



Young Singer Bursary

Kington Choral Society awards an annual bursary of up to £500 to support an up-and-coming young singer, aged between 18 and 30, in their musical studies.

We know that singing lessons can be expensive and that deciding whether to take music to a higher level takes time. You may be thinking of studying singing at music college or simply want an opportunity to develop your musicianship and explore your potential.

Our bursary can be used to contribute to expenses such as professional fees and travel while at the same time offering recipients the opportunity to take an active part in the choir under the professional guidance of KCS music director Robert Evans.

Recipients will need to become full members of the choir, attending rehearsals on Monday evenings, contributing to the rehearsal process and taking part in the choir's concerts (usually two a year). Where appropriate, they may also be invited to take on occasional solo roles. Awards normally run from the beginning of an academic year but may commence at any time. The KCS Young Singer Bursary was set up following a generous donation from an anonymous donor.
