What is it?

Overview

The National Catholic Youth Conference is a powerful, biennial, three-day experience of prayer, community, and empowerment for Catholic teenagers (of high school age) and their adult leaders. More than 23,000 young people and their leaders attended 2017 NCYC in Indianapolis; we are looking forward to having even more in 2019.

The 2019 National Catholic Youth Conference is November 21-23, back in Indianapolis, with the theme: "Blessed Broken Given"

What happens during NCYC?

The schedule includes keynote presentations, prayer, workshops, liturgy, and opportunities to participate in reconciliation and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, as well as recreational activities, concerts, and exhibits. A key component of NCYC is the thematic park which is a blend of traditional exhibit booths with interactive areas featuring service projects, games, recreation, live musical performances, arts and sports.

Is NCYC for me?

If you have ever asked yourself any of these questions (to name a few), then NCYC is for you:

- Who am I?
- Who does God say that I am?
- Do I really want to be Catholic?
- What makes the Catholic Church different than all the rest?
- How do I develop a deeper relationship with God? With Jesus? With the Holy Spirit?

Workshops

Workshops are the backbone of the NCYC experience. Students will have the opportunity to participate in 4 throughout the week, with a final 5th block of time used to help process those workshops so that they can bring the knowledge, insight, and wisdom gained back home.

NCYC offers two types of workshops covering a wide range of topics. The first type is a mega workshop, which usually seats between 3,500 and 7,000 people. These sessions are held in exhibit halls and offered only once per conference. The second type is a regular workshop. These sessions are held in meeting rooms and accommodate approximately 550 people per room, though some rooms hold as many as 1,200 people. These sessions are usually offered twice per conference.

Presenters include leading catholic speakers, priests, and religious from all over the world who specialize in any and every aspect of our Catholic faith.

Other Activities

Prayer & Worship

Prayer is an essential component of NCYC. Through prayer the Catholic Christian community is grounded in the Lord. The days are interwoven with various Catholic prayer forms, to give youth and adults alike, an experience of the breadth of prayer within the church.

Participants have the opportunity to experience and share in many forms of liturgy and prayer during NCYC—not to mention celebrating the closing Mass with 25,000 others!

Meditation areas and a prayer center allow youth and adults the chance to pray and reflect either alone or in small groups. Mass is offered each day of the conference, as well as opportunities for the Sacrament of Reconciliation, Eucharistic adoration, recitation of the rosary, prayer through music.

Music

Music is a key element of NCYC. Over the coming weeks, NFCYM will announce the acts that have been selected to open for general sessions in Lucas Oil Stadium and for mega workshops in the Indiana Convention Center.

Later this fall, the performance schedule for the thematic park Coffee House stage will be posted.

Service

Service is an integral and vibrant part of the thematic park experience. Opportunities abound in Inspiration Junction. From things to bring from home to hands-on projects in the hall, there are numerous opportunities to be of service to others at NCYC.

Recreation

With all that is offered at NCYC, by Saturday afternoon most participants are ready for a short break before closing liturgy. This is why from 3:30 pm to 5:00 pm, NCYC turns it focus to engaging participants in recreational activities.

Dance

Lead by top Catholic youth ministry DJs and featuring appropriate chart topping music, this dance attracts about half of the NCYC attendees.

Comedy Club

Featuring comedy performers and musicians in comedy sketches, the comedy club showcases the funny side of faith.



Trip Details

Who: High School Students, Adult Leaders, and Youth Ministry Coordinators

What: National Catholic Youth Conference

Where: Indianapolis, Indiana

Conference Site: Lucas Oil Stadium (home of the Colts) and the

Indianapolis Convention Center

Lodging: Surprise luxury housing (2 blocks away)

When: November 20-24 (note this means you will be missing 3 days of school)

How: Carpooling

Cost: \$700/Student Total

We are asking each student for a \$200 down payment. The remaining balance of \$500 can be fundraised by participating in the various Youth Ministry fundraisers throughout the year. Essentially you can go on this trip for as little as \$200. We want to make this experience as affordable as possible.

A \$200 down payment is due May 15. The remaining balance will be settled in June 2020 once all our fundraisers have been completed for the fiscal year. Over 90% of students who participate in our fundraisers earn enough money to cover their entire \$500 owed after the \$200 down payment!
