



## Tenure-track Faculty Position in Primate Microbiomics

The Department of Biology at the University of Nebraska at Omaha invites applications for a tenure-track faculty position at the rank of Assistant Professor. A Ph.D. in the life sciences and postdoctoral research experience are required.

*The university and department are strongly committed to achieving diversity among faculty and staff. We are particularly interested in receiving applications from members of under-represented groups and strongly encourage women and persons of color to apply for this position.*

We seek candidates with high-quality and high-impact research on mammalian gut microbiome. The hire is part of a collaborative effort with other University of Nebraska campuses (UNL and UNMC) in a “Food for Health” research initiative (<http://nebraska.edu/FoodForHealth2015/>). The focus is on translational research on dietary modulation of microbiomes with application to disease prevention or intervention, microbiome ecology and evolution, and/or gut-brain axis. The successful candidate will utilize primate models (marmoset and macaque). Appropriate startup assistance and core facilities are available across collaborating campuses that include: sequencing and genomics, computational resources, primate facilities, endocrinology and immunology.

The successful candidate will establish externally-supported research collaborations with faculty in the Gut Function Initiative at UNL, the Biology Department and Neuroscience and Behavior program at UNO, and the Munroe-Meyer Institute and Department of Genetics, Cell Biology, and Anatomy at UNMC. Workload assignment will be 75% research:25% teaching at UNO.
