Clinical Fellow in Paediatric Anaesthesia and PCCU- Joint research job with GOSH

To start Nov 2019.

Bart's and the London trust is the third largest paediatric unit in London, it is the largest paediatric A&E in London and is the base for HEMS and the regional Neonatal Transport Service. Most specialities are covered apart from paediatric cardiac and neurosurgery. There is extensive experience in neonatal anaesthesia (500 cases a year) with a medical and surgical neonatal intensive care. The hospital has the largest paediatric trauma intake in the United Kingdom with 200 polytrauma admissions last year. It has an active Paediatric anaesthetic unit with a good mixture of emergency and elective paediatric anaesthesia. A team of 10 Consultant Paediatric Anaesthetists lead the delivery of anaesthetics, acute pain and resuscitation. We work closely with our Consultant Paediatric Surgical and Paediatric colleagues. The consultant body is therefore able to provide considerable expertise in different anaesthetic techniques for paediatric surgery, perioperative care and resuscitation in the sick child.

The Paediatric Critical Care Unit is a six-bedded level 2 PICU. There are 6 PICU consultants, 8 Specialist registrars. This is level 2 PICU. The PCCU are pivotal in the resuscitation of all children admitted through A&E. There is an active interest in the audit and research of paediatric trauma

Job starts in Nov 2019 for 1 year.

The clinical part of the post consists of covering the on-call (ave 1:9). A total of 6 months of on-call is for PCCU at RLH, and the other 6 months for Paediatric Anaesthesia. These may be split into three-month slots to accommodate service commitments. The remainder of your time is non-clinical, and available for research/teaching/quality improvement projects. Additional clinical time may be available if desired.

Research/QI/education projects;

Based between Royal London, Great Ormond Street Hospital and Kings College Hospital.

The fellow will partake in 5-6 projects, which will be "pitched" to them by the consultants at the three sites.

It is expected that the portfolio of projects should be a mix of research, audit, teaching and writing chapters and reviews.

Supervision will be by Dr Ong and Dr Fernandez (GOSH), Dr Omar Hussain (Kings College Hospital) Dr Corinne Stannard (RLH) who will ensure projects are feasible and provide any support needed.

This job is suitable for trainees who will be ST5+ at the start of the post.
It will require someone with self-motivation and independence.
