

The Grow Asia Partnership

Grow Asia is a multi-stakeholder partnership platform that aims to reach 10 million smallholder farmers by 2020, helping them access knowledge, technology, finance, and markets to increase their productivity, profitability, and environmental sustainability by 20%. Grow Asia brings together South East Asia's smallholders, governments, companies, NGOs, and other stakeholders to develop inclusive and sustainable value chains that benefit farmers.

Grow Asia was established by the World Economic Forum, in collaboration with the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) Secretariat. Grow Asia builds on the experience and success of the Forum's New Vision for Agriculture (NVA) initiative, which facilitates multi-stakeholder partnerships across the world focused on agriculture development to deliver food security, environmental sustainability, and economic opportunity.

Strengthen Country Partnerships

Grow Asia launches and supports locally-led partnerships in alignment with country goals. Grow Asia helps to define their strategy, engage new partners, establish Secretariats and develop innovative solutions.

Partners collaborate in-country through Working Groups that co-design, co-implement, and co-fund value chain initiatives that benefit smallholder farmers. Grow Asia has catalyzed and supports five Country Partnerships in South East Asia:

Cambodia


Grow Asia is supporting the Cambodia Partnership for Sustainable Agriculture (CPSA) to develop value chain projects across six priority crops which will increase smallholders' production and access to market.

Indonesia

The Partnership for Indonesia's Sustainable Agriculture (PISAgro) seeks to provide an innovative, multi-stakeholder model for addressing the nation's agricultural challenges in a sustainable manner while improving the livelihoods of smallholder farmers. Grow Asia supports its 12 Working Groups focused on 11 crops and commodities.

Myanmar

The **Myanmar Agriculture Network (MAN)** serves as a multi-stakeholder platform to accelerate partnership opportunities and investment in food security, along with environmentally sustainable and inclusive agricultural growth in Myanmar.



Philippines

Grow Asia provides strategic direction and support to the **Philippines Partnership for Sustainable Agriculture (PPSA)**, which is developing value chain projects across four commodity-based Working Groups.

Vietnam

The Partnership for Sustainable Agriculture in Vietnam (PSAV) involves nearly 60 partners from the private sector, provincial governments, research institutes and NGOs. Task Forces focus on six crops and two cross-cutting themes of agri-finance and agrochemicals.











Convene and Broker Partnerships

Grow Asia convenes stakeholders including agri-business decision makers, policy leaders, financiers and practitioners to broker partnerships, share experiences and develop shared action plans which benefit smallholders.

The annual **Grow Asia Forum**, in coordination with the World Economic Forum on ASEAN, brings together senior leaders across sectors to explore opportunities for collaboration, innovation and investment in inclusive agricultural developments in South East Asia.

The annual **Grow Asia Practitioners' Workshop** provides Grow Asia and partners with an opportunity to establish cross-regional connections, troubleshoot and collaboratively define good practices and plans.

The Country Partnership Secretariat Workshop is a space for knowledge exchange, learning, planning and networking between the country Secretariats and the Grow Asia team.



Support Best Practice and Innovation

Grow Asia is accelerating replication and expansion of successful value chain projects through thought leadership and collaboration with in-country partners.

Grow Asia supports partners to design and share inclusive financial solutions for smallholders, and coordinates the development of new projects such as a **Replanting Bond** to help palm oil farmers intensify their land use through replanting.

Grow Asia works with partners to introduce innovative digital solutions. mFarmer is an open-source mobile platform, developed along with Unilever and Facebook, which will provide farmers with free access to agricultural and financial information and services.

Through commissioning research, Grow Asia has identified a framework of **pathways to scale** multi-stakeholder value chain projects, which will serve as a guide for partners.

Share Progress

Grow Asia aims to leverage partners' strengths by facilitating a knowledge sharing community and developing tools to strengthen performance measurement.

The **Grow Asia Exchange** is an online portal of research and case studies on sustainable agriculture. It also serves as a digital community for partners to share their own information, resources and learnings.

The **Grow Asia Counter** allows users to easily calculate and report the environmental impact of their farm management practices. Grow Asia has customized this online tool for our partners' priority crops.

The **Learning Partners' Network** will bring together academics, think tanks, NGOs and donors to share agriculture research, identify opportunities to support value chains and act as a resource for Grow Asia partners.
