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IWC client numbers top 13,000

IWC's support and services for our community continues to grow, with around 104,000 Episodes of Care delivered in the past financial year. This has risen from 71,542 in 2015/16 and 94,635 in 2016/17. Client numbers now top 13,000 across IWC services, and rising. Stage 2 of the IWC Health & Wellbeing Complex is under way, and is scheduled for completion in 2019.
