A Summary Report of the May 12, 2020 CFSD Governing Board Meeting





Superintendent Mary Kamerzell shared the following student and staff achievements.

Flinn Scholar

Senior Nik Gruber has been named a 2020 Flinn Scholar. He plans to study engineering at the University of Arizona. The Flinn Scholarship is a merit-based scholarship awarded annually to 20 Arizona high school seniors. It provides four years of study at an Arizona public university, study abroad, a funded internship, personal mentorship by faculty and alumni scholars, and other benefits.

Middle School Orchestras

All four of our middle school orchestras, representing both Esperero and Orange Grove, earned an Excellent rating or higher at the Arizona Music Education Association's all-state competition. Esperero - Concertino orchestra - Excellent; Esperero - Camerata orchestra - Superior. Their teacher/director is Ryan Watson. Orange Grove - Concertino orchestra - Excellent; and Orange Grove Camerata orchestra - Superior. Their teacher/director is Terry Alexander.

National Geographic Educator Certification

Kathleen Bowman, Manzanita 5th grade teacher, has successfully completed the National Geographic Educator Certification program. According to National Geographic, their certified educators "are committed to teaching their students about the world and how it works, empowering them to succeed and to make it a better place.

Virtual Signing Day

Six CFHS senior athletes signed their National Letters of Intent last month in a virtual signing ceremony hosted by Principal Jody Brase. Both family and friends were able to participate remotely. Speech and Debate

Two CFHS Speech and Debate team members are among the 77 Arizona competitors for the National Speech & Debate Association championship ("Nationals"), which will be held online this year. Junior Josh Tint is selected as the first qualifier in the even Big Questions. Senior Husuf Rahman is named a second alternate for Congressional Debate. The competition takes place June 14-20. Their teacher coach is Angela Hill.

Art Awards

Maria Cazzato, CFHS sophomore, was a gold key recipient winner for the Scholastic Art and Writing awards for 2020. Maria was invited to New York City's Carnegie Hall this summer to receive her award but will now be held virtually on June 4. Her artwork is also due to tour the country this year with other Scholastic winners.

Ava Sheppard, CFHS junior, won Best Drawing for her artwork 'Serenity" at the Joel D. Valdez Main Library in Tucson. Their teacher is Zoe Reinhardt.

Community Schools' Staff Recognition

The Arizona Community Education Association named Travis Kolter, CFSD Director of Community Schools, its Community Educator of the Year. Sherri Wirth, CFSD CARE and K+ Office Coordinator, received the Office Staff of the Year award.

Junior Achievement

Junior Achievement selects 18 youth under 18 years of age each year, who have made a difference in their community. Jonathan is an accomplished chess player, ranked nationally in his age group. He created the Pawn Initiative to encourage more people to play chess. He began teaching chess at the Boys and Girls Clubs in Tucson and at St. Luke's Home for seniors. His coach is Robby Adamson.

Approval of Revisions to K-12 Counseling Standards (second reading)

Dr. Kamerzell presented the second reading of the revisions to the K-12 standards for school counseling. She provided information about Arizona School Counselor Association's (ASCA) release of the school counseling model which includes the "ASCA Mindsets & Behaviors for Student Success: K-12 College and Career-Readiness Standards for Every Student" that replace the earlier ASCA standards approved by the CFSD Governing Board in January 2019. There were no recommended changes to the revisions since the first reading on April 12, and the board approved them, as presented.

Fiscal Year 2021 Maintenance and Operations Budget

Dr. Kamerzell gave an update on the Fiscal Year 2021 straw budget. She reported that there were very minor changes to the revenue and expenditure documents since the last board meeting, related to the district's Average Daily Membership (enrollment) and a professional learning online module subscription.

Board members talked about the possibility of the Arizona Legislature reconvening to discuss the State's budget for FY 2021 and perhaps address pending bills.
