

A GLOBALLY THREATENED SPECIES

Aquatic Warbler (Acrocephalus paludicola) is the only globally threatened passerine bird found in mainland Europe. Lithuania and Latvia are among eight countries worldwide with suitable breeding habitats for this rare species. In 2007 around 150 singing males were observed in Lithuania, while Latvian population is only 0-3.

Aquatic Warbler is a habitat specialist occurring mainly in open sedge fen mires and marshy habitats. Today it is facing extinction due to an increasingly abandoned farmland or transformation of wet meadows into grazing land. Therefore its conservation is closely linked to sustainable farming.
