



Dear Friends in Christ,

Below is part of a psalm from the captives in exile in Babylon. Of course, they were going through a much more severe trauma than we are. They were torn away from their homes and their temple in Jerusalem and carried off to a foreign land to live in exile.

Since the last time I sat down to write this article, we have lost over 50,000 American lives to the coronavirus. Worldwide more than 200,000 have died. Many lived a long life prior to this deadly disease, but so many have been taken away from their children and families way too soon! It is heart-breaking to hear of doctors

and nurses dying having served on the front lines of this pandemic.

The world needs our prayers. There is so much sorrow and pain and fear of dying. **Will you pause to pray every day to pray for the world?** See page 15 for a prayer that you could use. Or you can just talk to God, asking for comfort for the dying, peace for the grieving, healing for the sick, and to help us be of service in the midst of this crisis.

On Wednesdays at noon, Kevin continues to ring the church bell while praying the Lord's Prayer. If you are near Cooksville, you will hear our church bell ringing! Pause to join in praying the Lord's prayer on behalf of the world.

I long for the day when we can safely gather to worship God in song, with prayer, while hearing the Word and celebrating Holy Communion. Until then, we are the church, dispersed, in exile, yet still One in Jesus, connected with God through the Holy Spirit and to one another by that same Spirit.

On page 3 you will find a worship service that you can do in your home. Each Sunday has 2 hymns and the prayer of the day, which you will find on subsequent pages. We can sing the Lord's song in exile from our Sunday gatherings! We are still connected to one another by the Holy Spirit. Dare to sing hymns right out loud at home! It will do your heart good to lift up songs to God as prayers and acts of faith in a world that needs both.

Also I have set up a meeting room on Jit.si for a virtual coffee hour, where we can see one another and visit. Let's try it out this Sunday!

May the peace of God which surpasses all understanding keep your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.





Day

The Ascension of our Lord May 21st - 40 Days After The Resurrection

Forty days after each Easter, many Christians around the world celebrate the Ascension. It's the day when the resurrected Christ was raised up from the earth into heaven. The Ascension is the prelude to Pentecost, when the Holy Spirit came upon the gathering of disciples, including the apostles, in Jerusalem.

While many Christian churches celebrate Pentecost, the Ascension of Our Lord is often passed over because it always falls on a weekday, forty days after Easter Sunday. After the Resurrection, our risen Lord instructed his followers not to leave Jerusalem. It was there, Jesus said, that they would receive "the promise of the Father" (Acts 1:4, NRSV). What was that promise? It was that they would be baptized with the Holy Spirit. Shortly after that utterance, Jesus was "lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight" (v. 9).

So why did Jesus go away? Why did he "ascend to the Father?" Jesus answered this question when he confided in his disciples before his arrest:

^{16:7} "Nevertheless I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Advocate will not come to you; but if I go, I will send him to you. ...¹³ "When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth; for he will not speak on his own, but will speak whatever he hears ...¹⁴ He will glorify me, because he will take what is mine and declare it to you. ...¹⁶ "A little while, and you will no longer see me, and again a little while, and you will see me." (Excerpts from the 16th chapter of St. John)

Jesus' Ascension was his return to the Father. When the Day of Pentecost came, the Father sent the Spirit to indwell all believers as a seal of their salvation. The Spirit, as part of the Trinity, is "God with us." The Spirit is Christ present with us, all the time, with every single believer, in every single place on earth.


I always wondered why we never hear the disciples or the Apostle Paul wistfully talk about the time Jesus was with them during his earthly ministry, saying something like, “the Spirit of Christ in us is very special, but we sure miss having Jesus here with us in the flesh.” Of course, the reason they did not “miss” Jesus is because He was truly with them through the Spirit. They weren’t “keeping his memory alive” as some might think when they hear the words, “Do this in remembrance of me.” Their relationship with Jesus, their relationship with the Father, was not only “alive” because of the Spirit, it was even better than before.

The 16th-century theologian John Calvin said this about the Ascension:

“Christ left us in such a way that his presence might be more useful to us — a presence that had been confined in a humble abode of flesh so long as he sojourned on earth As his body was raised up above all the heavens, so his power and energy were diffused and spread beyond all the bounds of heaven and earth.” ❧

Pentecost, the Church's Birthday

May 31, 2020



Pentecost started as a Jewish festival commemorating God’s giving the Law to the Israelites 50 days after they escaped from slavery in Egypt (the Passover). It was also a harvest festival where the people brought the first fruits of their crops to Jerusalem as offerings to God during the festival.

Fifty days after the Resurrection, the first Christians, most of them Jews, gathered to celebrate this festival.

At that gathering something happened that was so awesome and indescribable that when writing about it, St. Luke could only use metaphors.

A sound like the rush of a violent wind filled the entire house where they were meeting. Something like tongues of fire appeared among them — a tongue rested on each of them.

It was then that they “were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability” (Acts 2:4, NRSV). The crowd that gathered outside was amazed and perplexed. They wanted to know what it meant. Some observers thought it was a gathering of drunks.



But Peter interpreted it all correctly to anyone who would listen. He told of Christ, his life, his mission, his death and his Resurrection. Most importantly, Peter explained that God had made Jesus both Lord and Messiah. The proof of that was the Resurrection.

Three thousand people were so moved by Peter’s words that they were baptized that day and “devoted themselves to the apostles’ teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers” (Acts 2:42). The first Christians became a family “of one heart and soul” (Acts 4:32). We, too, can be in union with one another when we allow the Holy Spirit to fill our hearts. ☪
