Love in the Truth Known in Us

2 John 1

¹ The <u>elder</u> unto the <u>elect lady</u> and her <u>children</u>, whom I <u>love</u> in the <u>truth</u>; and not I only, but also all they that have <u>known</u> the <u>truth</u>;

Elder – NT:4245 πρεσβύτερος **presbuteros** (pres-boo'-ter-os); comparative of presbus (elderly); older; as noun, a senior; specifically, an Israelite Sanhedrist (also figuratively, member of the celestial council) or Christian "presbyter": $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - elder (-est), old.

Elect – NT:1588 ἐκλεκτός **eklektos** (ek-lek-tos'); from NT:1586; select; by implication, favorite: **KJV** - chosen, elect.

<u>Lady</u> – <u>NT:2959</u> $K \cup \rho i \alpha$ **Kuria** (koo-ree'-ah); feminine of <u>NT:2962</u>; Cyria, a Christian woman: **KJV** - lady.

<u>Children</u> – <u>NT:5043</u> Τέκνον **teknon** (tek'-non); from the base of <u>NT:5088</u>; a child (as produced): *KJV* - child, daughter, son.

<u>Love</u> – <u>NT:25</u> ἀγαπάω **agapao** (ag-ap-ah'-o); perhaps from **agan** (much) [or compare OT:5689]; to love (in a social or moral sense):

KJV - (be-) love (-ed). Compare NT:5368.

<u>Truth</u> – NT:225 ἀλήθεια **aletheia** (al-ay'-thi-a); from NT:227; truth:

KJV - true, ^x truly, truth, verity.

<u>Known</u> – <u>NT:1097</u> γινώσκω **ginosko** (ghin-oce'-ko); a prolonged form of a primary verb; to "know" (absolutely) in a great variety of applications and with many implications (as follow, with others not thus clearly expressed):

KJV - allow, be aware (of), feel, (have) know (-ledge), perceived, be resolved, can speak, be sure, understand.

Dwells in Us

2 John 1

² For the <u>truth's</u> sake, which <u>dwelleth</u> in us, and shall be with us for <u>ever</u>.

<u>Truth's</u> – <u>NT:225</u> ἀλήθεια **aletheia** (al-ay'-thi-a); from <u>NT:227</u>; truth:

KJV - true, ^x truly, truth, verity.

<u>Dwelleth</u> – <u>NT:3306</u> μένω **meno** (men'-o); a primary verb; to stay (in a given place, state, relation or expectancy):

KJV - abide, continue, dwell, endure, be present, remain, stand, tarry (for), ^X thine own.

<u>Ever</u> – T:165 α lών **aion** (ahee-ohn'); from the same as <u>NT:104</u>; properly, an age; by extension, perpetuity (also past); by implication, the world; specially (Jewish) a Messianic period (present or future):

KJV - age, course, eternal, (for) ever (-more), [n-] ever, (beginning of the while the) world (began, without end). Compare NT:5550.

John 14

¹⁷ Even the Spirit of truth; whom the world cannot receive, because it seeth him not, neither knoweth him: **but ye know him**; **for he dwelleth with you, and shall be in you**.

John 8

Why do ye not understand my speech? even because ye cannot hear my word.

<u>Grace</u> – <u>NT:5485</u> χάρις **charis** (khar'-ece); from <u>NT:5463</u>; graciousness (as gratifying), of manner or act (abstract or concrete; literal, figurative or spiritual; especially the divine influence upon the heart, and its reflection in the life; including gratitude): **KJV** - acceptable, benefit, favour, gift, grace (-ious), joy, liberality, pleasure, thank (-s, -worthy).

2 Corinthians 8

⁷ Therefore, as ye **abound in every thing**, in **faith**, and **utterance**, and **knowledge**, and in all **diligence**, and in your love to us, **see that ye abound in this grace also**.

Mercy – NT:1656 ἔλεος **eleos** (el'-eh-os); of uncertain affinity; compassion (human or divine, especially active): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - (+tender) mercy.

Peace – NT:1515 εἰρήνη **eirene** (i-ray'-nay); probably from a primary verb eiro (to join); peace (literally or figuratively); by implication, prosperity:

KJV - one, peace, quietness, rest, + set at one again.

<u>Truth</u> – <u>NT:225</u> ἀλήθεια **aletheia** (al-ay'-thi-a); from <u>NT:227</u>; truth:

KJV - true, ^x truly, truth, verity.

<u>Love</u> – <u>NT:26</u> ἀγάπη **agape** (ag-ah'-pay); from <u>NT:25</u>; love, i.e. affection or benevolence; specially (plural) a love-feast:

KJV - (feast of) charity ([-ably]), dear, love.

Ephesians 6

²⁴ Grace be with all them that love our Lord Jesus Christ in sincerity. Amen.

Sincerity – NT:861 ἀφθαρσία **aphthrsia** (af-thar-see'-ah); from NT:862; incorruptibility; genitive case unending existence; (figuratively) genuineness: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - immortality, incorruption, sincerity.

1 Timothy 1

Galatians 5

⁶ For in Jesus Christ neither circumcision availeth any thing, nor uncircumcision; but **faith which worketh by** <u>love</u>.

<u>Love</u> – <u>NT:26</u> ἀγάπη **agape** (ag-ah'-pay) – love, i.e. affection or benevolence; specially (pl) a love-feast: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - (feast of) charity ([-ably]), dear, love.

¹⁴ And the grace of our Lord was exceeding abundant with faith and love which is in Christ Jesus.

Walk in the Truth

Rejoicing

2 John 1

⁴I <u>rejoiced greatly</u> that I <u>found</u> of thy <u>children walking</u> in <u>truth</u>, as we have <u>received</u> a <u>commandment</u> from the Father.

Rejoiced – NT:5463 χαίρω **chairo** (khah'-ee-ro); a primary verb; to be "cheerful", i.e. calmly happy or well-off; impersonally, especially as salutation (on meeting or parting), be well:

KJV - farewell, be glad, God speed, greeting, hall, joy (-fully), rejoice.

Greatly – NT:3029 $\lambda i \alpha v$ lian (lee'-an); of uncertain affinity; much (adverbially):

KJV - exceeding, great (-ly), sore, very (+chiefest).

Found – NT:2147 εὑρίσκω **heurisko** (hyoo-ris'-ko); a prolonged form of a primary heuro (hyoo'-ro); which (together with another cognate form heureo (hyoo-reh'-o)) is used for it in all the tenses except the present and imperfect; to find (literally or figuratively): **KJV** - find, get, obtain, perceive, see.

<u>Children</u> – <u>NT:5043</u> Τέκνον **teknon** (tek'-non); from the base of <u>NT:5088</u>; a child (as produced): *KJV* - child, daughter, son.

<u>Walking</u> – <u>NT:4043</u> περιπατέω **peripateo** (per-ee-pat-eh'-o); from <u>NT:4012</u> and <u>NT:3961</u>; to tread all around, i.e. walk at large (especially as proof of ability); figuratively, to live, deport oneself, follow (as a companion or votary):

KJV - go, be occupied with, walk (about).

Truth – NT:225 ἀλήθεια **aletheia** (al-ay'-thi-a); from NT:227; truth:

KJV - true, X truly, truth, verity.

Psalm 86

¹¹ Teach me thy way, O LORD; I will walk in thy truth: unite my heart to fear thy name.

Received – NT:2983 λαμβάνω **lambano** (lam-ban'-o); a prolonged form of a primary verb, which is use only as an alternate in certain tenses; to take (in very many applications, literally and figuratively [properly objective or active, to get hold of; whereas NT:1209 is rather subjective or passive, to have offered to one; while NT:138 is more violent, to seize or remove]):

KJV - accept, + be amazed, assay, attain, bring, *when I call, catch, come on (X unto), +forget, have, hold, obtain, receive (X after), take (away, up).

Commandment – NT:1785 ἐντολή **entole** (en-tol-ay'); from NT:1781; injunction, i.e. an authoritative prescription: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - commandment, precept.

1 Corinthians 13

⁶ Rejoiceth not in iniquity, but **rejoiceth in the truth**;

3 John 1

³ For I rejoiced greatly, when the **brethren came** and **testified of the truth** that is in thee, even as thou **walkest in the truth**.

Beseech – NT:2065 ἐρωτάω **erotao** (er-o-tah'-o); apparently from NT:2046 [compare NT:2045]; to interrogate; by implication, to request:

KJV - ask, beseech, desire, intreat, pray. Compare NT:4441.

<u>Lady</u> – <u>NT:2959</u> $K \cup \rho i \alpha$ **Kuria** (koo-ree'-ah); feminine of <u>NT:2962</u>; Cyria, a Christian woman: **KJV** - lady.

<u>Wrote</u> – <u>NT:1125</u> γράφω **grapho** (graf'-o); a primary verb; to "grave", especially to write; figuratively, to describe: *KJV* - describe, write (-ing, -ten).

New – NT:2537 καινός **kainos** (kahee-nos'); of uncertain affinity; new (especially in freshness; while NT:3501 is properly so with respect to age: KJV - new.

Commandment – NT:1785 ἐντολή entole (en-tol-ay'); from NT:1781; injunction, i.e. an authoritative prescription: KJV - commandment, precept.

Beginning – NT:746 ἀρχή **arche** (ar-khay'); from NT:756; (properly abstract) a commencement, or (concretely) chief (in various applications of order, time, place, or rank):

KJV - beginning, corner, (at the, the) first (estate), magistrate, power, principality, principle, rule.

<u>Love</u> – <u>NT:25</u> ἀγαπάω **agapao** (ag-ap-ah'-o); perhaps from **agan** (much) [or compare <u>OT:5689</u>]; to love (in a social or moral sense):

KJV - (be-) love (-ed). Compare <u>NT:5368</u>.

³⁴ A new commandment I give unto you, That ye love one another; as I have loved you, that ye also love one another.

<u>Walk</u> – <u>NT:4043</u> περιπατέω **peripateo** (per-ee-pat-eh'-o); from <u>NT:4012</u> and <u>NT:3961</u>; to tread all around, i.e. walk at large (especially as proof of ability); figuratively, to live, deport oneself, follow (as a companion or votary):

KJV - go, be occupied with, walk (about).

Commandments – NT:1785 ἐντολή **entole** (en-tol-ay'); from NT:1781; injunction, i.e. an authoritative prescription: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - commandment, precept.

Beginning – NT:746 ἀρχή **arche** (ar-khay'); from NT:756; (properly abstract) a commencement, or (concretely) chief (in various applications of order, time, place, or rank):

KJV - beginning, corner, (at the, the) first (estate), magistrate, power, principality, principle, rule.

Ezekiel 36

²⁷ And I will put my Spirit within you, and cause you to walk in my statutes, and ye shall keep my judgments, and do them.

Confess in the Truth In the Flesh

2 John 1

⁷ For many <u>deceivers</u> are <u>entered</u> into the world, who <u>confess</u> **not** that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh. This is a deceiver and an antichrist.

Deceivers – NT:4108 πλάνος **planos** (plan'-os); of uncertain affinity; roving (as a tramp), i.e. (by implication) an impostor or misleader; KJV - deceiver, seducing. Entered – NT:1831 ἐξέρχομαι **exerchomai** (ex-er'-khom-ahee); from NT:1537 and NT:2064; to issue (literally or figuratively):

KJV - come (forth, out), depart (out of), escape, get out, go (abroad, away, forth, out, thence), proceed (forth), spread abroad.

<u>Confess</u> – <u>NT:3670</u> ὁμολογέω **homologeo** (hom-ol-og-eh'-o); from a compound of the base of NT:3674 and NT:3056; to assent, i.e. covenant, acknowledge:

KJV - con- (pro-) fess, confession is made, give thanks, promise.

Flesh – NT:4561 σάρξ **sarx** (sarx); probably from the base of NT:4563; flesh (as stripped of the skin), i.e. (strictly) the meat of an animal (as food), or (by extension) the body (as opposed to the soul [or spirit], or as the symbol of what is external, or as the means of kindred), or (by implication) human nature (with its frailties [physically or morally] and passions), or (specifically) a human being (as such): **KJV** - carnal (-ly, +-ly minded), flesh ([-ly]).

<u>Antichrist</u> – <u>NT:500</u> ἀντίχριστος **antichristos** (an-tee'-khris-tos); from <u>NT:473</u> and NT:5547; an opponent of the Messiah: **KJV** - antichrist.

1 John 4

¹Beloved, **believe not every spirit**, but try the spirits whether they are of God: because many false prophets are gone out into the world.

² Hereby know ye the Spirit of God: **Every spirit that confesseth that Jesus Christ is come** in the flesh is of God:

³ And every spirit that confesseth not that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh is not of God: and this is that spirit of antichrist, whereof ye have heard that it should come; and even now already is it in the world.

Matthew 24

 $\underline{\text{Look}} - \underline{\text{NT:991}}$ βλέπω **blepo** (blep'-o); a primary verb; to look at (literally or figuratively):

KJV - behold, beware, lie, look (on, to), perceive, regard, see, sight, take heed. Compare NT:3700.

Lose – NT:622 ἀπόλλυμι **apollumi** (ap-ol'-loo-mee); from NT:575 and the base of NT:3639; to destroy fully (reflexively, to perish, or lose), literally or figuratively: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - destroy, die, lose, mar, perish.

Wrought – NT:2038 ἐργάζομαι **ergazomai** (er-gad'-zom-ahee); middle voice from NT:2041; to toil (as a task, occupation, etc.), (by implication) effect, be engaged in or with, etc.: **KJV** - commit, do, labor for, minister about, trade (by), work. Receive – NT:618 ἀπολαμβάνω **apolambano** (ap-ol-am-ban'-o); from NT:575 and

<u>NT:2983</u>; to receive (specially, in full, or as a host); also to take aside: KJV - receive, take.

 $\underline{\text{Full}} - \underline{\text{NT:4134}} \pi \lambda \acute{\eta} \rho \eta \varsigma$ **pleres** (play'-race); from $\underline{\text{NT:4130}}$; replete, or covered over; by analogy, complete: *KJV* - full.

Reward – NT:3408 μ ισθός **misthos** (mis-thos'); apparently a primary word; pay for services (literally or figuratively), good or bad: *KJV* - hire, reward, wages.

Psalm 33

⁴ For the Word of the LORD is right; and all **his Works are done in truth**.

James 1

²² But be ye doers of the Word, and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves.

John 14

¹¹ Believe me that I am in the Father, and the Father in me: or else believe me for the very works' sake.

<u>Transgresseth</u> – <u>NT:4254</u> προάγω **proago** (pro-ag'-o); from <u>NT:4253</u> and <u>NT:71</u>; to lead forward (magisterially); intransitively, to precede (in place or time [participle previous]): *KJV* - bring (forth, out), go before.

<u>Abideth</u> – NT:3306 μένω **meno** (men'-o); a primary verb; to stay (in a given place, state, relation or expectancy):

KJV - abide, continue, dwell, endure, be present, remain, stand, tarry (for), ^x thine own.

<u>Doctrine</u> – <u>NT:1322</u> δ ιδαχή **didache** (did-akh-ay'); from <u>NT:1321</u>; instruction (the act or the matter): **KJV** - doctrine, hath been taught.

1 Corinthians 14

⁶ Now, brethren, **if I come unto you** speaking with tongues, **what shall I profit you**, except I shall speak to you either by **revelation**, or by **knowledge**, or by **prophesying**, or **by doctrine**?

<u>Come</u> – <u>NT:2064</u> ἔρχομαι **erchomai** (er'-khom-ahee); middle voice of a primary verb (used only in the present and imperfect tenses, the others being supplied by a kindred [middle voice] eleuthomai (el-yoo'-thom-ahee); or [active] eltho (el'-tho); which do not otherwise occur); to come or go (in a great variety of applications, literally and figuratively):

KJV - accompany, appear, bring, come, enter, fall out, go, grow, $^{\chi}$ light, $^{\chi}$ next, pass, resort, be set.

Doctrine – NT:1322 διδαχή **didache** (did-akh-ay'); from NT:1321; instruction (the act or the matter): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - doctrine, hath been taught.

Receive – NT:2983 λαμβάνω **lambano** (lam-ban'-o); a prolonged form of a primary verb, which is use only as an alternate in certain tenses; to take (in very many applications, literally and figuratively [properly objective or active, to get hold of; whereas NT:1209 is rather subjective or passive, to have offered to one; while NT:138 is more violent, to seize or remove]):

KJV - accept, + be amazed, assay, attain, bring, X when I call, catch, come on (X unto), + forget, have, hold, obtain, receive (X after), take (away, up).

House – NT:3614 Oἰκία **oikia** (oy-kee'-ah); from NT:3624; properly, residence (abstractly), but usually (concretely) an abode (literally or figuratively); by implication a family (especially domestics): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - home, house (-hold). God speed – NT:5463 χαίρω **chairo** (khah'-ee-ro); a primary verb; to be "cheerful", i.e. calmly happy or well-off; impersonally, especially as salutation (on meeting or parting), be well:

KJV - farewell, be glad, God speed, greeting, hall, joy (-fully), rejoice.

Confess in the Truth (cont) In Doctrine (cont) Shunning Evil

2 John 1

For he that <u>biddeth</u> him <u>God speed</u> is <u>partaker</u> of his <u>evil deeds</u>.

Biddeth – NT:3004 λέγω **lego** (leg'-o); a primary verb; properly, to "lay" forth, i.e. (figuratively) relate (in words [usually of systematic or set discourse; whereas NT:2036 and NT:5346 generally refer to an individual expression or speech respectively; while NT:4483 is properly, to break silence merely, and NT:2980 means an extended or random harangue]); by implication, to mean:

KJV - ask, bid, boast, call, describe, give out, name, put forth, say (-ing, on), shew, speak, tell, utter.

<u>God speed</u> – <u>NT:5463</u> $\chi\alpha i\rho\omega$ **chairo** (khah'-ee-ro); a primary verb; to be "cheerful", i.e. calmly happy or well-off; impersonally, especially as salutation (on meeting or parting), be well:

KJV - farewell, be glad, God speed, greeting, hall, joy (-fully), rejoice.

Partaker – ΝΤ:2841 ΚΟΙνωνέω **koinoneo** (koy-no-neh'-o); from NT:2844; to share with others (objectively or subjectively): **KJV** - communicate, distribute, be partaker.

Evil – NT:4190 πονηρός **poneros** (pon-ay-ros'); from a derivative of NT:4192; hurtful, i.e. evil (properly, in effect or influence, and thus differing from NT:2556, which refers rather to essential character, as well as from NT:4550, which indicates degeneracy from original virtue); figuratively, calamitous; also (passively) ill, i.e. diseased; but especially (morally) culpable, i.e. derelict, vicious, facinorous; neuter (singular) mischief, malice, or (plural) guilt; masculine (singular) the devil, or (plural) sinners:

KJV - bad, evil, grievous, harm, lewd, malicious, wicked (-ness). See also <u>NT:4191</u>. <u>Deeds</u> – <u>NT:2041</u> ἔργον **ergon** (er'-gon); from a primary (but obsolete) ergo (to work); toil (as an effort or occupation); by implication, an act: **KJV** - deed, doing, labour, work.

Galatians 6

¹ Brethren, if a man be overtaken in a fault, ye which are spiritual, restore such an one in the spirit of meekness; considering thyself, lest thou also be tempted.

Joy in the Truth In the Spirit

2 John 1

¹² Having many things to write unto you, I would not write with paper and ink: but I <u>trust</u> to come unto you, and <u>speak face</u> to <u>face</u>, that our <u>joy</u> may be <u>full</u>.

<u>Trust</u> – <u>NT:1679</u> ἐλπίζω **elpizo** (el-pid'-zo); from <u>NT:1680</u>; to expect or confide:

KJV - (have, thing) hope (-d) (for), trust.

<u>Speak</u> – <u>NT:2980</u> λαλέω **laleo** (lal-eh'-o); a prolonged form of an otherwise obsolete verb; to talk, i.e. utter words:

KJV - preach, say, speak (after), talk, tell, utter. Compare NT:3004.

<u>Face</u> – <u>NT:4750</u> στόμα **stoma** (stom'-a); probably strengthened from a presumed derivative of the base of <u>NT:5114</u>; the mouth (as if a gash in the face); by implication, language (and its relations); figuratively, an opening (in the earth); specifically, the front or edge (of a weapon): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - edge, face, mouth.

<u>Joy</u> – <u>NT:5479</u> χαρά **chara** (khar-ah'); from <u>NT:5463</u>; cheerfulness, i.e. calm delight:

KJV - gladness, ^X greatly, (X be exceeding) joy (-ful, -fully, -fulness, -ous).

<u>Full</u> – NT:4137 πληρόω **pleroo** (play-ro'-o); from NT:4134; to make replete, i.e. (literally) to cram (a net), level up (a hollow), or (figuratively) to furnish (or imbue, diffuse, influence), satisfy, execute (an office), finish (a period or task), verify (or coincide with a prediction), etc.:

KJV - accomplish, ^x after, (be) complete, end, expire, fill (up), fulfil, (be, make) full (come), fully preach, perfect, supply.

<u>Children</u> – <u>NT:5043</u> τέκνον **teknon** (tek'-non); from the base of <u>NT:5088</u>; a child (as produced): **KJV** - child, daughter, son.

<u>Elect</u> – <u>NT:1588</u> ἐκλεκτός **eklektos** (ek-lek-tos'); from <u>NT:1586</u>; select; by implication, favorite: *KJV* - chosen, elect.

Sister – NT:79 ἀδελφή **adelphe** (ad-el-fay'); fem of NT:80; a sister (naturally or ecclesiastically): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - sister.

<u>Greet</u> – <u>NT:782</u> ἀσπάζομαι **aspazomai** (as-pad'-zom-ahee); from <u>NT:1</u> (as a particle of union) and a presumed form of <u>NT:4685</u>; to enfold in the arms, i.e. (by implication) to salute, (figuratively) to welcome: **KJV** - embrace, greet, salute, take leave.
