

Kids! Are You Ready for Rosh Hashanah?

Let's get in the holiday spirit. Choose an activity to try...or try them all!

### **Apple Cloud Crumble Dough**

Ingredients:

7 cups of flour

1 cup of vegetable oil (if you want your dough to be apple red, just add a few drops of food coloring to your oil)

A few shakes of apple pie spice

Directions:

Pour flour and oil into a large plastic bin. Mix together with your hands. Added a few sprinkles of apple pie spice for scent.

How to use your dough:

Scoop and pour with measuring cups. Pack into pie tins for imaginary apple pies. Dump, fill doll-sized bowls, pack into cookie cutters and pretend away!



### **Soft Apple Cloud Dough**

Ingredients:

2 cups cornstarch

1 cup apple-scented conditioner (Suave make a great apple scent)

A few drops of your favorite apple color if you would like

Directions:

Pour cornstarch into a large mixing bowl. Pour conditioner into the bowl of cornstarch. Using a spatula, stir and mix the two ingredients until the dough gets hard to mix with the spatula. Use your hands to finish kneading the dough together. Add a few drops of food coloring to turn your dough into an apple color. If the dough is too wet (and sticky),



add in a little corn starch. If it's too dry, add in a little more conditioner.

How to use your dough:

Play with it like playdough or slime. Squish, roll, and enjoy the great feeling on your hands!

### **Honey Slime**

Note: Using Borax requires adult supervision.

Ingredients:

1 cup glue (either white or clear)

Warm water

4 teaspoons Borax

A few drops yellow food coloring

Directions:

In a small bowl, mix  $\frac{3}{4}$  cup warm water, glue, and food coloring.

In another small bowl, mix 1  $\frac{1}{3}$  cups warm water and 4 teaspoons of Borax.

Combine the two mixtures together. Mix until it turns into slime!

How to use your honey slime:

Try it with cookie cutters, cut it with scissors, squish it, and knead it. Honey slime is also fun to use on a light table.





### Honeycomb Cards for a Sweet New Year

Supplies:

Paper

Small piece of bubble wrap

Yellow paint

Black pen or marker

Paint brush

**Directions:**

Paint one side of your bubble wrap. Flip the bubble wrap over and stamp it onto the center of your card. Press it down gently. Pull it up and set your card aside to dry. After you've made several honeycomb cards then dip your thumb into the paint and stamp a few thumbprints on each card. These thumbprints will be your bees. After you've made as many cards as you want to, set them aside and let them dry. Once your cards are dry, use your black pen or marker and add black stripes, wings and even a smile to your thumbprints to turn them into little bees flying over to some sweet honeycomb. Add a Rosh Hashanah greeting and you're good to go! Here are a few ideas:

Sending you sweetness for the new year.

Happy Rosh Hashanah! You're the bee's knees!

Shanah tovah! Have a sweet new year.

**Paper Roll Shofar**

**Supplies:**

3 toilet paper rolls

Party horn

Masking tape

Scissors

**Directions:**

Cut all the way across one roll lengthwise.

Take any decorations off your party horn so you are left with the plastic noise maker part of it.

Wrap the cut cardboard tube around the plastic noisemaker. Connect the cardboard roll to the plastic noisemaker securely with masking tape. With the other two rolls fold the edge to make a pleat in the bottom side. You are making the bottom small enough to fit inside another roll. This

will give the shofar a nice curve. Place the tubes inside each other. Cover your entire shofar with tape. Now you can blow your shofar! Tekiah!
