Our aims...(cont'd)

- c) **To create an Inclusive, Progressive economics discipline** based equally on environmental and social justice and on diversity amongst all humanity, comfortably including learning from natural science and other sources and including everyone and everything on the planet. This way of living will be diverse and inclusive with access for all. It will include those with no voice, and those with no power, and those with disability of all kinds and all minorities. It will undo the greatest happiness of the greatest number and include everyone equally. This we describe as "Progressive and Inclusive Economics."

In this Para -Olympic year we have been working to create a team as diverse as possible and walking the talk, practising what we preach.

We are extending our programme to expressly offer places in our teams at the highest level, to people with disabilities which are either of personality, physical and mental nature.

Our aims...(cont'd)

d) To create an economics which in which long term survivability of everyone and everything on the planet are regarded as equally important to short term considerations of profit, greed and growth.

Our aims...(cont'd)

e) To make economics efficient, and relevant to the concerns of the 21st century, removing the short term growthist and greed and wealth creation imperative and replacing it with more holistic values.

f) To make economics practise and theory accessible for everyone, (including women throughout the world) removing its exclusive priesthood. Everyone and everything on earth, has an economics impact, economics rights and economics responsibilities.

In 2011 Miriam Kennet was named as one of 100 most powerful women in the world who create change by poverty charity, One World Action and awarded by Jon Snow of the BBC.

g) To change peoples, (especially economists) perception of the natural world and its beings, and its systems so they see themselves, and their economy as part of it.

We launched our model of the economy in the House of Commons in 2011 where it was very well received.

h) To influence governments and politicians to adopt the above into policy making.

The Swedish and Ghanian Environment Ministers are using our books to inform their policy making in 2012. The RIO +20 Summit Leader used our books (Handbook of Green Economics) to inform the outcome of the conference.

The United Nations has badged our womens Unequal Pay and Poverty book as its own! We have spoken this year in the UK Bank of England and the board of the European Central Bank strategy discussions.

Our mission statement...

- We pledge to reform economics to make it accessible and useful for everyone, all people everywhere, other species, nature, the planet and its systems.
- We pledge to work up our new discipline of Green Economics into a robust economics discipline.
- We pledge to provide a usable analytical framework and models, metrics and benchmarks for you to use. (The Green Economy has taken off globally since we wrote this. Do let us know if it's a feature of different party's election campaigns for government programmes in your country).
- We pledge to reform mainstream economics to allow it to prevent poverty, not to create it, to enhance biodiversity and not destroy it and to work within the planet's capabilities not over-consume and exhaust its resources.
- We pledge to make economics accessible to all people everywhere, and to make everyone limit their impacts and enhance their responsibilities.
- We pledge to make economics an inclusive discipline founded on the complex mesh of social and environmental justice, and provisioning for the needs of all people everywhere, other species, nature, the planet and its systems.
- Further we pledge to within 5 years ensure that women's unequal pay is a thing of the past. The assumption that women are 70% of the world's poor- as happens now and that women will be paid less than men for equal work- is now an outdated notion and will be removed by our work- and in our hugely popular campaign.



The Ten Key Values of the Green Economics Institute

1. Green economics aims to provision for the needs of all people everywhere, other species, nature, the planet and its systems, all as beneficiaries of economics transactions, not as throw away inputs.
2. This is all underpinned by social and environmental justice, tolerance, no prejudice and creating quality of life for everyone including future generations and all the current generations, including older and younger people.
3. Ensuring and respecting other species and their rights. Ending the current mass extinction of species. Ensuring biodiversity.
4. Non violence and inclusion of all people everywhere, including people with special needs and special abilities. Ensuring all nations have equal access to power and resources. Local people having control over their own destiny and resources. Increasing life expectancy, human welfare and per capita GDP in the least developed countries.
5. Ensuring gender equity in all activities. Educating, respecting, empowering women and minorities.
6. Ending current high mass consumption and overshoot of the planet's resources and returning to live within the comfortable bounds of nature in the climatic conditions under which humans built their civilisation. Choosing lifestyle changes over techno fixes and eco technology. Lowering our own carbon usage and living lightly on the earth. Changing how economics is done: from being an abstract mathematical exercise to embracing realism and the real world we all live in and share and in which we are all concerned stakeholders.
7. Valuing and respecting all people equally.
8. Poverty prevention. Climate change and instability prevention, adaptation, mitigation. Protecting the most vulnerable from risk. Ensuring the future of small island states.
9. Quickly reducing carbon per capita globally to 2 tonnes in the next 5 years and zero soon after. Limiting and reversing climate change. Moving to renewable energy sources.
10. Building a future-proofed economics to solve the current economic uncertainty and downturn which is suitable for the 21st century. Creating and nurturing an economy based on sharing, rather than greed and profit. Completely reshaping and reforming current economics to do all the above.

What we do...

The Green Economics Institute (GEI) has developed a new discipline in economics that is based on an objective assessment of the problems, options and solutions available to society to deal with the challenges of ever more rapidly changing complex, fragile, vulnerable, physical and social environments and to promote provisioning for needs within social and environmental justice.

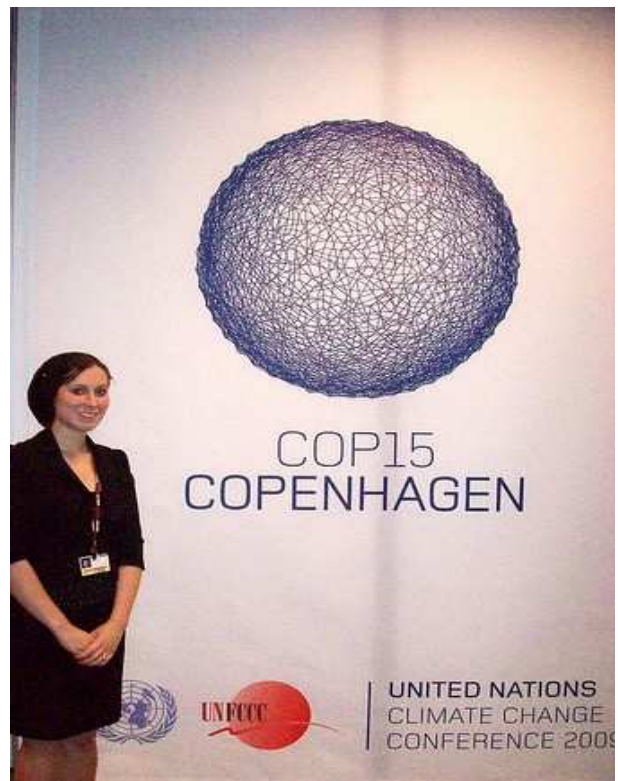


Ban Ki Moon, the General Secretary of the United Nations declared *"we are living in an age of global transformation, an age of Green Economics."* The Green Economics Institute launched the Greening the Economy initiative in the UN in December 2008. We have received encouragement that the mainstream is beginning to incorporate our ideas into economic policy and literature.

We have created the first green academic journal in the world – International Journal of Green Economics (IJGE) that seeks to facilitate debate about alternative perspectives to existing and future economics problems. Additionally, we now have major publishers wanting to work with us on a variety of projects and our own book series and journals.



Aiming to reform economics into a well-defined goals-based discipline, Green Economics, with practical answers to existing and future problems by incorporating a wider scope of relevant facts, knowledge, complex interactions and truly holistic explanations or solutions. *Green Economics was featured by Harvard (2008) and in Newsweek Magazine (2008).* The Institute has now over 48 contacts and branches worldwide. We are contributing to policy in many countries and we led the formation of European Green economics policy - we visited the European Parliament regularly for this work giving speeches and running workshops.



Green economics reclaims economics from the preserve of purely quantitative measurement, graphs, statistical data and the assumption of "homo economicus" to create a complex, interdisciplinary, holistic, long term, social science which is informed by qualitative and quantitative data from natural science. Its long-termism describes archaeological and palaeontological time frames, which provides a better setting better tools for economics than are offered by current conventions and short term business cycles.

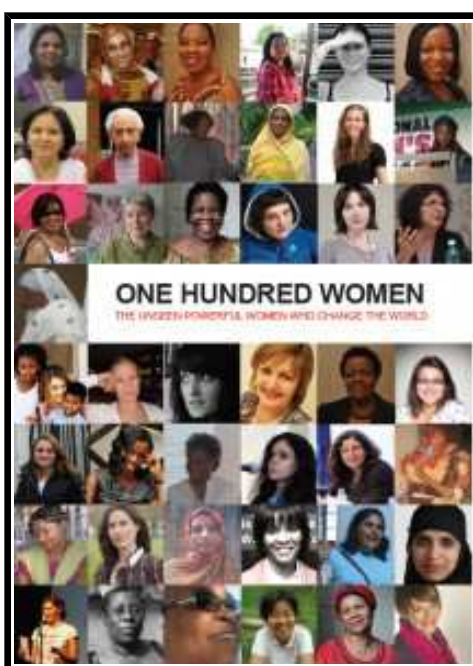
Miriam Kennet

Miriam Kennet is the founder and CEO Director of the Green Economics Institute, and founder and Editor of the International Journal of Green Economics, is a member of Mansfield College, Oxford University.

She currently teaches on the Interns College courses and founded the Green Economics Masters and PhD Courses at Birmingham City University. She designed and lectured on the Environmental Economics Course at Birkbeck College, London University and also taught Environmental Policy there and at Oxford University. She is author of around 35 articles, detailed on the Green Economics Institute's website and co editor of a book, Green Economics Beyond Supply and Demand to Meeting People's Needs and is creating a series with Gower Management Books on Green Economics and Sustainable Growth at the moment. Forthcoming book contributions include several books and book chapters.

She led a delegation to COP 15 Climate Change Conference in Copenhagen where we also ran an event. She was named one of 100 most powerful unseen global women by the Charity One World action for her global work on increasing women's economics power!

Miriam Kennet is a specialist in Green Economics and was the Co-Founder and is CEO of the Green Economics Institute. She founded and edits the first Green Economics academic journal in the world, the International Journal of Green Economics, and she has been credited with creating the academic discipline of Green Economics. Green Economics has been recently described by the Bank of England as one of the most vibrant and healthy areas of economics at the moment.

She has researched at Oxford University, Oxford Brookes, South Bank and Keele University, and is a member of Mansfield College, Oxford University and the Environmental Change Institute. She has taught, lectured and spoken at Universities and events all over Europe, from Alicante to Oxford and Bolzano, and to government officials from Montenegro and Kosovo to The UK Cabinet Office, Transport Department, National Government School and Treasury and spoken in Parliaments from Scotland to Austria and The French Senat and Estonia. She is also a regular and frequently speaks at public events of all kinds, and after dinner speaker.

She took part in the protests against mainstream economics outside the London Stock Exchange and the protesters find her ideas really useful. She is also very active in spreading Green Economics in Asia, China, and all round Africa where people find it may be one of the beacons of hope at the moment in an age of Austerity and Cuts as it provides a completely new way of looking at the world. Her work is very practical and she worked in factories and engineering for many years in the past. She is on the Assembly of the Green European Foundation and also on the steering group of the European Network of Political Foundations.

She has a delegation to the UNFCC COP Kyoto Climate Change Conferences and this year will head up a delegation to RIO + 20 Earth Summit, in RIO Brazil where she is very active. She regularly speaks on TV around Europe, most recently in Belgium, and Estonia and this year the BBC has made a special programme about her life and work. She runs regular conferences at Oxford University about Green Economics and this year has run 8 events from Youth in Action for Young People from Egypt involved in the revolution, People from FYRO Macedonia, Italy and other countries, as well as the Green Built Environment, The Greening of

China as the Chinese government is very interested in her work, Womens Unequal Pay and poverty, Green Economics and Methodology, truth,fact and reality with critical realism and several other events.

She publishes regularly, having over 100 articles, papers and other publications, as well 4 book series, one with Ashgate Academic Press, one with Gower Management Publishers, as well as a Handbook series and a Green Economics Reader Series. This years edited volumes include Green Economics:Voices of Africa, The Green Economics Reader, Handbook of Green Economics:A Practitioners Guide, The Green Built Environment, Women's Unequal Pay and Poverty,Green Economics and Climate Change. She also publishes in scientific papers, this year including the Latvian National Scientific Papers and Journals for example and book chapters including this year the University of Syracuse in the USA and she has been featured in the Harvard Economics review and Wall Street Journal as a leader. She has run training courses in the Cabinet Office, the National Government School, and most recently at Admiralty Arch, and in elsewhere around Europe. She has spoken in the Austrian and Scottish Parliaments, in the French Senate and in the Oxford Union and recently launched our Institute and Green Economics in Estonia and Montenegro. She is a member of the Environmental Change Institute at Oxford University and of Mansfield College, Oxford University.

Her lecture invitations include Birkbeck College and London University, in environmental economics and policy, Guandong and Hafei University in China, the Economics Ministry in FYRO Macedonia, the Regional Environment Centre REC in Hungary to officials of many Balkan states, and recently at Venice International University, in Montenegro to the Balkan Governments, and to Senior Civil Servants for Women's Leadership at the National Government School on women's day this March. She lectured on climate change economics at Schumacher College in the UK with the former foreign minister of the UK. She is championing slow travel for her lectures or the use of web cam in order to reduce her carbon footprint.

Miriam has published very widely on Green issues, business and the economy, from the Harvard College Economics Review, to the Rosa Luxembourg Foundation in Germany, and co founder and CEO of the Green Economics Institute. She studied economics at London University under Gracia -letto Gilies, Natural Science at Oxford under John Boardman and Economics Policy issues. She is author of numerous articles on Green Economics (and its development into a major new economics discipline) and lectures all over the world, most recently at the Venice International University, the Balkans, Cambridge University, Ankara University, Istanbul University, Oxford University and the UK's National Government School and Bolzano in South Tirol to Ministers and in Estonia to MPs and to Malaysian Ministers. She is also the series editor of a book series on 20th and 21st century philosophy with Ashgate Academic Publishers.

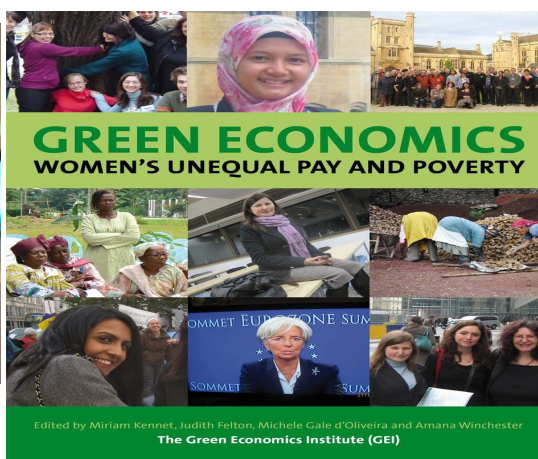

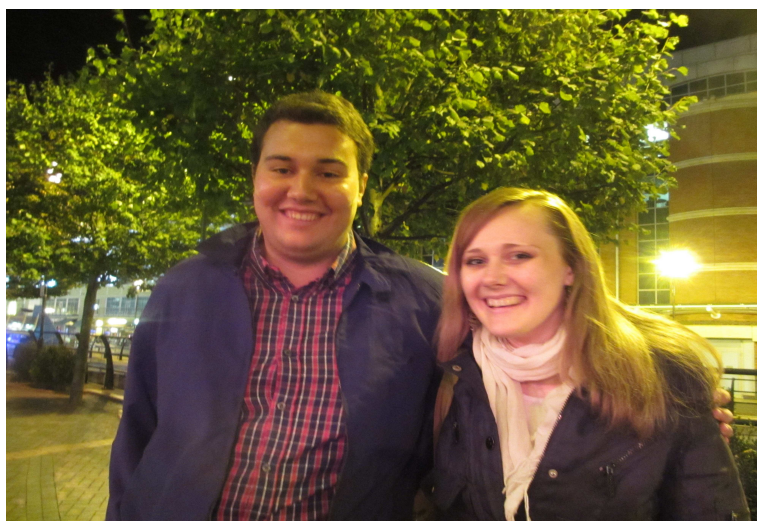

Moreover, It wanted to form new alliances for sustainable development that make it possible to put the commitments made by decision-makers at Rio and earlier UN meetings on sustainable development into practice.

A new discipline

A New Discipline: The Green Economics Institute (GEI) aims to develop a new discipline in economics that is based on an objective assessment of the problems, options and solutions available to society. It deals with the challenges of ever-changing complex, fragile, vulnerable, physical and social environments and to promote social and environmental justice. It aims to become trans-disciplinary and interdisciplinary so that it can factor in all the aspects of complexity into economics.

It seeks to provide a level of well-being to all people everywhere, non human species, the planet and its systems. It is based on practical and theoretical approaches targeting both methodology and knowledge and a comprehensive reform of current mainstream economics.

The current narrow economic approach is based on convention and on purposively designed methods. It is challenged by Green Economics to bring into its scope areas and concepts it has so far neglected.

Reworking Main stream economics: Green Economics is reworking the philosophy behind economic theory adding more recent philosophical discourses and ideas of “difference”. It builds on its enlightenment roots, adding feminism, post modernism, and the ideas about institutions and scientific investigations. It brings back the social and ethical element to decision making, while acknowledging the pivotal role of women and nature in real wealth creation. Green Economics analyses the simplistic undifferentiated growth imperative as well as many of the uncritical technical and social methods which derive economic propositions currently dominating economics but which are implicated in Global Environmental Change (GEC) and poverty. History, time, social and environmental justice are all incorporated back into the discourse to develop a truly “real” social and natural science, together with new learning from environmental science and philosophy.

Economics and Reality: Green economics reclaims economics from the preserve of purely quantitative measurement, graphs, statistical data and the assumption of “homo economicus” to create a complex, interdisciplinary, holistic, long-term social science which is informed by qualitative and quantitative data from natural science. Its long-termism describes the evolution of societies within archaeological and palaeontological time frames. Green Economics thus provides a better setting and better tools for understanding problems such as climate change, compared to what is offered by current conventions and short-term business cycles.

Features of Green Economics

Growth of abundance within the bounds of nature: Green Economics is concerned with establishing definitions of overall well-being and happiness for all people everywhere and the planet and biosphere, rather than deriving simplistic quantitative statistics. The purpose of economics is redefined and positive and normative statements are clearly differentiated. A distinction is made between destruction on the one hand, calculated and hidden as economic "growth", and on the other hand the true growth and abundance of natural resources for people and nature.

Alternatives to mainstream economics: The Institute critically discusses Green Economics alternatives and suggestions. The Green Economics discipline is in the process of being shaped and is undergoing rapid development. Green Economics builds on insights from environmental and ecological economics, feminist theory, welfare economics, development economics, post structuralism and post Keynesian ideas but moves beyond them to create a discipline that seeks to nurture new alternatives based on inter-generational equity and social and environmental justice. It is a discipline which condemns stewardship, dominion and dominance over other people, nature, the planet and its processes, and replaces it with an economics philosophy which shows concern for and co-operation with each other and acknowledges its embeddedness within nature.

Access and economics decision making for all: The Green Economics Institute argues for economic development based on economic access and decision making for all, including respect for cultural diversity and normative freedom. It does this by bringing together all the interested parties who want to help in developing this progressive discipline by inviting them to its events, and conferences, and by means of such activities as training, writing books and publications and by means of its research, and its campaigns and its lecturing at a variety of Universities and European Forums.

Our training courses are often met with great enthusiasm and have made a real difference to people's lives. Examples of our professional work and advice can be found on our website which has popularised this subject all over the world and made economics fun!

Conferences

We hold a large annual conference at Oxford University every summer, with guests and distinguished speakers from all corners of the world.



We also hold smaller conferences, one day events and smaller symposiums throughout the year – always with discounted prices for members.



3. Our Campaigns

The Green Economy has been called the Economics of Sharing the earth and its economy amongst ourselves but also with other species and systems of the planet, in addition but not exclusively, also to ensure it remains hospitable for us and our way of life. It is also the economics of doing and is intensely practical. We also work on **preventing runaway catastrophic climate change, preventing poverty and preventing species loss.**

As a part of our **Greening Business** campaign we are trying to influence many of the largest companies in the world, including focus on green supply chains and the greening of procurement with the aim of creating social and environmental justice. It also advocates greener transport methods and slower local smaller scale production, even with slow travel and more train travel, slow food and de-growth to keep within the earth's Carrying Capacity. It advocates "Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, Repair, Restore, Relax, Recover and also Avoidance, and Life style Changes"

We use innovative methods to reform, change and reclaim economics giving access and responsibility to everyone and everything for suitable economics decision making. We are also investigating corporate social responsibility and postulating for compulsory report on social and environmental impacts of all companies.

We have been working with the International Labour Organisation, EURAC European institute, the EU and the British Council to create **green jobs**- and what they call decent jobs- programme. Increasing numbers of jobs are being created in this vast and innovative transformation- this green economy. The Green Jobs Initiative of the United Nations and the International Labour Organisation and the International Federation of Trades Union describes a green job as "work in agricultural, manufacturing, research and development (R&D), administrative, and service activities that contribute(s) substantially to preserving or restoring environmental quality. Jobs can help to protect ecosystems and biodiversity; reduce energy, materials, and water consumption through high efficiency strategies; de-carbonize the economy; and minimize or altogether avoid generation of all forms of waste and pollution." Green Jobs are sustainable and contributes to social and environmental justice and is actually much more likely to last and to be competitive!.

Our **Women's Equal Pay and Equal Opportunity** campaign has resulted in 4 dynamic conferences and two books and a visit to Downing Street. And has been featured in the New Scientist. We are active to foster the wave of change in economics and welcome having a woman at the top of the IMF.
