### What is Auditory Processing Disorder? How may it affect learning?

Have you ever been to a talk, conference or meeting where the people talking talk quickly. There is also some background noise and people talking near you. Did you find by the end of that talk, you couldn't remember the key points being presented?

These are problems experienced by some children and adults with auditory processing difficulties (APD). Although the teacher may be speaking relatively slowly and clearly, many children with APD require more time and less background noise to recognise sounds and words to process a sentence. As a result they miss part of what is said and so do not understand the information or the task to be completed.

### 10 Signs of possible APD.

- 1 Complains of not being able to hear the teacher but when tested hearing is satisfactory.
- 2 Has difficulty following instructions and requires frequent repetition
- 3 Copies other children and requests help from them
- 4 Appears to day dream/lose attention often worse in group settings.
- 5 Problems become more noticeable from year 3/4 as teacher becomes more class based
- 6 Difficulty with reading and/or spelling
- 7 May have problems expressing himself clearly in speech or writing. Grammatical and sequential errors
- 8 May present with some features of Dyslexia but does not fully fit the picture
- 9 Problems at school are at odds with perceived cognitive ability
- 10 Problems with rhythm and pitch discrimination noticeable with playing music activities and possibly speech.

### What can you do?

- 1 It is important that you or the teacher do not diagnose this. It takes a highly skills specialist to ensure they have ruled out all other issues there could be before providing a diagnosis.
- 2 Do not share your assessment with your child. Giving them a label, when it has not been properly diagnosed as such can be damaging for their self-image and attitude.
- 3 Refer to your local Speech and Language services. This can be done directly by yourself of in conjunction with the school –
