Answer each question in two to three double-spaced pages.

- 1. Provide an explanation and biblical defense of justification.
- 2. Define the form of church polity you affirm and provide its biblical justification.
- 3. Explain the synergistic nature of sanctification being sure to describe the relationship between God's grace and moral effort in the Christian life.
- 4. Provide your understanding of how the Holy Spirit guides Christians today.
