### SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS 2019



1. **ANNOUNCEMENT:** Hagley & District Light Car Club will organise Hill Climb Events at Loton Park, Alberbury, near Shrewsbury, SY5 9AG (map reference 126/358143) on the following dates :

2. **EVENTS:** The events will be held under the General Regulations of Motorsports UK (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA), under these Supplementary Regulations, and any other written instructions the organising Club may issue. Additionally, motorcycles will be subject to **ACU** Regulations.

3. **LICENCE:** The track licence has been applied for.

4. **COURSE:** The tarmac course is 1,475 yards (1,349 metres) long with an average gradient of 1 in 25 (4%) and a steepest gradient of 1 in 7 (14%).

5. **NUMBER OF ENTRIES:** The maximum number of entries is as stated above. The minimum number of entries for a National A and a National A/B event is 80 and for a National B is 50. Should the minimum entry not be reached by "Discount Day" the event may be cancelled at the discretion of HDLCC. The Club reserves the right to combine classes where numbers necessitate.

For all events "Discount Day" is **25** full days before the event and "Closing Date" **14** full days before the event. Actual dates are given in the relevant Appendix. Entries may be paid on line via PayPal or by cash or a cheque made out to **Hagley & District Light Car Club**. The Club will require a competitor to reimburse any costs arising from a cheque which does not clear at its first presentation. **The minimum charge is £ 20.**

Entry fees include three personal passes valid up to 11.00. Additional fees are required for camping see Section 24.

Entry forms may be submitted by email but will not be processed or acknowledged until the receipt of the fee.

To receive an acknowledgement either provide an email address or enclose a stamped addressed envelope. This is not confirmation of an accepted entry. Notification of accepted entries will be sent out within 72 hours of the closing date.

It is the responsibility of the Entrant/Driver to ensure that the information given on the entry form is both correct and complete. The Entries Secretary can only act on the information given thereon.

8. **CANCELLATIONS AND NON-STARTERS:** The cancellation of an event as a result of circumstances beyond the Club's control e.g. force majeure, weather, foot and mouth disease, insufficient entries, etc., will result in a refund of the entry fee less actual costs to the Club.

In the event of a cancellation by a competitor of an entry received by the Entries Secretary the following refunds apply: -  
Up to and including "Discount Day" – a refund of the entry fee less £10 administration fee.  
Between "Discount Day" and up to and including "Closing Day" – a refund of the entry fee less £25 administration fee.  
After "Closing Day" – a refund of £20 on a written or email application received by the Entries Secretary up to 7 days after the event.

9. **RESERVES:** Should the event be oversubscribed then those over the maximum number may, at the discretion of HDLCC, be identified as reserves. **Reserves not informed that they are replacing a withdrawal WILL NOT practice or run.**

10. **COMPETITION NUMBERS:** Vehicles will be identified by competition numbers allocated by the organisers and confirmed in the final instructions/provisional entry lists. Numbers should be affixed to BOTH SIDES of the car in accordance with S 9.2.5. Numbers may be available from the Secretary of the Meeting.

11. **PROGRAMME:** The times of signing-on, practice and competition for each event will be defined in the Final Instructions. Competitors are asked to note the times of church services. There will be a prohibition on running engines in competing vehicles in classes NOT being run during Church Services. This will be rigidly enforced.

12. **TYRE WARMERS:** The use of an external device or power source to pre-heat the tyres of competing cars, whether the tyres are fitted to the car or not, is prohibited. The spinning of wheels to clean and induce heat into the tyres is allowed within the designated area after the pre-start line but forward motion must be maintained. Spinning wheels outside the designated area may result in exclusion from the event. Transmission warming/testing shall be strictly in accordance with K 14.2.

13. **CAMERAS:** Cameras may only be used on competing vehicles if they have been fixed in position at the time of scrutineering and are approved by the Chief Scrutineer. Failure to comply may result in exclusion.

14. **PRACTICE:** Competitors are recommended to walk the hill in their own time up to 15 minutes before the start of practice after which the hill must be clear for official vehicles. Unless prior permission has been given, any competitor not signed-on by 11:00 a.m. may be excluded.

15. **START PROCEDURE:** Cars will start singly at intervals. The starting signal is a red light followed by a green light. The method of timing is electronic by breaking a light beam at the start and finish. **No more than two people at any time, in addition to the driver and Officials are allowed in attendance on each car in the identified start area (S.9.3.5)**

16. **RED FLAG:** During your runs up the hill, if a marshal displays a red flag STOP IMMEDIATELY and await instructions. **At Triangle Bend and Fallow Bend the red flag may be augmented with flashing red lights.**

17. **FINISH PROCEDURE:** The finish line will be indicated by chequered boards. After crossing the finishing line follow the track to the holding paddock. Brake testing or practice starts are not allowed in the approach to or in the holding paddock. Return down the hill to the main paddock when directed to do so by an official. A static red flag will be displayed to indicate caution, drive slowly and be aware of marshals on or in close proximity to the hill. If a red flag is waved STOP IMMEDIATELY. **Competitors are required to wear ALL safety gear for the return downhill. Failure to do so is in contravention of S.9.2.1.**

18. **RECOVERY:** In the event that a stricken car has to be recovered using the available HDLCC Recovery Unit, equipment or marshals, care will be taken to minimise any further damage during the recovery. However the Club disclaims any responsibility for any such consequential damage.

19. **RESULTS:** Times will be displayed in or on the Results Hut adjacent to the Paddock. Results will be emailed or posted to all competitors within 7 days. Protests must be lodged in accordance with MSA Regulations.

The major trophies remain the property of Hagley & District Light Car Club Ltd. and will be presented at the Club's annual awards presentation. All other event awards will be presented on the day of the event.

21. **SUPPORT CREW:** Competitors are deemed to be responsible for the actions of their support crew. Any transgressions of these Regulations by support crew may result in the exclusion of the competitor at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course.
22. **MARKER POSTS/FLIP FLOPS:** Any competitor hitting these with the result that it causes a Red Flag, will have a one second penalty added to the time of their run. The third such penalty at any one meeting will be either exclusion from the event or the timed run disqualified, at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course.
23. **ACCESS:** Loton Park (postcode SY5 9AG) is located 9 miles west of Shrewsbury on the B4393 in the village of Alberbury. The gates into the park will be opened at 12:00 noon on the day before the event. Loton Park is a deer park and the gates must be closed in the hours of darkness. If you arrive after nightfall please ensure the gates are closed behind you.
24. **OVERNIGHT CAMPING** is permitted in the park at a cost of **£9.00** per unit. Payment of this fee is a condition of camping. People wishing to camp should complete the relevant section of the entry form for themselves and their support crew, where appropriate, and raise a separate cheque to be paid to the Secretary of the Meeting at Signing-on, dated the day of the event and made payable to "Deer Park Farm". Should a competitor, through force of circumstances, wish to camp without prior notice, payment should also be made to the Secretary of the Meeting on the day. Camping passes should be displayed on the side of the unit facing the access road. The park must be vacated within two hours of the completion of competition on the second day. Camping is not allowed on the last night after the completion of the meeting.

Please unhitch trailers and park tow vehicle at 90° to access road to allow parking spaces for other competitors and spectators. Any competitor found parking parallel to the access road will be asked to move.

H&S regulations require a minimum gap of 20 feet between parked motorhomes, caravans, etc. Please observe this requirement.

25. **DOGS: Members of the public will not be allowed to bring dogs into Loton Park.** Our landlord, Sir Michael Leighton, has agreed to allow competitors to bring dogs into the park on the following basis:-
  - a. From 1 hour before the programmed commencement of runs to 30 minutes after the final run, dogs must be kept in motorhomes or caravans out of sight of the general public. **It is not acceptable to leave dogs in cars or vans.**
  - b. Dogs may need to be exercised in the middle of the day and this must be done outside the park. Wherever possible such dogs should be removed from, and returned to, the park by car. Identifying this intention to the gatekeeper will avoid embarrassment on return.
  - c. Outside the hours identified in a) dogs may be exercised in the park within the area leased by HDLCC, identified by signage within the parking areas and not to the east or south of the track.
  - d. Dogs must be kept on a lead at all times they are outside a motorhome or caravan.

The Club is grateful to Sir Michael Leighton for granting this concession but it must be pointed out that it will be withdrawn if competitors do not abide by the rules a) to d). In the event of an incident involving a dog brought in by a competitor or his support crew, the offender will be required to remove the dog(s) immediately. Should an unleashed dog worry game or deer, the Loton Park Gamekeeper will be within his rights to take appropriate action.

26. **PADDOCK DISCIPLINE:** In parts of the tarmac surfaced paddock, trailers or tow vehicles (but not both) may be parked adjacent to competition vehicles. Competitors' cars or support vehicles must not be parked at the top of the paddock in the area designated for Officials and the Disabled. Cooking appliance e.g. BBQs, gas/primus stoves, etc., are not to be used in the paddock. Smoking is discouraged in the paddock because of the presence of fuel. Canopies are to be securely weighted in position. There are to be no fixings into the tarmac surface.

Competitors wishing to leave the venue prior to the completion of the event must seek permission from the Paddock marshals and take care not to block access for emergency vehicles through the paddock to the venue access/exit. A pass-out will be issued by the gate staff to competitors or service crew wishing to leave the venue for a short time during the event. **NOTE: Re-scrutineering is required on return if cars entered in a one-day or two-day event leave the venue at any time during the running of that event.**

The riding of cycles or scooters or use of any wheeled appliance such as a skateboards or hoverboards or Segways is not allowed at Loton Park at any time.

No competing or non-competing vehicles are allowed on the track out-of-hours unless on HDLCC business relating to the running of the event and authorised by the Clerk of the Course.

27. **CATERING:** On-site catering will be available, but competitors are reminded that Motorsport UK empower the Clerk of the Course, under Regulation D 25.1.14, to authorise a Medical Officer to conduct spot checks on any competitor to ascertain whether alcohol or prohibited substances have been consumed.
28. **DRONES:** Drones or small unmanned aircraft are not allowed at this venue. Loton Park is within Low Flying Area N°9 allocated to RAF Shawbury as a Helicopter Training Area.
29. **LOCAL ACCOMMODATION:** Details of local hotels/ bed & breakfast establishments can be found on the Internet.

30. **OFFICIALS OF THE MEETINGS:** Any changes will be notified in the Final Instructions.

**Note 1** Vehicles competing in Class J(i) must comply with the appropriate Motorsport UK Formula Regulations.

**Note 2** To be eligible for Class M, vehicles of monocoque construction and those with rear wings will be allowed, provided that they were standard on the car at the appropriate date. Wheel rim width may be increased by no more than 25mm, but period style must be retained.

The use of slick tyres is prohibited in Class M. The type, size and tread of tyre must remain the same throughout the meeting. Post 1945 cars must run on treaded tyres which may be road tyres complying with the Motor Vehicles (Construction and Use) regulations, or racing tyres as long as the latter have grooves in the tread pattern which must be lateral and circumferential and any 40mm diameter area of the tyre must have grooves in at least two different directions, which themselves must have a minimum width of 3mm.

**Note 3** All Caterhams, Lotus Sevens, Westfield and other "Kit Cars" complying with S11 and S12 of the MSA Yearbook will enter either class B or D. All other cars of this type which do not comply with the above will enter classes F or G and comply with the relevant safety regulations.

- Note 1** Vehicles competing in Class 9A must comply with the appropriate Motorsport UK Formula Regulations.
- Note 2** To be eligible for 12A and 12B, vehicles of monocoque construction and those with rear wings will be allowed, provided that they were standard on the car at the appropriate date. Wheel rim width may be increased by no more than 25mm, but period style must be retained. The use of slick tyres is prohibited. The type, size and tread of tyre must remain the same throughout the meeting. Post 1945 cars must run on treaded tyres which may be road tyres complying with the Motor Vehicles (Construction and Use) regulations, or racing tyres as long as the latter have grooves in the tread pattern which must be lateral and circumferential and any 40mm diameter area of the tyre must have grooves in at least two different directions, which themselves must have a minimum width of 3mm.
- Note 3** Except for those entered in a specific championship or club class, all Caterhams, Lotus Sevens, Westfield and other “Kit Cars” complying with S11 and S12 of the MSA Yearbook will enter classes 2 and 4. All other cars of this type which do not comply with the above will enter classes 5 or 6 and comply with the relevant safety regulations.
