





Increased interest in Peruvian heritage, colonial architecture and culinary excellence attract the world's savviest travelers to Peru. Lima, once considered only a quick stopover on the way to Cusco, is now seen as a destination.

The first Relais & Châteaux hotel in Lima is conceived as a hub for travelers promoting deeper exploration of the historic city; 17 suites, a signature restaurant with the spirit of a turn of the Century Explorers Club, a Guest House with the charm of Lima's traditional hospitality, a meeting center with artistic sensibility to connect travelers.

A place for contemporary explorers of life seeking the intrigues and mysteries of Peruvian culture, geography and nature, Hotel B will cater to traditionalists looking for an authentic historic atmosphere and to shrewd urban explorers willing to immerse themselves in the city's contemporary social and cultural scene.





SAN MARTIN

otel B breathes new life into an abandoned historic national monument; a mansion reflecting the glamour of the 20s, surrounded by artist's studios, diplomatic residences and walking distance to the Malecón overlooking the Pacific Ocean. The historic building was constructed when Hotel Bolivar was in vogue. The place has been rebuilt to reflect a Grand Hotel designed by renowned Peruvian contemporaries including architect David Mutal, interior designer Jordi Puig, experience deseñadora Sandra Masias, restauranteur Oscar Velarde,

marchand d'art Lucia de la Puente and art collector Susana de la Puente.

An arts-boutique Hotel in the heart of a bohemian revival neighborhood, housing a unique art collection of its own, Hotel B is surrounded by neighboring galleries and linked directly to the Lucia de la Puente Gallery, which will provide guests with opportunities for private viewings, special events and a connection to Lima's blossoming art scene.



The Property

he House is a pristine example of a Belle Époque mansion, originally built as a summer seaside retreat during the presidency of Augusto Leguia, when Peru was celebrating 100 years of independence and Lima had been transformed for the occasion. Thus it captures the celebratory spirit of the 1920s.

The French architect Claude Sahut, also responsible for remodeling parts of the Government Palace, Lima's main avenues, parks, theatres and other public buildings, was commissioned to design a summer retreat for the Garcia Bedoya family. The original two-story house was constructed in 1914 with traditional local materials complemented by Italian marbles and imported woods. It included an ornate façade, high ceilings, teatinas

(local styled skylights), open balconies and marbled terraces for ample ventilation.

Mrs. Maria Teresa García and her family occupied the property for 40 years until 1954, when the house was sold to the Báscones family who used it as their residence until 2010.


The reconstruction team includes sculptors from the Fine Arts Academy and a team of carpenters led by an Italian master woodcrafter. The project is considered a trademark of restoration by the INC (Peru's Historic Building Society). Remodeling and expansion preserved the original structure; adding a contrasting 3 story contemporary building to house additional rooms and service areas.

Barranco

he property is ideally located on the corners of Boulevard Saenz Peña and Calle San Martín, in the heart of Barranco; two blocks from the Pacific Coast and 5 minutes from Mirafores. The neighborhood, a protected historic area, is filled with historic houses, its own main square and the famous Puente de los suspiros (Lima's Bridge of Sighs). It has been populated with boutiques, restaurants, and is a walking distance from numerous galleries and museums.



La Biblioteca will hold a collection of Peruvian maps; paitings, prints, books and other paraphernalia to promote the idea of exploration.


The 17 guest rooms are designed to spoil and pamper guests.




Second Floor




Third Floor

Food and Beverage

he Hotels restaurant, bar and lounge have been designed to complement Lima's excellent restaurants; a place for traditional service and excellent Peruvian cuisine in a light informal presentation with a feeling of Old Lima.

Various service areas offer private settings for guests combined with venues open to Limeños.

Oscar Velarde, owner of La Gloria, Lima's acclaimed restaurant, and advisor to the cuisine at Cicciolina in Cusco, has designed the menu to highlight intense flavors of local fresh ingredients utilizing the freshest of Oscar's orchard, the catch of the day and a wide array of local purveyors.

The menu is a blend of traditional Peruvian ingredients and Mediterranean flavors. The food is straightforward and accessible. The cooking emphasizes traditional technique, the classics updated to enhance the taste clarity of their primary ingredients.



El Comedor/Restaurant & Bar

A Classic. The bar & restaurant hosts a lively mix of savvy locals and inquisitive travelers open for coffee, meals, lonche (*) or drinks. Grand Room is decorated to recall the bohemian cafes, a traditional hotel bar with stunning pieces of modern art. The bar boasts an educated selection of South American wines, Peruvian Piscos and fresh seafood. A lively meeting point with a traditional club service. Capacity 50.

*El Lonche/ Peruvian Tea Time

Lonche has been a tradition in Lima since early republican days. Society would gather at the end of the day to play, drink and converse while exchanging their secret recipes. The gathering became important within the political, social and culinary circles; the excuse was to enjoy exquisite nibbles. A variety of fresh herbs and infusions, coffee or hot chocolate served with open sandwiches, fresh fruit cuts and typical Lima biscuits.

**Access to Galeria (On Request)

The contemporary art gallery adjacent to the hotel is available for private events or exclusive guest dinners catered by El Comedor.

La Sala/Living Room

The central and largest room, the heart of the hotel, serves as a Guest Service Desk and gathering area. La Sala faces the main Street and has a grand French ambience with two large sitt ing areas; with access to amenities, full service, concierge and attentive staff.

La Biblioteca y Patio/Library & Patio

Adjacent to the hotel's Lobby, a comfortably modish lounge with an outdoor patio. A quiet room on the main floor replete with maps and books reminiscent of a travel club; private sitting area and large communal table suitable for mingling, a light breakfast, or work sessions which opens to an enclosed central patio with abundant greenery which separates the old house from the contemporary annex surrounded with jasmine and fig aromas; ideal for outdoor breakfast; also open for light lunch, dinner or private events.

El Lounge/Executive Lounge

Open format and relaxed, comfortable sitting and work area on the second floor with exclusive acces to hotel guests. Includes newspapers, light reading, basic home equipment, accompanied by light snacks, tea and coffee.

La Terraza/Sundowner Deck






Atelier

4 King Bedded Rooms. 34 - 42 square meters (330 - 452sq feet). Located on the second floor of the historic mansion, Atelier rooms include either a foyer or private terrace overlooking the Boulevard. The walk-through, open format bathrooms include twin vanity basins, separate rain shower and WC; some include a standalone bathtub and desk. Sitting area includes 1 couch (seats two), plus a chair, table, cocktail table, vintage armoire and cabinet. Complimentary high-speed wireless Internet connection, complimentary local phone calls, minibar, plasma TV with HD channels, iPod docking station.



Aposento

9 King (two twin) Bedded rooms. 22-36 square meters (236-387 sq feet). Situated throughout the historic mansion and the contemporary wing on all floors, overlooking either Calle San Martin or the inner Patio. Walk-in bathrooms have separate rain shower and WC; some include a stand-alone bathtub. Sitting area includes couch (seats two), chair, table, vintage armoire and cabinet. Complimentary high-speed wireless Internet connection, complimentary local phone calls, minibar, plasma TV with HD channels, iPod docking station.



Alcoba

4 Contemporary Queen Bedded rooms. 19 - 22 square meters (205 - 236 sq feet). 2 located on the first floor of the historic mansion and 2 on the second and third floor of the contemporary wing, overlooking the Spanish Diplomatic Residence on Calle San Martin. Split bathroom include separate WC and rain shower with single basin in main room. Sitting area includes sofa (seats one), desk with chair, vintage armoire and cabinet. Complimentary high-speed wireless Internet connection, complimentary local phone calls, minibar, plasma TV with HD channels, iPod docking station.
