Camper's Guide

What do you bring to camp??

- Bible and journal or small notebook
- Pencil or pen
- Bedding and pillow
- 2 Towels (1 for swimming)
- Soap and shampoo, etc.
- Toothbrush and toothpaste
- Casual/recreational clothing
- Sweatshirt or jacket
- Raincoat or rain poncho
- Modest swimsuit and water shoes
- Tennis/athletic shoes (required for after dinner and for recreation/hiking) and socks
- Sunscreen and insect repellent
- Medications in original containers with directions
- Flashlight
- Forms for: registration +incentive, and health record
- Small amount of money for an offering

What you may NOT bring:

- Cell phone
- Candy/food
- Knives
- Firearms
- Fireworks
- Ipod/Radio/Stereo
- Computer/IPad
- All electronic games
- Tobacco, drugs and alcohol
- CD or DVD player

*If you are unsure about whether to bring an item, please feel free to contact your director and ask prior to coming to camp.

Other Important Things to Know

- Remember to include a health form (*signed by a doctor*)! Campers who do not have a completed, signed health form will be taken to a local doctor by the manager on Monday of their camp session in order to ensure their safety at camp.
- Most camp sessions begin registration late afternoon (after 3:00 pm) on the camp's first day with the first meal being dinner.
- Most camps are open to having additional help, but it is important that you contact the director of that camp session prior to coming to camp.
- Generally, phone calls to campers are not advised while they are at camp. Calls tend to encourage homesickness. But, if there is a reason you need to contact a camper, counselor, or director during the week, please call the camp phone, listed below.

Visitors at Camp

While both camps and their leaders/staff love visitors, there are guidelines to visiting while camp is in session. We appreciate your adherence to these guidelines so we can continue to allow camps to run smoothly.

- Please check in at the Manager's Cabin or Dining Hall to speak with either the manager or the director.
- Visitors are welcome, although parents/guardians of children at camp should refrain from visiting at this time because your leaving causes campers to miss home.
