Why are we studying Exodus

- Laying the groundwork for a study in the book of Hebrews
- For the children
- For instructions on holiness and worship
- For our personal instruction (1 Corinthians 10:11-13)
- To see God as our deliverer (Daniel 6:26-27)

Preparation of two nations (Exodus 1)

- Israel
 - 2 Threats to the nation of Israel
 - Threat of slavery (Romans 6:5-7, 16-22)
 - Threat of death (1 Corinthians 15:54-57)
- Egypt
 - Pharaoh that treasured them (Genesis 50:6-7)
 - Pharaoh that feared them
 - Pharaoh that hated them

Exodus

Preparation of a deliverer (Exodus 2:1-22)

- Born in adversity
 - Fearless women
 - Faithful woman
 - Ambitious woman
- Raised by the adversary
 - Compassionate woman
- Rejection of the adversary (2:11-14, Hebrews 11:24-26)
- Growth of the deliverer

Exodus

Preparation of the hearts of men (Exodus 2:23-4:17)

- The heart of Israel is prepared
 - Groaned together (Psalm 6)
 - Cried together
 - Prayed together (Lamentation 3:52-56)
- The heart of Moses is prepared
 - Gods calling of Moses (v. 1-5)
 - Gods declaration to Moses (v. 6-10)
 - The excuses of Moses

Exodus

Preparation by bringing conflict (Exodus 5:1-23)

- The conflict with Pharaoh
- The conflict with Israel
- The conflict with Moses

Preparation for action (Exodus 6)

- Gods plan for action
 - Emancipation
 - Jesus sets us free (John 8:31-36)
 - Redemption
 - Jesus is our Redeemer (Titus 2:13-14)
 - Adoption
 - In Jesus we have adoption (Romans 8:14-15)
 - Possession
 - Jesus is our ultimate possession (Revelation 22:1-7)
