PRIMARY ELECTION SCENARIO TAKEAWAYS

- Without descriptions for any candidates,
 Applegate leads the entire field.
- When candidate descriptions are included, Democrats Applegate, Jacobs, Kerr and Levin split the vote and launch Republican Chavez into the frontrunner position. Diane Harkey follows closely behind, polling at about the same level as the leading Democrat in this split field.
- This suggests that if all of the possible candidates run in the primary, Chavez and Harkey could potentially be the top two votegetters, advancing to the general and leaving Democrats out altogether.

- The long ballot with descriptions for some candidates has very similar results to the ballot with the narrowed field. Regardless of the field size, Chavez and Harkey split the Republican vote; Chavez has a slight edge.
- More than half of respondents would vote for a Democratic candidate, while less than half of respondents would vote for a Republican. However, because Applegate, Jacobs, Kerr and Levin are largely splitting the Democratic vote, the top Republicans receive an equally sized or larger share of the vote than the top Democrats do.

- In head-to-head matchups, any of the leading Democrats would beat the leading Republican by between two and four points.
