PRIMARY ELECTION SCENARIO TAKEAWAYS

- With the Democratic vote split between several candidates, there is a real possibility of two Republicans advancing to the general election.
- That said, in a narrowed field, the Republican vote is split between 3 candidates, and the Democratic vote is split between 4.
- Clearly, the more Democrats there are on the primary ballot, the higher the chances that none of them will finish in the top two.

- Among Democrats, Gil Cisneros and Andy Thorburn are roughly even at the moment.
- Cisneros and Thorburn have a sizeable lead over the rest of the Democratic field, regardless of which version of the field is presented.



Do you expect to vote in the general election for US Congress, US Senate, and California Governor on November 6, 2018?


