Yoseph or Yehoseph:

This week's portion teaches that, "Yaakov was left alone, and a 'man' wrestled with him until the break of dawn." The Midrash in Each Thursday at the end of davening we say Tehillim Perek 81. In Posuk 6, we say "He (Hashem) appointed it (Shofar blowing on Rosh Hashana) as a testimony for Yehoseph when He went out

over the land of Mitzrayim". The Gemara (Sota 36b) explains that letter 'Hay' (of Hashem's name) was added to Yoseph's name in that Posuk as a result of Yoseph sanctifying Hashem's name through withholding from being seduced by the wife of Potifar. The Gemara (Berachos 20a) explains that because of his refusal to be seduced, no Ayin Hara has a hold over Yosef or his children. Yoseph refused to enjoy what was not his and as a result no Ayin Hara (from others) can take away or undermine from Yoseph and his children what belongs to them.

The Maharal (Nesivos Olam, Nesiv Ayin Tov) explains that Ayin Hara is caused by jealous attention. Yoseph instead attempted to retain a low profile wherever he was employed and, despite his talents and gifts, he did not wish to attract jealousy.

The Michtav MeEliyahu (vol. 3, p. 314) explains that Ayin Hara is a result of flaunting what one has been blessed with and thereby causing anguish to others who are less fortunate. This results in Heaven re-evaluating whether one continues to deserve the blessings. If one continuously recognizes that their blessings are directly from Hashem and not the result of their own personal talent or skill, this acts a protection that the person may share his gifts with others, which he realizes are meant to be shared.

Yoseph was so careful to attribute his talent to Hashem to the extent that even his owners recognized that his gifts and success were from Hashem. Through Yoseph's additional Kiddush Hashem in private (with the wife of Potifar) he merited further that the name of Hashem was added into his name (as a continuous reminder to him that all was from Hashem) and the eternal blessing to his children that no Ayin Hara would hold power over them.


