



### What's happened in school this week?

#### **Class Invincible**



This week Class Invincible have been very busy. In Maths we have been comparing objects and numbers. We have been learning the language of greater than and less than in addition to the symbols. In English we have been immersing ourselves into the story of Flat Stanley. We have made predictions about Flat Stanley and followed his journey to California. In Geography we have continued to learn about the UK. We have looked at the various flags from the countries in the UK and learnt the names of the capital cities in the UK. We have also started to learn about the 7 continents.



#### **Class Victory**

In class Victory in science we have discussed what we already know about plants. We used our observation skills to 'look carefully' at the different bulbs, seeds and flowers and grouped them. We had groups in size order, edible plants and non-edible plants and, Flowering and non-

flowering. We have planted out broad beans this week for early Spring crop too!



#### **Challenger and Little Lanterns**

The Foundation Stage Unit enjoyed their first expedition down to Adventure School. Although it was rather soggy we had great fun playing in the mud kitchen, swinging on the swings and buoy, sliding down the very slippery slide and scrambling up the muddy banks!











Following the sudden downturn in the weather we have had to review the drop off and collection routines at the beginning and end of the day. From **Monday 5**<sup>th</sup> **October** we will be following the one-way system onto the school site as shown in the diagram below. As parents will be coming through the school grounds extra caution will be needed to socially distance; therefore we kindly ask:

- All adults must wear a face covering to drop off or collect when on school site
- Follow the one-way system and leave the school site promptly to avoid congestion.
- Do not gather in groups of more than 6.
- Do not enter the school building under any circumstances.

#### Specific classes will operate in the following way:

#### Discovery and Endeavour (Y4/5/6)

**Drop off: 8:35am** Pupils enter through gate A by the path on their own and go straight to class as they do currently.

**Pick up:** Pupils are collected from the large playground at 3:05pm and leave through Exit B.

#### Victory, Invincible, Challenger (YR/1/2/3)

**Drop off: 8:40am** Pupils/parents enter through gate A by the path and go straight to their meeting point following the one-way system.


**Pick up:** Pupils are collected from the playground at **3:10pm** and leave through Exit B following the one-way system to the car park.

#### **Little Lanterns**

**Drop off: 9:00am** (unless booked into early morning club) entrance and exit across the field.

Pick up: 3:00pm Entrance and exit across the field.

Parents being Targeted by Phone Scammers

We have received, from Devon Local Authority, reports of what seems to be a variety of ways of getting people to call/connect to a premium phone line number by saying their child is ill or been in an incident. Parents/carers are being called on the phone, allegedly by their school, to say their child has been involved in an incident or taken ill. An example has been where a parent was called to say the child was ill and asked to dial 1 to be connected to right person to speak to. The phone line had been held open reportedly to a high cost phone line. In another example the parents were asked to contact the school on the number provided, which again turned out to be a high cost phone line.

If you have younger children and you are concerned about their speech and language development, these drop-in sessions are the ideal opportunity to get some expert advice:

#### Under two's speech and language drop-in sessions

An exciting pilot project is being launched in September by Children and Family Health Devon's Speech and Language Therapy Service.

#### About:

A virtual drop in for parents of children under 2 and professionals who are concerned about their speech, language and communication development. This will be delivered via the 'attend anywhere' platform. The Speech and Language Therapist will spend up to 10 minutes listening to the parents'/professional's concerns, asking questions and observing how the child and parent/s communicate and interact

All families will be given advice and/or ideas to try at home.

For some children, it will be recommended that they are referred to the Speech and Language Therapy service for a more detailed assessment. Professionals with concerns about the SLC development of children under 2 should ensure that the child and family remain anonymous when sharing their concerns via the drop in service
