Council Meeting
November 13, 2017

Easley City Council met on November 13, 2017 at 7:00 p.m. in the court room of the LEC. All members were present. Lisa Chapman, City Clerk, served as the recording secretary.

Mayor Bagwell called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The Rev. Jim Spencer with Brushy Creek Baptist Church gave the invocation followed by the pledge.

Easley City Council met in executive session prior to the meeting and no action was taken.

The minutes from the October meeting were approved as written.

Mayor Bagwell called on council for their reports.

Ward 1: There will be a meeting of the recreation committee on November 21st at the gym.

Ward 2: Had the opportunity to walk the Doodle Trail and it is a gem in our community. It is being well maintained by both cities. The new park is coming along nicely. The new sign looks really nice.

Ward 3: Congratulations to Councilmen Dykes, Moore, and Robinson on their re-election. It is good to see Attorney Allison back. Wished everyone a Happy Thanksgiving.

Ward 4: Good to see David Lappin back. Thank you to Mr. Steese and Ms. Smith for reaching out and providing some private training last week.

Ward 5: No report. Congratulated Chief Womack on a successful open house at Station 2. Glad to see David Lappin back.

Ward 6: No report, Thank you to Chief Tollison.

Mayor Bagwell called on Mr. Steese for his report. The Doodle Park is coming along nicely. The playground equipment has been delivered and the bathrooms are being worked on. We are still waiting on the gazebo to come in. City Hall will be closed Thursday and Friday, Nov. 23rd and 24th for the Thanksgiving holiday. December 9th is the Christmas parade and tree lighting in Old Market Square. The parade starts at 6:00. Councilman Dykes asked if there was a completion date for the park. Mr. Steese stated hopefully by the end of the year with a ribbon cutting sometime after the first of the year.

Citizens wishing to address council: Ms. Sharetta Bufford with Delta Sigma Theta Sorority. She read a letter (attached) asking council to make the following issues a priority during their sessions.

1. Voter rights
2. Racial profiling by law enforcement
3. Domestic violence
4. Education
5. Healthcare

She thanked Chief Tollison for having the police department represented at several events.

Presentations: Greene Finney & Horton with the City of Easley year-end audit report. Ken Meadows gave the presentation. The city received an unmodified opinion which is the best you can receive. Revenues exceeded expenditures. The general fund balance is approximately \$3,000,000. The City's financial condition has improved. The accounting process has improved from last year's audit.

Mayor Bagwell called on Joni Smith, Finance Director for her report. Revenue/expense/balance sheet was emailed to all of council. The general fund is at 16% of budget, we are under budget on expenses. All of the bank statements are up to date. The staff in the finance department has been great and everyone has stepped up to the plate with all the new procedures. Councilman Dykes commented that he felt more comfortable with the financial information.

Old Business: There were no second readings.

New Business: Ordinance no. 2017-12 to rezone 118 Dayton School Rd., Easley, South Carolina 29642 Tax Map No. 5039-18-31-2034 from R-10 to GR 2. Councilman Wright made the motion to approve with a second from Councilman Mann. Mayor Bagwell called on Tommy Holcombe, Building Official for an explanation. Mr. Holcombe stated this property joins property that has townhomes on it and the owner is looking to put more townhomes on this lot. It is a good improvement to the area and there was no opposition from the neighbors. The Planning Commission voted unanimously to approve. Councilman Robinson asked about a sewer easement. Mr. Holcombe commented that the owner is aware of this and has plans to work around it. There was no further discussion. Councilman Dykes called for the question and the motion passed 7-0.

Ordinance No. 2017-13: Approving an amendment to the redevelopment plan utilizing tax increment financing (downtown area redevelopment project); approving the execution and delivery of intergovernmental agreements with Pickens County and the School District of Pickens County related to the amendment; and other matters related thereto. Councilman Mann made the motion to bring to the floor for discussion with a second from Councilman Garrison. Mayor Bagwell called on Mr. Steese for an explanation. Our bond attorney could not attend tonight due to another meeting but will come to the December meeting to answer any questions council may have. Anything can be amended between first and second readings. The current TIF will expire in 2018 and we are looking to extend it for another 10 years to improve the downtown. Pickens County wants to freeze their portion and the intergovernmental agreement guides those terms. The goal is to freeze tax rates and invest the money into projects that will bring the tax rate up and improve the district. Items done in the previous TIF need repair like the parking lot at Old Market Square. A farmer's market pavilion is being considered. We have to give the county and the school district 45 days' notice which we plan on doing this Friday. There will be a public hearing in January followed by the second reading of this ordinance. By approving this ordinance you approve all the agreements. There was no further discussion. Councilman Garrison called for the question and the motion passed 7-0

TO RE-ZONE APPROXIMATELY .50 ACRE OF REAL PROPERTY
LOCATED AT 118 DAYTON SCHOOL ROAD FROM R-10 to GR2

WHEREAS, Timothy J. McKinney, as owner has applied to the City Planning Commission and City Council to rezone a piece of property at 118 Dayton School Road, Tax Map Number 5039-18-31-2034, from R-10 to GR2, and

WHEREAS, the City Planning Commission pursuant to public notice held a public hearing on October 16, 2017 to consider the proposed rezoning, and the Commission recommended approval of the proposed zoning designation of R-10 to GR2 and

WHEREAS, City Council finds the GR2, General Residential -2, classification to be compatible with the established zoning of surrounding properties;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EASLEY, SOUTH CAROLINA, that the parcel of property currently titled in the name of Timothy J. STATE ACCOMMODATIONS TAX MONIES AND AMEND THE FY 2017-18
CITY OF EASLEY STATE ACCOMMODATIONS TAX OPERATING BUDGET
ACCORDINGLY**

WHEREAS, the City ATAX Advisory Committee met on November 14, 2017, and their recommendations can be seen in attachment A; and

WHEREAS, the South Carolina General Assembly adopted transparency proviso #86.13, which states in part, "a political subdivision receiving aid from the Local Government Fund may not appropriate money to any entity unless that appropriation appears as a separate and distinct line item in the political subdivision's budget or in an amendment to the political subdivision's budget"; and

WHEREAS, City Council has determined the allocation of these funds in a consistent manner with the Advisory Committee recommendations; and

WHEREAS, City Council has determined the allocation of these monies is in the interest of the public and substantially contributes to the tourism development of the City of Easley;

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EASLEY, SOUTH CAROLINA, an appropriation of the budgeted \$80,000 in FY 2017-18 State Accommodations Tax proceeds as outlined in attachment A.
