FOX CITY FLIX

DIDC has hired Fox City Flix to set up and take down the 32-ft inflatable movie screen, provide the generator and also provide

sound. Sound will be projected from the screen, but able to play the sound on your car stereo (if you reserve a stall)!

LOCATION

The lawn and parking lot of St. Patrick's Parishlocated on the

corner of Nicolet Blvd. and Washington Street.

With a 32-ft screen, there is plenty of room on the grass for camping chairs and blankets. Feel free to walk, bike or drive to the event. There's plenty of parking behind St. Patrick's.

DRIVE-IN OPTION

While this event is mainly a lawn outdoor movie event, we do have limited 20 spots for drive-in options. These spots are available for reservation only for \$10 per car. THE OL' BAIT SHOP History of the Bait Shop on Doty Island

Eighty years ago Robert Mason built his home on a picturesque section of Doty Island along the Fox River—it is located at the end of Fox Street facing James Island. He was an outdoorsman and an entrepreneur. Steps from his back door he erected a small building which became the stopping off point for fishermen and river enthusiasts for about the next twenty-five years. It was known as The Bait Shop by the fishermen who came to get their bait for their fishing adventures along the Fox



and out onto Little Lake Butte de Mort. All they had to do was ring his home doorbell and out Robert would come, walk over to the Bait Shop and sell bait or possibly rent a rowboat. He would run it year round so ice fishing would be a money maker for him.


In the 1950's a youth named Dan Koerner became vary familiar to the Bait Shop and Mr. Mason. He would buy bait and then try his luck at fishing along the river. Dan refrained from using the rowboats which were difficult to maneuver for a youngster and fished along the banks. He lived just up the street from the shop with his eleven siblings. It was an exciting life along the water for him but a difficult time for his parents. Almost yearly his home would flood and his parents would be cleaning up a mess.

Now fast forward to 1980. Dan has grown up and looking for a place to settle down. He locates this beautiful section of property along the Fox at the entrance to Little

Lake Butte de Mort. It is just a stones throw away from where he grew up on Doty Island. You guessed it! On the property there is still the old Bait Shop. Dan carefully renovates it and brings it back to house all his fishing memorabilia.

Two thousand bobbers that Dan has collected from the shoreline hang from the ceiling. There is also a bobber Christmas tree. Robert Mason's original price list was discovered and hangs on the wall.

Now the Bait Shop is a private entertainment center where Dan and his wife invite friends and family over for fish fries and stories are shared about the "old days" on Doty Island. Places like Steckers, Winnies, Island Drug Store, Streiners Grocery, the Corner Store, and Brantmeyer Liquior Store are fondly remembered.





DOTY ISLAND STREET SIGNS Identity for Doty Island Community

During the last couple months, we've been working on 'alternative' projects to impact the community. One of the projects we've been working on has been Doty Island street signs toppers. The purpose of this project is to spread community pride and give our island community an identity



that is easily visible to the entire community.

Our DIDC council has worked with the Neenah and Menasha Public Works/Traffic Departments to ensure the material used and the size of the signs are consistent with their requirements.

WG, Inc. has created two design mockups based on our input. Eventually, we will devise the final version of the sign to propose to the Neenah and Menasha City Councils.

The mockups signs have been hung up on Keyes Street—at



Smith Park. One at the corner of Keyes/Cleveland and the other on the corner of Keyes/Park. THESE ARE NOT THE FINAL DESIGN or SIZE.

DIDC is using its "Sign Fund" monies for this project. Prior to city approval, we will need to determine how many signs will be need to be ordered and where to place them. Depending on cost and funds, not all intersections may receive a Doty Island topper.

DOTY ISLAND GREENS, LLC Fresh Veggies

Do you know where your produce comes from? Much of the fresh fruits and vegetables found in our grocery stores today are grown in California or in other countries. But did you know that we have an organic produce farm right here on the Island? Five-year Doty Island resident and founder of Doty Island Greens, Rob Turner, is passionate about producing organic produce using the urban farm methodology and grows nutrient-rich food right here on the Island.

Rob studied in Environmental



Science / Earth Science, and it is this training that gave him a strong understanding of soil and gardening. Soon after graduating with his degree, he started his own company, REV Organic, and focused on earthworm castings and the many benefits they provide to soil and plants. He also worked for a larger earthworm casting company as their full-time microbiologist.

He has since gone back to teaching full-time but created Doty Island Greens to grow a wide variety of vegetables in several plots on Doty Island and in Neenah. He uses an urban farm model which strives to grow food as locally as you can. It not only maximizes the nutrition in your food but also minimizes the carbon footprint spent to produce the food. Rob also focuses on making his produce as nutritionally dense as possible by building up the health of the soil it is grown in. Typically, he would sell his produce at the Farmer's Markets

but this year is trying out a Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) model. Over 20 residents in Menasha, Neenah, and Oshkosh are taking part in the CSA this year and sharing the bounties of the Doty Island Greens gardens.

If you're already an avid gardener and interested in improving the health of your own garden's soil, Doty Island Greens offers organic and sustainable products that will help build your soil's health over time. Rob also consults on what you can do to your soil to either produce more nutrient rich food or to convert lawn/non-garden space into a bountiful garden. Increasing the good microbiology in your soil (think bacteria, fungi, and protozoans) all lead to healthier plants and produce. It takes time and care to do so, but the end results benefit both your plants and you.


