Massimino's Ristorante celebrates grand re-opening in Ansonia

ANSONIA - A friendly, family-oriented atmosphere greets all who walk into the new Massimino's Ristorante downtown.

Owner Massimino Andretta of Ansonia and his family Friday hosted an official grand re-opening celebration at the two-story, 1,700-square-foot restaurant and banquet room at 85 Main St. The building is adorned with stone work and features a balcony off the banquet room.

The building is across the street from the original pizzeria Andretta opened in 2004.



A beaming Andretta, surrounded by his wife, Isabella, and three grown children, thanked his loyal friends and customers for supporting him for the past 15 years.

His motto is "Si Mangia in Famiglia" - "we eat with the family."

Andretta's brother-in-law, Mayor David S. Cassetti, said Andretta purchased the lot in 2012.

Cassetti, who worked in construction for many years, said he dug the foundation in 2017. "It took a few years [but] he's a really patient man," he said of Andretta.

Cassetti said the restaurant is "the first new construction on Main Street in over 30 years." A

building at 158 Main St. was constructed around 1987, he said.
