## **Commissioners discuss estimated \$400,000.00 bridge construction located on Apache road**

The Board of Commissioners meeting was called to order at 8:30 am on Tuesday May 19, 2020 in the Woodson County Commissioners room. First to order was the pledge of allegiance followed by the approval of the amended agenda. A motion was made to approve the amended agenda by Commissioner Yoho. The motion was seconded and passed.

Following was a motion to approve the minutes by Commissioner Yoho; the motion was seconded and passed.

Next up Yoho made a motion to enter into a 20 minute executive session to discuss non-elected personnel, to begin at 8:42.am and reconvene at 9:02 am in the commissioner's room. The motion was seconded and passed.

Up next was a meeting with Russell Stuckey with Emergency Management. Stuckey presented to the com-

missioners a check in the amount of 10,142.00 from emergency management performance grant. Yoho then made a motion to adopt disaster resolution 20-06 for 58 days and to have Chairman Forsyth to sign resolution 20-06. The motion was seconded and passed.

Afterwards was a meeting with Public Works Administrator Dane Onnen. Onnen gave a weekly report. Onnen also disclosed that he is in the process of scheduling continuing education training classes for road graders. There is no official date set yet, but it could be scheduled sometime in June. Onnen give a report that paperwork is being sent from the engineers in regards to the easements for Apache Rd. Bridge, with an overall cost estimating at around \$400,000.00.

Following was a motion made by Barnett to enter into a 15 minute executive session to discuss non-elected personnel, to begin at 10:07 a.m. and to

reconvene in commissioner's room at 10:22 a.m. The motion was seconded and passed.

Afterwards, Yoho made a motion to approve Angie Morrison a position on the Tri-Valley Developmental Services Board of Directors. The motion carried.

Following was a motion made by Barnett to disburse an economic development check in the amount of \$7500.00 to the Woodson County Chamber of Commerce. The motion carried. Barnett then made a motion to go into a ten minute executive session to discuss non-elect personnel in the commissioner's room at 11:09 and to reconvene in the commissioner's room at 11:19. The motion carried.

Lastly a motion was made by Commissioner Yoho to bring the meeting to adjournment; the motion was seconded and passed, bringing the May 19, 2020 commissioners meeting to a close.
