Sacrament Strand Year 2 “Welcome”

Obj 1: Lesson 1

Develop an understanding about Baptism as a *Sacrament* – a special meeting with Jesus.

1. What is a Sacrament? (It is a special meeting with Jesus)
2. What is the first Sacrament to be celebrated? (Baptism)

Obj 2: Lessons 2-4

Recognise the rite of Baptism with its *rituals* and *symbols* as a means of welcoming people into the part of God's family we call the Church.

1. Baptism welcomes us into what? (God's family – the Church)
2. Name two ways we make people feel welcome in Room 2/at our school? (saying hello, including them in our games, joey's buddies for new students)
3. Draw and name the symbols of Baptism. (oil, white garment, candle water)
4. Draw and name the rituals of Baptism. (Anoints baby with oil, pours water over baby's head, puts the white garment on the baby, gives the lighted candle to the parents)
5. Recall the words of Baptism. (I baptise you in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit)
6. What is the role of Godparents? (To support the parents in bringing up the child in the Catholic faith) Optional

Obj 3: Lesson 5

Develop an understanding about Baptism as a *Sacrament* which *purifies* and makes people *holy*.

1. Baptism makes people holy through who? (The Holy Spirit)
2. Water is a symbol of what in Baptism? (Cleansing)

Obj 4: Lesson 6

Develop an understanding of Baptism as a *Sacrament* through which people share in the life of the *Trinity*, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

1. Identify the three persons in the *Holy Trinity*. (God – Father, Jesus – Son, Holy Spirit)

Obj 5: Lesson 7

Develop an understanding of Baptism as a *Sacrament* which enables people to share in the *tapu – holiness* and *mana – spiritual power* of *Te Atua – Io Matua Kore – God*.

1. Give the meanings of the following words – Tapu (holy and very special), Mana (spiritual power), Te Atua - Io Matua Kore (God shares himself fully with us)
2. Why are we holy? (Because God shares his tapu, life and love with us , through Baptism)
3. We receive mana so we can share what with others? (God's love)

Obj 6: Lesson 8

Recognise ways that people are welcomed at Eucharist.

1. Name two ways we are welcomed at Eucharist? (We are greeted as we enter the church, Father welcomes at the beginning, we sing a song to start Eucharist)
2. What do we say after Father has read the Gospel? (Thanks be to God)
