City of Albany - The Field of Light: Avenue of Honour

05 October 2018 - 25 April 2019

From Inbound Product:

An immersive art installation by Bruce Munro, Field of Light: Avenue of Honour will pay homage to the Anzacs with 16,000 shining spheres at Mt Clarence marking the last sight of home for 41,000 troops who departed from Albany for the Great War. The internationally renowned UK artist's ephemeral landscape installation will reference the national flowers of Australia and New Zealand; honouring 100 years since the First World War's end and celebrating Albany's unique biodiversity with thousands of lights shining in the whites, yellows and gold of the wattle and the kowhai.

Highlighting the region's unique sense of place and identity in sophisticated, contemporary ways, Field of Light: Avenue of Honour will symbolise wild beauty, sacrifice, courage and honour. The installation was commissioned by independent, non-profit cultural organisation FORM with the City of Albany and made possible by funding from the Australian Government through the Building Better Regions Fund and the State Government through Tourism Western Australia and Lotterywest. It will coincide with peak wildflower season and the conclusion of the Anzac Centenary commemorations, exhibiting from October 2018 through to Anzac Day in April 2019.



The Field of Light exhibit will be open to visitors as a free public art exhibition, located at the base of Mt Clarence, adjacent to the Avenue of Honour. The City of Albany has committed to the development of tour products which will connect the Field of Light to the summit of Mt Clarence, in addition to inviting visitors to experience the National Anzac Centre and the Princess Royal Fortress precinct. The two touring options, Field of Light Sunset Panorama Tour and National Anzac Centre Field of Light Panorama Pass are available to book on the AOT

The **Field of Light Sunset Panorama Tour** will take visitors to the summit of Mt Clarence, where guests experience a self-guided walking tour of the ANZAC monuments including the location of Australia's first Anzac Dawn Service Mass. Discover Albany's amazing stories and view the panorama of King George Sound at sunset, imagining the departure of the ANZAC fleet. As our bus leaves Mt Clarence at dusk, guests will experience the panoramic view of the Field of Light; Avenue of Honour exhibit, before alighting for a self-guided walk, immersed in the cascading panorama of 16,000 lights whilst descending through the exhibit, like a field of wildflowers amongst native Australian trees.

The National Anzac Centre Field of Light Panorama Pass combines 2 incredible Albany experiences in one commemorative pass. Visit the award-winning National Anzac Centre; Australia's only museum dedicated solely to the conflicts of World War 1. Experience the multi-media interpretive exhibits as you follow the personal journeys of WW1 veterans. Then travel to the summit of Mt Clarence to experience the panoramic views of King George Sound; the last glimpse of Australia for the ANZAC fleet in 1914. Visit the location of Australia's first ANZAC Day Dawn Service Mass and be immersed in the cascading panorama of 16,000 lights as you descend through the Field of Light exhibit, like a field of wildflowers amongst native Australian trees.

Broome, WA

Broome is an exotic pearling town at the western gateway to The Kimberley region of Western Australian and has left a rich history and a unique multi-cultural mix of people. The pristine waters, wide empty beaches, abundant wildlife, tropical climate and breathtaking colours attract thousands of visitors each year. Rainbow Springs, Rotorua – Kiwi Encounter Hatchery Renovation

From David Hurst, International Sales Manager, Ngai Tahu Tourism:

Thank you for your support of Rainbow Springs and in particular the Kiwi Encounter "behind the scenes" experience.

Our hatchery at Rainbow Springs is the largest kiwi conservation hatchery in the world, 76% of all North Island chicks and 55% of chicks hatched nationwide are incubated and hatched at our hatchery and visitors on our "behind the scenes" tours are given a unique insight into the plight of the kiwi and the work that our team do every day to help save kiwi.



Upgrades to the hatchery

We are excited to announce that we will soon be making some fantastic upgrades to the hatchery which means that we will be able to save 50% more kiwi, with a new capacity of 180 kiwi per season.

Brown kiwi, one of the five kiwi species, will be a specific focus for the hatchery capacity increase. Brown kiwi are currently decreasing at a rate of 2% a year and we are the only conservation centre hatching them. Without our hatchery's work, Brown Kiwi would be extinct within two generations.

In the wild, the successful hatch rate of kiwi is approximately 50% and then only 5% make it to adulthood. Our facility lifts the hatch success rate of viable eggs to 98% (last season) and once we have cared for the chicks until they are about a kilo in weight their success rate in the wild increases to approximately 68%.

You can understand why increasing the capacity of our work is vital.

How the upgrades affect your clients

Construction around the kiwi hatchery is due to start at the end of July and our improved kiwi hatchery and behind the scenes tours will be complete in mid-November.

The following changes to our kiwi experience will apply during the redevelopment period:

- Modified behind the scenes tours will still take place until the new facility opens in mid-November. These will be different in that we will have relocated incubators, brooder huts and all other hatchery equipment into a temporary area. Tours will still be high quality and high value, they will just be in different locations.
- The nocturnal house will remain open at all times throughout the redevelopment period, allowing visitors to view kiwi during their guided tour.
- Due to kiwi breeding cycles, there are not typically any kiwi eggs at the facility from June through to September.
- *No eggs or chicks will be visible for approximately six weeks between October to mid-November. To compensate for this, the kiwi husbandry team will increase the information they share about our injured kiwi rehabilitation work, with case studies unique to the National Kiwi Trust shared



- The behind the scenes admission fee goes directly back into our kiwi raising programme

Thank you for your continued support which is helping to make the future look brighter for kiwi, and for your patience as we go through these exciting changes.


Where


