Robert McOwen - Boston, U.S.A.



Robert McOwen began Scottish country and highland dancing in Berkeley, California in 1973. He received the Teaching Certificate of the Royal Scottish Country Dance Society (RSCDS) by examination in Scotland in 1980, and since then has taught at dance camps and workshops across the United States, and in Canada, Scotland, Japan, New Zealand, and Australia. Robert became a member of the Scottish Dance Teacher's Alliance in 1987, and has taught, competed in, and performed highland dancing at various events across the United States, including Bonnie Rideout's "Scottish Christmas" Tour 1999-2005. In 2002, he and Karen Mahoney formed Highland Dance Boston, which has choreographed and performed many dances at Scottish events in the Boston Area. In his "spare time", Robert is a Professor of Mathematics at Northeastern University

Claire Collier - Lewiston, U.S.A.

Claire fell in love with Scottish Country Dancing while a graduate student at the University of Wisconsin and was soon dancing three times a week. After completing her graduate degree, she moved to Tarrytown, NY, and immediately joined the Westchester Scottish Dance Group, danced with the New Jersey class of the New York Branch, and was a member of the Loch Leven Scottish Country Dancers performing team for over 10 years. When she relocated to the Buffalo area, Claire joined the Hamilton (Ontario) Branch and has danced there for over 25 years. Since completing her Teacher's Certificate at TAC Summer School in 1996, Claire has taught the introductory, social, intermediate technique, and advanced classes in the Hamilton Branch. She has been a guest teacher in Buffalo and St. Catharines and taught workshops in Oakville, Toronto, London, Windsor, and Hamilton. Claire has also served on the executive of the Teachers' Association (Canada), the Hamilton Branch, and The White Cockade. Claire supports her Scottish Country Dance habit by working in the Development Office at Buffalo State College. When not dancing or working, Claire enjoys gardening, knitting, and travelling.
