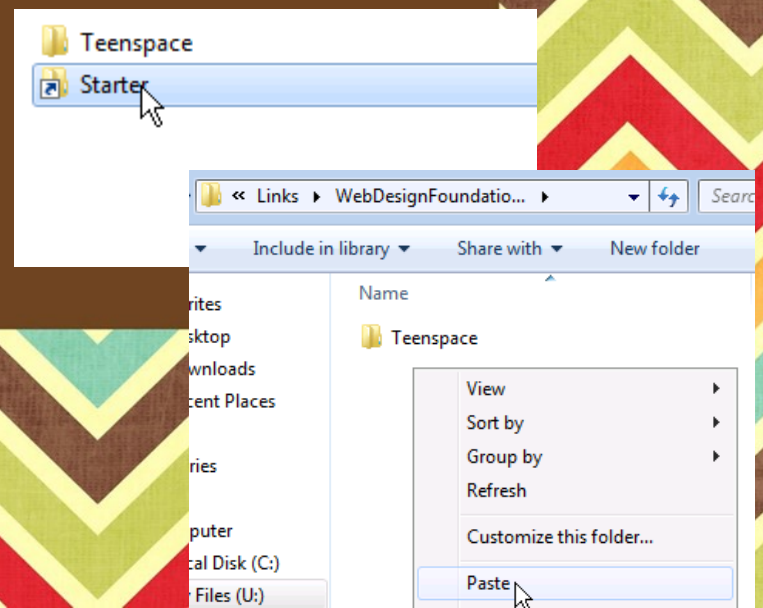
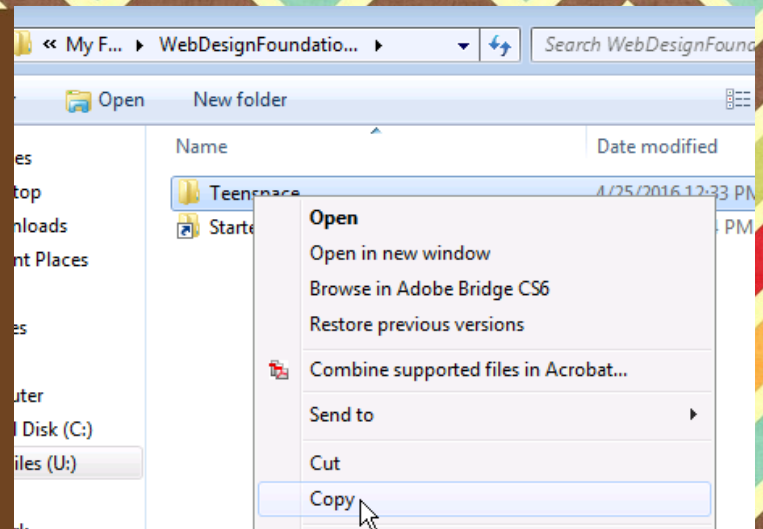

Task 2A: Creating a Simple CSS Site with ID Selectors [Top](#)

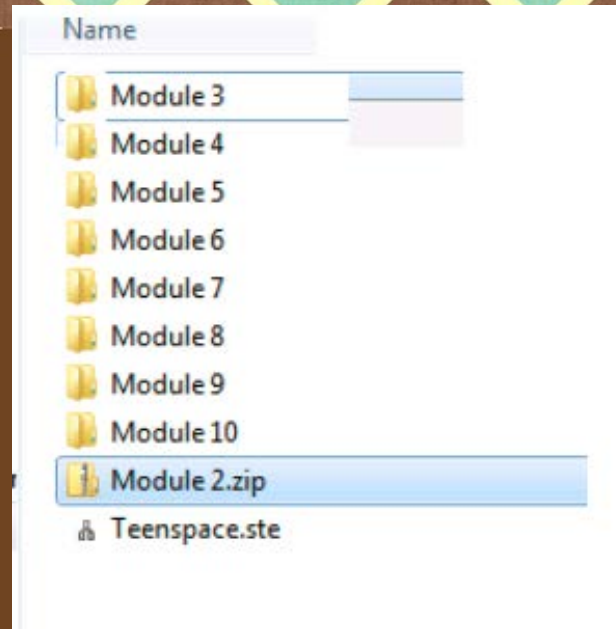
Teenspace has asked you to put together a simple demonstration site for a new client, Teen Volunteer, using Cascading Style Sheets (CSS). The client needs to know about various layout possibilities, as well as some examples of colors and fonts they may want to use. Let's start by making a basic layout in Dreamweaver CS6, including a header, navigation bar, content area, and footer.

Pework First, let's set up the folders you will be using throughout the course. In the online workspace, double-click the My Files Folder located on the desktop. Open the UserInterfaceDesign folder. In this folder you should see a Starter folder; open it. Right-click on the Teenspace folder and select [Copy \(or press Ctrl-C\)](#). Return to the UserInterfaceDesign folder and right-click > Paste to paste your folder (or press Ctrl-V). Your folder structure should look like the [example](#).

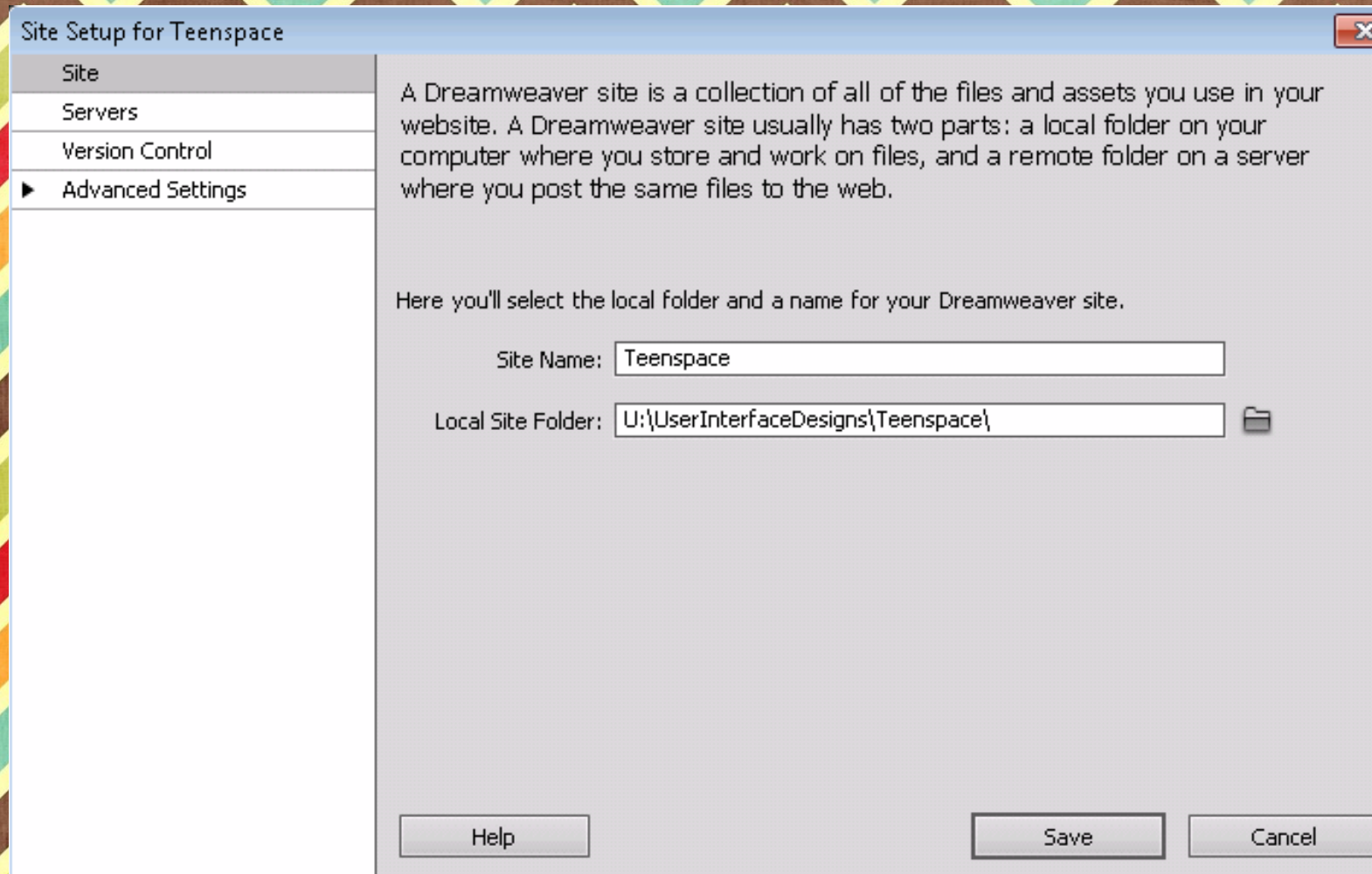

A Dreamweaver site is a collection of all of the files and assets you use in your website. A Dreamweaver site usually has two parts: a local folder on your computer where you store and work on files, and a remote folder on a server where you post the same files to the web.

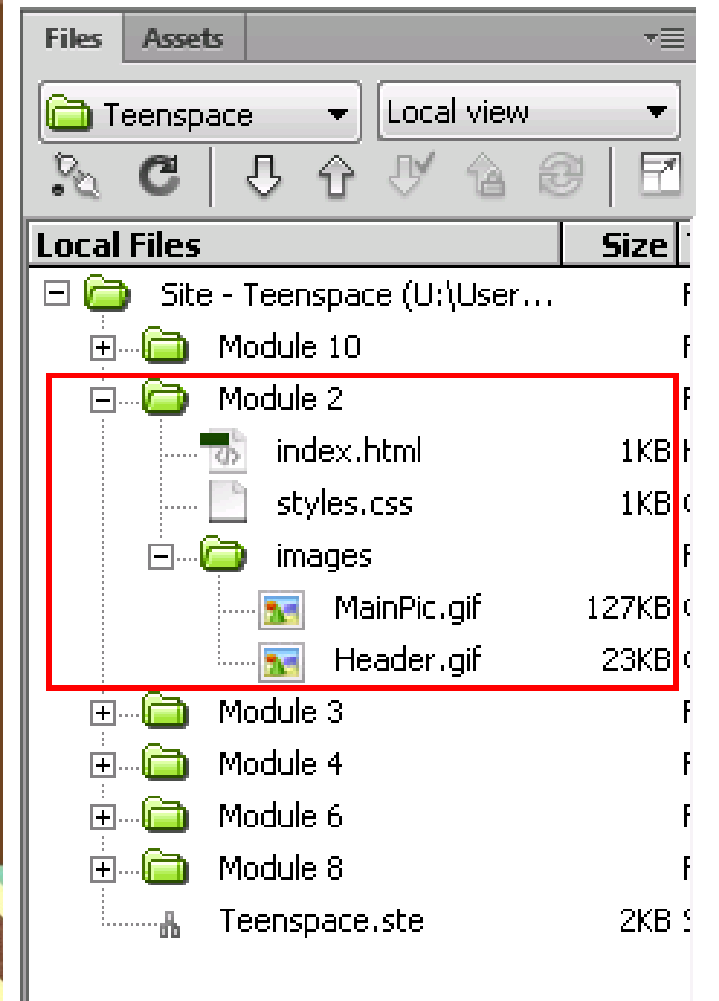

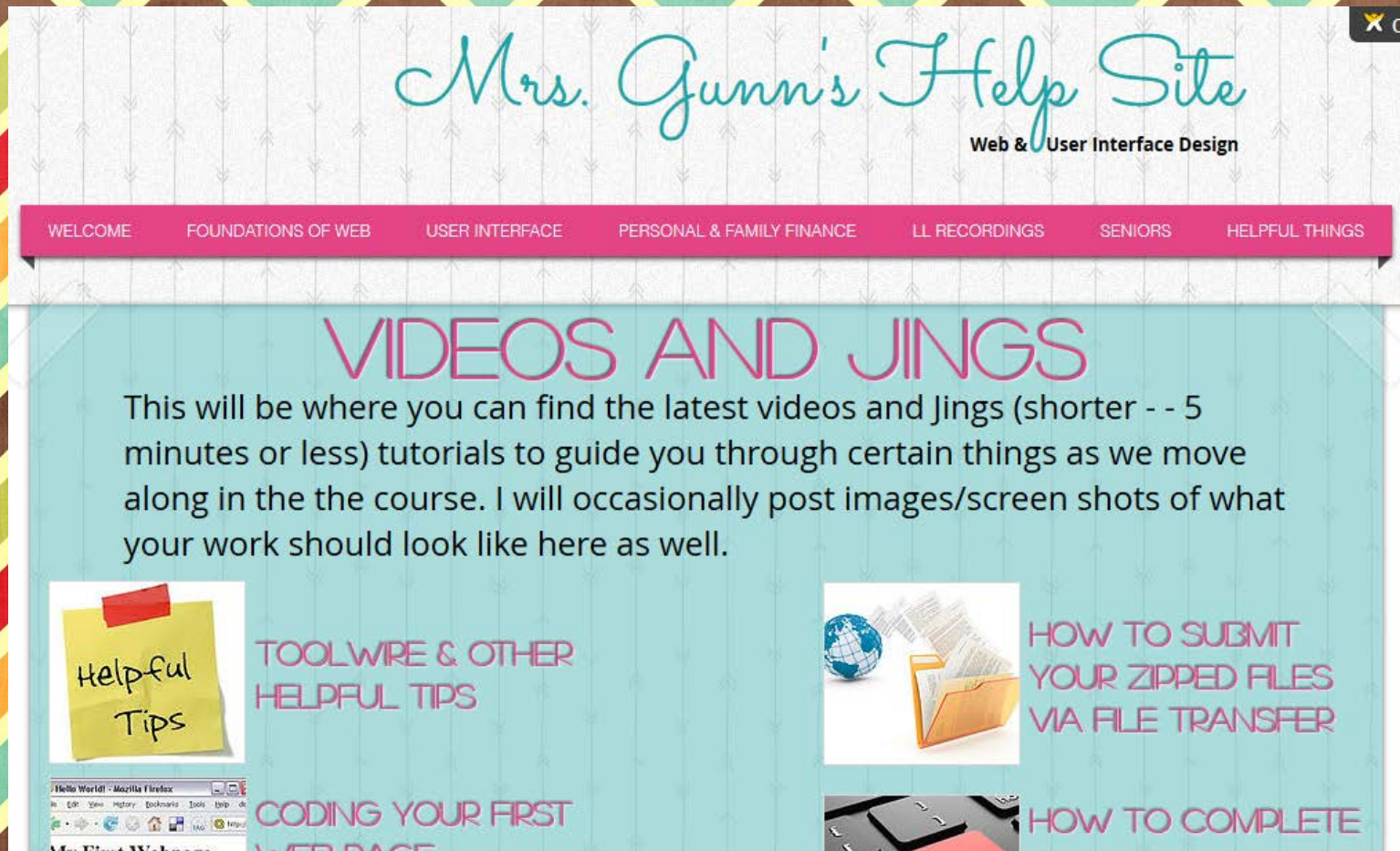
Creating Your Site

Step 1: We now need to make some basic files for the site. For this module, you will be saving all of your work in the Module 2 folder. In the Files Panel, right-click on the Module 2 folder and select "New File". Name this new file "styles.css". This file will contain all of the style rules we use for this site. Right-click the Module 2 folder again, choose New File, but name this file "index.html." "Index" is the universal home page name—you can't name this file anything else. When you have finished making your files, the Files Panel should look like [this example](#).

Double-click the index.html file to open it. You will see your blank home page in Design View. Set the title to "Teen Volunteer." This title will be visible to browsers.
