God Works

1 John 3

 10 In this the **children of God are <u>manifest</u>**, and the **<u>children</u> of the <u>devil</u>**: whosoever **doeth not** <u>righteousness</u> is **not** of God, neither he that loveth **not** his brother.

Manifest – NT:5318 φανερός **phaneros** (fan-er-os'); from NT:5316; shining, i.e. apparent (literally or figuratively); neuter (as adverb) publicly, externally: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - abroad, + appear, known, manifest, open [+-ly], outward ([+-ly]).

<u>Children</u> – <u>NT:5043</u> τέκνον **teknon** (tek'-non); from the base of <u>NT:5088</u>; a child (as produced): **KJV** - child, daughter, son.

Devil – NT:1228 διάβολος **diabolos** (dee-ab'-ol-os); from NT:1225; a traducer; specially, Satan [compare OT:7854]: **KJV** - false accuser, devil, slanderer. Righteousness – NT:1343 δικαιοσύνη **dikaiosune** (dik-ah-yos-oo'-nay); from NT:1342; equity (of character or act); specially (Christian) justification: **KJV** - righteousness.

Matthew 13

³⁶ Then Jesus sent the multitude away, and went into the house: and his disciples came unto him, saying, Declare unto us the parable of the tares of the field.

³⁷ He answered and said unto them, He that soweth the good seed is the Son of man;

³⁸ The field is the world; the good seed are the children of the kingdom; but the tares are the children of the wicked one;

³⁹ The enemy that sowed them is the devil; the harvest is the end of the world; and the reapers are the angels.

⁴⁰ As therefore the tares are gathered and burned in the fire; so shall it be in the end of this world.

Love Works

1 John 3

¹¹ For this is **the <u>message</u>** that ye **heard from the <u>beginning</u>**, that **we** should **love <u>one</u> another**.

 $\underline{\text{Message}} - \underline{\text{NT:31}}$ άγγελία **aggelia** (ang-el-ee'-ah); from $\underline{\text{NT:32}}$; an announcement, i.e. (by implication) precept: *KJV* - message.

Beginning – NT:746 ἀρχή **arche** (ar-khay'); from NT:756; (properly abstract) a commencement, or (concretely) chief (in various applications of order, time, place, or rank):

KJV - beginning, corner, (at the, the) first (estate), magistrate, power, principality, principle, rule. One another – NT:240 ἀλλήλων **allelon** (al-lay'-lone); Gen. plural from NT:243 reduplicated; one another:

 $\overline{\textit{KJV}}$ - each other, mutual, one another, (the other), (them-, your-) selves, (selves) together [sometimes with $\underline{\text{NT:}3326}$ or $\underline{\text{NT:}4314}$].

1 Thessalonians 5

- ¹² And we beseech you, brethren, to **know them which labour** among you, and are **over you in the Lord**, and **admonish you**;
- ¹³ And to **esteem them very highly in love for their work's sake**. And be at peace among yourselves.
- ¹⁴ Now we **exhort** you, brethren, **warn** them that are unruly, **comfort** the feebleminded, **support** the weak, **be patient** toward all men.

Galatians 5

¹³ For, brethren, ye have been **called unto liberty**; only use not liberty for an occasion to the flesh, but **by love serve one another**.

Righteous Works

1 John 3

¹² Not as Cain, who was **of that <u>wicked one</u>**, and <u>slew</u> his brother. And wherefore [why] <u>slew</u> he him? Because his own <u>works</u> were <u>evil</u>, and **his brother's** <u>righteous</u> [works].

<u>Wicked one</u> – <u>NT:4190</u> πονηρός **poneros** (pon-ay-ros'); from a derivative of <u>NT:4192</u>; hurtful, i.e. evil (properly, in effect or influence, and thus differing from <u>NT:2556</u>, which refers rather to essential character, as well as from <u>NT:4550</u>, which indicates degeneracy from original virtue); figuratively, calamitous; also (passively) ill, i.e. diseased; but especially (morally) culpable, i.e. derelict, vicious, facinorous; neuter (singular) mischief, malice, or (plural) guilt; masculine (singular) the devil, or (plural) sinners:

KJV - bad, evil, grievous, harm, lewd, malicious, wicked (-ness). See also NT:4191. Slew – NT:4969 σφάζω **sphazo** (sfad'-zo); a primary verb; to butcher (especially an animal for food or in sacrifice) or (generally) to slaughter, or (specifically) to maim (violently): **KJV** - kill, slay, wound.

Works – NT:2041 ἔργον **ergon** (er'-gon); from a primary (but obsolete) ergo (to work); toil (as an effort or occupation); by implication, an act:

KJV - deed, doing, labour, work.

Evil – NT:4190 πονηρός **poneros** (pon-ay-ros'); from a derivative of NT:4192; hurtful, i.e. evil (properly, in effect or influence, and thus differing from NT:2556, which refers rather to essential character, as well as from NT:4550, which indicates degeneracy from original virtue); figuratively, calamitous; also (passively) ill, i.e. diseased; but especially (morally) culpable, i.e. derelict, vicious, facinorous; neuter (singular) mischief, malice, or (plural) guilt; masculine (singular) the devil, or (plural) sinners:

KJV - bad, evil, grievous, harm, lewd, malicious, wicked (-ness). See also NT:4191. Righteous – NT:1342 δίκαιος **dikaios** (dik'-ah-yos); from NT:1349; equitable (in character or act); by implication, innocent, holy (absolutely or relatively): **KJV** - just, meet, right (-eous).

Psalm 106

³ Blessed are they that **keep judgment**, and he that **doeth righteousness at all times.**

Ezekiel 18

²⁴ But when the righteous turneth away from his righteousness, and committeth iniquity, and doeth according to all the abominations that the wicked man doeth, shall he live? All his righteousness that he hath done shall **not** be mentioned: in his trespass that he hath trespassed, and in his sin that he hath sinned, in them shall he die.

Romans 10

⁵ For Moses describeth the **righteousness which is of the law**, That the man which **doeth those things shall live by them**.

Righteous Works (cont)

1 John 3 (cont)

¹² Not as Cain, who was of that <u>wicked one</u>, and <u>slew</u> his brother. And wherefore [why] <u>slew</u> he him? Because his own <u>works</u> were <u>evil</u>, and **his brother's** <u>righteous</u> [works].

1 John 3

⁷ Little children, let no man deceive you: he that doeth righteousness is righteous, even as he is righteous.

1 John 2

²⁹ If ye know that he is righteous, ye know that every one that doeth righteousness is **born of Him.**

1 John 3

¹³ Marvel not, my brethren, if the world hate you.

<u>Marvel</u> – <u>NT:2296</u> θαυμάζω **thaumazo** (thou-mad'-zo); from <u>NT:2295</u>; by implication, to admire: **KJV** - admire, have in admiration, marvel, wonder.

<u>World</u> – <u>NT:2889</u> κόσμος **kosmos** (kos'-mos); probably from the base of <u>NT:2865</u>; orderly arrangement, i.e. decoration; by implication, the world (in a wide or narrow sense, including its inhabitants, literally or figuratively [morally]): *KJV* - adorning, world.

<u>Hate</u> – <u>NT:3404</u> μισέω **miseo** (mis-eh'-o); from a primary misos (hatred); to detest (especially to persecute); by extension, to love less: KJV - hate (-ful).

Psalm 55

³ Because of the voice of the enemy, because of the oppression of the wicked: for they cast iniquity upon me, and in wrath they hate me.

Matthew 10

²² And ye shall be hated of all men for my name's sake: but he that endureth to the end shall be saved.

Luke 6

²² Blessed are ye, when men shall hate you, and when they shall separate you from their company, and shall reproach you, and cast out your name as evil, for the Son of man's sake.

John 15

²⁵ But this cometh to pass, that the **Word might be fulfilled** that is written in their law, **They hated me without a cause.**

Life Works

1 John 3

¹⁴ We know that we have <u>passed</u> from <u>death</u> unto life, because **we love the brethren**. He that loveth **not** his brother <u>abideth</u> in death.

Passed – NT:3327 μεταβαίνω **metabaino** (met-ab-ah'-ee-no); from NT:3326 and the base of NT:939; to change place: KJV - depart, go, pass, remove.

Death – NT:2288 θάνατος **thanatos** (than'-at-os); from NT:2348; (properly, an adjective used as a noun) death (literally or figuratively):

KJV - ^X deadly, (be ... death.

<u>Abideth</u> – <u>NT:3306</u> μένω **meno** (men'-o); a primary verb; to stay (in a given place, state, relation or expectancy):

 \pmb{KJV} - abide, continue, dwell, endure, be present, remain, stand, tarry (for), X thine own.

1 Thessalonians 2

¹³ For this cause also thank we God without ceasing, because, when ye received the word of God which ye heard of us, ye received it not as the word of men, but as it is in truth, the Word of God, which effectually worketh also in you that believe.

1 John 3

¹⁵ Whosoever [any who] hateth his brother is a <u>murderer</u>: and ye know that **no murderer hath** <u>eternal</u> life <u>abiding</u> in him.

<u>Murderer</u> – <u>NT:443</u> ἀνθρωποκτόνος **anthropoktonos** (anth-ro-pok-ton'-os); from NT:444 and kteine (to kill); a manslayer: **KJV** - murderer. Compare NT:5406.

Eternal – NT:166 αἰώνιος **aionios** (ahee-o'-nee-os); from NT:165; perpetual (also used of past time, or past and future as well):

KJV - eternal, for ever, everlasting, world (began).

<u>Abiding</u> – <u>NT:3306</u> μένω **meno** (men'-o); a primary verb; to stay (in a given place, state, relation or expectancy):

KJV - abide, continue, dwell, endure, be present, remain, stand, tarry (for), ^x thine own.

Sacrificial Works

1 John 3

¹⁶ Hereby <u>perceive</u> we the <u>love</u> of God, because He <u>laid down</u> His life for us: and we <u>ought</u> to <u>lay down</u> our <u>lives</u> for the brethren.

Perceive – NT:1097 γινώσκω **ginosko** (ghin-oce'-ko); a prolonged form of a primary verb; to "know" (absolutely) in a great variety of applications and with many implications (as follow, with others not thus clearly expressed):

KJV - allow, be aware (of), feel, (have) know (-ledge), perceived, be resolved, can speak, be sure, understand.

<u>Love</u> – <u>NT:26</u> ἀγάπη **agape** (ag-ah'-pay); from <u>NT:25</u>; love, i.e. affection or benevolence; specially (plural) a love-feast:

KJV - (feast of) charity ([-ably]), dear, love.

laid down/ lay down – NT:5087 Tίθημι **tithemi** (tith'-ay-mee); a prolonged form of a primary theo (theh'-o) (which is used only as alternate in certain tenses); to place (in the widest application, literally and figuratively; properly, in a passive or horizontal posture, and thus different from NT:2476, which properly denotes an upright and active position, while NT:2749 is properly reflexive and utterly prostrate):

KJV - + advise, appoint, bow, commit, conceive, give, ^x kneel down, lay (aside, down, up), make, ordain, purpose, put, set (forth), settle, sink down.

<u>Ought</u> – <u>NT:3784</u> \dot{O} φείλω **opheilo** (of-i'-lo); or (in certain tenses) its prolonged form opheileo (of-i-leh'-o); probably from the base of <u>NT:3786</u> (through the idea of accruing); to owe (pecuniarily); figuratively, to be under obligation (ought, must, should); morally, to fail in duty:

KJV - behove, be bound, (be) debt (-or), (be) due (-ty), be guilty (indebted), (must) need (-s), ought, owe, should. See also NT:3785.

<u>Lives</u> – <u>NT:5590</u> ψυχή **psuche** (psoo-khay'); from <u>NT:5594</u>; breath, i.e. (by implication) spirit, abstractly or concretely (the animal sentient principle only; thus distinguished on the one hand from <u>NT:4151</u>, which is the rational and immortal soul; and on the other from <u>NT:2222</u>, which is mere vitality, even of plants: these terms thus exactly correspond respectively to the Hebrew <u>OT:5315</u>, <u>OT:7307</u> and <u>OT:2416</u>): **KJV** - heart (+-ily), life, mind, soul, +us, +you.

Isaiah 64

⁴ For since the beginning of the world men have not heard, nor perceived by the ear, neither hath the eye seen, O God, beside thee, what He hath prepared for him that waiteth for Him.

Psalm 107

²² And let them sacrifice the **Sacrifices of thanksgiving**, and **declare His works** with rejoicing.

Sacrificial Works (cont)

1 John 3 (cont)

¹⁶ Hereby <u>perceive</u> we the <u>love</u> of God, because he <u>laid down</u> his life for us: and we <u>ought</u> to <u>lay down</u> our <u>lives</u> for the brethren.

Hebrews 13

¹⁵ By Him therefore let us offer the **sacrifice of praise to God** continually, that is, the **fruit of our lips giving thanks to His name**.

Psalm 69

³⁰ I will praise the name of God with a song, and will magnify him with thanksgiving.

Compassionate Works

1 John 3

¹⁷ But whoso hath this world's <u>good</u>, and <u>seeth</u> his brother have <u>need</u>, and <u>shutteth up</u> his <u>bowels</u> of *compassion* from him, how <u>dwelleth</u> the love of God in him?

Good – NT:979 βίος **bios** (bee'-os); a primary word; life, i.e. (literally) the present state of existence; by implication, the means of livelihood: KJV - good, life, living.

Seeth – NT:2334 θεωρέω **theoreo** (theh-o-reh'-o); from a derivative of NT:2300 (perhaps by add. of NT:3708); to be a spectator of, i.e. discern, (literally, figuratively [experience] or intensively [acknowledge]):

KJV - behold, consider, look on, perceive, see. Compare NT:3700.

Need – NT:5532 χρεία **chreia** (khri'-ah); from the base of NT:5530 or NT:5534; employment, i.e. an affair; also (by implication) occasion, demand, requirement or destitution: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - business, lack, necessary (-ity), need (-ful), use, want. Shutteth up – NT:2808 κλείω **kleio** (kli'-o); a primary verb; to close (literally or figuratively): $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - shut (up).

Bowels – NT:4698 σπλάγχνον **splagchnon** (splangkh'-non); probably strengthened from splen (the "spleen"); an intestine (plural); figuratively, pity or sympathy: $\textbf{\textit{KJV}}$ - bowels, inward affection, + tender mercy.

<u>Dwelleth</u> – <u>NT:3306</u> μένω **meno** (men'-o); a primary verb; to stay (in a given place, state, relation or expectancy):

KJV - abide, continue, dwell, endure, be present, remain, stand, tarry (for), *thine own.

Acts 1

²Until the day in which he was taken up, after that he through the Holy Ghost had given commandments unto the apostles whom he had chosen:

³To whom also he **shewed himself alive after his <u>passion</u>** by many infallible proofs, being seen of them forty days, and speaking of the things pertaining to the kingdom of God:

<u>Passion</u> – <u>NT:3958</u> πάσχω **pascho** (pas'-kho); including the forms (patho (path'-o) and pentho (pen'-tho)), used only in certain tenses for it; apparently a primary verb; to experience a sensation or impression (usually painful): **KJV** - feel, passion, suffer, vex.

Psalm 111

⁴ He hath made his wonderful works to be remembered: the LORD is gracious and full of compassion.

Compassionate Works (cont)

1 John 3 (*cont*)

¹⁷ But whoso hath this world's good, and <u>seeth</u> his brother have <u>need</u>, and <u>shutteth up</u> his <u>bowels</u> of *compassion* from him, how <u>dwelleth</u> the love of God in him?

Romans 9

¹⁵ For he saith to Moses, I will have mercy on whom I will have mercy, and **I will have** compassion on whom I will have compassion.

Jude 1

²¹ Keep yourselves in the love of God, looking for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ unto eternal life.

²² And of some have <u>compassion</u>, making a difference:

Compassion – NT:1653 ἐλεέω **eleeo** (el-eh-eh'-o); from NT:1656; to compassionate (by word or deed, specially, by divine grace): **KJV** - have compassion (pity on), have (obtain, receive, shew) mercy (on).

1 Peter 3

⁸ Finally, be ye all of one mind, having compassion one of another, love as brethren, be pitiful, be courteous:

²³ And **others save with fear**, pulling them out of the fire; hating even the garment spotted by the flesh.

Work Works

1 John 3

¹⁸ My <u>little children</u>, **let us not love in <u>word</u>**, **neither in <u>tongue</u>**; **but in <u>deed</u> and in <u>truth</u>**. <u>Little children</u> – <u>NT:5040</u> Τεκνίον **teknion** (tek-nee'-on); diminutive of <u>NT:5043</u>; an infant, i.e. (plural figuratively) darlings (Christian converts): **KJV** - little children. <u>Word</u> – <u>NT:3056</u> λόγος **logos** (log'-os); from <u>NT:3004</u>; something said (including the thought); by implication a topic (subject of discourse), also reasoning (the mental faculty) or motive; by extension, a computation; specifically (with the article in John) the Divine Expression (i.e. Christ):

KJV - account, cause, communication, ^x concerning, doctrine, fame, ^x have to do, intent, matter, mouth, preaching, question, reason, ⁺ reckon, remove, say (-ing), shew, ^x speaker, speech, talk, thing, ⁺ none of these things move me, tidings, treatise, utterance, word, work.

Tongue – NT:1100 γλ $\hat{\omega}$ σσα **glossa** (gloce-sah'); of uncertain affinity; the tongue; by implication, a language (specially, one naturally unacquired): **KJV** - tongue.

<u>Deed</u> – <u>NT:2041</u> ξ ργον **ergon** (er'-gon); from a primary (but obsolete) ergo (to work); toil (as an effort or occupation); by implication, an act:

KJV - deed, doing, labour, work.

Truth – NT:225 ἀλήθεια **aletheia** (al-ay'-thi-a); from NT:227; truth:

KJV - true, X truly, truth, verity.

Psalm 15

¹Lord, who shall abide in thy tabernacle? who shall dwell in thy holy hill?

Psalm 101

⁷ He that worketh deceit shall not dwell within my house: he that telleth lies shall not tarry in my sight.

Proverbs 11

¹⁸ The wicked **worketh** a deceitful work: but to him that soweth righteousness shall be a sure reward.

John 5

¹⁷ But Jesus answered them, My **Father worketh hitherto, and I work**.

2 Corinthians 7
