

SAFEGUARDING

REMINDERS

Stoke Fleming Primary School recognises its responsibilities for safeguarding and promoting the welfare of all children under Section 175 of the 2002 Education Act and under the Children Act 2004 and the DfE guidance Working Together to Safeguard Children 2018.

A few key reminders:

- After 8:40 only staff, pupils and visitors who have signed in at the office should be in the school building. **Pupils and parents should not come into the school building before 8:40 unless the teacher has asked because of the weather.** This is due to fire regulations and pupil safeguarding
- Once pupils have been dropped at school please leave through the side gate and not through the school. If you need to speak to the office please come back in through the main entrance.
- If you are volunteering, coming in for an assembly or for a parent meeting we ask that children are dropped off and you enter the school through the office where you can sign in.
- Ensure all children are supervised coming through the car park at pick up and drop off times.
