Dear Friends in Christ,

The **Paschal greeting** is an Easter custom among Christians. Instead of "hello," one is to greet another with "Christ is Risen!" The response is "He is risen, indeed!" (see Luke 24:34). We use this greeting at the beginning of worship during the seven weeks of Easter. The pastor greets the congregation saying, "Alleluia! Christ is risen!" and they respond, "He is risen, indeed! Alleluia!"

I have always loved the thought of saying this greeting informally. A few times I have called a friend early Easter morning and said, "The Lord is risen!" But usually I am too focused on getting to church to do this. So now I usually send a few text messages.

Some Easters I don't feel like saying "Christ is risen!" because of what I am experiencing, or what my family and friends are going through. So far this season of Lent, I find it

difficult to see where new life is springing up, given the health crisis and grief that my family, and friends are enduring, and my own physical pain.



CONNECT

You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength. ... You shall love your neighbor as yourself. Mk. 12:30

CONNECT team met March 2 & 22nd with the task of "putting into perspective" all of the connections, learning, materials and ideas gathered from all of you since we started this process in September of 2016. We quickly confirmed that the activities we sponsored were only as strong as your willingness to participate, which is to say, very willing. You've completed surveys, participated in special attempts to get to know each other better, incorporated some new/old practices in our church groups, and shared your experiences, your gifts, your hopes, and some of your concerns and fears with each other. More than a few times, the team commented that these communications were electric; that there was a special connectedness that was beyond what was expected.

Just to review, this is what You've participated in so far:

1. Agreement to dwell in the word by adding prayer and study time to committee meetings.
2. Completion of a surveyed identifying the strengths of the congregation and sharing areas of concern.
3. Naming some of the many gifts possessed by individual members of Cooksville. The list of well over 100 gifts was generated by working in groups at a "coffee fellowship" event.
4. Sharing conversation with someone new during a fellowship time, with the goal of knowing them more personally. You talked of backgrounds, interests, hopes and more. We will probably do this activity again.
5. During an early Fall fellowship time, you welcomed each other back from summer and recognized students, groups, musicians and the entire congregation of learners to appreciate our successes and "think about" the story that tells about us.
6. Agreement to work at being more intentional in our prayer time. Many of you are participating in praying for each member of the congregation by naming a different member each day. If you never started that or got bogged down with it, please consider starting again.
7. Sharing your favorite bible story or verse during fellowship time. Many of you explained which concepts from the story

made it special for you. This activity may be sponsored again as it became a very "connecting" time.

One of the things the team was hoping would emerge from all of these activities would be a clear direction for our mission. I think at this point, it would be fair to suggest that the mission has many directions.



What feels more clear is a recognition of the strength we possess as a group, as a family of seekers. We believe that Our Story continues to unfold.


In April, the group will share much of this information with our synod partners in the two-year process at our final all-day event. We plan to identify threads of mission and strength and outline some possible short term goals. We think its been a good process and will recommend that Cooksville continue similar activities for at least next year. We think you are willing to work at a more detailed set of mission goals with the realization that renewing this Cooksville family gives a welcoming and powerful witness to the community around us.

CONNECT has an all day meeting at Central Lutheran in Edgerton on Saturday, April 21.

On Sunday, April 29, CONNECT will host Fellowship (after church) including a 'getting to know each other' activity. We will share responses to this question "Can you identify a person who has made a significant impact on your faith journey?" We hope you will join us!

God's Peace to You...

Passing the peace is a tradition rooted in Scripture that embodies our identity as peacemakers (Matt. 5:9; 2 Cor. 5:20) and trains our hearts, hands, and tongues in the ways of peace.

From the beginning Christians have exercised this practice:

- ✿ “Peace be with you” is a greeting Jesus himself used with his disciples (Luke 24:36; John 20:19, 26).
- ✿ The apostle Paul opened each of his letters with the words “Grace and peace be with you” (Rom. 1:7; 1 Cor. 1:3; 2 Cor. 1:2).

Today in many congregations we may pass the peace during a mutual greeting, after words of assurance, prior to celebrating the Lord’s Supper, or at the conclusion of a worship service. At these times we leave the comfort of our seat, turn to our neighbors, grasp their hands, and speak the words, “The peace of the Lord be with you” and receive the words in turn, “And also with you.”

The gesture is simple, but the meaning is profound.

When we extend our hand to another, we identify with Jesus, who extended his life to the point of death to make peace with humanity (Col. 1:20-21).



What’s more, in the midst of divisions we symbolize our unity through handshakes and hugs (Eph. 2:14-21).



Healing Services to be Held in April and July.

Healing Service — 4/29/18


A fifth Sunday of the month happens about four times a year. Some churches use this opportunity to offer a healing rite as a part of the regular worship service. On April 29, we will offer prayers for healing. This would be a good opportunity to invite a friend, or to tell a friend that you will offer a special prayer for them on that day.

The Healing Service is found on p. 276 of the ELW hymnbook. The introduction says:

The order for healing is an expression in worship of the church's ministry of healing. Here all who sense the need for God's healing in any aspect of their lives may join in prayer for others and themselves. Here each person may come to receive a word of blessing and prayer. Here each one may also receive a physical gesture of healing: the laying on of hands, which may be accompanied by anointing with oil. These signs, first given in baptism, tell us again that we are sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked forever with the cross of Christ, who is health and salvation for the whole world.

In its ministry of healing, the church does not replace the gifts of God that come through the scientific community nor does it promise a cure. Rather, the church offers and celebrates gifts such as these: God's presence with strength and comfort in time of suffering, God's promise of wholeness and peace, and God's love embodied in the community of faith.

(July 29th will be the next "fifth Sunday,"
and we will hold a Healing Service on that date as well.)






