Focused wholly on healthy vocal production for singers of contemporary commercial music (CCM) singing styles, the programme addresses cutting edge research and best practice for professional/semi-professional singers, student singers and teachers of CCM style. Additionally, the programme offers dedicated sessions for community and secondary choral conductors who incorporate or want to incorporate contemporary styles (gospel, pop/rock, etc.) into their repertoire portfolios.

The emphasis of the Symposium is 'the practical approach' with presentations ranging from technique and style sessions, to masterclasses for solo performers and contemporary choral singers. Another exciting session features leading ENT/voice specialist Dr Matthew Broadhurst. Dr Broadhurst will collaborate with our two keynote speakers, leading UK based CCM artist/teachers Mark de-Lisser and Dane Chalfin and speech pathologist/ pedagogy lecturer Dr Ron Morris to de-mystify contemporary voice through a 'real-time' endoscopic examination of 3 CCM singers.

Mark de-Lisser is vocal coach for The Voice (UK) and singing teacher to Jesse J and Joss Stone among other high profile Pop/Rock performers. Mark is also #1 Choral specialist in the UK and Director of the award winning "ACM Gospel Choir". He is the author of two choral publications 'SING OUT!' and 'Inspire Your Choir'.

Dane Chalfin

Dane Chalfin is a contemporary voice teacher and vocal rehabilitation coach working with recording artists/bands (such as Pulled Apart By Horses, Hurts, Delphic, Everything Everything), television productions (The Voice UK and Eurovision) and musical theatre productions (Rock of Ages, Sunny Afternoon, Motown, Jesus Christ Superstar, Wicked, The Producers). Dane is Principal Lecturer in Performance and Artistry at Leeds College of Music. He also spent six years working for an NHS mulitdisciplinary voice clinic and continues to consult with private and NHS clinics. Dane wrote three chapters for TC-Helicon's "Ultimate Guide to Singing," and has chapters in Bloomsbury's "Singer-Songwriters Handbook" and Compton's 2nd Edition of "The Voice Clinic Handbook," both coming later this year.


