labor fervently, strive.

<u>Working</u> – <u>NT:1753</u> ένέργεια **energeia** (en-erg'-i-ah); from <u>NT:1756</u>; efficiency ("energy"): *KJV* - operation, strong, (effectual) working.

...from – <u>NT:1756</u> ένεργής **energes** (en-er-gace'); from <u>NT:1722</u> and <u>NT:2041</u>; active, operative: *KJV* - effectual, powerful.
