What a busy year for Junior Basketball at South West.

This season there were 158 teams in our competition, in 8 different age groups of both boys and girls and 3 different divisions in most age groups. During this period South West supplied 60 referees and had 10 Supervisors/Game day controller on game days. During Season 2 we had almost 1,300 games of Junior Basketball played. Lots of clubs have been busy outside of the normal competition this season and below is just a quick overview of what they have been up to:

- Hawks took a girls team to the World Youth Basketball Tournament in the Open High School Division 1 competition in August. The team finished a creditable 2nd for further information on the tournament wybt.com
- Hornets took two U18 boys team to Hoop Nations in New Zealand in October. They
  had great success with one of the teams winning a silver medal in the U18
  Development division.
- Rockets took 2 Girl teams to Hoop Nations in New Zealand in October Both the U14 & U16 teams both finished 4th in this competition which was great a great achievement in this tournament.
- Mt Gravatt Magic are taking an U15 & U17 girls team to the Bronwyn Vigors Pacific Challenge Tournament in Coffs Harbour in December
- Rockets are taking U11, 13, 17 Boys teams to the Bronwyn Vigors Pacific Challenge Tournament in Coffs Harbour in December
- Rochdale Wildcats will have 7 coaches and Rockets have 13 coaches completing their Basketball Qld Club Coaching accreditation in November.


