...from – NT:1861 ἐπαγγέλλω **epaggello** (ep-ang-el'-lo); from NT:1909 and the base of NT:32; to announce upon (reflexively), i.e. (by implication) to engage to do something, to assert something respecting oneself:

KJV - profess, (make) promise.

KJV - break, disallow, discourage, make of none effect.

The saints, the children of God shall not be alienated NOT experience God breach of promise...

That was His promise toward us.

**KJV** - most surely believe, fully know (persuade), make full proof of.

Without ceasing – NT:88 ἀδιάλειπτος **adialeiptos** (ad-ee-al'-ipe-tos); from NT:1 (as a negative particle) and a derivative of a compound of NT:1223 and NT:3007; not intermitted, i.e. permanent:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - without ceasing, continual.

Remembrance – NT:3417  $\mu\nu\epsilon$ í $\alpha$  mneia (mni'-ah); from NT:3415 or NT:3403; recollection; by implication recital:

...committed to God, same commitment of forefathers, committed to Timothy ...our heritage...that I may serve from my forefathers.

<u>Testimony</u> – <u>NT:3142</u> μαρτύριον **marturion** (mar-too'-ree-on); neuter of a presumed derivative of <u>NT:3144</u>; something evidential, i.e. (genitive case) evidence given or (specifically) the Decalogue (in the sacred Tabernacle): **KJV** - to be testified, testimony, witness.

Prisoner – NT:1198 δέσμιος **desmios** (des'-mee-os); from NT:1199; a captive (as bound): **KJV** - in bonds, prisoner.

Partaker of the afflictions – NT:4777 συγκακοπαθέω **sugkakopatheo** (soong-kak-op-atheh'-o); from NT:4862 and NT:2553; to suffer hardship in company with:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - be partaker of afflictions.

Gospel – NT:2098 εὐαγγέλιον **euaggelion** (yoo-ang-ghel'-ee-on); from the same as NT:2097; a good message, i.e. the gospel:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - gospel.

Power – NT:1411 δύναμις **dunamis** (doo'-nam-is); from NT:1410; force (literally or figuratively); specially, miraculous power (usually by implication, a miracle itself):  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - ability, abundance, meaning, might (-ily, -y, -y deed), (worker of) miracle (-s), power, strength, violence, mighty (wonderful) work.

 $\underline{\text{Holy}} - \underline{\text{NT:40}}$  αμτίας **hagios** (hag'-ee-os); from **hagos** (an awful thing) [compare  $\underline{\text{NT:53}}$ ,  $\underline{\text{NT:2282}}$ ]; sacred (physically, pure, morally blameless or religious, ceremonially, consecrated):  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - (most) holy (one, thing), saint.

See also  $\underline{\text{NT:3364}}$ ,  $\underline{\text{NT:3372}}$ .

<u>Works</u> – <u>NT:2041</u>  $\xi \rho \gamma o \nu$  **ergon** (er'-gon); from a primary (but obsolete) ergo (to work); toil (as an effort or occupation); by implication, an act: **KJV** - deed, doing, labour, work.

<u>Abolished</u> – <u>NT:2673</u> καταργέω **katargeo** (kat-arg-eh'-o); from <u>NT:2596</u> and <u>NT:691</u>; to be (render) entirely idle (useless), literally or figuratively:

**KJV** - abolish, cease, cumber, deliver, destroy, do away, become (make) of no (none, without) effect, fail, loose, bring (come) to nought, put away (down), vanish away, make void.

<u>Death</u> – <u>NT:2288</u> θάνατος **thanatos** (than'-at-os); from <u>NT:2348</u>; (properly, an adjective used as a noun) death (literally or figuratively): **KJV** -  $^{x}$  deadly, (be ... death.

<u>Life</u> – NT:2222  $\zeta \dot{\omega} \eta$  **zoe** (dzo-ay'); from NT:2198; life (literally or figuratively): **KJV** - life (-time). Compare NT:5590.

Immortality – NT:861 ἀφθαρσία **aphthrsia** (af-thar-see'-ah); from NT:862; incorruptibility; genitive case unending existence; (figuratively) genuineness:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - immortality, incorruption, sincerity.

...from – NT:862 ἄφθαρτος **aphthartos** (af'-thar-tos); from NT:1 (as a negative particle) and a derivative of NT:5351; undecaying (in essence or continuance):  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - not (in-, un-) corruptible, immortal.

<u>Light</u> – NT:5461 φωτίζω **photizo** (fo-tid'-zo); from NT:5457; to shed rays, i.e. to shine or (transitively) to brighten up (literally or figuratively):

**KJV** - enlighten, illuminate, (bring to, give) light, make to see.

Gospel – NT:2098 εὐαγγέλιον **euaggelion** (yoo-ang-ghel'-ee-on); from the same as NT:2097; a good message, i.e. the gospel:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - gospel.

*KJV* - + advise, appoint, bow, commit, conceive, give, <sup>x</sup> kneel down, lay (aside, down, up), make, ordain, purpose, put, set (forth), settle, sink down.

Preacher – NT:2783 κήρυξ **kerux** (kay'-roox); from NT:2784; a herald, i.e. of divine truth (especially of the gospel): **KJV** - preacher.

...from – NT:2784 κηρύσσω **kerusso** (kay-roos'-so); of uncertain affinity; to herald (as a public crier), especially divine truth (the gospel): **KJV** - preacher (-er), proclaim, publish.

<u>Apostle</u> – <u>NT:652</u> ἀπόστολος **apostolos** (ap-os'-tol-os); from <u>NT:649</u>; a delegate; specially, an ambassador of the Gospel; officially a commissioner of Christ ["apostle"] (with miraculous powers): **KJV** - apostle, messenger, he that is sent.

Teacher – NT:1320 διδάσκαλος **didaskalos** (did-as'-kal-os); from NT:1321; an instructor (genitive case or specially): KJV - doctor, master, teacher.

<sup>12</sup> For the which cause I also suffer these things: nevertheless I am not <u>ashamed</u>: for I know whom I have <u>believed</u>, and am <u>persuaded</u> that he is <u>able</u> to <u>keep</u> that which I have <u>committed</u> unto him <u>against</u> that day.

<u>Ashamed</u> – <u>NT:1870</u> ἐπαισχύνομαι **epaischunomai** (ep-ahee-skhoo'-nom-ahee); from NT:1909 and NT:153; to feel shame for something: **KJV** - be ashamed.

...from – NT:153 αἰσχύνομαι **aischunomai** (ahee-skhoo'-nom-ahee); from **aischos** (disfigurement, i.e. disgrace); to feel shame (for oneself): **KJV** - be ashamed.

Believed – NT:4100  $\pi$ ιστεύω **pisteuo** (pist-yoo'-o); from NT:4102; to have faith (in, upon, or with respect to, a person or thing), i.e. credit; by implication, to entrust (especially one's spiritual well-being to Christ):

*KJV* - believe (-r), commit (to trust), put in trust with.

Persuaded – NT:3982 πείθω **peitho** (pi'-tho); a primary verb; to convince (by argument, true or false); by analogy, to pacify or conciliate (by other fair means); reflexively or passively, to assent (to evidence or authority), to rely (by inward certainty):  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - agree, assure, believe, have confidence, be (wax) confident, make friend, obey, persuade, trust, yield.

<u>Able</u> – <u>NT:1415</u> δυνατός **dunatos** (doo-nat-os'); from <u>NT:1410</u>; powerful or capable (literally or figuratively); neuter possible:

KJV - able, could, (that is) mighty (man), possible, power, strong.

<u>Keep</u> – NT:5442 φυλάσσω **phulasso** (foo-las'-so); probably from NT:5443 through the idea of isolation; to watch, i.e. be on guard (literally of figuratively); by implication, to preserve, obey, avoid:  $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$  - beward, keep (self), observe, save. Compare NT:5083.

<u>Committed</u> – <u>NT:3866</u> παραθήκη **paratheke** (par-ath-ay'-kay); from <u>NT:3908</u>; a deposit, i.e. (figuratively) trust: *KJV* - committed unto.

<u>Against</u> – <u>NT:1519</u>  $\varepsilon$ **i** $\zeta$  **eis** (ice); a primary preposition; to or into (indicating the point reached or entered), of place, time, or (figuratively) purpose (result, etc.); also in adverbial phrases:

*KJV* - [abundantly-], against, among, as, at, [back-] ward, before, by, concerning, + continual, + far more exceeding, for [intent, purpose fore],, + forth, in (among, at, unto, -so much that, -to), to the intent that, + of one mind, + never, of, (up-) on, + perish, + set at one again, (so) that, therefore (-unto), throughout, til, to (be, the end, -ward), (here-) until (-to), ... ward, [wherefore-], with. Often used in composition with the same general import, but only with verbs (etc.) expressing motion (literally or figuratively).
