3 **GENERAL ORDER RE: IMPLEMENTATION OF EMERGENCY RELIEF**
4 **AUTHORIZED PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 68115 BY CHAIR**
5 **OF JUDICIAL COUNCIL**

6 Exercising the authority granted under Government Code section 68115 and the July 30,
7 2018 Order of Chief Justice Tani G. Cantil-Sakauye, Chair of the California Judicial Council,
8 issued in response to the July 30, 2018 request for an emergency order made by the Superior
9 Court of Trinity County (“Court”), this Court **HEREBY FINDS AND ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:**

10 1. For purposes of computing time for filing papers with the Court under Code of
11 Civil Procedure sections 12 and 12a, July 30, 2018, through July 31, 2018, inclusive, are deemed
12 holidays (Gov. Code, § 68115(c));

13 2. For purposes of computing time under Penal Code section 825, and Welfare and
14 Institutions Code sections 313, 315, 631, 632, 637, and 657, July 30, 2018, through July 31,
15 2018, inclusive, are deemed holidays (Gov. Code, § 68115(d));

16 3. Where necessary and appropriate, and with the concurrence of the Presiding
17 Judge, the Court may order that sessions be held anywhere in the county, including in
18 correctional and juvenile detention facilities, from July 30, 2018, through July 31, 2018,
19 inclusive (Gov. Code, § 68115(a));

20 4. Where necessary and appropriate, and with the concurrence of the Presiding
21 Judge, the Court may transfer civil cases pending trial to a superior court in an adjacent county if
22 the requirements of Government Code section 68115(b) are met, from July 30, 2018, through
23 July 31, 2018, inclusive (Gov. Code, § 68115(b));


24 5. In appropriate cases, any judge of the Court may extend, to no later than August
25 3, 2018, the duration of any temporary restraining order that would otherwise expire from July
26 30, 2018, through August 3, 2018, inclusive, because the emergency condition described herein
27 prevented the Court from conducting proceedings to determine whether a permanent order
28 should be entered (Gov. Code, § 68115(e)); and

6. In appropriate cases, any judge of the Court may extend the time period provided

1 in section 859b of the Penal Code for the holding of a preliminary examination from 10 court
2 days to not more than 15 days, in cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire
3 from July 30, 2018, through August 1, 2018, inclusive (Gov. Code, § 68115(g)).
